NETTING IN GIPPSLAND LAKES.

IT is intended, at the expiration of one month from this date, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to issue a Proclamation revoking Proclamations dated 26th day of June, 1878, and 29th day of September, 1879, relative to use of nets, &c., in Back Lake, Bunga Lake, Lake Reeves, McMillan's Straits, McLellan's Straits, Avon and La Trobe Rivers, and in lieu thereof to issue a Proclamation prohibiting the use of Trammels, Trawls, or other Nets or Engines, as follows:—

Bunga Lake.—The whole year, within a line running S.E. from Clear Point, at the S.W. extremity of Jubilee Head, passing the N.E. extremity of Crescent Island, to a point on the opposite shore.

Reeves Lake.—The whole year, westward of a line running N.W. and S.E. through a point on the extreme S.W. of Rotomah Island.

McMillan's Straits and Newland Backwater.—The whole year, within a line running S.E. of the eastern extremity of the land S.E. of Eagle Point Bay, to the northernmost point of Raymond Island, and also within a line running from the westernmost point of Raymond Island, due west to a point on the opposite shore.

Duck or Lady Bay.—The whole year, within a line running from Lady Point, on the N.E. extremity of Banksia Peninsula, due north to a point on the opposite shore.

Jones' Bay and Victoria Lagoon.—The whole year, within a line running S.W. from the southernmost point of the shore between Jones' and Blond Bays, to another point on the opposite shore.

McLennan's Straits—Western Entrance.—The whole year, in Lake Wellington, within half-a-mile from any point or portion of a line starting from the northernmost point of the western bank, and extending N.E. to another point on the opposite bank;

Eastern Entrance.—The whole year, in Lake Victoria, within half-a-mile from any point or portion of a line running from the extreme or outward point of either bank, or side, to the opposite extreme seaward or outward point, where the waters of the straits herein specified enter Lake Victoria or any bay thereof.

Avon and La Trobe Rivers.—The whole year, within half-a-mile from any point or portion of a line running from the extreme seaward or outward point of either bank or side to the opposite extreme seaward or outward point where the waters of the rivers specified herein enter Lake Wellington or any bay thereof.

N.B.—All the above bearings are magnetic.

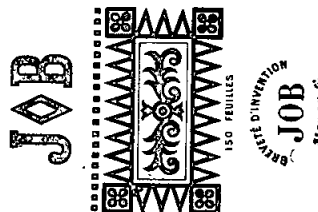

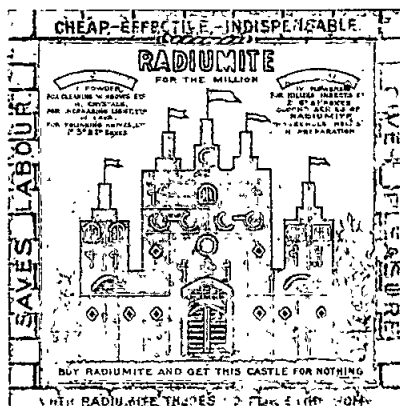

THE MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST COMMISSIONERS.

IN pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1890*, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following Regulations, namely :—

Regulations Nos. 332, 333, 334, 335, 336, 337, 338, 339, 340, 341, 342, 343 and 344 made and passed by the said Commissioners on the 27th March, 1901, are hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following Regulations are enacted :—

339. No coal shall be landed at any wharf, dock, pier, jetty, landing stage, or platform within the Port from any vessel carrying coal and hereinafter called a collier, or from any lighter, unless an entry has been previously passed or a permit granted to land such coal by the collector.

360. When a permit has been granted to land coal, complete entries shall be passed by the company or person desiring to land such coal within seven days after the arrival of such vessel within the Port.

361. All such entries must be passed within seven days after the arrival of such vessel, and be delivered to the Collector accompanied by a stevedore's certificate showing the distribution of the coal and the time and date of the final discharge of the vessel.

362. Pit certificates issued by the Owner or Owners of collieries or their Agent or Agents duly authorized there-to, are to be produced by the Master or Agent in Victoria of the vessel to which they are issued to the Collector either at the time of entering inwards or before clearing of such vessel outwards.

363. All coal put overside from any vessel into other vessels will be treated as transshipments free of wharfage rates, but in all instances (except in the case of lighters used for storage purposes) when coal is put from one vessel into another vessel not intended to go beyond the State of Victoria, Import entries must be passed such as will satisfy the Collector aforesaid that no wharfage rates are payable. When coal is put into lighters used for storage purposes, transshipment entries shall immediately be passed clearly stating the word "Lighter" before the name of the receiving vessel.

364. All coal landed from any vessel at any wharf, dock, pier, jetty, landing stage, or platform within the Port and not transhipped within forty-eight hours of the final discharge of such vessel shall be subject to payment of wharfage rates.

365. Receipts for all coal exported or transhipped shall be produced to the collector, and such receipts shall after the entries aforesaid have been indorsed thereon by him, be retained and filed by him.

366. Register books shall be kept by the coal importers at their offices on the wharf, and such register shall show the distribution of the inward cargo of each collier; that is to say, the number of tons landed, the number of tons transhipped into any vessel, and the number of tons retained for stores, and the number of tons (if any) then remaining in such vessel. Such transactions shall be entered immediately after the final discharge of a collier, and must be available for signature by the collector or any person to be appointed by him to check the same. Such books shall be accessible at any time, and as often as he may require, to any Harbor Trust official.

367. No coal shall be landed from any lighter at any wharf, dock, pier, jetty, landing stage, or platform within the Port without an entry having been previously passed, or a permit granted to land such coal by the collector.

368. All coal landed from lighters at any wharf, dock, pier, jetty, landing stage, or platform within the Port will be subject to payment of wharfage rates, and an "Import" entry must be passed for such coal, the name of the lighter appearing therein as the importing vessel.

369. No coal transhipped from a lighter or lighters shall be subject to payment of wharfage rates; but a transhipment entry must be passed for such coal by the company or person desiring to tranship, and the name of the lighter or lighters shall appear in such entry as the importing vessel or vessels.

370. A register of lighters intended to be used for the storage of coal shall be kept by the collector, and no lighter shall be recognised by the Commissioners for such purpose unless so registered, and books shall be kept at the coal importers' offices on the wharf showing the quantities of every input and output of coal into and from every lighter: such transactions shall be entered within twenty-four hours after the transaction; such books shall be available for inspection, verification, and signature by the collector or any person to be appointed by him for such purpose so soon after each transaction as he shall think fit, and shall be accessible to, and may be inspected at any time by any Harbor Trust official.

371. The lighter books mentioned in the last preceding Regulation shall be balanced at the end of each quarter-year; that is to say, at the end of the months of March, June, September, and December in every year, and the collector or other person aforesaid shall certify as to the correctness or otherwise of each such balance.

The preceding Regulations shall be read and construed with the Regulations made by the Commissioners on 28th March, 1900, and any Regulations amending the same.

IN pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1890*, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following Regulations, namely:—

93. (a) All wharfage rates shall be paid to the Collector at the receiving office of the Commissioners.

150. (a) Within twenty-four hours after the arrival of any vessel from which goods other than coals are to be landed, discharged, or transhipped in the port, the master or owner shall deliver to the Collector a true and complete copy of the manifest of the said vessel in respect of all goods intended to be landed, discharged, or transhipped in the port, and such copy shall set forth the particulars specified in the Form A in the Schedule hereto, and shall be signed by the master or owner and by the agent (if any) as being correct. No goods shall be landed, discharged, or transhipped in the port without the consent of the Collector until such copy manifest as aforesaid has been delivered to him. If the master or owner fails to deliver the copy of the manifest within the time aforesaid, or lands, discharges, or tranships any goods from his vessel before such copy manifest is delivered to the Collector, or prior to his consent being obtained, he shall be liable to a penalty of £20. If the copy manifest delivered to the Collector be inaccurate in any material respect any person by, or by whose authority the said copy was signed as being correct shall be liable to a penalty of £20.

150. (b) The owner or consignee or his agent of all goods liable to wharfage rates, other than coals, shall before removing the goods sign and deliver to the Collector full and accurate particulars of such goods according to the Form B in the Schedule hereto, and shall pay to the Collector the rates, tolls, and charges payable in respect thereof. Any person removing goods or causing goods to be removed before the provisions of this Regulation have been complied with shall be liable to a penalty of £10.

150. (c) Where goods are not to be landed on any wharf in the port, but are to be discharged into lighters or transhipped from one vessel to another, the master, owner, or agent of the discharging vessel, or of the receiving lighter, or the owner, or consignee of the goods shall, before the goods are so discharged, or transhipped, deliver to the Collector true and accurate particulars in the Form C in the Schedule hereto of all goods intended to be so discharged or transhipped.

96. The word "secretary" will be substituted for the word "treasurer" in clause 96 of the Regulations of the Commissioners, made on the 28th day of March, 1900, and for the figures "89" in Clause 260 of the same Regulations the figures "358" shall be substituted in that clause.

The preceding Regulations shall be read and construed with the Regulations made by the Commissioners on 28th March, 1900, and any Regulations amending the same.

PORTS IN VICTORIA: WHARFAGE RATES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Reginald Arthur James Talbot, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 2 of the *Wharfrage and Harbors Rate Alteration Act 1904* (No. 1927) it is amongst other things provided that the Governor in Council, by proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, may from time to time alter, raise, or lower, at discretion, the wharfrage and harbors rate leviable according to the scale of charges contained in the Second Schedule of the *Marine Act 1890*: Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby revoke the rates fixed by proclamation of 22nd day of November, 1904, published in the *Government Gazette* of the 23rd day of November, 1904, page 3718, and do hereby make the wharfrage rates for ports in Victoria, which shall read as set forth in Schedule hereunder, and which shall come into force on and after the first day of July, 1905.

- (b) Firewood by weight in any quantity not exceeding ten cubic feet, shall keep in such building, yard, or place, a proper and sufficient weighing instrument, and shall permit the same to be used without charge for the weighing or re-weighing of such coal or firewood.

2. Every person who in any vehicle carries for sale, or carries for delivery to a purchaser—

- (a) Coal in any quantity not exceeding five hundred-weight; or
- (b) Firewood by weight in any quantity not exceeding ten cubic feet, shall carry in, on, or under such vehicle, a proper and sufficient weighing instrument, and shall permit the same to be used without charge for the weighing or re-weighing of such coal or firewood.

3. Every person who exposes or offers for sale or sells or delivers coal in quantities not exceeding five hundred-weight, or firewood by weight in quantities not exceeding ten cubic feet, from any vehicle shall carry and deliver, or cause to be carried and delivered, such coal or firewood made up in boxes, sacks, or other receptacles labelled or marked in such a manner as to indicate the weight of coal or firewood which each such box, sack, or receptacle contains.

4. Every person who sells or delivers coal in quantities not exceeding five hundred-weight, or firewood by weight in quantities not exceeding ten cubic feet, shall insert, or cause to be inserted, in a weight ticket or note, in the form prescribed by clause 8 hereof, to be given by him to the purchaser, a statement of the correct weight of such coal or firewood.

5. Every person in charge of a vehicle in which coal in any quantity, or firewood sold by weight in any quantity not exceeding ten cubic feet, is being conveyed for delivery to a purchaser, shall exhibit the weight ticket or note therefor to any inspector who may demand the same, and immediately on his arrival at the place of delivery, and before such coal or firewood is unloaded, shall hand such ticket or note to the purchaser, or inmate, or other person in charge of the house or place of delivery.

6. No person shall be required to carry coal or firewood for the purpose of being weighed or re-weighed a greater distance than forty chains.

7. When firewood is sold by measure the delivery ticket shall be in the following form:—
