BY-LAW No. 183.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behall by the Railways Acts, do hereby make the following By-law, and do hereby repeal so much of alf previous By-laws and practices as conflicts therewith:— "

CARRIAGE OF COAL.

- (a) In respect of coal forwarded by rail on the Up journey from any coal-field direct to any station the rate for haulage over the whole or any part of the line from the coal-field to Melbourne shall be Three faithings per ton per mile (of which One halfpenny per ton per mile shall be paid by the Consignee or Consignor, and One farthing per ton per mile shall be paid to the Victorian Railways Commissioners out of the Consolidated Revenue), and the rate for haulage on any other line shall be the rate applicable to the Miscellaneous Class, computed by subtracting the Miscellaneous Class rate for the mileage hauled over the whole or any part of the line from the coal-field to Melbourne from the Miscellaneous Class rate for the total mileage from the coal-field to the station of destination.
- (b) In all other respects the rate applicable to the Miscellaneous Class shall be charged.
- (c) The minimum charges shall be 2s. per ton for distances up to and inclusive of 6 miles; 2s. 3d. per ton for distances over 6 and up to and inclusive of 8 miles; and 2s. 6d. per ton for distances beyond 8 miles, with a minimum truck load for bogic trucks of eighteen (18) tons, for fifteen (15) ton trucks of thirteen (13) tons, for ten (10) ton trucks of nine (9) tons, and of one ton less than the actual tonnage capacity of the truck when such is less than fen (10) tons, provided that the minimum truck load shall in no case be less than six (6) tons.
- (d) The provisions of this By-law shall have effect on and from the first day of January, 1905.

For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are not supplied with water, and being within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe, one-half of the before-mentioned rate, and where lands and tenements are over a quarter of a smile and under half-a-mile from a stand-pipe, one-quarter of the before-mentioned rate.

6. Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly, where the water is used for domestic and other than domestic purposes, shall be the quantity which at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons would be capual to the assessed rate for the half-year which would be payable in respect of the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. WHEREAS by the Fisheries Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1093) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make Proclamations which shall have force and effect only in any waters or places specified therein for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sections 37 and 38 of the said Act; and that every Proclamation under the said Act shall be published in the Government Gazette, and may be explained, varied, revoked, annulled, or superseded by any other Proclamation under the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation prohibit fishing in the Garden Hut and Monument Creeks, from their source down as far as a place known as the White Bridge, for a period of two years from the date of this Proclamation.

WHEREAS by section 27 of the Mines Act 1904 [4]
Edw. VII., No. 1961], it is provided that the mode of conducting elections for representatives of Mining Boards, the time for holding the same, the remuneration to be paid to the members of such boards, the appointment of the chairman of each board, the number of members necessary to form a quorum, the places and times of meeting, the mode of filling seats vacated pursuant to the provisions of the said Act, shall be provided for in regulations to be approved by the Governor in Council: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the now in part recited Act, doth, for the purposes aforesaid, approve of the following regulations:—

ELECTION OF REPRESENTATIVES FOR REGISTERED COMPANIES.

1. The mode of procedure for the election of representatives for registered companies carrying on mining operations in a mining district to the Mining Board for such district, shall be as follows:—

(a) The Returning Officer for Mining Board elections in each mining district shall, on or before the first day of February, in the year 1905, or the corresponding day in every triennial year thereafter, as the case may be, cause notice in the form contained in the First Schedule to these regulations, or to the like effect, to be sent to the legal manager or secretary of each registered company carrying on mining operations in such district.

(b) Any such registered company shall be apticled.

(b) Any such registered company shall be entitled, on or before the second Saturday in the month of February, in the year 1905, or the corresponding day in each triennial year thereafter, as the case may be, to nominate two persons for election as representatives of registered companies to the Mining Board of the district in which such company carries on mining operations.

(c) Such nominations shall be in the form contained in the Second Schedule to these regulations, or to the like effect, and shall be lodged with the Returning Officer for such district on or before the last day for nomination as aforesaid, and shall be signed by at least two directors and the legal manager or secretary of such company, and shall be under the seal of the company.

(e) If, at Five o'clock in the afternoon of the last day for nominations, the number of persons nominated as aforesaid shall exceed two, the Returning Officer shall give notice to each such company in the form contained in the Third Schedule to these regulations, or to the like effect, of the names of the persons so nominated, and shall direct each such company to send or deliver to the Returning Officer, before Five o'clock in the afternoon of the last Saturday of the month, a statement, in writing, setting out the full names of the persons (not exceeding two) for whom such company votes, and such statement shall be signed by at least two directors and the legal manager or secretary of such company, and shall be scaled with its scal. The envelope or covering, containing such statement, shall be indorsed "Voting paper of a Registered Company."

(f) Within one week from the last Saturday in the month of February, in the year 1905, or the corresponding day in each triennial year thereafter, as the case may be, the Returning Officer for each district shall at the time and place of which he has given public notice, proceed, in the presence of such persons as may be in at-

tendance, to open such before-mentioned envelopes or coverings, and shall ascertain the number of votes recorded for each person nominated, and shall forthwith give public notice of the number of votes to recorded, and shall declare the two persons who have received the greatest number of votes to be duly elected representatives of registered companies carrying on mining operations in such district, and if two or more persons shall have received an equal number of votes, the Returning Officer shall have the casting vote.

(g) In the event of the scat of any representative of registered companies carrying on mining operations in any mining district becoming vacant within the period of twelve months immediately preceding the last day of nomination for the next ordinary triennial elections after the election of such representative the Governor in Council shall appoint some suitable person to fill such vacancy until the holding of such elections, but in all other cases an extraordinary election shall be held to fill such vacancy, and the provisions of these regulations shall as far as possible apply to the conduct of such election, but the date of nomination, the time for sending voting-papers to the Returning Officer, and declaring the result of such voting, shall be fixed by the Governor in Council, and notice thereof given in the Government Gazette.

(h) No election shall be liable to be questioned by reason only of any effect or informality in the constitution of a registered company, or in the appointment of the directors, legal manager, or secretary, or in any nomination paper or notice furnished by any registered company or other person who neglects to carry out any obligation or duty cast upon him by these regulations, or the non-receipt by any registered company or other person who neglects to carry out any obligation or duty cast upon him by these regulations, or who shall in any way contravene the same, shall be liable upon conviction to a penalty not exceeding \$\int 20\$.

- (d) No person being an uncertificated insolvent shall be capable of being elected a member of a Mining Board.

 (e) If the number of candidates nominated as aforesaid for any mining district shall not exceed the number of members to be elected for such district, the Returning Officer shall declare such candidates to be duly elected, and they shall be deemed to be duly elected accordingly; but if the number of such candidates shall exceed the number of members to be elected for such district, the Returning Officer shall cause voting-papers to be printed with the Christian and surnames of all the candidates in full in the form in the Ninth Schedule to these regulations, and shall give public notice that a poll will be taken for the election of members on the day appointed for that purpose; and on that day a poll shall be taken at such places within such mining district as the Governor in Council shall from time to time direct and every poll shall commence at Nine o'clock in the afternoon, and shall be taken in such buildings as the Returning Officer shall select.

 ach candidate shall be entitled to appoint in writing one scrutineer to be present in each polling room; and such scrutineers and the Returning Officer or deputy, and any electors not exceeding six in number, shall alone be permitted at any one time to enter or remain in the polling room without the consent of the Returning Officer or deputy; and every Returning Officer or deputy shall have power to cause any person to be removed who shall obstruct the approaches to any polling room or shall conduct himself in a disorderly manner; and all constables and peace officers shall aid and assist such Returning Officer or deputy in the performance of his duty. the performance of his duty.

- (h) The Returning Officer or deputy in each district shall provide pencils or pens and ink in every polling room for the use of the electors, and also a locked box with a cleft or opening therein capable of receiving the ballot-papers; and such box shall stand on a table opposite the Returning Officer or deputy, who shall keep the key of such box.
- (i) Every elector before voting shall produce his miner's right to the Returning Officer or deputy, who shall stamp or otherwise mark the same, and shall deliver to such elector a ballot paper with such stamp or mark; and every such elector shall, without leaving the room, strike out the names of every candidate for whom he shall not desire to vote; and in case any elector shall be unable to read or write, the Returning Officer or deputy, if required, shall, in view of such one of the scrutineers as such elector may desire, strike out the names of such candidates as such elector may designate; and after such names shall have been so struck out, the voting-paper shall be deposited in the said box.
- (i) It shall be lawful for any Returning Officer or deputy, or for any one candidate or scrutineer, to put to any person tendering his vote the questions following:—
 - (I.) Are you of the age of twenty-one years?
 - (II.) Are you residing in this district?
 - (III.) Are you a natural born or naturalized subject of the King?
 - (IV.) Are you the person named in this miner's right?
 - (v.) Have you already voted at this election?

And no other question shall be put to any person tendering his vote; and no person who shall refuse to answer any such question, or who shall not answer the same to the satisfaction of the Returning Officer or deputy, or whose miner's right shall have thereon when first produced as aforesaid a stamp or mark as aforesaid appearing to have been made or affixed at the same election, shall be permitted to vote.

- (k) Immediately upon the close of the poll the Returning Officer or deputy at each polling-place shall proceed, in the presence of the scrutineers of the candidates, to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate; and every deputy shall immediately afterwards forward the voting-papers scaled up together with a list of the total votes for each candidate to the Returning Officer; and such Returning Officer shall, as soon as conveniently can be after the day of the poll, give public notice of the number of votes given to each candidate, and shall declare the candidates who have received the greatest number of votes in each district, not exceeding the number to be elected for the same, to be duly elected; and if two or more candidates shall have received an equal number of votes, the Returning Officer shall have the casting vote.
- (1) If the seat of any representative of the holders of miners' rights on any Mining Board shall become vacant within the period of twelve months immediately preceding the last day of nomination for the next ordinary triennial elections after the election of such representative, the Governor in Council shall appoint some suitable person to fill such vacancy; but in all other cases an extraordinary election shall be held to fill such vacancy, and the provisions of these regulations shall, as far as possible, apply to the conduct of such election, but the date of nomination and the date of the election shall be fixed by the Governor in Council, and notice thereof shall be given in the Government Gazette.

APPOINTMENT OF RETURNING OFFICER.

4. Within and for every mining district, there shall be a Returning Officer, whom the Governor in Council shall appoint, and may from time to time remove, and it shall be lawful for every such Returning Officer, from time to time, to appoint, by writing under his hand, a sufficient number of deputies for the conduct of elections.

REMUNERATION TO BE PAID TO MEMBERS OF THE BOARD.

5. Each member of the Board, other than the Inspector of Mines, shall be paid the sum of Two pounds two shillings for each attendance, together with the amount of all coach and railway fares actually and necessarily paid in attending Board meetings, and also the sum of Ten shillings as travelling expenses for each day, other than the days of meeting, necessarily absent from home, travelling to and from such meetings.

APPOINTMENT OF CHAIRMAN.

6. At the first meeting of every Mining Board after any triennial election, and whenever the office of chairman of any such Board shall become vacant, the members of such Board shall proceed to the election of chairman, and the member who shall receive the greatest number of votes shall be entitled to vote for himself, and in case any two or more members shall receive an equal amount of votes, the chairman shall be selected from such two or more members by lot. members by lot.

OUORUM.
