### KING'S REGULATION

(Made by His Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, in accordance with the provisions of the Pacific Order in Council, 1893.)

TO AMEND THE SOLOMONS (FISHERIES) REGULATION 1904.

(L.S.) EVERARD IM THURN.

#### Interpretation.

In this Regulation the word—

- "Ship" shall mean every description of vessel used in navigation or in fishing as hereinafter referred to, and not being a boat as defined herein.
- "Boat" shall mean any open undecked vessel whether usually hoisted to a ship's davits, or carried on board of a ship, or attached to a ship.
- "Master" shall mean any person other than a pilot who is for the time being in command or in charge of any ship or boat, or who is in charge of any fishing operations as hereinafter defined.
- "Protectorate" shall mean and include the islands of the British Solomon Islands Protectorate and the waters of the said islands for three miles seaward from low-water mark of any part thereof.
- "Fishing" shall mean the business of diving for, collecting, preparing, storing, catching by net or otherwise, or carrying from any place within the Protectorate to any other place within the Protectorate, pearl-oysters or pearl-oyster shells, the sea slug commonly called béche-dermer, sponges, or any other fish or shell the produce of the waters of the Protectorate, but shall not include the catching of fish for food.
- "High Commissioner" shall mean the High Commissioner for the Western Pacific.
- "Resident Commissioner" shall mean the Resident Commissioner of the British Solomon Islands Protectorate.
- "Fishing Licence" shall mean the licence for fishing provided for in this Regulation.
- "Ship Licence" shall mean the ship's Trading Licence provided for in the "Solomons (Revenue) Regulation 1898."
- "Native" shall mean an aboriginal native of any island in the Pacific domiciled in the Protectorate, but shall not include Chinese, Japanese, and Malays.

Short Title.

2. On and after the first day of September one thousand nine hundred and five it shall be unlawful for any person save as hereinafter provided to use or employ any ship or boat for fishing in the waters of the Protectorate, or within three miles to seaward of any part thereof unless such ship or boat is provided with a licence in the form given in the Schedule hereto.

3. The High Commissioner or the Resident Commissioner may grant a licence in the form given in the Schedule hereto in respect of any ship or boat to be employed in fishing as aforesaid, and except as hereinafter provided there shall be payable for every such licence or renewal of such licence a fee in accordance with the following scale, that is to say:—

- (1) For an annual licence (a) for every ship the sum of ten shillings for every ton or part of a ton of the registered tonnage of such ship, provided that the amount to be paid in respect of any ship shall not exceed the sum of one hundred pounds; and (b) for every boat the sum of ten shillings for every ton of carrying capacity.
- (2) For a half-yearly licence (c) for every ship the sum of six shillings for every ton or part of a ton of registered tonnage, provided that the amount payable in respect of any ship shall not exceed the sum of sixty pounds; and (d) for every boat the sum of six shillings for every ton of carrying capacity.

If any ship in respect of which a licence is applied for under this Regulation is not registered, the High Commissioner or the Resident Commissioner shall ascertain the tonnage thereof according to the rules prescribed by law for ascertaining the tonnage of ships.

The carrying capacity of boats shall be estimated by the Resident Commissioner or by some person duly authorized by him in that behalf.

4. The owner or master of every ship or boat in respect of which a Ship Licence shall have been obtained shall on application and without further payment be entitled to a Fishing Licence in the form of the Schedule hereto.

5. Licences issued under this Regulation shall be of force (a) annual licences from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December in the same year; and (b) half-yearly licences from the first day of January to the thirtieth day of June or from the first day of July to the thirty-first day of December as the case may be. Payment for the full term shall be made for licences issued after the commencement of the annual or half-yearly term in respect of which they are obtained.

Licences may be renewed by the High Commissioner or by the Resident Commissioner by indorsement on the original licence.

6. Every Fishing Licence shall be available for the boat or ship only in respect of which it is issued. Provided always that on proof to the satisfaction of the Resident Commissioner that any ship duly licensed as hereinbefore provided has been withdrawn from the Protectorate during the period for which such licence has been issued and another vessel substituted therefor, the Resident Commissioner may on surrender of the Fishing Licence, and on payment of the proper rate per ton for difference in tonnage measurement should the tonnage of the substituted ship exceed that of the ship withdrawn, issue a substituted Fishing Licence in respect of the ship so substituted, and for such substituted Fishing Licence a fee of ten shillings shall be paid.

7. The owner or master of any ship or boat who without having obtained a Fishing Licence but having obtained a Ship Licence shall make use of or employ such ship or boat for the purpose of fishing within the Protectorate shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding five pounds or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month.

8. The owner or master of any ship or boat who without having obtained a Fishing Licence or a Ship Licence shall make use of or employ such ship or boat for the purpose of fishing within the Protectorate shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding one hundred pounds or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months.

9. Any person who shall accept delivery of produce of the waters of the Protectorate from or deliver such produce to any ship or boat in respect of which neither a Fishing Licence nor a Ship Licence shall have been obtained shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months.

10. It shall be lawful for the Resident Commissioner, or for any officer duly authorized by him in that behalf, to seize and take any ship or boat which may be found employed in fishing in the waters of the Protectorate without being licensed under this Regulation, and to detain such ship or boat until a prosecution for breach of this Regulation is heard and determined.

11. No person holding a Certificate of Occupation of coast lands under the Solomons (Waste Lands) Regulation 1900 as amended by the Solomons (Waste Lands) Regulation 1901 or under the Solomons (Waste Lands) Regulation 1904 shall be liable to take out a licence under the provisions of this Regulation for fishing in the waters of such lands as specified in the said certificate, and no owner of coast lands shall be required to take out a licence in respect of the waters of such lands.

12. This Regulation shall not apply to the ships or boats of His Majesty's Navy, nor to any native engaged in fishing on his own account.

13. This Regulation may be cited as "The Solomons (Fisheries) Regulation 1905."

PERSONS AUTHORIZED TO MAKE APPLICATIONS TO FIX OR INCREASE THE SUMS PAYABLE BY PARENTS, ETC.

WHEREAS by section 51 of the *Neglected Children's Act 1890* it is enacted as follows, that is to say :—  
"Applications to fix or increase the sum payable by any parent, or to vary or revoke any order suspending or dispensing with payment or to recover payment of the same, may be made by or on behalf of any person authorized by any general or special order of the Minister :". Now therefore I, Samuel Gillott, the Chief Secretary of the State of Victoria, and the responsible Minister of the Crown administering the said Act, do by this General Order authorize the Secretary of the Department for Neglected Children, all Superintendents of Police, all Inspectors and Sub-Inspectors of Police, all Sergeants of Police, and all Police Constables now holding office or hereafter to be appointed, to make applications to fix or increase the sum payable by any parent or to vary or revoke any order suspending or dispensing with payment, or to recover payment of the same.

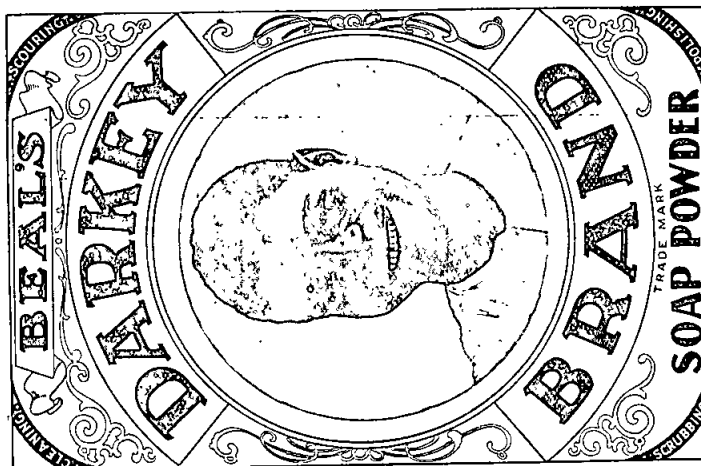

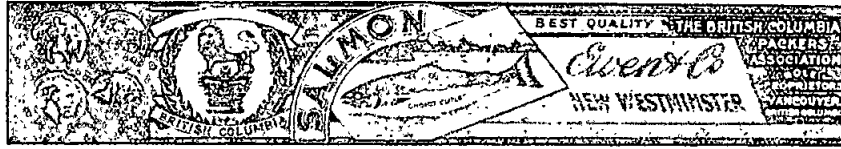

REFERRING to Notices to Mariners, Nos. 11 of 1904 and 12 of 1905, masters of vessels, pilots, and others are hereby informed that deepening operations in the vicinity necessitate the removal of No. 2 Light Beacon, and that on and after the 1st July next a red light in lieu thereof will be exhibited from the Red Pile Beacon south of No. 3. This light on with No. 4 will point out when to turn off No. 1 lead (two red lights) and direct the course towards No. 3 Light Beacon.

Sailing Directions.

*By Night.*—In approaching the anchorage vessels of deep draught should not bring the white light on the old structure to bear north of N.E. by E. in order to avoid the four-

fathom patch, which bears N.W. ½ N. from the light on Wonga Shoal; then get the outer leads (which consist of two red lights vertical seven (7) feet apart and two white lights vertical seven (7) feet apart) in line; keep these in line passing between the occulting light on the Red Buoy and the outer green light on the north bank, also between the other green lights on the north bank and the white lights on the revetment mound.

Steer on the same line until the two red lights of No. 1 lead are coming on; then steer with them on line until the red light south of No. 3 Beacon is on with No. 4; then direct the course to pass a safe distance off No. 3; then steer for a like distance off No. 4, and so on from beacon to beacon round the point until No. 9 is reached. From a safe distance off No. 9 the lights of No. 10 lead will be seen; keep them in line until the red light is about a quarter of a point open to the right of the white light of No. 11 lead; then gradually alter the course to bring the lights of No. 11 lead in line; keep them in line (a sharp lookout being kept for the mooring buoys on the starboard hand) until the lights of No. 12 lead are seen coming into line; proceed as before by altering the course before the lights are on with each other. The same applies in the change from No. 12 to No. 13 leads; when the lights on the wharfs are seen opening out off Luff Point, alter the course so as to round the point at a safe distance, and then up the centre of the Channel, looking out for the mooring buoys on the starboard hand.

*By Day.*—The directions by day are the same as by night, merely substituting the beacons for the lights.

In going outwards the directions are just the opposite to those given for coming inwards; but in such case, in changing from one lead to another, the course should be gradually altered when abreast of the low (red) beacon of each lead.
