ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Reginald Arthur James Talbot, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to provide for the Issuing of Treasury Bonds when required for paying off repurchasing or redeeming Government securities or for exchanging therefor."

"An Act to amend the Companies Acts so far as regards Dairying Companies."

"An Act to further amend the *Poisons Act 1890*."

"An Act to reduce for One Year the Municipal Endowment."

"An Act to further amend the *Audit Act 1890*."

"An Act to declare the Rates of Income Tax for the Year ending on the thirty-first day of December One thousand nine hundred and six."

"An Act relating to Duties payable under the Administration and Probate Acts."

"An Act to authorize the revesting in the Crown of certain Lands in the City of Melbourne now held under Certificate of Title by Trustees as a Recreation Ground for and in connexion with the Friendly Societies of Victoria and also the cancellation of the Crown Grant and Certificate and for other purposes."

"An Act to enable the Victorian Railways Commissioners to construct acquire maintain and use Motor Carriages or Cars for passenger traffic."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this twenty-second day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and five, and in the fifth year of His Majesty's reign.

TRIENNIAL GENERAL RENEWAL OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.—LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO ELECTORS.

IT is hereby notified that all persons (including State servants) who are holders of electors' rights issued before or on the 1st December, 1904, must, not later than the 1st December next, obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names retained upon the new General Electoral Lists, which will be made up forthwith after that date.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from such Lists.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar, but the renewed right will be equally available for any election that may take place before the coming into force of the new rolls in February, 1906.

Intending applicants for electors' rights are cautioned to apply early to the Registrar. If application be postponed until the last day allowed for the purpose, the Registrar may be unable to issue rights to all applicants, and those to whom rights are not issued will not be enrolled, and will lose their title to vote.

No person whose name is on, or entitled to be on, any roll of ratepaying electors for any division of a province may obtain an elector's right for such province.

Foreigners who desire to obtain electors' rights must, if not already naturalized, obtain letters of naturalization, without which they are not qualified.

Each applicant for an elector's right for the Legislative Council should provide himself with the stamp (6d.) necessary for payment for the right.

THE MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1890*, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners (hereinafter called the "Commissioners") make the following Regulation, namely:—

Sub-clause (a) of Clause No. 348 of the Regulation made by the Commissioners shall be and is so altered that the said sub-clause for the future shall be:—

(a) For every day or part of a day (not including Sundays and public holidays, unless where the vessel casts off from the wharf on Sunday or any public holiday) during which any vessel, other than a vessel mentioned in sub-clause (b) or a vessel licensed under clause numbered 340 hereof or any ferry-boat plying within the port shall use any wharf of the Commissioners, there shall be paid the sum of One halfpenny per ton of the net register tonnage (British Standard) of such vessel. Provided that if any vessel without having left the port in the interim shall use one or more wharfs for more than six days in the whole, and shall have paid the rates for such six days, the rate to be paid for every day she uses any wharf after such six days shall be One farthing per ton aforesaid. A vessel lying in tier outside a vessel moored to or alongside any wharf of the Commissioners shall be liable to the preceding rates as if she were directly moored to the wharf. 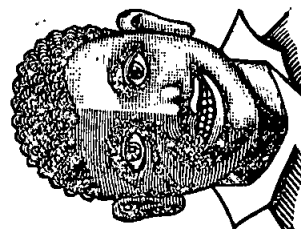

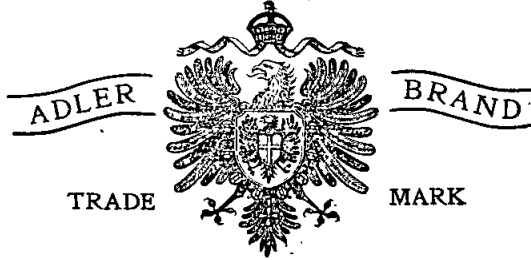

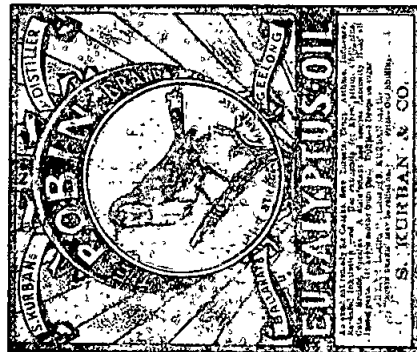

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

BY-LAW No. 188.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf by the Railways Acts, do hereby make the following By-law, and do hereby repeal so much of all previous By-laws as conflicts therewith.

1. Melbourne time is to be observed at all stations.

Melbourne time to be observed.

2. No passenger shall enter at a booking station, or travel from any such station in any carriage or other vehicle of the Commissioners unless furnished with a pass or ticket entitling him to enter or travel therein.

Passengers to obtain tickets and deliver up the same on demand.

Any intending passenger on paying the prescribed fare will be furnished with a ticket, and every passenger shall show his pass or ticket to, and allow it to be marked by, any authorized employé of the Commissioners whenever so required by such employé, and the holder of any return ticket shall, if so required, produce the return half on the forward journey. Every pass or ticket, whether single, return, or periodical, shall be delivered up on demand of any such employé.

Tickets not to be used for any other day than for which issued.

Any ticket not used on the day, within the period, or for the journey for which it was issued, and any return ticket not used within the prescribed time, shall be deemed cancelled.

Any person who shall travel without a proper pass or ticket, or who shall fail or refuse to show or deliver up such pass or ticket upon demand as aforesaid, shall pay the fare from the station whence the train originally started, or the then previous checking station (if any), whichever shall be the nearer to the end of his journey, and, in addition, shall be liable to the penalty hereinafter provided. Any person who shall use or attempt to use any pass or ticket in contravention of, or be otherwise guilty of a breach of this By-law, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

3. Tickets are the property of the Commissioners, and are not transferable. Any person not duly authorized by the Commissioners who shall sell or attempt to sell any pass, ticket, or portion of a return ticket, or who shall use or attempt to use a transferred pass, ticket, or portion of a return ticket, or a ticket, the time for using which has expired, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds. Any person who shall travel on such pass, ticket, or portion of a return ticket or expired ticket, shall in addition be liable to pay the fare which he would have been liable to pay for the journey.

Sale and purchase of tickets. Passengers using expired tickets.

4. No passenger, unless he join the train at a stopping place where tickets are not issued, or unless he be the then holder of an ordinary full fare ticket to the intermediate station at which he alights, and also rebooks at the full ordinary rate without deriving any advantage as regards fare by the double booking, shall take a ticket at any intermediate station for the purpose of continuing his journey in the same train as that in which he shall have arrived at such station. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Booking at intermediate stations to continue journey by same train.

5. No ticket, whether single or return, shall be used by a passenger for a journey other than that between the stations named thereon, or to a station between those so named, and in the latter event only if the passenger, by so using the ticket, derive no advantage as regards fare. A Workman's Ticket and an Excursion Ticket shall not be used for any other train than that for which they may have been issued. A holder of a Workman's Weekly Ticket who leaves a train on the forward journey at any station before the destination shown on such ticket, shall not continue his journey to such destination except upon payment of the ordinary fare from the place at which he resumes such journey.

Tickets only to be used between stations named thereon and by proper trains.

Any person who uses or attempts to use a ticket in contravention of this By-law, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds. Any person who shall use a ticket for any other station than that for which it is available shall pay the difference (if any) between the sum actually paid and the fare between the stations from and to which the passenger has travelled, in addition to the penalty.

6. No passenger shall break his journey at an intermediate station and thereafter proceed by a subsequent train on the same ticket, unless by permission of the officer in charge, or authorized by the Regulations of the Commissioners. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Breakage of journey on tickets.

7. No ticket shall be recognised by any employé of the Commissioners unless the number, date, and names of the stations on such ticket are legible.

Defaced tickets not to be recognised.

Any person who shall use or attempt to use any ticket defaced, mutilated, altered, or illegible in any of the above particulars, will be regarded as not having paid his fare, and, in addition to the amount of the fare, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

8. No passenger shall place his foot or feet upon any seat or part of a seat in any carriage or other vehicle of the Commissioners under a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

Passengers not to place their feet on seats.

9. No person shall expectorate upon the floor or any other part of any carriage, vehicle, waiting-room, or platform of the Commissioners. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

Expectorating on station premises or rolling-stock.

Male passengers not to enter waiting-rooms or carriages set apart for females.

10. No male person shall enter any room, carriage, or other vehicle set apart for the accommodation of females, and any such person who shall enter such room, carriage, or other vehicle, or remain therein after being warned to leave the same, may be removed therefrom, and, in addition, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

Full fare passengers only to travel in smoking compartments.

11. No person shall travel in any compartment of any carriage set apart for smoking unless he shall have paid the adult fare for the time being in force, notwithstanding he may be the holder of a certificate purporting to authorize him to travel at a less fare. Any person found so travelling, who refuses either to pay such adult fare or to quit such compartment when required so to do by an authorized employé of the Commissioners, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

Smoking in places not set apart for the purpose.

12. No person shall smoke in any shed or covered platform of a station, or in any building, or on any pier, jetty, or wharf of the Commissioners, or in any carriage, or other vehicle, or compartment thereof not specially provided for that purpose. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law may be summarily removed, and, in addition, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

Entering or leaving carriages when in motion, &c.

13. No person other than an employé of the Commissioners, shall, without reasonable excuse, enter, or leave, or attempt to enter or leave any carriage or other vehicle while the train is in motion, or elsewhere than at the side of the carriage or other vehicle adjoining the platform or other place appointed by the Commissioners for persons to enter or leave the same. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Opening carriage doors or getting through windows.

14. No person, other than an employé of the Commissioners, shall, without reasonable excuse, enter or leave any carriage or other vehicle of the Commissioners by getting through a window, or shall open a locked carriage door with a key or other instrument at any time, or any door, whether locked or not, while the train is in motion. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

Travelling on roof, steps, &c., of carriage.

15. No person, other than an employé of the Commissioners, shall, without reasonable excuse, travel on the roof, steps, or footboard of any carriage or other vehicle, or on an engine or on any portion of any carriage or other vehicle not intended for the conveyance of passengers. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law may be summarily removed, and, in addition, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Persons intoxicated or committing any nuisance.

16. No person in a state of intoxication shall enter or remain in a carriage or other vehicle, or be upon any station or premises of the Commissioners, and no person shall in or upon any such carriage, vehicle, station, or premises, commit any nuisance, or gamble, or write, or use any insulting, indecent, obscene, blasphemous, abusive, or offensive words, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law may be summarily removed from such carriage, vehicle, station, or premises, and shall be liable, in addition, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

Persons with infectious or contagious diseases.

17. The Commissioners may refuse to carry any person who has any infectious or contagious disease. No person who has any such disease shall, without the authority of the Commissioners, resort to or come upon any premises of the Commissioners, or travel, or attempt to travel, on any railway. No person who has charge of any person who has any such disease shall, without the like authority, aid or assist the person having any such disease to travel, or attempt to travel, on the railway. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law may be removed from any such premises or from any carriage or other vehicle of the Commissioners, and shall forfeit any fare which he may have paid, and, in addition, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

Making use of means of communication between passengers and railway servants.

18. No person shall make use of the means of communication between the passengers and employés of the Commissioners in charge of a train, or apply any brake without reasonable excuse. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

Gratuities not to be offered to employés.

19. No person shall give or offer a gratuity to any employé of the Commissioners under a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

Obstructing employés in the execution of their duty.

20. No person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any employé of the Commissioners in the execution of his duty. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

Lost property or documents found to be handed over.

21. Any person who finds any lost property upon any station or premises or in or upon any carriage or vehicle of the Commissioners shall immediately hand over the same to the officer in charge of the railway station at or nearest the place where such property was found, or to the guard in charge of the train. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Injuring or removing railway property.

22. No person shall wilfully or negligently injure any lining, shutter, or blind, or break or deface any window, or remove or injure any number-plate, notice, or advertisement, or remove or extinguish any lamp of, or in, any carriage, or otherwise damage any fittings, carriage, or other property of the Commissioners. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to pay the amount of the damage done, and, in addition, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

23. No person shall omit to shut and securely fasten any gate set up at either side of the railway for the accommodation of the owner or occupier of the adjoining lands as soon as he and any vehicle, cattle, or other animals under his care have passed through the same. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds. Persons omitting to shut and fasten gates, &c.
24. No person, unless authorized in writing by the Commissioners, shall post, stick, paint, or write, or cause to be posted, stuck, painted, or written, any placard, bill, advertisement, or other matter within or on any post, fence, gate, platform, wall, building, or other property or premises of the Commissioners. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds. Posting placards on railway property or premises.
25. No person, unless authorized in writing by the Commissioners, shall sell or attempt to sell any article on any railway premises. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds. Sales on railway premises.
26. No person shall wilfully trespass upon any railway, pier, wharf, jetty, station, land, or other premises of the Commissioners. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds. Trespassing on railway premises.
27. Any person (unless holding a platform ticket), not being an intending passenger in possession of a ticket, who does not leave any premises of the Commissioners when required so to do by an authorized employé of the Commissioners, may be removed therefrom, and, in addition, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds. Persons to leave railway premises when required to do so.
28. No person shall cross, or attempt to cross, any line of railway elsewhere than at an authorized crossing-place, or cross, or attempt to cross, any line of railway at an authorized crossing-place when warned so not to do by an employé of the Commissioners. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds. Persons crossing at unauthorized places.
29. No person on foot (excepting a person in charge of a vehicle or live stock) shall cross, or attempt to cross, any line of railway on the level at a station or any other place where an overbridge or subway is provided. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds. Persons crossing line to use over-bridge or subway where provided.
30. No person, unless duly authorized in writing by the Commissioners, shall come in or upon any carriage, vehicle, or premises of the Commissioners, for the purpose of removing any passenger's luggage for reward unless engaged by him for such purpose, and no person, unless so authorized as aforesaid, shall solicit custom or hire in or upon any carriage, vehicle, or premises of the Commissioners. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law may be removed from such carriage, vehicle, or premises, and in addition shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds. Unauthorized persons soliciting custom.
31. No driver of any hackney carriage, omnibus, cart, dray, or other public vehicle shall ply for hire within any premises of the Commissioners without a licence in writing from them. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds. Drivers of vehicles to be provided with written licence.
32. Every driver of an omnibus, cab, carriage, cart, dray, or other vehicle shall, while in or upon any station, yard, or other premises of the Commissioners, obey the reasonable directions of any authorized employé of the Commissioners. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds. Drivers of vehicles to obey directions of railway officers.
33. No person shall drive any horse or horses attached to a vehicle, or drive any motor-car or other machine through, into, or out of any railway station, yard, or premises of the Commissioners, at a rate of speed involving danger to others. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds. Horses, vehicles, &c., not to be driven at dangerous speed.
34. No person shall ride or drive any horse, or any bicycle, motor-car, or other machine upon or along any railway, pier, wharf, jetty, platform, or any pathway, subway, or other way used in connexion with any of the railway stations, buildings, piers, wharfs, or jetties vested in, used by, or under the control of the Commissioners, and set apart for the exclusive use of pedestrians. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds. Horses, bicycles, &c., not to be ridden or driven except where set apart therefor.
35. No person shall take or attempt to take across any railway on the level any traction engine, road engine, or any vehicle of whatsoever description the weight of which on any wheel exceeds 3 tons or 6 tons on any axle, or any vehicle or contrivance having thereon any load exceeding 14 feet in height or 12 feet in width, or any load that is exceptional and will cause, or will be likely to cause, an obstruction of the railway, unless such person shall have given 48 hours' previous notice, in writing, of his intention to so cross, particularising the place and time where and when he intends to cross, and the name and address of the owner of such engine, vehicle, or load to the Station-master or Officer-in-charge of any railway station, which is also a telegraph station, or the railway station next adjacent to the point at which such person proposes to so cross such railway, provided a man be in charge of such station, and unless and until such person has made such provision as may be required by the Commissioners to prevent any injury being done to railway property or such railway by reason of the crossing of such engine, vehicle, or load. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds. Traction engines, road engines, or other vehicles crossing line.

Loaded firearms
not to be
carried.

36. No person shall, without the written authority of the Commissioners, take or place into or upon, or discharge from or upon any premises, carriage, or other vehicle of the Commissioners any loaded firearm. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Missiles,
rubbish, &c.,
not to be
thrown.

37. No person shall throw, or cause to be thrown, at or from any carriage or other vehicle of the Commissioners, or on to any railway or any station building, pier, wharf, jetty, land, or other premises vested in, used by, or under the control of the Commissioners, any glass, stone, or other missile, or any filth, dirt, rubbish, or other matter of a similar nature. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

Polluting water
in railway
reservoirs, &c.

38. No person shall bathe in or pollute the water of any reservoir or tank connected with any railway of the Commissioners, and no person shall fish or shoot in, over, or upon any such reservoir or tank without the consent in writing of the Commissioners. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

Poison not to
be placed on
railway station,
&c.

39. Any person putting or placing any poison, or any poisoned meat, grain, or any poisoned substance whatsoever, on or upon any railway, railway station, or railway reserve, save with the authority of the Commissioners, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Sewage,
drainage, &c.,
not to be
placed or
emptied on
railway
premises.

40. No person shall permit to flow, or empty or place or cause or suffer to flow or to be emptied or placed, any sewage, night-soil, drainage, or other offensive matter, on to or upon any railway, or any station, building, pier, wharf, jetty, land or other premises vested in or used by or under the control of the Commissioners. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds:

Animals not to
be driven
across the line
at unauthorized
places.

41. No person, whether with or without a vehicle, shall ride or drive, or attempt to ride or drive, any horse, cattle, sheep, or other animal across any line of railway on the level thereof when a train is in sight and in motion coming towards such place, or when warning of its approach has been given by a whistle, or when warned so not to do by an employé of the Commissioners. Every person when crossing shall use all possible despatch to cross such line. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

Allowing
animals to
stray on
railway
premises or
lands.

42. No person shall drive or negligently allow any cattle, horse, sheep, swine, or other animal to stray upon any line of railway or premises of the Commissioners. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

Conveyance of
dogs or other
animals in
carriages.

43. No person shall take into or have in his charge in any carriage or other vehicle intended for the conveyance of passengers, any dog or other animal, except under the conditions imposed for the conveyance of such dog or other animal. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds; and any such dog or other animal may be forthwith removed from any such carriage or vehicle, and from the premises of the Commissioners.

Diseased
animals on
railway
premises.

44. The Commissioners may refuse to carry any horse, cattle, sheep, swine, bird, or other live stock which they reasonably believe to be diseased. No person shall wilfully or negligently drive or bring, or cause, or permit to be driven or brought upon or into any station yard, shed, or premises of the Commissioners, any horse, cattle, sheep, swine, bird, or other live stock, having or suffering from any disease whatsoever. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

Destroying,
damaging, or
defacing
By-laws.

45. Any person who destroys, damages, or defaces, or tampers with any copy of a By-law exhibited or placed on any railway premises shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

By-laws not
to be waived.

46. No employé of the Commissioners has any authority to waive, dispense with, or vary these By-laws or any of them.

Sydney excursion tickets will not be available by the express train on the New South Wales line, except on payment of 20s. first class and 15s. second class. In all cases the journey may be broken for one month on the forward and during the currency of the ticket on the return journey.

Mines Acts.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO LICENCES TO WORK TAILINGS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-second day of November, 1905.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

Mr. Davies | Sir Samuel Gillott.

WHEREAS by the Mines Acts it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to make Regulations generally for carrying out the provisions of the said Acts in respect to leases and licences, and such Regulations from time to time to alter, add to, or rescind: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby repeal the Regulations relating to Licences to Work Tailings, made on the 9th day of December, 1901, and doth make the following Regulations in lieu thereof: Provided always that the Regulations now repealed shall have full force and effect until the coming into operation of the Regulations now made, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER THE MINES ACTS RELATING TO TAILINGS LICENCES.

INTERPRETATION.

"Regulations" shall mean the Regulations now made.
"Tailings" shall mean any sand, slimes, slum, or other mine material which has been produced by mining operations, or by the crushing or treating of mining material.

"Applicant" shall mean any person, corporate company, or other legally constituted association applying for a licence under these Regulations.

"Application" shall mean the application for a licence.

"Licence" shall mean the licence granted in pursuance of these Regulations.

"Minister" shall mean the Minister of Mines for the time being for the State of Victoria.

"Secretary" shall mean the Secretary for Mines for the said State.

"Warden" shall mean a Warden of the gold-fields.

The singular number shall include the plural and the plural the singular.

The calculation of days shall be exclusive of Sundays, Good Friday, and Christmas Day.

LIMIT.

(1) These Regulations shall apply only to tailings situate on Crown land which have become the property of the Crown, pursuant to the provisions of section 53 of Act 1514, or section 54 of Act 1961, or any amendment of the said sections.

APPLICATION.

(2) Any person desirous of obtaining a licence to work, treat, or remove tailings for the purpose of extracting therefrom any gold or other metals or minerals shall—

(a) Mark out the site upon which such tailings are situated, by erecting and keeping erected, until the application has been granted, refused, or abandoned, posts painted blue, at least three inches square, and not less than three feet above the ground, as far as circumstances and occupiers will permit, to define the boundaries and angles of the land, with a metal plate affixed, having painted thereon the words "Applied for Tailings licence," and the date of marking-out, and the name of the applicant or (if more than two) the first two applicants legibly painted thereon.

(b) Within 10 days from marking out the site insert in a newspaper printed and published in the locality where the land is situated, or if no such newspaper then in one printed and published nearest the locality, an advertisement or notice in the form marked "A" in the Schedule hereto.

(c) Within 10 days from marking out the site, post similar notices at the office of the warden and at the post-office or petty sessions court, whichever shall appear to the applicant to be nearest the land by the ordinary road.

(d) Within 10 days from marking out the site, give to every person owning or occupying the site, or having or claiming to the knowledge of the applicant to have any rights to the site, or the tailings, or any part thereof, a similar notice. It will be sufficient if this notice is given either personally or by leaving the same at the abode of such person, or by posting the same by registered letter at such time as that by ordinary course of post it will reach such person within seven days after the erection of the posts.

(e) Within 10 days from the marking out of the site the applicant shall cause to be posted to the Secretary, or leave at his office, accompanied by a registration fee of Ten shillings, an application in the form set out in Schedule "A" hereto, with the declaration in the form set out in Schedule "C" hereto indorsed thereon duly completed, together with a copy of the newspaper containing the notice hereinbefore provided for. The registration fee shall not in any event be returned.

(3) Every application shall be registered in the books of the Office of Mines in the order of, and shall have indorsed thereon the day and hour of, its receipt.

(4) Priority shall be determined according to the date and hour of marking out the site applied for.

(5) Within 28 days after marking out, or under special circumstances such further time as the Secretary may allow, the applicant shall forward to or lodge at the Secretary's office, Mines Department, Melbourne, a plan by a mining surveyor, and field notes of the site applied for, as hereinafter provided.

(6) At any time during its progress the application may be declared abandoned, if the applicant withdraws the same, or fails to comply with these regulations or with all requisitions made on him by the Secretary; and notice of such abandonment shall be published in the *Government Gazette*.

(7) In every instance the Governor or the Governor in Council, on the recommendation of the Minister, shall decide whether a licence shall be issued, and, in the event of two or more applications being received in respect to the same tailings, to whom a licence shall be granted, notice of the granting of any licence shall be published in the *Government Gazette*.

SURVEY.

(8) On receipt of instructions from the applicant so to do, the Mining Surveyor shall with all reasonable speed make a survey of the site applied for, and shall furnish to the applicant a copy of his field notes and a plan—

- (a) showing by metes and bounds the extent of the tailings applied for.
- (b) Showing a tie or connecting line to a block of land surveyed under the Mines Acts, or on behalf of the Lands Department.
- (c) Showing any overlap on or inclusion of land held under miner's right mining or mineral lease or any section of the Land Acts, or applied for as a mining or mineral lease.
- (d) The average length, width, depth, and the approximate number of cubic yards of the tailings stated thereon.
- (e) A certificate, signed by the surveyor, and dated, that posts as required by clause 2 of these Regulations, were standing at the time of survey, must be indorsed on the plan.

OBJECTIONS.

(9) Any person desiring to object to the granting of any application may do so by forwarding to or lodging with the Secretary, within 21 days from the marking out of the site, a notice in writing setting out his name and address, and the particulars of his objections, together with the sum of Three pounds which shall be subject to such order as the Minister may think fit.

(10) The Minister may, should he think it advisable, refer any application to the Warden to hold an inquiry and to make a report and recommendation in connexion therewith; and thereupon the procedure provided by the Regulations relating to Gold Mining leases with respect to opposed mining lease applications, shall be followed as nearly as the circumstances will permit.

THE LICENCE.

(11) The licence may be for any term not exceeding Five years, and the annual rent shall be One penny for every hundred cubic yards or fractional part of tailings; provided, however, that no licence shall be granted for a less annual rent than Ten shillings. The licence shall be in the form set out in Schedule "B," or as near thereto as the circumstances of the case will permit.

(12) The licence shall be subject to the conditions to be contained therein, and if at any time there shall be a breach of or non-compliance with such conditions the Governor in Council may order that the licence shall be forfeited, and a notification of such forfeiture shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and thereupon all right and title of the licensee to or in respect of the tailings or site for which the licence shall have been granted shall cease.

TRANSFER OF LICENCES.

(13) The interest in any licence may be transferred with the consent of the Minister and upon payment to the Secretary of a fee of ten shillings and lodgment at the Secretary's office of an application for transfer signed by the transferor in the presence of a Justice of the Peace who shall affix his signature thereto as a witness; and the transferee shall be subject to these Regulations as fully as if the licence had been originally granted to such transferee.

(14) These Regulations shall come into force at the end of 21 days after the same shall have been published in the *Government Gazette*; but they shall not apply to or in any way affect any application for a licence made and not determined at the time of the coming into operation of these Regulations, but such application may be carried on and determined as if these Regulations had not been made.

SCHEDULE B.

FORM OF LICENCE.

I (name and title of Governor or Governor in Council or officer administering the Government), of the State of Victoria, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty King Edward the VII., hereby grant to of in the said State, full licence and authority to remove from off the land or to treat thereon all the tailings now lying on the surface of the land (subject nevertheless to such rights interests and authorities as may be lawfully subsisting therein at the date of these presents) shown on the plan at the back hereof.

And this licence shall be in force for a term of years, unless the same be forfeited or rendered void, and shall be subject to the restrictions, limitations, and conditions expressed in the Mines Acts, and any regulations for the time being in force and in the memorandum indorsed hereon or written or printed at the back hereof.

In witness hereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this day of , in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred

MEMORANDUM (TO BE PRINTED AT BACK).

(1) This licence only gives to the licensee the right to use the surface of the land, and then only for the purpose for which the licence has been granted, and for no other purpose whatsoever.

(2) The licensee will not be permitted to assign or to grant a sub-licence in respect of this licence or to part with his interest herein, without the consent in writing of the Minister for the time being having charge of the Mines Department.

(3) Not fewer than men shall be continuously employed during the usual hours of labour.

(4) The yearly rent shall be the sum of and before the licence is delivered to the licensee he shall pay to a Receiver of Revenue the first year's rent, and afterwards the succeeding payments to that officer on the day of in each succeeding year during the currency of this licence, such payments to be due and payable in advance.

(5) The licensee shall erect and keep erected during the said term posts not less than three feet high above the ground and painted blue with the number of the licence painted legibly thereon, and such posts shall define the boundary line and angles of the said land.

(6) The licence may be forfeited for any breach or neglect of the above conditions.

(7) The Governor may grant gold mining or mineral leases of the land, the subject of this licence, and in that event the licensee shall carry on the work of treating or removing the tailings in such a manner so as not to unreasonably interfere with the working by the lessee under any such lease.

SCHEDULE C.

1. Mill owners shall keep a book, and shall enter therein all loads delivered at their mills, by whom delivered, date, measurement, and place logs were obtained, the said book to be open for inspection during working hours, and a copy of any entry therein to be evidence in any court.

The price must include delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

For police stations, excepting the depot, the successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond, for the sum of £5 per horse per station, and for the depot and other stations a bond based on one-quarter of the total amount of the tender accepted within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts where the sum stated in the bond is £50 and upwards, and one surety where the sum stated is under £50.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or oaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality. As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

2. The quantities stated in the schedule are only approximate, and the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned. Should new telegraph stations be formed or additional horses be required at any station, the contractor will be required to supply the extra forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, and also forage for any extra horses that may be at any time stabled at the depot for police purposes, at the same rates.

4. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

5. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

6. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.

7. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue to either party by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, but he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 4.

8. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.

9. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

10. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

11. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.
