TRIENNIAL GENERAL RENEWAL OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.—LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO ELECTORS.

IT is hereby notified that all persons (including State servants) who are holders of electors' rights issued before or on the 1st December, 1904, must, not later than the 1st December next, obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names retained upon the new General Electoral Lists, which will be made up forthwith after that date.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from such Lists.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar, but the renewed right will be equally available for any election that may take place before the coming into force of the new rolls in February, 1906.

Intending applicants for electors' rights are cautioned to apply early to the Registrar. If application be postponed until the last day allowed for the purpose, the Registrar may be unable to issue rights to all applicants, and those to whom rights are not issued will not be enrolled, and will lose their title to vote.

No person whose name is on, or entitled to be on, any roll of ratepaying electors for any division of a province may obtain an elector's right for such province.

Foreigners who desire to obtain electors' rights must, if not already naturalized, obtain letters of naturalization, without which they are not qualified.

Each applicant for an elector's right for the Legislative Council should provide himself with the stamp (6d.) necessary for payment for the right.

RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT. **IN THE SUPREME COURT OF VICTORIA.**

The 3rd day of November, 1905.

WHEREAS it is expedient to add a New Rule to the Rules at present in force, and whereas it is expedient to repeal Order 16, Rule 9A, made the 20th day of July, 1905, and which came into force on and after the 1st day of August, 1905, the same is hereby repealed and the following Rule is hereby substituted:—

ORDER 16, RULE 9A.

9A. *Power to approve Compromises in absence of some of the persons interested.*—Where in proceedings concerning a trust or concerning a matter in which there are numerous persons having the same interest or similar interests a compromise is proposed, and some of the persons interested in the compromise are not parties to the proceedings, but there are other persons in the same interest before the Court and assenting to the compromise, the Court or a Judge, if satisfied that the compromise will be for the benefit of or will not be prejudicial to the absent persons and that to require service on or notice to such persons would cause unreasonable expense or delay may, either before or after judgment, approve the compromise, and order that the same shall be binding on the absent persons, and they shall be bound accordingly, except where the order has been obtained by fraud or non-disclosure of material facts.

And this Rule shall come into force on and after the 8th day of November, 1905.

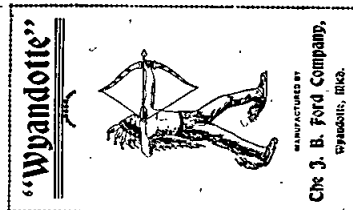

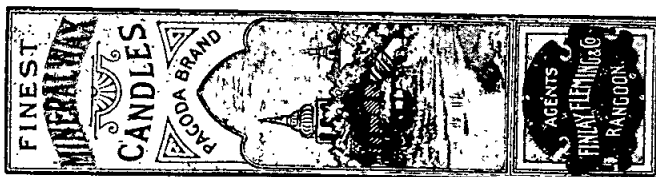

SEYMOUR WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1906, No. 16.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Seymour Waterworks Trust, a portion of the Waterworks District of which Trust has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Acts*, make the Regulation following:—

The following are the rates for 1906 which the owners or occupiers of lands, tenements, and vacant or unoccupied allotments within the aforesaid Urban District, and liable to be rated, shall pay to the Trust in respect of such property:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twenty-six pounds (£26) annual municipal value and under, a rate of One pound sterling shall be paid.

2. For every house or tenement of more than Twenty-six pounds annual municipal valuation, a rate of Ninepence in the pound shall be paid.

3. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied allotments of land, if not more than Five shillings annual municipal valuation, a rate of Five shillings for each and every separate allotment by which a main passes.

4. For every allotment of land exceeding Five shillings annual municipal valuation fronting a street wherein a main pipe of the Trust is laid, a rate of One shilling in the pound shall be paid.

5. For all lands and tenements, situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are not supplied with water, and being within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe, one-half of the before-mentioned rate, and where lands and tenements are over a quarter of a mile and under half-a-mile from a stand-pipe, one-quarter of the before-mentioned rate.

6. Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly, where the water is used for domestic and other than domestic purposes, shall be the quantity which at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the assessed rate for the half-year which would be payable in respect of the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. In cases where water is sold by measure for other than domestic use solely, the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly shall be 27,000 gallons.

7. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties on the 1st of January and 1st of July, 1906.

8. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

CARISBROOK WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1906.

THE Commissioners of the Carisbrook Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the following Regulations:—

REGULATION NO. 13.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1906 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said Urban District:—

1. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds or under, the sum of One pound sterling.
2. For every house or tenement of above Ten pounds and not more than Fifteen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings in the pound, according to such value.
3. For every house or tenement of above Fifteen pounds, and not more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.
4. For every house or tenement of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal value and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.
5. For every house or tenement, not being used as a domicile, of Ten pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.
6. For every house or tenement, not being used as a domicile, of above Ten pounds and not more than Fifteen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings in the pound, according to such value.
7. For every house or tenement, not being used as a domicile, of above Fifteen and not more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.
8. For every house or tenement, not being used as a domicile, of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal valuation, and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.
9. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling; over Twenty pounds municipal value, One shilling in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.
10. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement for domestic and other than domestic purposes, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at the price named, would be equal to the rate payable in respect of the property so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.
11. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, or brickwork, and plastering; or, if there be no contract, then upon the value of the amount charged or fixed for such stonework, brickwork, and plastering.
12. For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the cylinder of the engine.
13. For water supplied to market gardeners for other than domestic purposes solely, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon, and the minimum quantity to be charged for yearly shall be 50,000 gallons, the supply to be by meter only.

That the above-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance, first payment to be on the first day of January, 1906, and the second payment on the first day of July, 1906. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Carisbrook Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rate and charges.

Where water is supplied for other than domestic use solely, the charge shall be One shilling per One thousand gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly shall be Ten thousand gallons. Charges for water shall be due and payable on 1st January and 1st July, 1906.
4. The foregoing rates are made payable in equal moieties on the 1st January and 1st July, 1906.
5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by such Acts, make the following Regulation, viz.:—

REGULATION No. 26.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements, liable to be rated, shall pay for the year 1906 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said Urban District:—

1. For every house and tenement of Sixteen pounds annual municipal value and under, the sum of One pound sterling.

2. For every house and tenement of Seventeen pounds annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of Six pounds five shillings per cent. per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

3. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land unsupplied with water from the works of the Trust of Nine pounds annual municipal value and under, the sum of Ten shillings sterling.

4. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land unsupplied with water from the works of the Trust of Ten pounds annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of Six pounds five shillings per cent. per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property, provided that in any case the rate shall not be less than One pound sterling.

5. For every water-trough, Twelve shillings per annum will be charged, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of troughs supplied by measurement shall be 12,000 gallons.

6. For water supplied by measurement by the Trust, One shilling per 1,000 gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed on), and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens (except market gardens) and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust by measurement for the purpose of irrigation, or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half-an-acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons; exceeding half-an-acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 60,000 gallons; for every additional acre, and proportionately, according to the foregoing scale for any fractional part of an acre.

In livery, bait, and carriers' stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 5,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses. In open sheds used for the above purpose, each space of 5 feet shall be charged as a stall.

7. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by meter where water is supplied for domestic purposes as well as for purposes other than domestic, shall be the quantity which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons (or Fourpence per 1,000 gallons for market gardens), equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

8. The Trust will, if it so think fit, but not otherwise, let for hire water meters, the rent for which shall be at the rate of Five shillings each per annum, which rent shall be exclusive of and in addition to the amount or rate charged for the recorded consumption of water, and shall be due and must be paid, half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in each year.

9. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering; or, if there be no contract, then upon the value of or the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, or plastering.

10. For water supplied to market gardens, the charge shall be Fourpence per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 300,000 gallons per acre, and proportionately for every fractional part of an acre. The supply to be by meter only.

11. For water supplied to breweries, the charge shall be Ten pounds per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

12. For water supplied to cricket or bowling clubs, Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

13. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the engine cylinder.

14. For water supplied to syphon pumps, Twenty shillings each per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

15. For water supplied to private fountains, Twenty shillings each per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

That the before-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1906, excepting the charge for water supplied by measure, which shall be paid quarterly.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

ELMORE WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
REGULATION FOR 1906.

THE Commissioners of the Elmore Waterworks Trust, of the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the Regulations following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1906 in respect of water supplied by the Trust, within the Water Supply District:—

1. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of the annual municipal value of Sixteen pounds (£16) and under, the sum of One pound per annum shall be paid.

2. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of the annual municipal value of Seventeen pounds (£17) and upwards, a rate of One shilling and threepence (1s. 3d.) in the £1 shall be charged.

3. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant lands shall be One shilling and threepence (1s. 3d.) in the £1, according to the municipal valuation, provided that in no case shall a rate of less than Twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.) be paid.

4. For water supplied to public troughs a charge of Two pounds (£2) shall be made, provided that no person shall be charged for more than one trough.

5. Any water supplied to troughs other than public troughs, must be paid for by meter or by special agreement, at such rates, upon such terms, and subject to such conditions as the Trust and the person requiring such supply may agree to adopt.

6. For water supplied by measure, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, except in the case of special agreement with the Trust.

7. The foregoing rates are made payable in equal moieties on the 1st January and the 1st July, 1906.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

A Regulation of the Shire of Winchelsea Waterworks Trust, made under the Water Acts for the purpose of imposing, levying, and receiving a rate.

IN pursuance of the powers granted and conferred by the Water Acts, the Commissioners of the Shire of Winchelsea Waterworks Trust hereby make the following Regulation:—

A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all the rateable property in the Waterworks District of the Shire of Winchelsea Waterworks Trust, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of Winchelsea, in which such lands and tenements are situated, for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1906, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1906, provided that the sum of Ten shillings shall be the minimum amount of rates to be paid annually by every owner or occupier of such lands or tenements.

Such rate shall be payable and collected in two equal proportions or instalments of One shilling each, and the first portion or instalment shall be due and payable on the 1st day of January, 1906, and the second portion or instalment shall be due and payable on the 1st day of July, 1906.

Such person as the Commissioners of the Shire of Winchelsea Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, and receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

UPPER MACEDON WATERWORKS TRUST.

REGULATION.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, the Commissioners of the Upper Macedon Waterworks Trust do hereby make the following Regulations:—

1. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the direction of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

2. The service pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers shall in no case exceed half-inch in diameter; for the supply of water for other than domestic purposes, and for all supplies by meter such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.

3. If any person shall waste water of the Trust by neglecting to repair any service pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the water from such service-pipe or otherwise, as to the Trust may seem fit until the necessary repairs have been effected.

4. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste; any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

5. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

6. Water closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.

7. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one million (1,000,000) gallons.

8. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does or causes or permits to be done anything in contravention of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

9. The water supplied in the Waterworks District of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these regulations and not otherwise, through pipes, meters, laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with the said regulations and not otherwise.

10. In the construction of these regulations the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Upper Macedon Waterworks Trust.
