GENERAL REGULATIONS RESPECTING PUBLIC ACCOUNTS.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, has, by an Order made on the 20th day of June, 1905, repealed sub-clause (b) of Clause 36 of the General Regulations respecting Public Accounts, and has substituted the following in lieu thereof:—

(b) To holders of a power of attorney, on production of the power or a copy certified by the Registrar-General, and, after registration of the same, by the Department concerned, by the Treasury and the Paymaster at the office at which an account is payable, and by the Auditor-General. Where the original power of attorney has not been filed at the office of the Registrar-General, it must, except when the Treasurer specially directs to the contrary in writing, be attached to the first account paid under its authority for ultimate filing in the Audit Office. This regulation is not to apply in cases of refunds of Income Tax, where the Commissioner of Taxes has certified that the amount is legally payable to the Attorney, or to accounts on which the Master in Equity or Lunacy, the Curator of Estates of Deceased Persons, or the Crown Solicitor has certified that the amount is legally payable to the Attorney.

And His Excellency, by the same Order, has directed that the words "the Crown Solicitor" be inserted after the words "Curator of Estates of Deceased Persons" in Clause 36 (c) of the said Regulations.

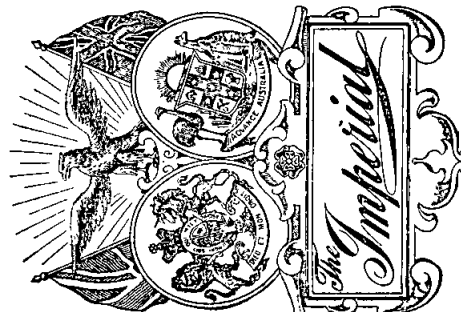

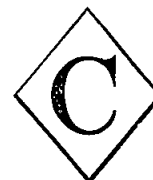

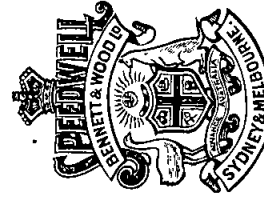

RULES, REGULATIONS, AND SCALE OF FEES FOR QUANTONG CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the Trustees of the Quantong Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations, that is to say:—

No. 1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations (if any) heretofore made shall be and are hereby repealed.

No. 2. The office of the Trust shall be open daily, Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted, from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.

No. 3. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.

No. 4. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the Trustees therefor, who, if the application is approved of and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (under Schedule B) which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right on obtaining the permission of the Trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection thereon.

No. 5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the Trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing, with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written consent of the trustees.

No. 6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths has been delivered to the secretary, gatekeeper, or sexton.

No. 7. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.

No. 8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground, unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

No. 9. The hours for burial shall be:—On week days, September to April inclusive, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.; May to August inclusive, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.; on Sundays throughout the year, from 8 to 10 a.m., or from 2 to 5 p.m.

No. 10. No interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

No. 11. The Trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person having paid the fee for a private grave and requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same, subject to the approval of the Trustees; but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron securely cemented.

No. 12. No private grave shall be re-opened, or any interment permitted therein, without the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give the same.

No. 13. No persons employed by the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment, or for which he has special authority from the Trustees.

No. 14. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from 7 a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.

No. 15. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the Trustees.

No. 16. No smoking shall be allowed, nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

No. 17. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Reginald Arthur James Talbot, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part III. of the *Land Act 1901* (1 Edw. VII. No. 1749) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time set apart and appropriate for the purposes of "village community allotments" any land not alienated from the Crown and not being auriferous lands or lands permanently reserved for any purpose whatsoever, provided that such land shall not include any mallee block or allotment except such as may have been or may hereafter be purchased by the Crown in accordance with the conditions of the *Land Act 1901* aforesaid, and may at any time revoke any such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation set apart and appropriate for the purposes of village community allotments the portions of land described hereunder, viz.:

REGULATIONS FOR THE INTRODUCTION OF CITRUS FRUITS INTO VICTORIA FROM NEW SOUTH WALES AND QUEENSLAND.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Reginald Arthur James Talbot, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Vegetation Diseases Act 1896* (59 Vict. No. 1432), it is among other things provided that the Governor in Council, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, may, either absolutely or subject to any regulations, prohibit the importation, introduction, or bringing into Victoria of any tree, plant, or vegetable which is, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, likely to introduce any disease or insect into Victoria: And whereas, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, citrus fruits are likely to introduce disease or insects into Victoria: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation order as follows, that is to say:—

No citrus fruits shall be imported introduced or brought into the State of Victoria from the States of New South Wales or Queensland in the Commonwealth of Australia, unless they be accompanied by a certificate signed by an officer of the Department of Agriculture of the State from whence they are shipped that such citrus fruits have been fumigated with hydrocyanic acid gas.

TOWN OF PORT MELBOURNE.

BY-LAW No. 84.

A By-law of the Town of Port Melbourne made under and pursuant to the *Local Government Act 1903*, by virtue of section 7 of the *Coal and Firewood Act 1904*, and numbered 84, for regulating, for the purposes of the last-named Act, the sale of coal in quantity, and the sale of firewood in quantities not exceeding ten cubic feet; for prescribing the distance beyond which any person is not to be required to carry any coal or firewood for the purpose of weighing or re-weighing the same; for prescribing the form of weight tickets or notes and delivery tickets; and for fixing the fees to be paid for the use for the purposes of the *Coal and Firewood Act 1904*, of any weighing instrument.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, and of the *Coal and Firewood Act 1904*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Port Melbourne, order as follows:—

1. Every person who in any building, yard, or other place sells or offers for sale—

(a) Coal in any quantity; or

(b) Firewood by weight in any quantity not exceeding ten cubic feet, shall keep in such building, yard, or place, a proper and sufficient weighing instrument, and shall permit the same to be used without charge for the weighing or re-weighing of such coal or firewood.

2. Every person who in any vehicle carries for sale, or carries for delivery to a purchaser—

(a) Coal in any quantity not exceeding five hundred weight; or

(b) Firewood by weight in any quantity not exceeding ten cubic feet, shall carry in, on, or under such vehicle, a proper and sufficient weighing instrument, and shall permit the same to be used without charge for the weighing or re-weighing of such coal or firewood.

3. Every person who exposes or offers for sale or delivers coal in quantities not exceeding five hundred weight, or firewood by weight in quantities not exceeding ten cubic feet, from any vehicle shall carry and deliver, or cause to be carried and delivered, such coal or firewood made up in boxes, sacks, or other receptacles labelled or marked in such a manner as to indicate the weight of coal or firewood which each such box, sack, or receptacle contains.

4. Every person who sells or delivers coal in quantities not exceeding five hundred weight, or firewood by weight in quantities not exceeding ten cubic feet, shall insert, or cause to be inserted, in a weight ticket or note, in the form prescribed by Clause 8 hereof, to be given by him to the purchaser, a statement of the correct weight of such coal or firewood.

5. Every person in charge of a vehicle in which coal in any quantity, or firewood sold by weight in any quantity not exceeding ten cubic feet, is being conveyed for delivery to a purchaser, shall exhibit the weight ticket or note therefor to any inspector who may demand the same, and immediately on his arrival at the place of delivery, and before such coal or firewood is unloaded, shall hand such ticket or note to the purchaser, or inmate, or other person in charge of the house or place of delivery.

6. No person shall be required to carry coal or firewood for the purpose of being weighed or re-weighed a greater distance than from any part within the boundaries of the Town as far as to the Town Weighbridge, at the side of the Town Hall, in Spring-street, Port Melbourne.

7. When firewood is sold by measure the delivery ticket shall be in the following form:—

Coal and Firewood Act 1904.

Delivery Ticket for Firewood sold by measure and not by weight.

 Take notice that you are to receive herewith *tons*
[or cubic feet] of firewood. The sale of such firewood is made by measure and not by weight.

10. If any person be guilty of any offence or misfeasance, or wilful act of commission or omission contrary to any provision contained in this By-law, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

11. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.
