### KING'S REGULATION

(Made by His Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, in accordance with the provisions of the Pacific Order in Council, 1893.)

#### TO PROHIBIT THE USE OF EXPLOSIVES FOR FISHING IN THE BRITISH SOLOMON ISLANDS PROTECTORATE.

(L.S.) EVERARD IM THURN.

1. This Regulation shall be cited as "The Solomon Islands Fisheries (Explosives) Regulation short title. 1905."

2. In this Regulation—

"Protectorate" means the British Solomon Islands Protectorate.

Interpretation.

"Explosives" means and includes dynamite, gun-cotton, nitro-glycerine, gunpowder, fulminate of mercury, and every adaptation and preparation thereof as an explosive.

"Public fishery" means any salt or fresh water in the Protectorate or any waters within the limits of the territorial waters thereof, but shall not include waters the property of any private person.

3. On and after the first day of January one thousand nine hundred and six it shall be unlawful to use explosives for the purpose of catching or destroying fish in any public fishery within the limits of the Protectorate. Date of coming into operation.

4. Any person committing a breach of this Regulation shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds or, in the discretion of the Court, to imprisonment with or without hard labour for a term not exceeding fourteen days. Penalty.

WHEREAS by the *Colonial Solicitors Act 1900*, it is enacted that where as respects a Superior Court in a British Possession His Majesty the King in Council is satisfied on the report of a Secretary of State:—

- (a) that the regulations respecting the admission of persons to be Solicitors of that Superior Court are such as to secure that those Solicitors possess proper qualifications and competency; and
- (b) that by the law of the British Possession the Solicitors of the Supreme Court will be admitted to be Solicitors of the Superior Court in the Possession on terms as favorable as those on which it is proposed to admit Solicitors of that Superior Court in pursuance of the said Act to be Solicitors of the Supreme Court;

His Majesty in Council may order that the said Act shall apply and the same shall accordingly apply to the said Superior Court and British Possession, subject to any exceptions, conditions, and modifications specified in the Order:

And whereas by the said Act it is further provided that His Majesty in Council by the same or any subsequent Order may as respects the Court and British Possession named in the Order provide for all matters authorized by the said Act to be prescribed, and for all matters appearing to His Majesty to be necessary or proper for giving effect to the Order and to the said Act, and that an Order in Council applying the Act to a Court in a British Possession may provide that Solicitors of that Court may be admitted by virtue of the said Act to be Solicitors in any part of the United Kingdom, namely, England, Scotland, or Ireland, or in two or one of those parts only:

And whereas application has been made by the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia that the said Act may be applied to that State:

And whereas His Majesty in Council on the report of the Secretary of State for the Colonies is satisfied that the regulations respecting the admission of persons to be Solicitors of the Supreme Court of the State of Victoria are such as to secure that those Solicitors possess proper qualifications and competency and that by the law of the State of Victoria the Solicitors of the Supreme Court in England and Ireland and Law Agents in Scotland will be admitted to be Solicitors of the Supreme Court of the State of Victoria on terms as favorable as those on which it is proposed to admit Solicitors of that Court in pursuance of the said Act to be Solicitors of the Supreme Court:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the said recited Act and in execution of the powers thereby in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to Order, and it is hereby ordered, that the *Colonial Solicitors Act 1900*, shall apply to the Supreme Court of the State of Victoria and to the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, and that Solicitors of the Supreme Court of the State of Victoria may be admitted by virtue of the said Act to be Solicitors in England, and in Ireland, and Law Agents in Scotland, subject to the conditions hereinafter specified.

(1) A Solicitor of the Supreme Court of the State of Victoria (hereinafter called the applicant) who, having been in practice before such Court for not less than three years, is desirous of being admitted to be a Solicitor of the Supreme Court in England or Ireland or a Law Agent in Scotland, shall be a male British subject.

(2) The applicant shall, four calendar months at least before the first day of the month in which he proposes to be admitted, leave with the Registrar of Solicitors, or in the case of Scotland with the Registrar of Law Agents, his original certificate of admission in the said Supreme Court of the said State together with

- (a) a certificate from the authority of the said State in whose custody the roll of the Solicitors of the said Court is kept, stating that his name is still upon the roll and has never been removed therefrom and that no order has ever been made directing him to be suspended from practising his profession:
- (b) one or more certificates of fitness and character signed by two resident practising Solicitors of at least five years standing in the said Court and by at least one of the Judges or officers next in rank of such Court:
- (c) a statutory declaration in terms of or to the effect of that set out in the Schedule A hereunto annexed.

(3) The leaving of the before-mentioned documents shall be equivalent to notice of intention to apply for admission within the meaning of the Acts regulating the admission of Solicitors in England and Ireland respectively.

(4) A certificate under the hand of the Registrar of Solicitors that the applicant has complied with the provisions of the *Colonial Solicitors Act 1900*, and of this Order, shall be equivalent to the certificate of his having passed the Final Examination required in England and Ireland respectively.

(5) The application for admission to be a Solicitor in England shall be made to the Master of the Rolls and for the like admission in Ireland to the Lord Chancellor of Ireland.

(6) The applicant in England or Ireland shall not be required to pass any examination either before or after making such application.

(7) The admission of the applicant as a Solicitor in England or Ireland shall be stamped with the stamps required to be impressed on the admission of Solicitors in England and Ireland respectively, and shall be impressed with such further stamp as shall, together with the amount of stamps paid on Articles of Clerkship and admission in the State of Victoria (such amount being certified by a Judge of the Supreme Court of the said State in the form set out in the Schedule B hereunto annexed) be equal in amount to the sum payable on Articles of Clerkship in England and Ireland respectively.

(8) The admission of the applicant as a Law Agent in Scotland shall be stamped with such stamp as shall, together with the amount of stamps paid on Articles of Clerkship and admission in the State of Victoria (such amount being certified by a Judge of the Supreme Court of the said State in the form set out in the Schedule B hereunto annexed) be equal to the stamps required to be impressed on the Articles of Clerkship and admission of Law Agents in Scotland.

(11) The application for admission to be a Law Agent in Scotland shall be made by petition to the Court of Session, and if the Court shall be satisfied that the applicant has complied with the requirements of this Order they shall ordain him to undergo the examination in law prescribed for the time being for applicants for admission as Law Agents in Scotland under the *Law Agents (Scotland) Act 1873*, and Acts amending the same, and on the Court being satisfied that the applicant has duly passed such examination, then and not otherwise the Court shall cause him to be admitted a Law Agent and his name to be enrolled as such, which admission shall be in writing and signed by a Judge of the Court, and shall be stamped with the stamps required by clause 8 of this Order.

The rules in force in Scotland for the time being as to the presentation of petitions for admission as Law Agent and the proceedings under the same shall be applicable to all applications under this Order for admission as a Law Agent in Scotland.

## IMPORTANT NOTICE TO ELECTORS.

**I**T is hereby notified that all persons (including State servants) who are holders of electors' rights issued before or on the 1st December, 1904, must, not later than the 1st December next, obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names retained upon the new General Electoral Lists, which will be made up forthwith after that date.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from such Lists.

Each applicant for an elector's right for the Legislative Council should provide himself with the stamp (6d.) necessary for payment for the right.

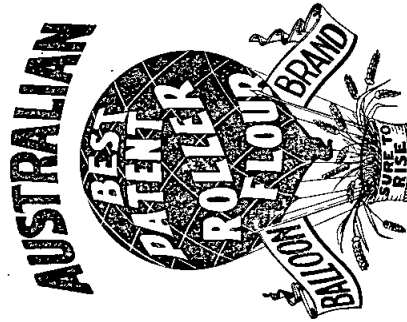

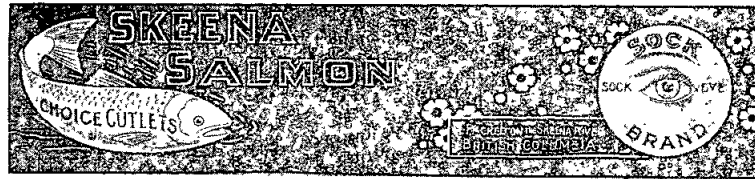

NIHILL WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING  
REGULATION FOR 1906.

THE Commissioners of the Nhill Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following Regulations:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of all lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by this Trust within its Waterworks District, that is to say:—

1. Every allotment of land, whether occupied or otherwise, of less than Eleven pounds sterling annual municipal value, the sum of Two shillings in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation.

2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile, whether occupied or otherwise, of less than Eleven pounds sterling annual municipal value, the sum of One pound sterling per annum.

3. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile, or allotment of land, whether occupied or otherwise, of Eleven pounds sterling, or more than Eleven pounds annual value, an amount equal to Two shillings in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation.

4. For all tenements or allotments of land, whether occupied or otherwise, in the said district, situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements or allotments of land, whether occupied or otherwise, are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenements or allotments of land, whether occupied or otherwise, are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

5. For every steam boiler supplied with water, except by special agreement, a charge of Twenty shillings per each horse-power shall be made.

6. For water supplied to siphon pumps, One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, or as may be decided upon by the Commissioners, in addition to a supply for domestic or other purposes.

7. In all cases of water supply, the Trust reserves the right of putting on a meter at the consumer's expense, and supplying water by measure, and in all cases where water is supplied to drinking or other troughs, or reservoirs, the Trust may compel the use of a floating-ball tap, or other improved device, to regulate the supply of such drinking or other troughs or reservoirs, to prevent the same overflowing.

8. Water supplied to the Government Departments, charitable or other public institutions, and religious denominations, shall be by measure, or by special agreement.

9. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, or at such price as may be specially agreed upon, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners and occupiers of gardens and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation or ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

One-sixteenth of an acre or less, per annum, 8,000 gallons.

7. For water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust, Two shillings and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than the amount of the assessed rate that would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure (and except in cases where the Trust has made special agreements).

8. A minimum of Ten shillings, and a maximum rate of Two pounds to every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year.

9. Such rates and charges are hereby made payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1906.

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

(2) For every house or tenement situate in any street or road where pipes have been laid for the supply of water thereto, such house or tenement being used either wholly or partly as a domicile, where the municipal valuation for the time being of such house or tenement does exceed the sum of Two hundred pounds sterling, a rate of Eightpence in the pound sterling for the first Two hundred pounds and Fourpence in the pound sterling for any amount over and above the sum of Two hundred pounds sterling, upon the municipal valuation for the time being of such house or tenement shall be paid.

(3) For every occupied or unoccupied allotment or vacant lot, the rate to be paid shall be at the rate of Fourpence in the pound sterling, according to the municipal valuation of such allotment. Provided that in no case shall a less rate than Six shillings each be charged.

(4) For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe of the Trust, there shall be paid one-half of the above rates. And for all such lands and tenements being over a quarter of a mile, but within half-a-mile from such stand-pipe, one-quarter of the full rate shall be paid.

3. The foregoing rate for the year ending the thirty-first day of December, 1906, shall be due and payable in two equal moieties, half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1906.

4. Such person as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover such rate.

(a) On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, or block of land supplied with water, a rate of Two shillings for each pound sterling on the amount of the municipal annual value, but the minimum annual amount to be paid shall be One pound sterling.

(b) Occupied and unoccupied land, where no water is supplied, shall be charged Five pounds per centum on the amount of municipal valuation.

(c) For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust or otherwise provided for in this Regulation, the rate shall be Fourpence for every 100 gallons.

(d) Occupied and unoccupied land, where no water is supplied from stand-pipes, shall be Sixpence for every 100 gallons.

(e) For steam boilers, the rate shall be Ten shillings per annum for each horse-power of each boiler, except in such cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.

(f) In buildings in course of erection, when water is required for building purposes, the rate shall be Ten shillings per centum on the contract price of the work or by special agreement. Wooden houses shall be charged half rate; payment to be made before supply is given.

(g) The supply of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the Trust will in each case determine, and the preliminary payment must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken or used.

(h) In case of any dispute as to the sub-section applying to any particular case, the Trust shall have the power to decide or to make a special rate.

(i) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic or other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which, at Fourpence per 100 gallons, equals the amount of the assessed rate for the year which would be payable for the premises or land so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(j) The rate hereby made shall be payable in equal moieties, half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st January and 1st July, 1906.

(k) Such person or persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates and charges.
