**I**N compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and after due inquiry, I, the responsible Minister for the time being administering the Factories and Shops Acts, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1893*, as re-enacted by the *Factories and Shops Act 1896*, in the

**FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF MESSRS. BRIGHT AND HITCHCOCKS, DRESSMAKERS, MILLINERS, AND TAILORS, MOORABOOL STREET, GEELONG,**

for a period of eight weeks from the 28th February, 1905, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than thirty females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said thirty females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That every female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

**REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS, VICTORIA.**

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.

(b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

**PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.**

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys.

*Form of Certificate for presentation to the Board of Examiners.*

I, A. B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C. D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as \_\_\_\_\_, in the practice of land surveying, for the period of \_\_\_\_\_, viz., from \_\_\_\_\_ (or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of four years, three of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

NOTE.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, or the United States of America, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Rules.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road, and of an area having buildings thereon in illustration of a town survey.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

9. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

#### SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

##### Mathematics.

(a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

##### Computation.

(b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

##### Principles and Practices of Surveying.

(c) Details of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, subdivisional, and other surveys, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting from field notes and from co-ordinates, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Acts, writing descriptions of boundaries.

(Candidates may be required to make actual surveys.)

##### Engineering Surveys.

(d) Levelling; grading; measurement of earthworks. (Including practical tests.)

##### Use of instruments.

(e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, telemeter, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer, tachometer, and steel band.

##### Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

(f) Determination of time, latitude, and azimuth, reduction of star places; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

(With practical tests.)

##### Drawing.

(g) General plan-drawing, compilation of plans, drawing of sections and contours, projection of maps and charts.

##### Miscellaneous.

(h) Physics and geology (elementary); names and description of Australasian timbers of economic value (*vide voce*).

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having matriculated, or of having passed the senior examination at a University, or the Senior Civil Service examination of New Zealand, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 66 per centum of the maximum marks allotted these papers.

Candidates producing evidence of having taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University may be further exempted from working out papers in physics and geology.

#### CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate passing the examination held under these Rules shall be entitled to a certificate of competency.

13. Any surveyor qualified in Victoria prior to 1st January, 1896, or any surveyor licensed prior to 1st January, 1896, in any other Australasian State or Colony who, by reason of his absence from that State or Colony, is prevented from obtaining the certificate of competency from the Board of that State or Colony, may make application to this Board, and on his satisfying the Board that he is competent, either without examination or on such examination as the Board may require, shall be entitled to a certificate of competency; such application shall be accompanied by the fee (£2 2s.).

#### LICENCES TO SURVEY.

14. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocity Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey competency under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be

accompanied by the fee (£1 1s.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act 1895*, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

3. He must also show that he has served for not less than three months under some authorized mining surveyor in the conduct of surveys in mines, and for three months under some experienced mining manager in actual mining operations.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.—VICTORIA.

[No. 135.]

TARGET PRACTICE.

MARINERS and others are hereby notified that the Commonwealth Defence Act 1903, Part 6, contains the following sections:—

“71. The officer in charge of any artillery or rifle range may stop all traffic, during artillery or rifle practice, on any road or water-way crossing the line of fire or in dangerous proximity thereto.”

“72. No ships, boats, or persons shall come or remain within the prescribed distance of any ship, battery, gun, or person engaged in artillery or rifle practice, or shall remain in any position so as to obstruct such practice.”

It is also hereby notified that the Defence authorities publish the following notice for general information, namely:—

“All Forts from which practice is carried on will fly a red flag from the masthead or flagstaff. All ships and boats should be kept at a distance of at least 800 yards to the left and one mile to the right of the line of fire from a distance of 6,000 yards from the Battery, in accordance with Part 6 Defence Act No. 20, 1903.”

SHIRE OF ORBOST.

BY-LAW No. 15.

Under the Health Act 1890.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Act 1890, and of every other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the president, councillors, and rate-payers of the Shire of Orbost, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within its jurisdiction, make the following by-law (that is to say):—

Pans and Cesspits.—The ordinary system of pans for night-soil shall be adopted.

Removal of Night-Soil.—No householder or occupier shall contract with any person or persons for the removal of night-soil, or permit or cause the same to be removed by any person or persons, save and except the person or persons in that behalf to be appointed by the council of the said shire, and such pan or pans shall be emptied, and contents thereof removed, as the said council shall direct.

Use of Disinfectants.—Every householder shall use or cause to be placed for use in and in connexion with every closet a suitable disinfectant or deodorant.

Charge for Removal.—For the removal of such night-soil, every householder or occupier, as aforesaid, shall pay to the said council, or the person appointed on its behalf, the sum of One pound nineteen shillings (£1 19s.) per annum for a once-a-week service, and for a fortnightly service One pound six shillings (£1 6s.) per annum for every pan used, such sum to be payable quarterly, in advance, and in default of payment the same to be and to become recoverable in any Court of Petty Sessions: Provided that in cases of special nature the said council shall be at liberty to make such charge as it may deem fit.

Extent of Application of By-law.—This by-law, numbered fifteen (15), shall apply to and have operation within the boundaries of the townships of Orbost and Lakes Entrance.

Penalties.—If any person commit a breach of any of the provisions of this by-law he shall, for every breach, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10), and a further penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5) or less than Five shillings (5s.) for each day such offence is continued after any conviction.

The above by-law was passed by the Council of the Shire of Orbost on the 21st day of December, 1904, and subsequently confirmed by the said council on the 18th day of January, 1905.

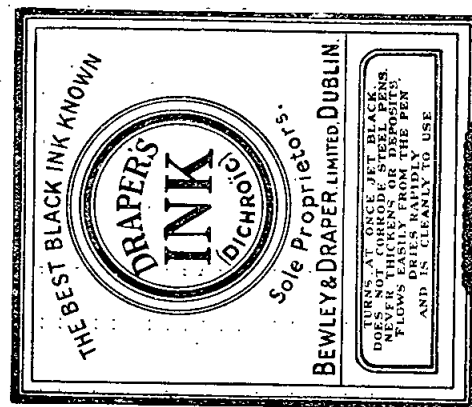

## LILLYDALE WATERWORKS TRUST.

## REGULATION NO. 2.

THE Commissioners of the Lillydale Waterworks Trust do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Water Acts*, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the following Regulations:—

1. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from the premises to which it is supplied, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or who shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such offence.
2. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust who shall take or carry away water from the stand-pipe, hydrant, or any public or private service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such offence.
3. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for that purpose; and any person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds for every such breach.
4. Before any person shall affix any service-pipes to any pipes of the Trust, or alter or repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipes, or service-pipes, cocks, or fittings connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such work, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with such pipes, service-pipes, cocks, or fittings as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
5. Licences to affix and lay or alter or repair service-pipes, to tap mains and sub-mains, and to do and execute generally the plumbing and other work necessary for laying on and maintaining water services may be granted to persons who shall satisfy the Trust of their competency to perform such plumbing and other work, upon payment of an annual fee of One pound. The Trust may cancel licences at any time.
6. The quality of the materials required in laying private services shall be as follows:—
  - (1) The whole of the pipe tees, thimbles, bends, reducing couplings, plugs, &c., to be of the best galvanized iron.
  - (2) All pipes and pieces to be true in sectional form, straight longitudinally, and of equal strength and thickness throughout the entire body of the same.
  - (3) All ends of pipes, bends, &c., to be properly and truly threaded, and capable of being screwed into thimbles, tees, &c.
  - (4) The whole of the pipes, tees, bends, &c., to be sound and free from all defects, and capable of withstanding a hydrostatic pressure equal to a column of water 400 feet in height.
  - (5) All delivery cocks and thimbles for connecting the service-pipes and mains to be high pressure, and made of brass of the best quality and workmanship, and of approved pattern, to screw into

elbows, bends, &c. All cocks and thimbles to stand the same pressure as the pipes.

- (6) No service-pipe shall be laid at a depth below the surface of the ground of less than 10 inches.

Ordinary connexions with mains and sub-mains must be made with proper brass stopcocks, ferrules, to which, for iron services, a length of not less than 3 feet of lead pipe must be attached. The weight of lead to be used per lineal yard will be  $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch, 6lbs.;  $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch, 9lbs.; 1-inch, 12lbs.

The maximum tapping that will be allowed without clips for each size of main will be as follows:—3-inch and 4-inch,  $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch; 6-inch, 1-inch.

7. In every bath the inlet must be distinct and unconnected with the outlet. The inlet pipes must be visible and accessible, and be attached to the bath above the bottom thereof, and such bath shall be provided with a proper well-fitted and perfectly water-tight ground outlet, plug, or cock. Overflow pipes to private baths or other vessels will not be permitted, except where the supply is taken by measure.

8. All paddocks to which water is laid on must be provided with water-troughs fitted with approved self-acting ball taps to prevent overflow.

9. Buildings in the course of erection will be supplied with water at the rate of one per centum on the contract price of foundations, masonry, brickworks, and plastering, to be paid in advance before making any connexions. Buildings not being built by contract, at such a charge as shall be agreed to by the Trust. When a special connexion with the main has to be made the applicant must pay the cost of such connexion.

10. Any person using water by means of a hose, except by permission of the Trust, or where the water is supplied by measure, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for each offence.

11. Where water is required for other than domestic purposes solely, a meter must be provided within one month of the receipt of a notice from the Trust requiring same, unless special arrangements have been made by the Trust. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where so supplied shall be such amount as is represented by the rate of One shilling in the pound net annual value.

12. Where water is supplied to tenements outside the Waterworks Trust area special arrangements must be made.

13. Each and every meter shall be certified to as in working order according to tests of a like character to those adopted by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works for the testing of meters, and when fixed shall be maintained and kept in proper working order by the owner or occupier of the property whereon it is being used. The meter must be so placed as to be open for inspection, and so as to be protected from injury and with means of access thereto. The key of the meter shall be in the possession of the Trust. No meter shall be connected with more than one separate and distinct inlet pipe leading from the service-pipe, unless otherwise permitted by order of the Trust.

14. If any meter should cease registering, or be reported by the inspector as out of repair or registering inaccurately, the Trust shall estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order, and until it is repaired and refixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter or during the corresponding period of the previous year, or the Trust may insert a check meter on the service-pipe.

15. No meter shall be fixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering 1,000,000 gallons.

16. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of premises or of any land or tenements who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision of laying on a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundaries of such land, premises, or tenements, abutting on the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

17. Any person who, having been served with a notice to provide a meter, shall refuse or neglect to do so within the time in such notice specified, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every day after the expiration of the time mentioned in the notice he shall continue to refuse or neglect to comply with the terms of such notice.

18. If any person damage or pollute in any way any stream, reservoir, aqueduct, or other waterworks belonging to the Trust, he shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

19. If any person supplied with water by the Trust wilfully or negligently causes or suffers any pipe, valve, cock, cistern, bath, or other apparatus or receptacle, to be out of repair or to be used or contrived so that the water supplied by the Trust to him is, or is likely to be, wasted, misused, unduly consumed for irrigation, or contaminated, he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

20. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes or permits to be done, anything in contravention of these Regulations, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charges imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these Regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

21. Any person who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe, the property of the Trust without permission, in writing, of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break open or injure any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, weir, channel, reservoir, or engine, the property of the Trust, or who shall trespass on the Trust's work without leave, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

22. The officers of the Trust shall have power at all times, within the hours prescribed by sections 451 and 471 of the *Water Act 1890*, to enter any house, building, or land through or into which water is supplied by the Trust, to measure or otherwise, in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for the measuring, conveyance, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, or preventing waste, and to inspect and examine if there be any waste or misuse of such water, and may remove any meter, instrument, pipe, or apparatus, the property of the Trust; and if any person hinder such officer from entering or making such inspection, or effecting such removal, he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

23. In the construction of these Regulations the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation or company, whether aggregate or sole; the word "officer" shall be deemed and taken to mean any officer or servant of the Trust duly authorized in that behalf; and the word "Trust" shall be deemed to mean the Lillydale Waterworks Trust.

24. Notwithstanding anything contained in any of the foregoing Regulations, the Trust may, from time to time, alter, revise, or make additions to them, as may be deemed expedient.

The foregoing Regulations were made by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Lillydale Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of the powers contained in the *Water Acts*, on the evening of Thursday, the 9th day of February, 1905.

No. 1093) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make Proclamations which shall have force and effect only in any waters or places specified therein for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sections 37 and 38 of the said Act, and that every Proclamation under the said Act shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and may be explained, varied, revoked, annulled, or superseded by any other Proclamation under the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation revoke such part of the Proclamation made under the provisions of the said *Fisheries*

*Act 1890*, and bearing date of the 25th day of November, 1902, relating to the protection of Murray Bream and Murray Perch, and do hereby prescribe as a "close season" throughout Victoria and in all Victorian waters for Murray Bream and Murray Perch, the period from the 15th day of August to the 30th day of November (both days inclusive) in every year, during which period it shall be unlawful under the Act for any person to take, sell, or expose for sale any Murray Bream and Murray Perch.

WHEREAS by the *Water Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that at the expiration of two months after the notice of any application for the constitution of a Waterworks Trust shall have been first advertised in the *Government Gazette*, the Minister, if satisfied that the provisions of the now in part recited Act have been substantially complied with, shall submit such application and the general plan and description therein referred to, and all petitions which have been received in respect of such application, to the Governor in Council, together with any recommendations as to the granting of the application or as to any alterations or additions he may think desirable in the proposed waterworks; and that the Governor in Council may thereupon approve of the construction of such proposed waterworks, with or without any alterations or additions in the general plan and description thereof, or may disapprove of the construction of such waterworks, and shall make an order accordingly: And whereas it is further enacted that if the Governor in Council shall approve of the construction of such waterworks, with or without alterations or additions or restrictions of any such general plan and description, a Waterworks Trust shall be constituted to construct, maintain, and continue the whole or any part of the waterworks therein described, in accordance with the provisions of such Order, and of the now in part recited Act: And every Order approving of the construction of any proposed waterworks, and the constitution of a Waterworks Trust for the purpose shall—

- (a) State the amount of money which the Governor in Council will grant as a loan for the purpose of carrying out the same and paying the cost and expenses of the plans and application for the same, and also the rate of interest which will be charged for such loan;
- (b) Proclaim the limits of the lands within which such Trust shall have authority, to be called a Waterworks District;
- (c) State what are the principal works to be constructed;
- (d) Assign a corporate name to such Waterworks Trust; and
- (e) Contain such provisions (not inconsistent with those of the now in part recited Act) as, according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of each case, the Governor in Council shall think fit:

And whereas it is further enacted, by section 25 of the *Water Act 1890* aforesaid, that whenever a Waterworks District is either wholly, or with the exception of the waterworks or proposed waterworks thereof, within one municipal district, the Governor in Council may appoint the municipal council for the time being of such municipal district, together with one or more persons, not being members of such municipal council, to be the Waterworks Trust of such Waterworks District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, has approved of a general plan and description as set forth in a certain application of the Council of the Shire of Bulla, for a loan for the purpose of carrying out works for the supply of the Sunbury township, Lunatic Asylum, and Railway Station, with water, and doth hereby order and appoint, as follows:—

- (1) The construction of the said waterworks;
- (2) The Municipal Council of the Shire of Bulla for the time being and one other Commissioner to be the Waterworks Trust of such Waterworks District.
- (3) That the amount of loan hereby granted shall be Sixteen thousand pounds sterling (£16,000), and that the interest to be charged for such loan shall be at the rate of Four pounds per centum per annum, payable half-yearly.
- (4) That the limits of the lands within which the said Waterworks Trust shall have authority shall be those comprised within the following boundaries, viz.:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR RECREATION PURPOSES IN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF WARRNAMBOOL, KNOWN AS THE "WARRNAMBOOL RACING AND RECREATION RESERVE."

WE, James Lindsay, Walter Synnot Manifold, Edward Henry Price, Charles Crawford Macknight, and Octavius Frederick William Palmer, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Recreation purposes in the Municipal District of Warrnambool, known as the "Warrnambool Racing and Recreation Reserve," having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section one hundred and ninety-nine of the *Land Act 1901* : —

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve which is parcelled out into the following divisions, shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except as hereinafter provided, but no person shall be allowed on the lawn or enter any of the buildings in the reserve on days on which admission fees are not imposed, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained :—

- (1) The grand stand, the lawn, the members' carriage paddock (surrounded with a close fence), and all approaches thereto.
- (2) The hill, the enclosures pertaining to the hill (surrounded with a close fence), and all approaches thereto.
- (3) The saddling paddock, the birdcage, and all approaches thereto (surrounded with a close fence).
- (4) The weighing yard, the judge's box, the stewards' stand, the stewards' room, the secretary's office, the jockeys' room, the casualty room, the committee stand, the scales platform (surrounded with a close fence), and all approaches thereto.
- (5) The outer carriage paddock and approaches (surrounded with a close fence).
- (6) The course proper and approaches, enclosed and reserved.
- (7) The training track and the remainder of the reserve, which is enclosed.

2. No person shall enter at any race or other meeting into any of the said divisions, nor bring any horses, carriages, or other vehicles therein except on production of a ticket to be issued by the Committee of Management duly authorizing him or her in that behalf, and then only in such part or parts of the said divisions as shall be indicated on the ticket, and only on the days for which the ticket is issued; but the ticket-holder shall not remain in any of the said divisions or any part thereof for a longer period than half-an-hour after the last race of the day shall have been run, unless with the consent of the Committee of Management.

3. No person except the judge or any person he may call to his assistance, or a steward, shall enter the judge's box at the time the horses are prepared to start, or are running for any race.

4. No person shall enter the weighing stand or the weighing yard or the approaches thereto, except the jockeys requiring to be weighed and the owners and trainers of horses desirous of seeing their jockeys weighed.

5. The following persons shall not be admitted to any division of the reserve :—

- (1) Any person proved to the satisfaction of the Committee of Management to have been at any time guilty of any malpractice or dishonorable conduct in connexion with racing.
- (2) Any person proved to the satisfaction of the Committee of Management to be a defaulter.

6. All persons paying for admission to any of the said divisions, or any part thereof, shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which he or she shall on demand produce or, if required, surrender to all gatekeepers and other persons having authority from the Committee of Management to demand the production or surrender of same.

7. Persons renting or hiring for any race meeting the grand stand, or any portion thereof, or any booth or building in the reserve, and persons allowed to train or exercise horses in the reserve, shall abide by an order given by the Committee of Management, in reference to the reserve and the buildings and other erections for the time being thereon.

8. No person shall take any dog into any part of the said divisions or into any building thereon.

9. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

10. No person shall damage in any way any trees, shrubs, or flowers at any time planted or growing in the reserve; nor shall fires be lighted therein.

11. No person shall climb or jump over the fences, or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

12. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management, provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

13. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth, or other structures, for the purpose of offering for sale any article or for any other purpose, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

14. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations for young trees or shrubs.

15. Any person committing in the reserve, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences shall, together with any horses, carriages, or other vehicles in his possession or care, be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased and is or may be in possession of a ticket of admission to any of the said divisions or any part thereof :—

- (1) Assaulting any other person.
- (2) Being drunk.
- (3) Riding, crossing, or trespassing on the course, or any part of it, during a race meeting, or when the horses are prepared to start or are running for any race.
- (4) Using profane, indecent, or obscene language.
- (5) Using any threatening, abusive, or insulting words.
- (6) Behaving improperly or riotously.
- (7) Being found in any part of any of the said divisions and not producing upon demand, or, if required, not surrendering to any gatekeeper or other person, having authority from the Committee of Management to demand production of same, a ticket duly authorizing admission to that part of the said divisions where such person shall be so found, unless such person shall forthwith satisfy the Committee of Management, or the steward deputed by them, that the proper charge for admission has been paid by such person, and that such person's ticket has been lost.
- (8) Obtaining admission to any part of any of the said divisions, when disentitled to such admission under these regulations.

16. No person shall after the 1st day of March, 1905, carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker on any portion of the reserve other than upon the portion of the stand and lawn enclosures or the hill enclosures, set apart for the bookmakers, and then only when he shall have obtained the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management of the reserve, or the stewards of the Warrnambool Racing Club, or those authorized by such Committee of Management or stewards.

17. Every person carrying on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker, whether in the stand and lawn enclosures or the hill enclosures, shall during the time he shall be so carrying on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker, wear a ticket, to be supplied by the Committee of Management of the reserve or the stewards of the Warrnambool Racing Club, or by those authorized by the said Committee of Management, or stewards, which ticket shall be visible to the public, and shall have thereon his name.

18. The following is the scale of charges or fees which may be levied and taken for admission to each of the said divisions and the buildings thereon, respectively :—

Provided always that the Committee of Management may exempt any member of a race club, wholly or partially, from the payment of all or any of such charges or fees, and that the moneys so received shall, after deducting necessary expenses, be applied in the permanent improvement of the reserve for racing and other recreation purposes, or in the erection, maintenance or repair of buildings and fences, or the planting of trees or shrubs in the reserve, and in prizes for any race, or in such other manner in or upon the reserve as shall be necessary or expedient for the purpose of rendering the same more convenient and useful for racing and other recreation purposes.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section one hundred and ninety-nine of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any justice forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall on conviction, forfeit, and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS.

BY-LAW No. 6.

**I**N pursuance of the *Water Act 1890*, and of every other right, title, or power in any wise enabling it in that behalf, the Corporation styled The Ballarat Water Commissioners doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

1. Visitors will be allowed access to the Gong Gong and Kirk's Reserves only between the hours of sunrise and sunset of each day.

2. Public conveyances or vehicles used for hire will be permitted to enter the reserve known as Kirk's for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers, but must retire to such stand or portion of the reserve as may be set apart for such conveyances, or as may be pointed out by the caretaker or other employes of the Commissioners, and in no case and under no pretext will the owners or persons in charge of such vehicles be permitted to ply for hire from any other stand or place within the reserves.

3. Private or public vehicles conveying visitors will be permitted to enter or pass through such portions of the water reserves as the Commissioners may from time to time approve, but drivers of such vehicles and visitors will be held personally responsible for the properly closing and fastening of any gate or gates opened or passed through by them.

4. No fires shall be lighted in any part of the Water Reserves, except in such places as are specially provided for the purpose, and in the event of injury or damage being done to the works, buildings, fences, plantations, trees, shrubs, timber, grass, or other property of the Commissioners by or through the lighting of any fire upon any lands belonging to the Commissioners, the person or persons causing the same will be held responsible for the same.

5. No person shall wash utensils, cloths, or clothes, or throw any live or dead animal, stones, sticks, empty bottles, tins, rubbish, refuse, debris, or thing of any kind whatsoever, in or into any of the reservoirs, aqueducts, channels, creeks, or other water supply works belonging to or under the control of the Commissioners.

6. No person shall commit a nuisance or deposit offensive matter on the reserves, or do any act or thing whereby the water is or may be defiled, polluted, obstructed, or otherwise interfered with.

7. No person shall swim, walk, wade, or stand in the water in the reservoirs or in the aqueducts, races, channels, or other works in connexion with the water supply.

8. No person shall enter or stand upon or within the lines of high water of any of the reservoirs, or shall stand, walk, or run up or down the outer or inner slopes of the dams or reservoir embankments.

9. No person shall angle for fish in or upon or about any of the reserves or reservoirs or waters under the control of the Commissioners, or remove any fish therefrom without first obtaining a licence from the Commissioners in such form and subject to such Regulations as the Commissioners shall adopt, and have approved by the Governor in Council.

10. No person shall shoot or snare wild fowl or carry fire arms in or upon or about any of the reserves or reservoirs or waters under the control of the Commissioners, or remove any wild fowl therefrom.

11. All dogs found upon lands reserved for water supply purposes shall be liable to be destroyed.

12. No person shall remove any timber, firewood, trees, shrubs, grass, stone, gravel, sand, earth, or other material from the lands vested in or under the control of the Commissioners, or erect any dwelling, tent, booth, or other structure thereon, or sell any refreshments or other commodities within the reserves without the consent, in writing, of the Commissioners.

13. No person shall enter or remain in any of the reserves or upon any of the lands under the control of the Commissioners who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

14. Each and every person who enters upon the lands vested in the Commissioners does so at his or her own risk.

15. The Ballarat Water Commissioners will not hold themselves responsible for any accident arising from any cause whatsoever that may occur or happen to any visitor to the water reserves and works.
