Public Service Act 1890.

AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS.

SECTION 59 (VI.).

THE Public Service Commissioner, pursuant to the provisions of the *Public Service Act 1890*, hereby makes the following amendments of Chapter V. of the Regulations gazetted on the 30th December, 1902:—

Appointment to the General Division.

Repeal—Clause 1.

Add—Clause 1. Every person applying to be recorded for appointment to the General Division of the Public Service must, at the date of an examination, be between the ages of sixteen and forty-one (or in cases of special duties forty-six) years, and must forward to the Commissioner an application in his own handwriting, stating his full name and address, the date and place of his birth, and the particular appointment or the class of appointment which he desires to obtain, and furnish a certificate of his good moral character and industrious habits. (See also Clause 13.) Provided always that persons applying to be recorded for appointment to the undermentioned offices must, at the date of an examination, be between the ages specified opposite the description of the office, and must not at the time of appointment be over the maximum ages set down:—

Repeal—Clause 14.

Add—Clause 14. The names of all persons included in the return of the examiners as qualified for appointment, the appointment or class of appointment applied for by every such person, the date of the examination, and the number of marks obtained thereat shall be registered in the "Register of Persons Qualified for Appointment," in the order of merit as determined by the marks gained, provided that the name of any person who obtained less than one-half of the maximum number of marks for each subject specified in the schedule hereto shall not be registered. If two or more candidates obtain the same number of marks, the order of their merit shall be determined by the number of marks severally obtained for (1) Arithmetic, and (2) Handwriting; and, if these numbers be also the same, then by lot: Provided that no name of any person shall remain on the register as that of a person qualified for appointment after he shall have attained the age of forty-one (or, in special cases, forty-six) years, or after the maximum ages mentioned in clause 1 in respect of the positions referred to therein, or for a longer period than two years, except as hereinafter prescribed. The names of candidates for appointments to positions exempt from examination shall be registered upon the date the Commissioner is satisfied the applicant is qualified to be so registered. In the case of more than one applicant being registered on one day the Commissioner shall determine the relative order of their registration.

* These positions are exempt from examination; but it should be understood that persons appointed to them may be required to pass the prescribed examination before they are transferred or promoted to other positions.

3. He must also show that he has served for not less than three months under some authorized mining surveyor in the conduct of surveys in mines, and for three months under some experienced mining manager in actual mining operations.

4. A candidate whose application has been approved as having complied with the foregoing will be examined, and will be required to pass in each of the four following subjects:—

- (a) Mining Surveying.—Connexion and reduction of bearings to datum of surface survey; survey of vertical and inclined shafts, drives, and workings; survey of mineral veins and lodes, leads, and drifts.

**REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS,
VICTORIA.**

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

- (a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.
- (b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys.

I, A.B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as _____, in the practice of land surveying, for the period of _____, viz., from _____ to _____

NOTE.—For this purpose a “qualified surveyor” shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, or the United States of America, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Rules.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road, and of an area having buildings thereon in illustration of a town survey.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

9. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

Mathematics.

- (a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

- (b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practices of Surveying.

- (c) Details of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, subdivisional, and other surveys, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting from field notes and from co-ordinates, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Acts, writing descriptions of boundaries.

(Candidates may be required to make actual surveys.)

Engineering Surveys.

- (d) Levelling; grading; measurement of earthworks. (Including practical tests.)

Use of instruments.

- (e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, telemeter, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer, tachometer, and steel band.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

Determination of time, latitude, and azimuth, reduction of star places; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

(With practical tests.)

Drawing.

- (g) General plan-drawing, compilation of plans, drawing of sections and contours, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellaneous.

- (h) Physics and geology (elementary); names and description of Australasian timbers of economic value (*vide vocc*).

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having matriculated, or of having passed the senior examination at a University, or the Senior Civil Service examination of New Zealand, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 66 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates producing evidence of having taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University may be further exempted from working out papers in physics and geology.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate passing the examination held under these Rules shall be entitled to a certificate of competency.

13. Any surveyor qualified in Victoria prior to 1st January, 1896, or any surveyor licensed prior to 1st January, 1896, in any other Australasian State or Colony who, by reason of his absence from that State or Colony, is prevented from obtaining the certificate of competency from the Board of that State or Colony, may make application to this Board, and on his satisfying the Board that he is competent, either without examination or on such examination as the Board may require, shall be entitled to a certificate of competency; such application shall be accompanied by the fee (£2 2s.).

LICENCES TO SURVEY.

14. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as

surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 ls.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act 1895*, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

OFFICIAL NOTICE.—XXVIII.

Sheep Dips and similar preparations.

THE attention of the Board of Trade has been called to the dangers which may arise from packages of Sheep Dip and similar preparations containing poison being so stowed on board ship as to become damaged, and to cause their contents to escape, and mix with articles used for human food which may also form part of the cargo of the vessel.

The Board think it desirable to inform all persons interested that it is very important that all such packages, boxes, or cases, intended for export should be marked on the outside with the word "Poison," in letters at least as conspicuous as the address, so that shipowners who carry these goods may know the nature of the contents of the packages they are dealing with and stow them accordingly.

OFFICIAL NOTICE.—XXIX.

Carriage Coastwise of Petroleum Spirit.

The Board of Trade are advised that petroleum spirit gives off a highly inflammable gas at all times, and that the holds of vessels in which it is stowed become quickly charged with an explosive atmosphere which passes by diffusion through wooden bulkheads into the adjoining spaces below deck, and that any light or fire coming into contact with this atmosphere will cause an explosion probably attended with disastrous results.

The owners and masters of vessels carrying petroleum spirit should therefore take special precautions against smoking and the use of lights or fire of any kind when the cargo is being loaded or unloaded, or while the hatches are off or any deck openings are uncovered, and they are reminded that the risk from the inflammable nature of the cargo does not cease when the loading is completed, but continues during the subsequent voyage of the vessel.

Attention has also been called to accidents which have occurred to certain vessels engaged in carrying petroleum spirit in wooden barrels coastwise, and the Board of Trade are advised that, in order that this trade may be carried on with greater safety, the following regulations should be observed:—

- (1) In all ships, except those which are specially built for the carriage of petroleum spirit, it should be contained in metal packages of a suitable character such as steel barrels or drums, instead of in the wooden barrels at present largely used for the purpose.

This regulation will not apply to consignments of the spirit when carried as a deck-load and so stowed as not to come within the meaning of "improper loading." In such cases care should be taken that the barrels are in good condition.

- (2) The holds of vessels carrying the spirit should not be ventilated by removing the hatches during the voyage. Proper ventilators should be fitted, extending to the bottom of the hold, and these should have large cowl heads, the openings being covered with fine brass wire gauze. All ventilation in the crew spaces should be carefully attended to and kept open.

Petroleum spirit cannot be carried without danger in wooden vessels or barges having forecables or other cabins below deck, it being impossible to insure that wooden bulkheads will be impervious to petroleum vapour, as they are always likely to allow this vapour to penetrate to the space beyond, especially in dry weather.

It follows from the above that only iron or steel vessels and barges should be used for the carriage of this cargo, and that they should be fitted with perfectly water-tight bulkheads without any openings. Where, however, there are bilge sluices in the bulkheads, these should be kept closed as long as any petroleum is on board the vessel.

The Board of Trade have instructed their officers that, with proper precautions as to stowage and keeping the barrels containing the spirit clear of the passengers' promenade or deck space, no objection need be made to the carriage coastwise of a deck load of petroleum spirit in a passenger steamer, provided the vessel is not an "Emigrant Ship" within the meaning of the *Merchant Shipping Act 1894*.

In any case, however, in which this cargo is carried in a Home Trade Passenger ship, it would be advisable for the owners of the vessel to post up conspicuous notices as to the danger of smoking or striking matches in proximity to the barrels.

The above Regulations refer to petroleum within the meaning of the Petroleum Acts, and therefore include any liquid which is produced by distillation from petroleum, shale, or coal, and flashes at a temperature of less than 73 deg. F. as ascertained by the first schedule to the *Petroleum Act 1879*, such as Benzoline, Gasoline, Petrol, Naphtha, Petroleum Spirit, Lythene, &c., &c.

Carbon Papers.

The Board of Trade are advised that Carbon Papers, containing, as they do, fatty substances and finely-divided Carbon, or compounds of Carbon, are liable, under certain conditions, to some risk of spontaneous ignition.

They, therefore, think it desirable to inform all persons interested in the carriage of these goods on board ship, that if a limited number of sheets are packed in air-tight tins within a suitable case, no objection need be raised to their carriage as general cargo.

If carried in any quantity and not packed in such tins they should be carried as deck cargo only.

OFFICIAL NOTICE.—XXXI.

Nitre Cake.

The Board of Trade are advised that Nitre Cake when dry may be carried with safety in iron drums, as it does not then act on the iron; it is a hard solid, and when thus packed is not a dangerous cargo.

The salt is, however, very hygroscopic, and when exposed to air, especially damp air, rapidly absorbs moisture with ultimate complete liquefaction. This liquid, though strongly acid to test paper, has none of the corrosive action of strong sulphuric acid. Nevertheless, in contact with metallic iron it evolves hydrogen. If, then, the Nitre Cake is packed in a wet condition, or if, owing to defective drums, moisture gets access to it, hydrogen would be evolved, and the drum would become filled with a mixture of hydrogen and air which, when a light came into contact with it, might explode. This danger, as before stated, does not exist if the cake is packed dry, and it will not subsequently arise if the drums are sound.

It is safer, on the whole, to pack the cake in stout water-tight wooden casks, when no danger due to evolution of hydrogen could arise.

Sulphide of Sodium and Sulphide of Potassium.

The Official Notice XI. printed on page 42 of the above Instructions is cancelled, and the following Notice substituted for it:—

The Board of Trade are advised that the Sulphides of Sodium and Potassium in the dry or anhydrous form are liable to spontaneous combustion, and they warn ship-owners and ship-masters of the dangers attending the carriage of these substances on board ship, unless packed in strong, air-tight vessels, such as steel drums.

In the hydrated condition, the Sulphides of Sodium and Potassium are not liable to spontaneous combustion, and no objection need be raised by any Officer of the Board of Trade to their shipment on this account.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf by the Railways Acts, do hereby make the following By-law, and do hereby repeal so much of the provisions of all previous By-laws and practices as conflict therewith:—

1. The rates per ton, for the carriage between Melbourne and the following stations of all traffic (other than that from and to Euston and the Darling River District referred to in Section 3 hereof) shall be the ordinary Mileage Rates, viz.:—

(c) No junction charge is made on wool, and the charge for haulage of wool from Albury to Victorian Stations shall be the Victorian mileage rate, the whole of which shall be payable to the Victorian Railways Commissioners.

(f) The provisions of Section 2 shall not have any effect on any existing "through" rates between Victorian and New South Wales Stations which are divided between the States in proportion to their respective mileage.

3. The rates per ton for the carriage between Melbourne and Echuca, Kerang, Swan Hill, or Mildura of goods forwarded to or from Euston or any place in the Darling River District shall be as prescribed in the Schedule hereunder. The rates prescribed in Section 1 hereof in the case of Echuca, Kerang, and Swan Hill, and the rates prescribed in Section 4 hereof in the case of Mildura shall be charged in the first instance, and rebates to the rates as specified hereunder will subsequently be allowed in every case in which the rates specified hereunder are less than the mileage rates, on production of certified bills of lading or a certificate or such other proof as the Victorian Railways Commissioners may require as conclusive evidence—

(a) that such goods are absolutely for use in Euston or the Darling River District, and have been duly delivered at the destination specified in the Consignment Note ;

(b) or were duly forwarded from Euston or the Darling River District.

Such rebates will not be granted unless the rebate sheets are lodged with the Victorian Railways Commissioners within one month of the date of the consignment of the goods.

The rates for the carriage of all traffic between Serviceton and Victorian stations, as specified on page 53 of the Goods Rates Book, dated 1st July, 1901, are hereby cancelled, and the ordinary mileage rates shall be charged in lieu thereof.

6. *Consignments consisting of goods in two or more classes.*—General Condition No. 22, as printed on page 4 of the Goods Rates Book, dated 1st July, 1901, is hereby cancelled, and the following shall have effect in lieu thereof:—

- (a) When goods classified in two or more classes are consigned to one consignee, such goods may, if it be cheaper than to charge separately for the goods in each class at the rates and conditions applicable to each class, be aggregated in one or more groups, and the total weight of each such group charged under the rates and conditions applicable to the goods in the highest class in each such group.
- (b) The following Regulation in respect of the charges for the carriage of any lot consisting of not less than six tons of goods in any or all of Classes A, B, C, 1, 2, and 3 shall apply only to such traffic forwarded from Melbourne to Eaglehawk, *via* Woodend, Lancefield, Maldon, Maryborough, and Daylesford, *via* Woodend and Ballarat, Stawell, *via* Geelong and Bacchus Marsh, Mortlake, and Beeac, or from Melbourne to any station intervening on the routes specified between each of the places named and Melbourne.
- (1b) The actual weight of goods in classes A, B, and C, forming the whole or a portion of such six-ton lot, shall be charged at the rates applicable to Classes A, B, or C, as the case may be, irrespective of the minimum weight applicable to each such class, provided that if any goods in Classes B, C, 1, 2, or 3 be reduced in class when consigned in specified quantities, or for any other reason, the rate of the class to which such goods are reduced shall be charged only when the specified quantity of such goods is consigned and any other reason under which such goods are reduced in class is complied with.
- (2b) On goods in any or all of Classes 1, 2, and 3, forming the whole or a portion of such six-ton lot, the rates therefor shall be reduced ten per cent., provided that in no case shall the net rate for goods in Classes 1, 2, or 3 be less than ten per cent. below the Class 1 Mileage Rates for the distance.
- (3b) Provided always that in respect of any mixed lot of this character, consisting of less than six tons, the goods in the lot shall, if it be cheaper than to charge for the same as prescribed in Clause (a) above, be charged as prescribed in Sub-clauses (1b) and (2b) hereof, and the tonnage short of six tons shall be charged at Class A rate.
- (c) In respect both of Clauses (a) and (b), the charges shall in all cases be subject to the tariff for "Smalls," and the goods must be consigned and delivered to the Commissioners on the same day for one consignee at the same destination station.
- (d) The provisions of Section 6 shall not be operative in respect of carrying agents.

7. *Rates for the Carriage of Dumped or Scoured Wool.*—The rates prescribed in this By-law for the carriage of greasy and scoured wool respectively from the stations specified herein shall apply equally to dumped and undumped wool.

The rates prescribed in the Goods Rates Book, dated 1st July, 1901, for the carriage of wool from stations other than those specified in this By-law, shall apply to greasy wool, whether dumped or undumped, and the rates for the carriage of scoured wool, whether dumped or undumped, shall be 20 per cent. more than the rates for greasy wool, provided that such additional charge on scoured wool shall in no case exceed 5s. per ton more than the rates on greasy wool.

7. The provisions of this By-law shall take effect on and from the 1st day of March, 1905.

CITY OF FITZROY.

BY-LAW NO. 74.

A By-Law of the City of Fitzroy, made under sub-sections 22, 24, and 27, section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered Seventy-four, for Regulating Traffic and Processions; Regulating the Use of Barbed Wire; Prohibiting Wandering Cattle; and for Maintaining the Good Rule and Government of the Municipal District.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Fitzroy, order as follows:—

1. *Definition of Street.*—The word "street," wherever hereinafter used (not being repugnant to the Act, and not inconsistent with the context), shall mean and include any highway, public bridge, road, lane, footway, square, place, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

2. *Definition of "Motor Car" and "Motor Cycle."*—The words "motor car" and "motor cycle" shall, whenever occurring in this By-law, mean and include locomotive wheeled vehicles propelled or driven, or the motive power for which shall be by means of petrol, steam, or other vapour, or by electricity; and the words "motor cycle" shall mean any bicycle or tricycle driven or impelled by the like means.

3. *Repeal of Previous By-laws and Regulation.*—The By-laws of the City of Fitzroy numbered fifty-four and sixty-two, for suppressing nuisances and regulating traffic and processions, and the regulation numbered one hundred and thirty-three, shall be, and the same are, hereby repealed.

4. *Use of Advertising Vehicles Regulated.*—No person shall carry about on any vehicle drawn by a horse or other animal, or drawn or propelled by such person or on any animal or on foot, in any street, any picture, placard, bill, notice, advertisement, plan, flag, or symbol, whether painted, written, or printed, or partly painted, partly written, or partly printed upon, pasted upon, or otherwise adhering to or placed upon or attached to any part of such animal, vehicle, or person, so as to cause or create or add to any obstruction to public traffic, or to be likely to cause any damage to persons or property.

5. *Limitation of Width of Loading.*—No person shall drive any vehicle drawn by a horse or other animal along or across any street having any timber, iron, or boards laid across such vehicle so that either end projects more than two feet beyond the wheels or sides of such vehicle.

6. *Vehicles to be Lighted at Night.*—No person shall, between one half-hour after sunset of any day, or before one half-hour before sunrise of any day, drive, or permit or allow to be driven or impelled any wheeled vehicle of any description whatever (not being a motor-car), whether drawn or impelled by himself or drawn by a horse or other beast of burden, whether licensed or not, upon or along any street being a thoroughfare, without carrying in front thereon a good serviceable and effectual lamp, with a light burning therein sufficiently bright to be seen at a distance of fifty yards therefrom securely fixed to the off-side of such vehicle.

7. *Processions.*—No procession of persons, animals, or vehicles of any description, shall march, parade, or pass along any of the streets of the City of Fitzroy for other than funeral purposes, unless the persons, or some one or more on their behalf, organizing or intending to take part in such processions or conducting the same, shall have previously obtained the written consent of the mayor, or, in his absence, of the town clerk, of the said city, and then only by the route and during the hours specified in such written consent, nor unless the recipient thereof shall have given 24 hours' written notice of the time, place, and route intended, with other particulars of such consent, to the officer for the time being in charge of the police of the said city.

8. *Rule of the Road.*—Every person driving any animal or vehicle whatever, or riding any animal, shall keep to the left or near side of the carriage-way of the street, and when passing any other vehicle or animal going in the same direction shall go or pass on the right or off-side of such other vehicle or animal, and shall allow any person desirous so to do to pass on the right or off-side; save and except that in passing tram-cars travelling in the same direction drivers, riders, and propellers of vehicles and foot passengers shall pass such tram-cars on the left side.

No person shall drive any vehicle or ride any animal on the right-hand or wrong side of the road without justifiable cause, and every person driving any vehicle, or riding any animal, shall keep as near as practicable to the footpath on his left side, so as to permit other persons going in the same direction to pass freely on the right-hand or off-side.

9. *Vehicles Obstructing a Street.*—No person shall leave any cart or other vehicle in or on any street, being a thoroughfare, without any horse or other animal being harnessed thereto, unless in consequence of some unavoidable accident having occurred.

10. *Vehicles Not to be Left Unattended.*—No driver of any vehicle shall be away from his horse, or cattle, so as to be unable to have full control of it, or them, unless one of the wheels of such vehicle be securely fastened by a chain or strap so as to effectually prevent the rotation thereof.

11. *No Wandering Cattle Allowed.*—No person shall permit or allow cattle, of which he is the owner or the person in charge thereof, to graze or wander upon any land not enclosed by a substantial fence.

12. *Rule of the Footpath.*—Persons walking along the footpath of any street shall, unless for reasonable cause or with reasonable excuse, keep on their respective right-hand sides of the path so as to pass other persons meeting them on the left-hand side.

13. *Loitering Prohibited.*—No person or persons shall wilfully obstruct the carriage-way or footway of any street by standing or loitering thereon after having been required by any member of the police force, or by any officer of the council specially authorized in that behalf, to discontinue such standing or loitering.

14. *Barbed Wire.*—No person shall place or use in or on any fence or other erection on land adjoining any street any wire with spikes or jagged projections, unless the same be placed on the inside of the posts of such fence or erection, and no such wire shall be placed or used so that the clothing of any person passing along such street is liable to be torn thereby.

15. *Advertising on Paths, &c.*—No person shall, without the previous consent of the mayor or town clerk, write, paint, print, stencil, place, or affix any letter, figure, device, poster, sign, or advertisement upon any footpath, street, or road within the City of Fitzroy, or upon any building, fence, or other property vested in the municipality or under the control and management of the Council of the City of Fitzroy.

16. *Motor Cars and Motor Cycles.*—No person shall drive, ride, or impel any motor car or motor cycle upon or along any street at a greater speed than eight miles an hour without the permission, in writing, of the mayor or town clerk of the city being first had and obtained.

17. No person shall drive, ride, or impel any motor car or motor cycle upon, along, or across any footpath, save across any such footpath direct to or from any premises abutting thereon, for the purpose of entering or leaving such premises.

18. Every person driving, riding, or impelling any motor car or motor cycle during the times between one-half hour after sunset and one half-hour before sunrise, shall have a lamp attached to the front thereof and keep the same lighted so as to exhibit an adequate light in the direction in which such person is proceeding.

19. Every person driving, riding, or impelling any motor car or motor cycle shall keep the same upon the near or left-hand side of the carriage-way of the street, and whenever overtaking any other vehicle (save only a tram-car going in the same direction), or any horse or other beast of burden or foot-passenger proceeding or standing on the carriage-way, such person shall keep to the off or right-side thereof (except in the case of tram-cars travelling in the same direction, which he shall keep on the left side thereof); and such person shall, within a reasonable distance from or before passing such vehicle, horse, or other beast of burden, or such foot-passenger, by sounding a bell or whistle or horn, give audible and sufficient warning of his approach.

20. In every case where a person driving or riding or impelling any motor car or motor cycle meets or overtakes any vehicle drawn by any horse or other beast of burden, and such horse or other beast of burden may, on such meeting or overtaking, become restive or alarmed, or shall cease to be under the due control of the person for the time being in charge thereof, the person riding, driving, or impelling such motor car or motor cycle shall dismount or stop as speedily as possible, and shall assist to prevent an accident, and shall continue dismounted or stopped so long as may be reasonably necessary. And, in the event of any accident, shall, upon request by a police officer or officer of the council, give his true name and address, and also the true name and address of the owner of the motor car or motor cycle, as the case may be.

21. *Operation of By-law.*—This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the City of Fitzroy.

22. *Penalty.*—Every person who shall offend against any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

CITY OF FITZROY.

BY-LAW NO. 75.

A By-Law of the City of Fitzroy, made under sub-sections 10, 17, 18, 25, and 34 of section 197 of the *Local Government Act* 1903, and numbered seventy-five, for suppressing nuisances; providing for the health of the residents in the City of Fitzroy, and against the spreading of contagious and infectious diseases; prohibiting spitting or expectoration on footpaths, and for maintaining the good rule and government of the municipal district.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1903, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Fitzroy do hereby order as follows:—

1. *Definition of Street*.—The word "street" shall mean and include any highway, public bridge, road, lane, pathway, footway, square, place, court, alley, or passage whether a thoroughfare or not.

2. *Noisy and Musical Instruments, &c.*—No person shall sound or play upon any musical or noisy instrument, ring any bell, cry any goods, bawl or sing in any street within fifty yards of any dwelling house or place of business after being required by any inmate or occupier of such house or by any member of the police force to desist.

3. *Placing Refuse in Street*.—No person shall sweep or otherwise remove from any shop, house, or vehicle into any street any dust, waste paper, shavings, or other refuse, or being a hawker of rabbits, fish, fruit, or vegetables, or a news-vendor or other street trader or any other person not being a street trader throw down and leave in any street any offal, skins, waste paper, shavings, feathers, or other refuse.

4. No person shall throw down and leave in any street any bill, placard, or other substance intended, or apparently intended, for the purpose of advertising.

5. No person shall throw down or leave in any street any bill, placard, or other paper which shall have been torn off or removed from any bill-posting station.

6. *Bottles, Broken Glass, &c.*—No person shall willfully throw down, place, or leave any bottle or broken glass, nail, or other sharp substance on or in any street in such a position as to be likely to cause injury to passengers or animals or damage to property.

7. *Spitting*.—No person shall spit or expectorate upon the footpath of any street of the City of Fitzroy.

8. *Orange Peel, &c.*—No person shall throw, place, or leave upon any public footway within the City of Fitzroy any orange or banana peel.

9. *Foul Water to be put into Sewers*.—No person on premises connected with the sewerage system of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works shall deposit or throw any household slops, soap suds, or other foul or offensive fluid or matter upon any street, or upon any part of such premises, other than directly into drains or sinks by which such fluid or matter will pass directly into the sewers of the said Board.

10. *Operation of By-law*.—This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Fitzroy.

11. *Penalty*.—Any person who shall offend against any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

BY-LAW NO. 76.

A By-law of the City of Fitzroy, made under sub-section 7, section 197 of the *Local Government Act* 1903, and numbered seventy-six, for preserving good order and decency in any building belonging to the municipality, or under the control and management of the Council; preventing damage to such building or to the furniture or fittings thereof; and regulating any meeting or gathering held therein.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1903, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Fitzroy order as follows:—

1. *Preserving Order in Municipal Buildings*.—No person shall in any building belonging to the municipality or under the control and management of the Council, and whether at any meeting or gathering held therein or not—

(a) behave in an improper, disorderly, or indecent manner; or

(b) deface the walls by writing thereon, or otherwise injure or damage the said building or any of the furniture or fittings thereof.

No. 21.—FEBRUARY 15, 1905.—1324.—5.

2. *Preserving Order at Meetings*.—No person shall at any meeting or gathering held in any such building—

(a) stand upon any chair or seat or stand or sit upon any window sill, dado, cornice, balcony railing, or staircase railing; or

(b) disturb or interrupt any such meeting or gathering; or

(c) curse or swear or use any gross, indecent or abusive language; or

(d) conduct himself in an insulting or riotous manner; or

(e) be drunk; or

(f) take part in any disturbance or disorder; or

(g) cause any obstruction by standing or otherwise in the approaches to the external doors of such building or in the corridors, aisles, or passages within the same.

3. *Penalty*.—Every person who shall by any wilful act or default be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each such breach, and shall be further liable in the amount of damages occasioned by such person.
