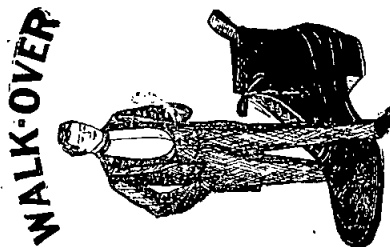

The distribution of the vote will be made one month after the above-mentioned date, when a sum equal to the amount of the prize money awarded and paid away for horticultural exhibits will be allotted to each society having a claim, and be made payable to the treasurer thereof, provided that the sums claimed do not exceed in the whole Two hundred and eighty-nine pounds ten shillings, and if they do exceed this amount then they will be reduced *pro rata*, and the allotment made accordingly.

3. No society whose expenditure in prizes between the 1st January, 1904, and the 31st December, 1904, amounts in the total to less than Twenty-five pounds shall be entitled to participate in the vote.

4. A sum not exceeding Ten pounds ten shillings may be paid out of the above vote to the Royal Horticultural Society for Grand Champion prizes, to be awarded at said society's show in 1905.

**REGULATIONS** for the distribution of the sum of Two thousand pounds (£2,000) granted by Parliament to Agricultural Societies, 1904-5.

1. Each society shall furnish to the Secretary for Agriculture, on or before the 1st March, 1905, a statement in the form marked A, which must be verified by statutory declaration in the form marked E.

2. On receipt of the above-mentioned statement, so verified, the Minister of Agriculture may cause to be paid to the treasurer of each society a sum equal to one-half of the amount shown to have been awarded and paid away in prizes not exceeding £25 each (except for the exhibits mentioned in the statement above referred to, and such other exhibits the Minister may consider unsuitable), on condition that this sum does not exceed the amount raised by members' subscriptions and private donations; and, if it do exceed the same, that it be in that case reduced to a sum equal to the amount so raised.

3. A sum not exceeding One hundred and ten pounds may be paid out of the above vote for medals awarded as Grand National prizes at the Shepparton Agricultural Show.

4. A sum not exceeding Fifty-one pounds may be paid out of above vote for medals awarded as champion prizes for poultry at the Hamilton, Tatura, Nhill, Port Fairy, and Korat Agricultural Shows.

5. If the sums claimable be in excess of the sum of One thousand eight hundred and thirty-two pounds (£1,832), they shall be reduced *pro rata*.

6. No society located within 20 miles of any other society shall be entitled to participate in the vote unless the sum awarded and paid away in prizes by such society as hereinbefore specified amounts in the total to One hundred pounds at least.

7. The Royal Agricultural Society shall not participate in the vote for the year 1904-5, but a sum not exceeding Seven pounds may be paid for medals awarded at that Society's Show.

## INSTRUCTIONS.

1. ## SHIRE OF PHILLIP ISLAND AND WOOLAMAI.

A By-law of the Shire of Phillip Island and Woolamai, made under the *Health Act 1890*, and numbered 8, for double pan service at Cowes, Phillip Island.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Phillip Island and Woolamai order as follows:—

1. Every closet within the portion of the shire herein-after described shall be furnished with a double pan service, and such pans shall be furnished with air-tight lids. The pans will be provided by the council and shall be removed for cleansing at times authorized by the council, at least once every week.

## REMOVAL OF NIGHT-SOIL.

2. The occupier of every tenement within the said area in which any night-soil pan is in use shall pay to the council of the Shire of Phillip Island and Woolamai for each pan an annual charge of Twenty-six shillings for the removal of the said night-soil.

3. The amount of the annual charge may be altered from time to time by resolution of the council.

4. All closets to be hereafter erected in the said area shall be constructed to the satisfaction of the council.

5. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises in the said area shall cause to be kept in every closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

6. No householder or occupier shall contract with any person or persons for the removal of night-soil, or permit or cause same to be removed by any person or persons save and except the person or persons in that behalf to be appointed by the said council, and any such pan or pans shall be removed and emptied alternately as the said council directs.

7. Extent of application of By-law:—

This By-law, No. 8, shall apply to and have operation in that portion of the Phillip Island Riding of the Shire of Phillip Island and Woolamai within the boundaries described hereunder, namely:—

The area bounded by lines commencing at a point on Western Port Bay on the beach of Phillip Island in a line with eastern boundary of allotment 10 of section 10, of allotments 10 and 20 of section 9, and allotments 98 and 97, township of Cowes, parish of Phillip Island; thence south by the said boundaries of said allotments to the south-east angle of allotment 97; thence west along the south boundaries of allotments 97, 95, 94, 90, 89, 85, 84, and 77 to the south-west angle of allotment 77; thence north along the western boundaries of allotments 77, 78, and 79 to the beach of Western Port Bay; thence along the said beach easterly to the commencing point.

8. Every person committing a breach of any one of the provisions contained in this By-law, No. 8, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty or sum not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or if such breach be a continuing act or default shall forfeit and pay a penalty or sum not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such offence shall be committed or continued.

REGULATIONS OF THE BALLARAT WATER COMMISSIONERS.

## BY-LAW No. 6.

IN pursuance of the *Water Act* 1890, and of every other right, title, or power in any wise enabling it in that behalf, the Corporation styled The Ballarat Water Commissioners doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

1. Visitors will be allowed access to the Gong Gong and Kirk's Reserves only between the hours of sunrise and sunset of each day.

2. Public conveyances or vehicles used for hire will be permitted to enter the reserve known as Kirk's for the

purpose of picking up or setting down passengers, but must retire to such stand or portion of the reserve as may be set apart for such conveyances, or as may be pointed out by the caretaker or other employés of the Commissioners, and in no case and under no pretext will the owners or persons in charge of such vehicles be permitted to ply for hire from any other stand or place within the reserves.

3. Private or public vehicles conveying visitors will be permitted to enter or pass through such portions of the water reserves as the Commissioners may from time to time approve, but drivers of such vehicles and visitors will be held personally responsible for the properly closing and fastening of any gate or gates opened or passed through by them.

4. No fires shall be lighted in any part of the Water Reserves, except in such places as are specially provided for the purpose, and in the event of injury or damage being done to the works, buildings, fences, plantations, trees, shrubs, timber, grass, or other property of the Commissioners by or through the lighting of any fire upon any lands belonging to the Commissioners, the person or persons causing the same will be held responsible for the same.

5. No person shall wash utensils, cloths, or clothes, or throw any live or dead animal, stones, sticks, empty bottles, tins, rubbish, refuse, debris, or thing of any kind whatsoever, in or into any of the reservoirs, aqueducts, channels, creeks, or other water supply works belonging to or under the control of the Commissioners.

6. No person shall commit a nuisance or deposit offensive matter on the reserves, or do any act or thing whereby the water is or may be defiled, polluted, obstructed, or otherwise interfered with.

7. No person shall swim, walk, wade, or stand in the water in the reservoirs or in the aqueducts, races, channels, or other works in connexion with the water supply.

8. No person shall enter or stand upon or within the lines of high water of any of the reservoirs, or shall stand, walk, or run up or down the outer or inner slopes of the dams or reservoir embankments.

9. No person shall angle for fish in or upon or about any of the reserves or reservoirs or waters under the control of the Commissioners, or remove any fish therefrom without first obtaining a licence from the Commissioners in such form and subject to such Regulations as the Commissioners shall adopt, and have approved by the Governor in Council.

10. No person shall shoot or snare wild fowl or carry fire arms in or upon or about any of the reserves or reservoirs or waters under the control of the Commissioners, or remove any wild fowl therefrom.

11. All dogs found upon lands reserved for water supply purposes shall be liable to be destroyed.

12. No person shall remove any timber, firewood, trees, shrubs, grass, stone, gravel, sand, earth, or other material from the lands vested in or under the control of the Commissioners, or erect any dwelling, tent, booth, or other structure thereon, or sell any refreshments or other commodities within the reserves without the consent, in writing, of the Commissioners.

13. No person shall enter or remain in any of the reserves or upon any of the lands under the control of the Commissioners who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

14. Each and every person who enters upon the lands vested in the Commissioners does so at his or her own risk.

15. The Ballarat Water Commissioners will not hold themselves responsible for any accident arising from any cause whatsoever that may occur or happen to any visitor to the water reserves and works.

16. If any person commit a breach of any of the above Regulations, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

17. From and after the date of the approval by the Governor in Council of the foregoing Regulations, the Regulations made and adopted by the said Corporation, styled The Ballarat Water Commissioners, on the twelfth day of July, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, and approved by the Administrator of the Government in Council on the twenty-ninth day of July, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

# BAIRNSDALE IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—REGULATION No. 18.

THE Commissioners of the Bairnsdale Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance of the power conferred by the Water Acts, hereby make the following Regulations for determining the rates and charges to be paid in respect of water supplied or available for supply by the Trust within the Urban Division, and further purposes, during the calendar year 1905:—

No. 1. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands, houses, and tenements situated in the Urban Division of the Trust area shall pay in respect of water supplied or available for supply to such lands, houses, or tenements situated on any street in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which lands, houses, or tenements, if not on such streets, are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1905, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1905, and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates:—

- (a) On every house or tenement of Twenty-two pounds rateable annual value or under, Twenty shillings per annum.
- (b) On every house or tenement above the annual rateable value of Twenty-two pounds, a rate of One shilling for every One pound per annum of municipal valuation.
- (c) On all vacant allotments of land under the annual rateable value of Twenty-two pounds, a rate of One shilling for every One pound per annum of municipal valuation.
- (d) For water supplied from the wharf at Bairnsdale for shipping, or any other purposes, a minimum charge of Sixpence per 100 gallons, or Sixpence for any fractional part thereof, and a minimum charge of Three shillings per 1,000 gallons, or Three shillings for any fractional part thereof exceeding 500 gallons, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust.
- (e) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust or water supply under terms of sub-section (g) of section 1 of this Regulation), One shilling per 1,000 gallons.
- (f) Water supply to gardens, nurseries, manufactories, aerated water and cordial makers, brewers, bakers, butchers, livery and coach-horse stables, hotel premises, and for any other than domestic purposes, may be charged for by measurement at the discretion of the Trust.
- (g) For water supplied to Government departments, cricket clubs, bowling greens, boating clubs, show-yards, cattle yards, and recreation reserves, shall be charged by measurement at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than 30,000 gallons per annum.
- (h) Private water troughs will be charged for at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each, except when, in opinion of the Trust, a meter shall be necessary.
- (i) For water supplied to gardens, and for any other than domestic purposes, will be charged for at the rate of Seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.) per annum, the quantity of water so used not to exceed 12,000 gallons per annum; a meter to be fixed at the expense of the ratepayer when, in opinion of the Trust, the same shall be necessary.
- (j) For water supplied for new buildings being erected, at the rate of One pound (£1) per cent. on the contract price for labour and material of all stone, brick, concrete, and plastering work, or any other work where water is used, and to be arranged for before the work is commenced.

2. The rates and charges for water, and all sums due to the Trust under this Regulation, shall be paid by and be recoverable from the owner of the premises, or the occupier or person requiring, receiving, or using the supply of water.

3. The said rates and charges shall be payable in advance by equal instalments on the 1st day of January, 1905, and on the 1st day of July, 1905 (except in the case of water supplied by meter or by agreement, which shall be payable at such time or times as may be determined by the Trust from time to time), and the first payment shall be made at the time when the owner or occupier shall become liable to pay the rates and charges for the supply of water as hereinbefore mentioned.

In the construction of this Regulation the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Bairnsdale Irrigation and Water Supply Trust.

WHEREAS by section 208 of the *Land Act 1901* power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein prescribed: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following additions to, and amendment of, the Regulations made on 8th January, 1902, and 2nd September, 1902 (that is to say):—

*Land Act 1901.*

*Additions to, and amendment of, the Regulations made on 8th January, 1902, and 2nd September, 1902.*

PART IV.—SAWMILL AND TIMBER LICENCES.—STATE FORESTS, TIMBER RESERVES, AND OTHER CROWN LANDS.

Timber, other than redgum, in the State Forest within the parishes of Nayook, Nayook West, Noojee East, and Tooronga, shall, from 1st January, 1905, be sold under special permit and royalty only; but licences current shall remain in force until their expiration by effluxion of time, and contracts now existing for the supply of timber shall not be affected by this Regulation.

The conditions for the cutting and removal of timber approved by His Excellency the Governor in Council on 2nd September, 1902 (*Gazette*, 10th September, 1902, page 3744), for the Victoria State Forest, shall apply to the above parishes.—(Corr. F.42653.)

REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE  
ARARAT COMMON.

**I**N pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons, made by the Governor in Council on the 8th day of January, 1902, the Borough Council of Ararat, having drafted the following Regulations for the management of the Ararat Common, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such common:—

## REGULATIONS.

1. In the construction and for the purposes of these Regulations, the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oven, steers, horses, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules, and the words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats.

2. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licences, or carriers' licences, and farmers residing within a distance of five miles from the common, may respectively depasture thereon four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on the common one additional head of large cattle or the equivalent in small cattle for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

3. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the first day of October and the first day of April in every year:—For every cow, heifer, ox, or steer, 5s. per annum; for every horse, mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, or mule, 7s. per annum; for every goat, 1s. 6d. per annum; for every sheep, 3s. 6d. per annum. Progeny under the age of six (6) months of stock legally depasturing on the common, free.

4. No person shall depasture on the common stock of which he is not the *bona fide* owner.

5. During the months of October and April in each year, or as soon thereafter as possible, all owners of stock on the common shall be required to muster such stock in their own yards or in some other convenient place, to be determined by the managers, within forty-eight (48) hours after receiving notice, in writing, so to do, and to assist in branding them with the common brand, horses only being exempt from branding.

6. Previous to the depasturing of stock the owners thereof shall register the same, with brands and descriptions, in a book to be kept for the purpose, and such registration shall be renewed half-yearly, and shall be made previous to the branding of such stock.

7. Holders of licences shall be at liberty to substitute stock for others removed from the common during the currency of their licences by giving notice, in writing, to the herdsman, showing the brands and number of stock so substituted, and a record of such notice shall be kept by the herdsman.

8. All stock depastured on the common, if not registered, branded, and duly paid for, shall be liable to be impounded by the herdsman.

9. No entire animal shall be depastured on the common without the written permission of the managers.

10. No licence shall be transferred without the written permission of the managers.

11. When any animal is affected with any contagious disease, the owner of such animal shall remove the same from the common within twelve hours after receiving notice so to do from the managers or herdsman, and such animal shall not again be put on the common without the special permission, in writing, of the managers.

12. After due notice has been given the managers shall, at the owner's expense, be at liberty to remove all diseased animals from the common, and, also at the owner's expense, to remove, bury, or destroy all dead carcasses found on the common.

13. No person shall cart away water from any dam on the common without the permission, in writing, of the managers.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

# REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWN OF DARLEY.

WE, William Henry McFarlane, J.P., Thomas Cain, J.P., James Robinson, James Kerr, James Cosgrove, James Hanson, Edward Bernard Manning, Michael Cain, and David Robertson, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Recreation in the town of Darley, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act 1901* :—

## REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.
6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence, and every person who, knowingly and wilfully, offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown Lands, or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

### DUNOLLY DISTRICT HOSPITAL.

#### REVISED RULES.

(6). For dealing with any other business brought forward by the Committee of Management or by a contributor or life governor, provided 14 clear days' notice in writing to the secretary has been given and the nature of the business is fully disclosed.

6. At all general meetings annual contributors of £1 shall have one vote, and for every £1 additional one vote—provided no person shall have more than three votes. Life governors, in accordance with Rule 37, shall have one vote. Contributors or life governors may either vote at all general or special meetings in person or by proxy, such proxy being a contributor or life governor duly qualified.

9. Every firm or partnership or banking company, on becoming a contributor of £1 or upwards, shall exercise its privileges through some member or officer of same. Provided in case of a banking company such company shall nominate the officer through whom it desires to exercise its privileges.

11. No person shall vote at any meeting of contributors while he is a salaried officer of the institution.

12. All life governors elected to the title prior to the gazetted of these rules shall be entitled to all privileges they have hitherto enjoyed.

#### Constitution.

13. The governing committee in whom is vested the powers and authorities of this corporation shall consist of fifteen contributors, exclusive of ex-officio members under Rule 40.

14. The fifteen contributors elected as the governing committee shall have equal powers and privileges, and for the purpose of election shall be divided as follows, ten ordinary and five extraordinary members.

15. On the second or last Thursday in the month of July in every year, one-third part of the ordinary members of the committee shall go out of office, but may, nevertheless, be re-elected; and the persons who shall go out of office shall be those who have been the longest in office without re-election; or where two or more shall have been in office the same length of time, then those who shall go out of office shall be determined by lot.

16. At the annual meeting in July five contributors shall be appointed to act as extraordinary members of committee. Such extraordinary members shall have power to attend and vote at all committee meetings, but their seats shall not become vacant through non-attendance, as prescribed for ordinary members by Rule 19.

18. The president, vice-president, treasurer, honorary medical officers, and auditors shall retire annually from their respective offices, but shall, nevertheless, be eligible for re-election; and the president, vice-president, and treasurer shall be elected to office by members of committee at their first monthly meeting after the annual meeting in July, and the election shall proceed by ballot, or in such manner as the majority at such monthly meeting or adjournment thereof may decide. Any failure to elect a president, vice-president, or treasurer under this rule shall not invalidate the election of such officer if made at a subsequent meeting.

19. If any member of the committee shall die, or resign by letter under his hand, addressed to the chairman of the committee, or become insolvent, or compound with his creditors, or be convicted of any treason, felony, or misdemeanor, or be absent from four consecutive meetings from the committee, his office shall become vacant, and the remaining members of the committee may declare his office vacant, and temporarily appoint thereto some contributor to such institution until the next annual meeting, when the person thus temporarily appointed shall retire, as one of those who, by the provisions of this Act, are required to go out of office.—Act 1099, sec. 15.

#### Committee of Management.

22. No person shall be considered eligible for election at the annual meeting unless he, or some one duly authorized on his behalf, shall have given notice, in writing, to the secretary fourteen days before the date of such meeting of his intention to stand for such election as member of committee. Provided always that in the event of sufficient nominations not being sent to supply all the offices it shall be competent for the annual meeting to dispense with the above conditions and to fill up any vacancies which may exist after the formal nominations have been disposed of. All elections when contested shall be by ballot.

27. Sub-committees may be appointed from time to time, at the discretion of the Committee of Management, and the president shall be, ex-officio, a member of all committees.

28. At the first meeting of the committee in each year, after the annual general meeting, the following sub-committees shall be appointed, viz. :—

(1) A visiting committee, to consist of three members for each month in the year.

(2) A finance committee, to consist of three members.

28A. The visiting committee shall have power to suspend at any time all paid officers or servants of the institution for non-observance of rules, misbehaviour, or neglect of duty, and shall, at the next monthly meeting of Committee of Management, report the cause of such suspension, and the Committee of Management may confirm or remove suspension whichever course they may deem necessary.

#### Order of Proceedings.

34. No proposition to enact or amend a by-law, or to frame or vary any rule, shall be entertained unless one month's previous notice shall have been given of such; and no motion to rescind a resolution shall be submitted within three months after such resolution has been passed, unless one month's notice of the same be given, and such motion be passed by an absolute majority of the committee present.

36. No member of the committee shall vote or take part in the discussion of any matter in or before the committee in which he shall directly or indirectly, by himself or his partners, have any pecuniary interest.

#### Privileges of Life Governors, Contributors, and Others.

37. Benefactors of £25 and upwards, and contributors of £15 and upwards, shall be entitled to be made life governors. The word "benefaction" shall mean a sum of money raised from the public by church or other collections, by fêtes and entertainments, or contributed by mining or other companies, societies, or associations, bodies under the Local Government Act, or a bequest from the estate of a deceased person. The nomination of benefactors as life governors to be made by the minister or governing body of churches, the collector or collectors (other than paid collectors), the committee of the said fêtes or entertainments, or the giver or givers thereof, the directors of mining or other companies, societies,

or associations, the councils of the Local Government bodies, and executors of a deceased person respectively. The word "contribution" shall mean a personal gift. If the accommodation of the hospital will permit of their reception, life governors and contributors of £1 and upwards shall have the privilege of recommending patients, as follows:—Life governors, one indoor or two outdoor patients in each year; contributors, one indoor or two outdoor patients for every pound of their contributions within the year of such contribution. Any persons subscribing ten shillings in one sum shall have the privilege of recommending one outdoor patient, but shall not be entitled to vote.

37A. If any fête committee or other honorary body duly appointed by a public meeting for the purpose of raising funds for the institution should, by themselves, or through collectors appointed by them, canvass for, and obtain, cash subscriptions, and the full amount of such subscriptions is duly paid to the treasurer or to the secretary of the hospital, with a certified list of the persons subscribing, the Committee of Management may order that the names of such persons be placed upon the list of donors to the institution for the current year. Any person or persons whose name or names appear on such list shall be entitled to all rights and privileges accorded to donors of like amounts direct to the institution, as provided for in these rules.

38. Any person or persons collecting and paying in not less than £1 in one sum in any year by subscription boxes shall be allowed to recommend one indoor or two (2) outdoor patients for every pound so collected, but shall not have the right of voting by virtue of such collection.

39. Every public or corporate body which shall contribute an annual sum of £1 and upwards, shall be entitled to recommend for the current year the same number of patients as private contributors of like amount.

41. Every clergyman paying to the institution the sum of £1 or upwards from collections in his church, shall be entitled to recommend the same number of patients as private contributors of like amount, but shall not have the right to vote.

42. Any person or persons prior to the gazetting of these rules, who in the opinion of the Committee of Management, had rendered signal service to the institution, and who would have been entitled to the privileges of life governor under Rule 17, had such a rule been in force at the time, may be elected as life governor or life governors on the recommendation of the Committee of Management and confirmed by the contributors.

#### Collector.

49. The collector shall canvass for contributions such district as the Committee of Management may appoint, and shall afford clerical assistance, if called upon to do so. He shall give a receipt for every sum he receives, and keep a counterpart of such receipt in a book which shall be provided for the purpose by the committee. He shall furnish admission tickets to such contributors and others as may be entitled to them; and shall hand over to the treasurer in the first week of every month the moneys received by him during the preceding month, and at the same time supply the treasurer with a statement of the contributors, and the respective sums paid by them; and shall enter into a bond with two sureties, jointly and severally, in the sum of £150 for the due fulfilment of his office. The Committee of Management may alter, vary, or add to the duties of collector.

50. In addition to the paid collector, the Committee of Management may appoint honorary collectors if they deem such a course necessary.

#### Resident Surgeon.

62. He shall exercise close supervision over the wardsmen, nurses, and servants, and shall preserve order and sobriety, and in cases of insubordination or serious neglect of duty have power to suspend such person or persons, and shall immediately notify the secretary, in writing, of such suspension and the cause thereof, and the secretary on receiving such notice shall at the earliest date possible convene a meeting of the Visiting Committee, who may, after inquiry, confirm or remove such suspension and report their action to next monthly meeting of Committee of Management. In the event of one or more of the Visiting Committee being unable to attend on date notified, the president shall for the purposes of this rule only direct the secretary to request the attendance of one or more members of the Committee of Management and this sub-committee so constituted shall have the same powers as the Visiting Committee. In cases where suspension is ordered by the Resident Surgeon the Superintendent may temporarily employ a substitute (if necessary) pending the decision of Visiting Committee or sub-committee before-mentioned.

72. He shall make a special report of every patient who may have been two months in the hospital; and report to the committee every month the number of persons who have been received, discharged, and have died since the last report, with the number of all under treatment, and also of those considered incurable by the medical staff, to be dealt with as the committee may think fit.

#### Superintendent and Dispenser.

75. He shall have the immediate superintendence of all servants and in the absence of the Resident Surgeon of the wardsmen and nurses, and shall see that they do their duty, shall enforce order, sobriety, cleanliness, neatness, and obedience to orders on their part. In case of any misbehaviour, disobedience, or serious neglect of duty on the part of the wardsmen, nurses, or servants he shall as soon as possible report the same, in writing, to the Resident Surgeon, who shall forthwith take action as directed in Rule 62. Provided that if, in the opinion of the Resident Surgeon, the complaint is not of such a serious nature as to warrant suspension, he may stay further action for the time being, but he (Resident Surgeon) must immediately furnish the secretary with a copy of the Superintendent's complaint and a report setting forth his own views on the matter, in order that both complaint and report may be placed before the Committee of Management at their next meeting.

78. He shall not order any article required for the hospital, excepting stores and provisions, without the authority, in writing, of the Visiting Committee, or General Committee.

79. The Committee of Management may appoint any suitable person (male or female) to the position of Superintendent and dispenser, and may also vary, add to, or diminish his or her duties as they deem fit.

#### Wardsmen, Nurses, and Servants.

80. They shall live in the house, and shall not leave it except on necessary occasions. They shall not be absent for more than two hours at any one time, nor after Twelve o'clock at night without the permission of the Visiting Committee, or of the Resident Surgeon, nor shall they leave the institution during the absence of the Superintendent. They shall obey the orders of such officers, but shall not be employed in any way except in work strictly connected with the hospital.

81. The head nurse shall have the charge of and be accountable for the bedding and linen, and make an inventory of the same in a book to be kept for that purpose, in which she shall regularly enter the receipt, loss, and expenditure of each article; and she shall, in the month of June in each year, prepare and submit to the committee a statement of the stock of each article on hand, and of the probable requirements for the ensuing half-year.

83. They shall obey the orders of the Resident Surgeon, or in his absence the Superintendent, and shall behave with tenderness to all patients and with civility and respect to strangers. They shall withdraw from the wards when the Visiting Committee enter them, unless requested to remain; and shall take no present or gratuity in money or otherwise from the patients, their friends, or strangers who may visit the institution, on any pretence whatever.

90. They shall not admit any stranger into the wards without permission of the Resident Surgeon, or of the Superintendent in his absence.

91. All wardsmen, nurses, and servants, shall be obedient to the regulations of the institution; they shall report immediately to the Resident Surgeon, or Superintendent, any impropriety of conduct or infringement of the rules by any patient, visitor, or other person, and if such complaint be not properly attended to, they shall report the same to the Visiting Committee at its next meeting.

93. Every employé of the hospital other than the Resident Surgeon and secretary at the time these rules shall come into force and every employé who may hereafter enter into employment in this institution shall sign an agreement undertaking to give one month's notice, in writing, to the secretary of intention to resign his or her position, and in default of giving such notice shall forfeit any salary or wages due at time of leaving the service of the Committee of Management of this institution, and shall further agree to receive one month's notice, in writing, from the Committee of Management to quit the service of the institution should such committee aforesaid decide to dispense with his or her services. Provided no notice shall be given to any employé in cases where his or her services shall have been dispensed with under either Rule 28A or Rule 62.

#### Patients.

97. The committee may, if necessary, make provision for the reception and treatment of patients labouring under contagious or infectious diseases, provided the Resident Surgeon is satisfied that such can be done with safety.

99. Patients shall conduct themselves in an orderly manner, and shall observe all directions of the Honorary Medical Officers, Resident Surgeon, Superintendent, wardsmen, and nurses.

102. They shall not gamble nor smoke nor spit on the floor, nor deface or injure any part of the ward, nor any furniture, bedding, or clothing therein, nor sing, blaspheme, nor use rude or indecent language on pain of dismissal by Resident Surgeon or Visiting Committee, provided when a patient is dismissed by the Resident Surgeon that officer shall immediately report the cause thereof to the Visiting Committee.

105. Patients considered by the Resident Surgeon sufficiently convalescent to be able to assist in the work of the

institution or grounds may at the discretion of the Resident Surgeon, and with the approval of the Visiting Committee be so employed, provided that work connected with the internal working of the institution shall have first consideration and that of the grounds second. For the better arrangement of duties and suitable employment of convalescent patients the Resident Surgeon and Superintendent shall consult together on necessary occasions with the view of having all such patients profitably employed.

107. Ministers of religion shall have access to sick persons of their respective denominations at such times as shall be appointed by the committee, and any minister may attend any patient at any time when requested by such patient, and any request made by a patient in this respect shall be immediately sent by the Superintendent to the minister named by such patient.

108. On the death of a patient a printed circular shall be sent by the Superintendent to a clergyman of the denomination to which the deceased belonged or to any person for whom deceased had previously expressed a preference in this respect inviting him to attend the funeral of such patient at a time named in the circular, and the usual burial fee shall be paid to the clergyman officiating in each case if requested.

#### *Paying and other Patients.*

112. Patients admitted as ordinary patients, or outpatients, may be charged such sum or sums as the Committee of Management may direct.

113. Every paying patient shall, on admission to the hospital, sign an undertaking in the following form, viz. :—

#### FORM OF AGREEMENT.

In consideration of my being admitted as a paying patient of the Dunolly District Hospital, I hereby, for myself, my executors, and administrators, promise and agree to and with the said Dunolly District Hospital to pay to the said Dunolly District Hospital the sum of £ per week for my maintenance and medical treatment whilst in such hospital, such payment to commence from the date of my admission, viz., the day of 18.

Regulation of the Borough of Ararat, numbered 6, made under section 107 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, in force in the Borough by virtue of By-law No. 49 of the above-named Borough for the purposes therein stated.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Borough of Ararat, make the following Regulation, which shall apply to and have operation in and for the places named therein (that is to say) :—

In connexion with By-law No. 49.—“It shall not be lawful, after this Regulation becomes law, to allow milk

cows to wander in the following streets, lanes, rights-of-way and reserves situate within the boundaries of the said streets, between sunset and sunrise; and milk cows so found wandering will be impounded and the owner prosecuted for allowing such cows to so wander and become a nuisance (that is to say) :—High-street and Barkly-street, between the following boundaries :—Albert-street on the east; View Point-street on the west; the railway line on the north; and the south right-of-way on the south; the area thus bounded to include all the streets, as well as Albert-street and View Point-street, together with the portion of Lambert-street and Collings-street parallel to the railway.”

#### BOROUGH OF ARARAT.

##### BY-LAWS.

By-laws of the Borough of Ararat made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 46, 47, 48, and 49.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Borough of Ararat order as follows (that is to say) :—

The several parts, and the subdivisions, sections and provisions as are hereinafter enumerated, are hereby adopted in and for the said borough (that is to say) subsections 24, 25, 26, and 27, of section 197 of division 2 of Part VII. of the *Local Government Act 1903*.

##### BY-LAW No. 46.

Section 197—Sub-section 24.—“It shall not be lawful to use in or on any fence or other erection adjoining any street or road of any wire with spikes or jagged projections closer to any road or street within the Borough of Ararat than three (3) inches.”

##### BY-LAW No. 47.

Section 197—Sub-section 25.—“It shall not be lawful to throw, place, or leave upon any public highway or footpath, orange peel, banana peel, or other vegetable matter, within the Borough of Ararat.”

##### BY-LAW No. 48.

Section 197—Sub-section 26.—“It shall not be lawful to write, paint, print, stencil, place, or affix any letter, figure, device, poster, sign or advertisement upon any footpath, street, or road, or upon any building, fence, or other property vested in the Borough of Ararat, or under the management and control of the Council.”

##### BY-LAW No. 49.

Section 197—Sub-section 27.—“It shall not be lawful for cattle to graze or wander upon any street or road within the Borough of Ararat or upon any land within the borough not enclosed by a substantial fence.”

Every person offending against any of these foregoing By-laws shall, on conviction before any justice or justices, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each offence.

These By-laws shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the Borough of Ararat.

#### SHIRE OF COLAC.

##### BY-LAW No. 61.

**T**HE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Colac, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, hereby make the following By-law, being By-law No. 61 of the said Shire :—

1. This By-law may be cited as a By-law for forbidding the deposit of offensive or objectionable matter in any public place within the Shire of Colac.

2. Section 2 of By-law No. 39 is hereby repealed, its provisions being incorporated in the following section :—

3.
