DENTAL BOARD OF VICTORIA.

THE Dental Board of Victoria, by virtue of the powers vested in it by the *Medical Act 1890*, Part II., and the *Dentists Act 1898*, doth, with the consent and approval of the Governor in Council, make the following Regulation:—

COUNCIL OF LEGAL EDUCATION.

RULES FOR THE ADMISSION OF BARRISTERS AND SOLICITORS.
The thirteenth day of April, 1905.

IN pursuance of the authority conferred by the *Legal Practitioners Reciprocity Act 1903*, the Council of Legal Education hereby makes the following Rule for the admission of barristers and solicitors to practise in Victoria:—

The following persons may proceed in the course for the admission of barristers and solicitors prescribed in Part I., Division 1., Rule 5, of the Rules of the sixteenth day of February, One thousand nine hundred and five, although they have not passed an examination or examinations which would entitle them, according to the Statutes and Regulations of the University of Melbourne, to enter for the examination of the first year of the course for the degree of Bachelor of Laws:—

(a) Any person who, before the coming into operation of the said Rules of the sixteenth day of February, 1905, had passed a preliminary examination as prescribed by Part II., Rule 3, of the Rules of the Supreme Court, dated the twenty-sixth day of November, 1892.

(b) Any person who, before the coming into operation of the said Rules of the sixteenth day of February, 1905, had passed the Matriculation Examination of the University of Melbourne, and who, after matriculating, shall within two years hereafter pass in Latin at any annual examination of the University of Melbourne.

In either case he must, before presenting himself for any of the examinations mentioned in Rule 5 (b) of the Rules of the sixteenth day of February, 1905, produce to the Secretary of the Board of Examiners a certificate of having passed the examinations required in (a) or (b) hereof, and must lodge with the said secretary a copy of such certificate.

THE BALLARAT WATER COMMISSIONERS.

BY LAW No. 7.

REGULATIONS for fishing in the Reservoirs connected with the Ballarat Water Supply.

1. No person will be permitted to angle for fish in the reservoirs or waters connected with the Ballarat Water Supply without a licence, to be issued by the Commissioners.

2. Application for a licence to be made at the office of the Commissioners, each application to be subject to approval.

3. The subscription for each licence shall be Ten shillings for each open season, from the 1st September to the 30th April following (both dates inclusive). Angling to be permitted only between the hours of Five a.m. and Eight p.m. of each day during such season.

4. No angling or fishing in any way will be permitted on Sundays, nor during the close season, viz., from May the 1st to August the 31st in each year.

5. The licence shall be non-transferable, and any person other than the one to whom the licence is issued using the same shall be treated as a trespasser, and the licence shall be forfeited and cancelled.

6. The holder of a licence while fishing shall wear attached to the lapel of his coat a distinctive badge or card, to be issued by the Commissioners, and shall produce his licence if called upon to do so by any officer or employé of the Commissioners; and in case of refusal or failure to produce the same he shall be liable to be treated as a trespasser.

7. The use of ground bait, fixed engine, or other means to capture fish (except with one rod and line by each holder of a licence) is strictly prohibited.

8. No empty tins, bait, waste paper, and other refuse or debris shall be left within or about the contour lines of the reservoirs, and all such must be cleared, removed, and carried away by the persons using same.

9. The holder of a licence shall agree and undertake to obey these regulations, and also all by-laws and regulations now or hereafter in force, relating to and affecting visitors and other persons entering into and upon the lands, reservoirs, and works vested in or under the control of the Commissioners; and also agree and undertake to assist the Commissioners and their officers and employés by all legal means to prevent the pollution or contamination of the water supply by persons standing, wading, washing, or bathing therein, or by any other means whatsoever.

10. In the event of a breach of any of the foregoing regulations being committed by the holder of a licence, such licence shall be forfeited, and the Commissioners may cancel same, and the person offending shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

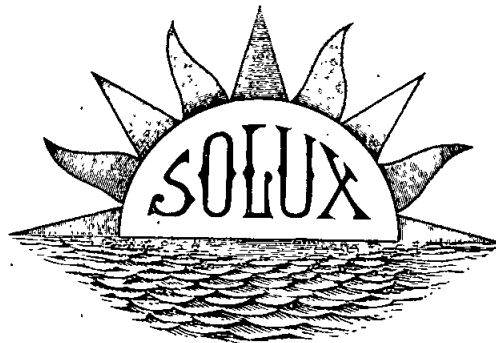

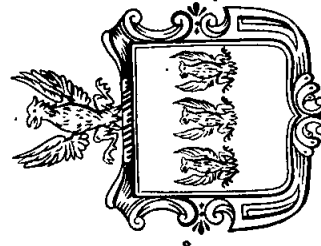

WANGARATTA WATERWORKS TRUST.—
REGULATION No. 3.

THE Wangaratta Waterworks Trust, whose Waterworks District has been proclaimed an Urban District, doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts, make the following Regulation:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements situated within the aforesaid Waterworks District shall pay for the year 1905, in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure, for domestic purposes by the Trust:—

- (a) On lands and tenements of the annual municipal value of £20, or under the sum of £1.
 - (b) On lands and tenements above the annual value of £20, the sum of Five pounds (£5) per centum on the amount of the municipal valuation.
 - (c) The charges for the supply of water otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes shall not in any case be less than Twenty (20) shillings per annum.
 - (d) For water supplied by stand-pipes or hydrant, Sixpence (6d.) per load not exceeding 100 gallons shall be paid.
 - (e) Water supplied by meter shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings (2s.) per thousand gallons up to the amount of the assessed rate, in respect of the premises so supplied; and One shilling (1s.) per thousand gallons for water used over the amount of the assessed rate, subject to any special agreement for the supply of water that may be entered into by the Trust with any person. In cases where the supply is solely for purposes other than domestic, the minimum charge will be for 10,000 gallons per annum.
 - (f) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by meter where water is supplied for domestic purposes, as well as for purposes other than domestic, shall be the quantity which, at the rate of Two shillings (2s.) per thousand gallons, equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
2. Such person or persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates and charges.

WHEREAS by section 23 of the *Education Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1086) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: And whereas by section 18 of the *Teachers Act 1893* (56 Vict. No. 1302) it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations for the purposes therein mentioned, and for carrying out any of the provisions of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby alter the name of Regulation No. XXIII. of the Regulations made under the *Education Act 1890*, and doth rescind sections 1, 9, 11, 13, and 19 of the said Regulation, and doth make the following sections in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

REGULATION XXIII.—TRAINING COLLEGE.

Section 1.—The members of the Training College will be a principal, two or more resident lecturers, visiting lecturers, and students.

Section 9.—The course of instruction in the Training College for the Trained Teacher's Certificate shall be—

FIRST YEAR.

Education, Part I.—

- (a) The history of education (period to be prescribed).
- (b) The leading principles of education and their application.
- (c) School organization and management
- (d) Infant school teaching and management.
- (e) *Practical*.—During the year 175 hours to be spent in schools, including at least 60 hours in teaching, and a week to be spent in the Model Country school. Attendance at two criticism lessons weekly.

History—

The leading sections of either half of Green's *Short History of the English People*, together with an outline of Australian History.

* Mathematics, Part I.—

Algebra.—Symbolic Notation. Addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division. Fractions. H.C.F. L.C.M. Factors. Simple equations. Quadratic equations. Easy simultaneous equations. Easy examples in surds and indices. Graphic solution of equations. Problems.

Geometry.—Books I. and II. of Godfrey and Siddon's *Elementary Geometry* or approved equivalent.

* Latin, Part I.—

- (a) Accidence and the leading rules of syntax.
- (b) Translation of Latin from book to be prescribed.
- (c) Translation of easy passages at sight.
- (d) Easy prose composition, easy complex sentences.

N.B.—French or German of equivalent standard may be substituted.

Science, Part I.—

- (a) Elementary general science, including a course in physics and in chemistry with laboratory work; or
- (b) A course in nature study with field work.

Music—

Theory.—To understand the elements of the Staff and the Tonic Sol-fa Notations, the Great Staff, Key Signatures up to five sharps and five flats, Time Signatures C_2 , $\frac{3}{4}$, $\frac{2}{4}$, $\frac{3}{8}$, $\frac{6}{8}$, $\frac{9}{8}$ ordinary marks of expression and musical terms in general use, Modulation to Dominant, Subdominant, and Relative Minor; also the terms Major, Minor, Relative Major, and Relative Minor.

* Part II. of each of these subjects (Latin, Mathematics, and Drawing) may be taken by students in their first year with the approval of the Principal.

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Practice.—To pitch and conduct an easy school song. Trigonometry.—Angular measurements. Addition. Formulæ, or Pure Mathematics, Part I. (Melbourne University), or

Mixed Mathematics, Part I. (Melbourne University).

Latin, Part II.—

As for Part I., but of greater difficulty; or Latin, Melbourne University Matriculation Examination; or Latin, Part I., Melbourne University.

Science, Part II.—

As for Part I., but of greater difficulty; or Natural Philosophy, Part I.; or Chemistry, Part I.; or Biology, Part I.; or Natural Science (Melbourne University).

Music, Part II.—

Attendance for choral practice.

Drawing, Part II.—

Drawing with the brush; drawing plant and other forms from nature; drawing in light and shade from casts and models; elementary decorative design and colour composition; elementary modelling; freehand perspective; blackboard drawing and drawing from memory for illustrative purposes.

Practice.—To give a satisfactory demonstration or lesson in any subject specified under Drawing in Regulation I.

Manual Training, Part II.—

Cardboard-work or Woodwork for men students. Needlework for women students.

Notes.—(i.) At the discretion of the Director any subject of the Diploma of Education may be taken in lieu of any subject of the second year's course, except in the case of Education, Part II.

(ii.) Students who are preparing for the infant teacher's certificate will not be required to take the full course in mathematics or Latin.

* Part II. of each of these subjects (Latin, Mathematics, and Drawing) may be taken by students in their first year with the approval of the Principal.

Section 11.—At the end of each year, students will be examined in the subjects prescribed for the course of instruction for that year. Each student who passes a satisfactory examination in Education, Parts I. and II., History, Literature, Mathematics, Parts I. and II., Latin, Parts I. and II., Science, Parts I. and II., Drawing, Parts I. and II., and Manual Training, or the approved equivalents thereof, and shows satisfactory proficiency in Music and in Gymnastics, and who obtains in the aggregate a satisfactory number of marks, shall be entitled to a trained teacher's certificate; provided that such certificate shall not be issued until such student has satisfactorily performed the duties of a teacher for the period of two years after the termination of his studentship. (In estimating the total number of marks, no credit will be given for less than 25 per cent. of marks in any subject.)

Section 13.—Students who exhibit special merit, as determined by examination and report from the Principal, may attend such courses of lectures at the University and at the Training College as the Director may in each case determine, provided that each such student shall have passed in all of the subjects of his first year, and that he has passed the Matriculation Examination of the Melbourne University. Such students will be entitled to a trained teacher's certificate upon their completing their first year of the Diploma of Education.

Section 19.—Persons other than students may, on payment of a fee of £10 10s. per annum, be admitted to the course of instruction for the Trained Teacher's Certificate, or, on payment of a fee of £6 6s. per annum, be admitted to the course of instruction for the Infant Teacher's Certificate, or, on payment of a fee of £4 4s. per annum, to the course of instruction in Education only. Students admitted to a course of instruction in Education may, on the payment of an additional fee of £1 1s. per annum, be admitted to a course of instruction in any one of the other subjects taught at the Training College.

No. 1893) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make Orders exercising certain powers therein set forth, amongst others, to sever any portion of Victoria forming part of a municipal district from such municipal district, and annex the same to any other municipal district with which the portion so severed forms one continuous area, and from time to time make any apportionment of property rights and liabilities, and give any direction as to any matters and things that may be necessary to do justice as between the municipalities concerned; and that every such Order shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the said Act are now exercised upon a petition signed by a majority of the ratepayers of a portion of the Shire of Beechworth with regard to a certain area therein described, notices of such petition having been duly published: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in compliance with the prayer of the said petition, doth by this present Order sever from the said Shire the portion described in such petition, and doth annex the portion so severed from such shire to the Tarrawingee Riding of the Shire of North Ovens; and with the advice aforesaid doth re-define the boundaries of the said Shire of Beechworth with its Shire Riding as reduced, and of the said Shire of North Ovens with its Tarrawingee Riding as enlarged, in the manner set forth hereunder, that is to say:—

Part of the Shire of Beechworth severed therefrom and annexed to the Shire of North Ovens.

BEECHWORTH SHIRE (REDUCED AND RE-DEFINED).

Commencing at the junction of the Myrtle Creek with the Ovens River; thence north-easterly by the said creek and Barwidgee Creek to the north boundary of allotment 2 of section 1, parish of Barwidgee; thence easterly by the said allotment and allotment 1 of section 2 to the north-east angle of the latter allotment; thence south-easterly

No. 1086) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned; and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind Clause 6 of Regulation No. VII. of the Regulations under the *Education Act 1890*, made on the 13th March, 1905, and doth make the following Regulation in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

REGULATION VII.—NIGHT SCHOOLS.

Clause 6.—An allowance, determined upon the basis of the average attendance, will be made to teachers of night schools for cleaning, providing fuel, light, and such other articles as may be required, according to the following scale:—

In schools where the average attendance is not less than 30 but under 40, £8 per annum.

In schools where the average attendance is not less than 40 but under 50, £9 15s. per annum.

In schools where the average attendance is not less than 50 but under 60, £11 5s. per annum.

And an increase of £1 10s. for every additional 10 in average attendance.
