Duck or Leafy Bay.—The whole year, within a line running from Lady Point, on the N.E. extremity of Banksia Peninsula, due north to a point on the opposite shore.

#### VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.--VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

#### BY-LAW No. 187.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf by the Railways Acts, do hereby make the following By-law, and do hereby repeal so much of all previous By-laws, Instructions, and Practices as conflicts therewith:—

(1) Except on any gazetted holiday, and on any other day during which tickets at the Holiday Excursion Rate are on issue to the general public, the fare chargeable for the conveyance of each member of the Naval and Military Forces respectively of the Commonwealth who is required to travel on the Victorian Railways on duty shall be—

unless the ordinary fare be cheaper than the minimum fare specified herein, in which event such ordinary fare shall be charged.

- (2) On any gazetted holiday, however, and on any other day during which tickets at the Holiday Excursion Rate are on issue to the general public, the full Holiday Excursion Fare shall be charged in every instance.
- (3) In respect of the carriage by Goods Train of any Stores, Horses, Guns, or Ammunition on behalf of the Defence Department of the Commonwealth, one-half of the ordinary rates by Goods Trains in force in respect of such consignments shall be charged; but in the event of any such consignment being conveyed at the special request of the Defence Department by passenger train, the full ordinary rates by Goods Trains in force in respect of such consignments shall be charged.




