KING'S REGULATION

(Made by His Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, in accordance with the provisions of the Pacific Order in Council, 1893.)

TO AMEND "THE GILBERT AND ELLICE (FISHERIES) REGULATION 1905."

(I.S.) EVERARD IM THURN.

THE Gilbert and Ellice (Fisheries) Regulation shall be amended as follows, that is to say:—

The second paragraph of the Interpretation clauses thereof shall be cancelled and the following substituted therefor—

1. "Public fishery" shall mean any salt or fresh water in the Protectorate or any waters within the limits of the territorial waters thereof, but shall not include waters the property of any private person.

2. This Regulation shall be cited as "The Gilbert and Ellice (Fisheries) Amendment Regulation 1905."

WHEREAS by section 148 of the Local Government Act 1903 (3 Edw. VII. No. 1893), it is among other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make Regulations for giving effect to any matters required to be prescribed, and generally for the purpose of carrying into effect the provisions of the Voting by Post Act as applied to the election of Councillors at Municipal Elections:

And whereas it is provided by section 21 of the Voting by Post Act 1900 that the Governor in Council may, in such manner as may be prescribed, appoint or remove persons (therein called officers) who shall witness the signatures of persons who vote by post; and shall post to the Returning Officer all postal ballot-papers received by them, and execute such powers and duties as may be prescribed:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

1. The following persons are hereby appointed officers within the meaning of section 21 of the Voting by Post Act 1900, as applied to Municipal Elections, viz:—

- All Justices of the Peace,
- All Councillors of any City, Town, Borough, or Shire,
- All Municipal Clerks,
- All Clerks of Courts,
- All Head Masters of State Schools,
- And Every Member of the Police Force,

throughout the State of Victoria.

2. Every letter or envelope transmitted through the Post Office, pursuant to the Voting by Post Act as applied to Municipal Elections, either by or to a Returning Officer, shall have the necessary postage upon same prepaid.

And the Honorable Ewen Hugh Cameron, His Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

NETTING IN THE MOYNE RIVER.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, at the expiration of one month from this date, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to revoke the Proclamation issued on 13th day of February, 1894, and published in the *Government Gazette*, page 1001, defining the area in the Moyne River in which netting is prohibited, and to issue a Proclamation defining such area to be as follows:—

AMENDED NOTICE OF INTENTION TO ISSUE A PROCLAMATION RE NETTING IN GIPPSLAND LAKES.

IT is intended, at the expiration of one month from this date, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to issue a Proclamation revoking Proclamations dated 26th day of June, 1878, and 29th day of September, 1879, relative to use of nets, &c., in Back Lake, Bunga Lake, Lake Reeves, McMillan's Straits, McLellan's Straits, Avon and La Trobe Rivers, and in lieu thereof to issue a Proclamation prohibiting the use of Trammels, Trawls, or other Nets or Engines, as follows:—

Reeves Lake.—The whole year, westward of a line running N.W. and S.E. through a point on the extreme S.W. of Rotomah Island.

McMillan's Straits and Newland Backwater.—From the 1st October to 31st March in each year, within a line running S.E. of the eastern extremity of the land S.E. of Eagle Point Bay, to the northernmost point of Raymond Island, and also within a line running from the westernmost point of Raymond Island, due west to a point on the opposite shore.

Duck or Lady Bay.—The whole year, within a line running from Lady Point, on the N.E. extremity of Banksia Peninsula, due north to a point on the opposite shore.

Jones' Bay and Victoria Lagoon.—The whole year, within a line running S.W. from the southernmost point of the shore between Jones' and Blond Bays, to another point on the opposite shore.

McLennan's Straits — Western Entrance.—The whole year, in Lake Wellington, within half-a-mile from any point or portion of a line starting from the northernmost point of the western bank, and extending N.E. to another point on the opposite bank.

Eastern Entrance.—The whole year, in Lake Victoria, within half-a-mile from any point or portion of a line running from the extreme or outward point of either bank or side to the opposite extreme seaward or outward point where the waters of the straits herein specified enter Lake Victoria or any bay thereof.

Avon and La Trobe Rivers.—The whole year, within half-a-mile from any point or portion of a line running from the extreme seaward or outward point of either bank or side to the opposite extreme seaward or outward point where the waters of the rivers specified herein enter Lake Wellington or any bay thereof.

N.B.—All the above bearings are magnetic.

for a period of four weeks from the 12th July, 1905, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than twenty-seven females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said twenty-seven females shall not be employed for more than fifty-four hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.

2. 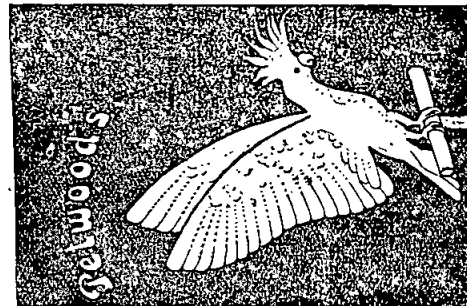

A Regulation of the Shire of Coburg, made under the 44th section of the *Meat Supervision Act 1900*, for fixing the fees for examining and branding carcasses of animals and meat fattened and slaughtered by any person on his own premises, which premises are situated outside the Meat Area, and also the carcasses of animals and meat slaughtered at any abattoir situated within the limits of the Meat Area as at present constituted from time to time within the Shire of Coburg.

By virtue of the powers conferred by section 44 of the *Meat Supervision Act 1900*, the Council of the Shire of Coburg being the Municipal Council of the Municipal District of Coburg, doth hereby make the following Regulation two (2) in the place of sub-section four (4) of Regulation one (1), which is hereby repealed:—

REGULATION No. 2.

The fees payable for examining and branding carcasses or meat by or under the direction of the Meat Inspector shall be as follows:—

For every ox, cow, bull, heifer, steer, or calf ...	6d.
For every sheep, lamb, or goat	3d.
For every swine	6d.

and such fees shall be paid to the Shire Collector at the Shire Offices once at least in every week, and the amount of such payment shall correspond with and be accompanied by a voucher from the Meat Inspector.

Local Government Act 1903.
SHIRE OF RUTHERGLEN.
BY-LAW No. 2/1905.

A By-law of the Shire of Rutherglen, made under the Local Government Act 1903, and numbered 2/1905, for regulating the hours during which and the conditions on which traction engines may proceed over any street or road.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1903, the Council of the Shire of Rutherglen in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, orders as follows, that is to say:—

1. No person shall use on any road or cause or procure any other person to use any traction engine not having its wheels constructed as hereinafter specified, or having on its wheels any other bars, spikes, grips, or other projections than those hereunder described:—

The driving wheels of a traction engine used on any road shall be cylindrical and smooth, soled and shod with diagonal bars of not less than three inches in width, nor more than three-quarters of an inch in thickness extending the full breadth of the tire, and the space intervening between any two of such cross bars shall not exceed three inches.

2. No traction engine shall be driven at night (herein defined as between sunset and sunrise) unless by written permission of the Council defining the route to be travelled and the extended hours during which such travelling is permissible, such permission to be withdrawable at any time on two days' written notice given by the Shire Secretary to that effect, and forwarded to the owner's or driver's address by registered letter.

3. While travelling under the aforesaid permission, every traction engine shall exhibit proper and sufficient carriage or other approved lights.

4. Every person in charge of or driving a traction engine shall provide himself with a licence to do so, obtainable from the Shire Council at any time after the coming into effect of this By-law, and such licence shall expire on the thirty-first day of December following the date of issue, but shall be renewable from year to year on payment of the prescribed fee of Five shillings, such licences to be issued only to persons who, in the opinion of the Council, are competent to manage a traction engine on a public road.

5. No traction engine shall halt (unless through unforeseen circumstances or unless actually engaged in loading or unloading) in any part of a road where the traffic-way is narrowed by fences, excavations, embankments, dangerous depressions, and such like, but shall draw off at least twenty feet from the middle of the formation in the case of a made road, or the middle of the surveyed road if unmade.

6. The driver of every traction engine, when travelling his engine on any public road, shall (if proceeding at more than two and a half miles per hour) reduce his speed to that limit while passing any vehicle, and shall, when requested verbally or by up-raised arm as a signal by any person driving a horse or horses in any conveyance, stop until such conveyance has passed such traction engine.

7. Any person who contravenes or does not comply with any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to the following penalty:—

- (a) For the first offence a fine not less than Ten shillings nor exceeding Three pounds;
- (b) For the second or subsequent offence a fine not less than Two pounds nor exceeding Five pounds.
