## QUARANTINE GROUND FOR TREATMENT OF BONES, ETC.

## COUNCIL OF LEGAL EDUCATION.

## RULES FOR THE ADMISSION OF BARRISTERS AND SOLICITORS.

THE TWENTY-EIGHTH DAY OF NOVEMBER, 1905.

IN pursuance of the authority conferred by the *Legal Practitioners Reciprocity Act* 1903, the Council of Legal Education hereby makes the following rules for the admission of Barristers and Solicitors to practise in Victoria:—

1. In Part I., Division I, Rule 5, paragraph (a) shall be repealed and the following substituted therefor:—

(a) He must before presenting himself for any of the examinations mentioned in (b) have passed an examination or examinations which would entitle him, according to the Statutes and Regulations of the University of Melbourne, to enter for the examination for the first year of the course for the Degree of Bachelor of Laws.

2. Every person before entering into Articles must produce to the Secretary of the Board of Examiners either Certificates of having passed the examination or examinations mentioned in Rule 5 (a) and the examinations in the Law of Property in land and conveyancing and the Law of Contracts and personal property or a diploma or testamur of the Degree of Bachelor of Laws in the University of Melbourne, and must lodge with the said Secretary copies of such Certificates or such diploma or testamur.

3. In Part I., Division I, Rule 6 shall be repealed, and the following substituted therefor:—

(6) Articles of Clerkship, together with an affidavit or affidavits of the due execution thereof, shall be filed in the Office of the Prothonotary within six months of the execution thereof. 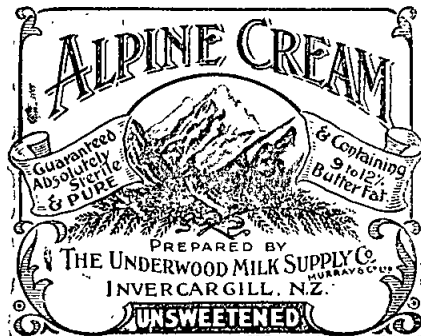

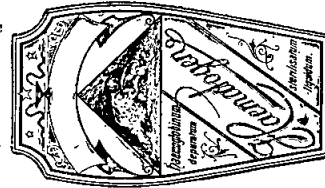

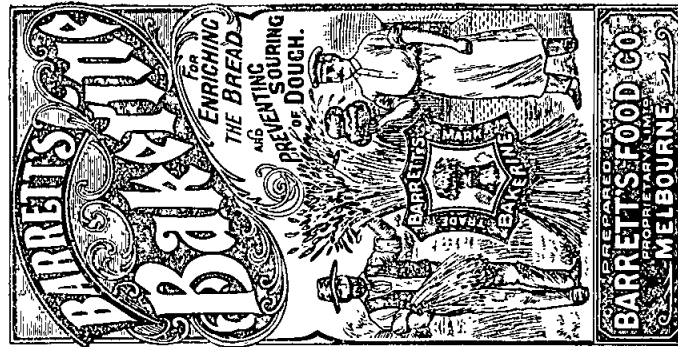

A By-law of the Council of the City of Hawthorn, made under the *Health Act 1890*, and numbered Fifty-three.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, the Council of the City of Hawthorn, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the said City, hereby makes this By-law, and orders and directs as follows:—

1. By-law number Forty-three of the said Council is hereby altered by the rescission of clause Twelve of the said By-law, and the substitution of the following clause for the said clause Twelve, namely:—

12. The occupier of any house, building, tenement, or premises within the City of Hawthorn shall cause to be provided and kept within the fences or walls enclosing such house, building, tenement, or premises a covered receptacle not exceeding Four cubic feet in contents, constructed of galvanized iron properly rivetted and soldered, so as to be water-tight, with handles thereto, so that the same may, with the contents thereof, when there are any, be readily and conveniently movable by the public scavenger or such other person or persons as the said Council may appoint for that purpose; and such occupier shall cause all dust, ashes, or other household refuse produced, collected, or accumulated on any such premises to be from time to time placed in such receptacle, and such occupier shall cause such receptacle to be kept covered and in a dry and cleanly condition, and on the day or days appointed by the said Council for the removal thereof such occupier shall cause such receptacle to be placed in the yard of such house, building, tenement, or premises at a distance not exceeding Ten feet from the entrance to such yard from a street, lane, or right-of-way, so that the contents of such receptacle may be readily and conveniently discharged and removed by the public scavenger or such other person or persons as the said Council may appoint for that purpose, and no such occupier shall place any such receptacle or permit the same to be placed in or on any street, lane, or right-of-way.

SHIRE OF NORTH OVENS

BY-LAW No. 13.

A By-law of the Shire of North Ovens, made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1903*, section 107, sub-section 17, and the *Health Act 1890*, and the *Health Act 1900*, for regulating the trade of cow-keepers, dairymen, and purveyors of milk.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of North Ovens order as follows:—

1. By-law No. 10 of the Shire of North Ovens shall be and is hereby repealed.

2. By-law No. 22 and any other By-law of the United Shire of Beechworth, so far as the same is in force in that portion of the Shire of North Ovens severed from

the United Shire of Beechworth, and annexed to and now forming part of the Shire of North Ovens, shall be and is hereby repealed.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have the force of law throughout the whole of the Shire of North Ovens.

4. Every person carrying on the trade of cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk within the Shire of North Ovens at the time this By-law shall come into operation shall, on or before the 31st day of December, 1905, and in every subsequent year, so long as he carries on such trade between the first day of October and the first day of December, register himself with the Council of the said shire by signing and lodging with the secretary of the said shire or with such other officer of the shire as may be duly appointed for that purpose, an application in the form set out in the first schedule hereto, and paying the fees hereinafter provided.

5. Every person who shall at any time after this By-law comes into operation, commence or first carry on the trade of cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk within the said shire, shall, within two months from the date he shall so commence or first carry on such trade, register himself in manner provided in clause 3 hereof, and shall, so long as he carries on such trade, renew such registration in each subsequent year, as provided by the said clause.

6. If any person carrying on the trade of cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk within the said shire, having registered himself as herein provided, shall, after such registration at any time during the year in respect of which he is registered, keep a number of cows greater than the number registered by him, either at any one or more places within the said shire, he shall, within 14 days after having first kept such cows, register such excess number in manner provided in clause 4 hereof.

7. If any person carrying on the trade of cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk within the said shire, shall at any time in any year after he is hereby required to register the same, keep any cows within the said shire, either at any one or more places without having registered the same, he shall be guilty of a breach of this By-law.

8. Every person applying to be registered in accordance with clause 4 hereof shall, on making such application, pay the fees set forth in the second schedule hereto.

9. Every registration as aforesaid made by any person, notwithstanding the time of the year at which same is made, shall be deemed to be in respect of the year ending on the 30th day of September next following the date of such registration.

10. Upon receipt of every such application and fee the secretary or other duly appointed officer shall indorse such application with a memo. of the date upon which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same and enter the particulars on the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose.

11. In the interpretation of this By-law the word "person" shall be deemed to include one or more persons, whether male or female, and shall include a corporation.

12. Every person guilty of any breach of this By-law or any of its provisions, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10, nor less than 5s., or to a penalty not exceeding £5 nor less than 5s. for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

#### WODONGA WATERWORKS TRUST. REGULATIONS.

THE Commissioners of the Wodonga Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following Regulations:—

The following are the charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by this Trust within the Wodonga Waterworks Trust, that is to say:—

1. In all cases where a meter has to be used, the charge shall be at the rate of One shilling and threepence for every 1,000 gallons, except where otherwise provided.

2. For buildings in course of erection to which water is supplied, the charge shall be One pound per centum on the amount of the contract for such building, except the iron and wood work,

3. That for all stand-pipes used for the purpose of watering gardens and other purposes other than purely household purposes by ratepayers, the charge shall be Ten shillings per annum per pipe. Provided that water for any garden exceeding the limit of 66 feet by 50 feet, or 3,300 square feet, must be supplied by meter, in which case the charge shall be at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons.

4. A special charge of Two pounds per annum shall be made for water supplied to St. Joseph's Convent and School in connexion therewith.

5. All Government buildings not connected with the Victorian Railway Department and supplied with water by the Trust, shall be charged a fixed sum of Three pounds each per annum.

6. All steam-engines using water must be supplied through a meter.

7. Rateable consumers may at their option be supplied by meter, in which case they may have as many pipes as they may see fit, provided that all water used by each such consumer shall pass through the meter, and each such consumer shall be charged at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons, until a sum has been reached equal to the amount of his rates; and at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons for all water used over and above that sum. Provided that no such consumer shall pay less than the amount of his rates, although he may not use sufficient water at One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons to equal the amount of his rates.

That the foregoing charges be paid in half-yearly payments on the 30th day of June and the 31st day of December in each and every year.

#### Long Lake Water Supply Act 1902.

#### RATING REGULATION BY THE BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS FOR THE YEAR 1905.

WHEREAS by the *Long Lake Water Supply Act 1902*, No. 1808, it is provided that for the purpose of supplying water to the area as such area is defined by section 2 of the said Act, for stock and domestic purposes, it shall be lawful for the Board of Land and Works, out of such moneys as may be legally available for such purpose, and at such times, and in such manner, and subject to such directions as the Governor in Council may order, to construct all such works at Long Lake as may be necessary, including main distributory channels therefrom.

And whereas by section 2 of the said Act it is provided that the word "area" means so much of the mallee country and mallee border as defined in the *Land Act 1901*, containing about six hundred square miles, in the county of Tatchera, as can be supplied with water for stock and domestic purposes from the main distributory channels, and as may from time to time be defined by an order of the Governor in Council, published in the *Government Gazette*.

And whereas under date the 21st July, 1903, the Governor in Council directed and ordered the Board of Land and Works to construct certain specified works at Long Lake, including main distributory channels therefrom, and further declared and described certain channels to be main distributory channels.

And whereas the Governor in Council, under date 21st July, 1903, defined by certain boundaries the area capable of being supplied with water for stock and domestic purposes from the said declared main distributory channels, particulars whereof were published in the *Government Gazette* of 29th July, 1903.

And whereas by section 8 of the aforesaid Act it is provided that—

(1) The Board of Land and Works shall in each and every year make and levy a rate upon all land within the area for the purpose of meeting expenditure connected with supplying water to the area and maintaining the works in an efficient state.

(2) Such rate shall be made and levied in such manner as may be prescribed in regulations hereunder, but shall not be made and levied until the works are so far completed as to render a supply available and ready for distribution.

And whereas the aforesaid works were, prior to 31st December, 1903, so far completed as to render a supply of water available and ready for distribution,



Now therefore the Board of Land and Works doth hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the aforesaid Act, and for the purpose hereinbefore mentioned, make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

A rate of Twopence per acre upon all lands situated within the area as defined by the Governor in Council, under date the 21st July, 1903, is hereby made for the year commencing 1st January, 1905, and ending 31st December, 1905.

Such rate shall be due and payable by every person who occupies any land within the area as defined, or, if there be no occupier, then by the owner of such land, and such rate shall be due and payable on the 18th December, 1905.

I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of provisions contained in Part I. of the Land Act 1901, do hereby order as follows, viz:—

The Proclamation bearing date the 10th October, 1898, by which it was declared that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should dig or remove stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth on or from the Crown lands comprised within the boundaries of the town of Casterton, is hereby rescinded so far only as it affects the removal of sand from the bed of the Glenelg River.—(05.C.20975.)

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this fifth day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and five, and in the fifth year of His Majesty's reign.

The price must include delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

For police stations, excepting the depot, the successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for the sum of £5 per horse per station, and for the depot and other stations a bond based on one-quarter of the total amount of the tender accepted within ten days after the acceptance is notified. 1. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station.
3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, and also forage for any extra horses that may be at any time stabled at the depot for police purposes, at the same rates.
4. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.
5. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.
6. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.
7. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.
11. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.

## SHIRE OF ALEXANDRA.

## BY-LAW No. 6.

A By-law of the Shire of Alexandra, made under section 635 of the *Local Government Act* 1903, and numbered 6, for regulating the market place and the buildings and pens therein, and for preventing nuisances or obstructions therein, or in the immediate approaches thereto, for fixing the days and hours during each day on which the market shall be held, for licensing yards and premises for the sale of cattle within the municipal district, and for fixing the dues to be paid for such licences.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1903, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Alexandra order as follows:—

1. The market shall be known as the Alexandra Corporation Sale Yards, and shall be held at the place and in the buildings and yards appointed to be used for the purposes of such market, situate in the township of Alexandra, and the said market shall be used for the sale of cattle.

2. The said market shall be open daily between the hours of 8 o'clock in the forenoon and 7 o'clock in the afternoon for the reception, delivery, and sale of cattle; and the market shall be held on Tuesday, the 6th day of January, 1906, and on Thursday, the 25th day of January, 1906, and subsequently on every second Tuesday and fourth Thursday in each month. Provided that in the event of such second Tuesday or fourth Thursday falling on Christmas Day or on a Public Holiday, or in the event of any special cause rendering it necessary or desirable, the council may substitute and appoint some other day in lieu thereof for the holding of the said market.

3. That the rents to be paid by any person or persons or auctioneering firms using the sale yards for the purpose of selling cattle by auction shall be One pound per day. Provided, however, that in the event of two or more persons or auctioneering firms using the sale yards for the purpose of selling cattle by auction on the same day, the rent shall be Fifteen shillings each per day.

4. No person shall cause any riot or disturbance, or be drunk or disorderly, or curse or swear, or use any indecent language, or be guilty of any indecent conduct within the said market, or in or upon the immediate approaches thereto.

5. That in the event of two or more persons or auctioneering firms offering cattle for sale by auction on any market day, such persons or auctioneering firms shall draw lots for the order of precedence in selling. The sale of fat cattle shall commence at the hour of One o'clock p.m., and immediately after all fat cattle have been offered for sale the person or persons or auctioneering firms having sales of store cattle shall, in the same order of precedence, proceed to offer such store cattle for sale. Provided, however, that in offering fat and store cattle for sale each person or persons or auctioneering firm shall be allowed time for selling such fat and store cattle on the basis of 200 head of cattle per hour, and no person or persons or auctioneering firm shall be allowed to occupy a longer period than one hour at a time, and at the expiration of one hour shall give way to the person or persons or auctioneering firm next in order of precedence.

6. No two persons or auctioneering firms shall sell or offer for sale by public auction at the same time any cattle in the market.

7. All cattle must be removed out of the market before Twelve o'clock noon on the day following the day of sale.

8. The council may license any yards or premises within the Shire of Alexandra for the sale of cattle on such days only as have not been proclaimed market days, and the annual licence-fee shall be the sum of Five shillings per annum for each yard or premises so licensed.

9. Any person or persons guilty of any wilful act or breach or default of this by-law, or any of the provisions thereof, shall, on conviction before two or more justices, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

The foregoing by-law, being by-law No. 6 of the Shire of Alexandra, was agreed to by the council of the said shire on the sixth day of November, One thousand nine hundred and five. And confirmed by the said council on the fourth day of December, One thousand nine hundred and five.

4. The sum of Two shillings and sixpence sterling shall be the amount of the annual licence-fee to be paid for the issue of such licence authorizing an auctioneer to sell in the said Corporation Sale Yards, provided that the fee for such licence shall only be in proportion to the period for which such licence shall be issued to the period at which it shall expire, and every such licence shall expire on the thirty-first day of December in each year.

5. No auctioneer shall exercise his vocation within the Corporation Sale Yards without such consent, or otherwise than in accordance with the terms hereof.

6. Any person or persons guilty of any wilful act or breach or default of this by-law, or any of the provisions thereof, shall, on conviction before two or more justices, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
