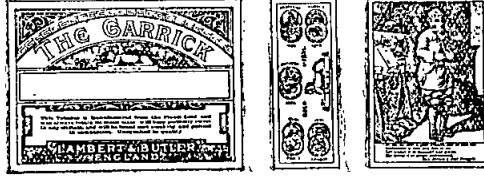

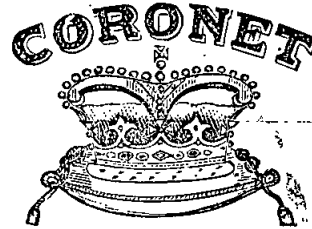

Factories and Shops Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and after due inquiry, I, the responsible Minister for the time being administering the Factories and Shops Acts, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the Factories and Shops Act 1890, as re-enacted by the Factories and Shops Act 1896, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF MR. M. BORCHARDT, CAP MANUFACTURER, RAMSDEN-PLACE, MELBOURNE,

for a period of eight weeks from the 30th March, 1905, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than twenty-five females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said twenty-five females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Three-pence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

CAUSE OF FIRE ON THE S.S. "WARRIMOO."

CARRIAGE AND STOWAGE OF KEROSENE ON PASSENGER STEAM-SHIPS.

THE following Report of Committee, received by the Marine Board of Victoria on the above subject, was adopted thereby, and is published for the information of whom it may concern.

REPORT

IN THE MATTER of a FIRE, which was discovered in the No. 2 hold of the s.s. *Warrimoo*, after leaving Port Phillip Heads on the 8th March, 1905, on a voyage for New Zealand, *via* Hobart.

The Nautical Expert Committee has taken into consideration the documents referred thereto relative to the above-mentioned casualty, and desires to report that it has adopted the theory formed by the Chief Inspector of Explosives as to the cause of the fire, namely, that there was no evidence of spontaneous combustion, and that in his opinion there was no doubt the fire was communicated to the cargo *through the ventilator*, either by a lighted match or by the contents of a lighted pipe.

In view thereof, the Committee is of opinion that the cowls of all hold ventilators should be at least seven (7) feet above the deck, with a view to minimising the possibility of fires being occasioned in holds by a lighted match or the contents of a lighted pipe being thoughtlessly thrown into the openings of cowl heads.

With regard to the carriage and stowage of kerosene on steam-ships carrying passengers, the Committee desires to draw attention to certain conditions which were suggested thereby in 1896 upon a question which was then raised, as to whether limited quantities of kerosene might be carried in holds with other cargo, with the result that the Board, on the 4th September, 1896, approved that kerosene might be carried as follows, and the Board's Inspector was so instructed, namely:—

- (1) In limited quantities in any one hold between iron bulkheads, provided that when so carried there be not in the same compartment any cargo of an inflammable character.
- (2) If practicable, when kerosene is so carried, it should be stowed under or near the hatchway, and so placed that it may be readily accessible for the purpose of being thrown overboard in case of necessity.
- (3) There is no objection also to the carriage of kerosene on deck, provided that it be stowed so as not to interfere with the safety or comfort of passengers, or to become an impediment to the navigation of the ship under any circumstances, or to prevent free access to the boats or other life-saving appliances.

The Committee recommends that the attention of ship-owners and agents be drawn to the foregoing.

6. No person will be permitted to camp on the Reserve who has the appearance of being a disorderly character, who is in a filthy condition, or affected with any infectious disease.
7. No tramps or travellers will be allowed to remain in the shelter-shed longer than Twenty-four hours in each month.

8. Any person found damaging the buildings on the Reserve, fences, gates, seats, or other structures will be prosecuted.

9. No person will be permitted to carry or discharge firearms within the boundaries of the Reserve.

10. Any person found fishing with rod or net in the pond or reserve without proper authority will be liable to prosecution.

11. No person will be allowed to bathe in the pond, or damage any growing shrub or flower in the enclosure.

12. Persons who allow their goats to trespass on the Reserve will be prosecuted.

13. Persons camping on the Reserve are not to strew rubbish and waste paper about.

14. Parties making use of the grounds for sports, shows, or picnics to comply with the conditions imposed by the Council, and to be responsible for any damage done to property during the time of occupation.

15. Any person who shall, by any act or default, be guilty of any breach of these By-laws shall be subject to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
