AMENDED NOTICE OF INTENTION TO ISSUE A PROCLAMATION RE NETTING IN GIPPSLAND LAKES.

IT is intended, at the expiration of one month from this date, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to issue a Proclamation revoking Proclamations dated 26th day of June, 1878, and 29th day of September, 1879, relative to use of nets, &c., in Back Lake, Bunga Lake, Lake Reeves, McMillan's Straits, McEllan's Straits, Avon and La Trobe Rivers, and in lieu thereof to issue a Proclamation prohibiting the use of Trammels, Trawls, or other Nets or Engines, as follows:—

Reeves Lake.—The whole year, westward of a line running N.W. and S.E. through a point on the extreme S.W. of Rotomah Island.

McMillan's Straits and Newland Backwater.—From the 1st October to 31st March in each year, within a line running S.E. of the eastern extremity of the land S.E. of Eagle Point Bay, to the northernmost point of Raymond Island, and also within a line running from the westernmost point of Raymond Island, due west to a point on the opposite shore.

Duck or Lady Bay.—The whole year, within a line running from Lady Point, on the N.E. extremity of Banksia Peninsula, due north to a point on the opposite shore.

Jones' Bay and Victoria Lagoon.—The whole year, within a line running S.W. from the southernmost point of the shore between Jones' and Blond Bays, to another point on the opposite shore.

McLennan's Straits — Western Entrance.—The whole year, in Lake Wellington, within half-a-mile from any point or portion of a line starting from the northernmost point of the western bank, and extending N.E. to another point on the opposite bank.

Eastern Entrance.—The whole year, in Lake Victoria, within half-a-mile from any point or portion of a line running from the extreme or outward point of either bank or side to the opposite extreme seaward or outward point where the waters of the straits herein specified enter Lake Victoria or any bay thereof.

Avon and La Trobe Rivers.—The whole year, within half-a-mile from any point or portion of a line running from the extreme seaward or outward point of either bank or side to the opposite extreme seaward or outward point where the waters of the rivers specified herein enter Lake Wellington or any bay thereof.

N.B.—All the above bearings are magnetic.

NETTING IN THE MOYNE RIVER.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, at the expiration of one month from this date, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to revoke the Proclamation issued on 13th day of February, 1894, and published in the *Government Gazette*, page 1001, defining the area in the Moyne River in which netting is prohibited, and to issue a Proclamation defining such area to be as follows:—

Within a radius of one cable from and outside of any point on an imaginary line extending north-west from the extreme westerly point of Griffiths Island to the nearest point on the mainland, and within imaginary lines outside the mouth, as follows:—A line extending seaward from each of the outer extremities of the training walls two hundred yards in an easterly and westerly direction; two parallel lines, namely, one from each outer extremity of the lines from the training walls extending a distance of four hundred yards in a northerly direction; and a line extending in an easterly and westerly direction at a distance of four hundred yards from the training walls.

2. VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.—VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

BY-LAW No. 187.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf by the Railways Acts, do hereby make the following By-law, and do hereby repeal so much of all previous By-laws, Instructions, and Practices as conflicts therewith :—

(1) Except on any gazetted holiday, and on any other day during which tickets at the Holiday Excursion Rate are on issue to the general public, the fare chargeable for the conveyance of each member of the Naval and Military Forces respectively of the Commonwealth who is required to travel on the Victorian Railways on duty shall be—

For every single journey required to be travelled, two-thirds of the ordinary single fare in respect of such journey, and

For every return journey required to be travelled, one-half of the ordinary return fare in respect of such journey,

with a minimum fare of—

6d. for every first-class single journey ticket so issued,

4d. for every second-class single journey ticket so issued,

1s. for every first-class return journey ticket so issued, and

8d. for every second-class return journey ticket so issued,

unless the ordinary fare be cheaper than the minimum fare specified herein, in which event such ordinary fare shall be charged.

(2) On any gazetted holiday, however, and on any other day during which tickets at the Holiday Excursion Rate are on issue to the general public, the full Holiday Excursion Fare shall be charged in every instance.

(3) In respect of the carriage by Goods Train of any Stores, Horses, Guns, or Ammunition on behalf of the Defence Department of the Commonwealth, one-half of the ordinary rates by Goods Trains in force in respect of such consignments shall be charged; but in the event of any such consignment being conveyed at the special request of the Defence Department by passenger train, the full ordinary rates by Goods Trains in force in respect of such consignments shall be charged.

(4) On every occasion, however, on which a special train is provided by arrangement with the Defence Department for the conveyance of members of the Naval and Military Forces respectively of the Commonwealth; or for the carriage of any Stores, Horses, Guns, or Ammunition on behalf of the Defence Department of the Commonwealth, the fares, charges, and conditions enumerated in the foregoing clauses shall apply, but the amount which shall in the aggregate be paid in respect of every such special train shall be not less than the equivalent of a sum calculated at the rate of 8s. per mile run on both the forward and return journey, unless the return journey be commenced within twelve hours of the time of arrival on the forward journey, in which event the aggregate amount shall be not less than the equivalent of a sum calculated on the basis of 8s. per mile run on the forward journey, and 4s. per mile in respect of the return journey; the minimum charge in either case to be £5 for each such special train.

(5) The provisions of this By-law shall be deemed to have become operative as from the first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and five.

MALLEE LANDS AVAILABLE FOR SELECTION AS AGRICULTURAL ALLOTMENTS UNDER LICENCE.

THE land, known as "Holloway's mallee block," is situated at Tyntynder, from 7 to 12 miles north-west from Swan Hill railway station.

Applications (with uncanceled duty stamp of value of 5s. affixed) must be made on the usual form, addressed to the President of the Board of Land and Works, and lodged at any Crown Lands Office or Receipt and Pay Office in the State on or before Friday, 4th August, 1905.

One application and duty stamp will only stand good for one allotment, but if an applicant desires to apply for more than one allotment he may do so.

Telegrams, or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement, will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for £10, with two approved sureties for the due performance of the contract, within ten days after the acceptance is notified.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Firewood at _____," as the case may be, and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of firewood which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must be split out of large timber, and must be perfectly sound, dry, and of the kind or kinds specified in the tender; neither burnt wood, heartwood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. The billets must be not less than 4 inches nor more than 6 inches in diameter. The long wood to be not less than 9 inches nor more than 18 inches in diameter. Delivery to be made on the written order of the chief officer of the Department requiring the supply. The ton of firewood consists of 40 cubic feet. If the firewood is obtained from a State forest timber reserve, or ordinary Crown lands, persons cutting and removing same must be provided with proper Crown licences for the particular areas concerned.

3. Orders will be issued half-yearly (except in cases where the storage is small, when they will be issued quarterly); but the contractor must have 24 hours' notice before purchases are made at his risk.

4. The contractor will be bound to place it in stacks, for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. The stacks are to be 2 feet wide (or 4 feet 6 inches for long wood) by 5 feet high, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets (or lengths) are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. In the event of any inconvenience being felt, either through delay in delivery or of stacking the wood, the Department concerned will purchase the same or re-stack that delivered, at the contractor's risk, from whose account any expense incurred thereby will be deducted.

5. The officer receiving the supply shall have full power to reject any wood which he may consider not in accordance with the contract, notice of which will be given to the contractor in writing, stating the reason. The contractor may, however, claim a survey; but in that case he must, within 48 hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the wood.

6. The board of survey will be composed of persons appointed by the Honorable the Treasurer, and the decision of the board of survey is to be considered as final.

7. If the board of survey shall decide that the supply is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.

8. Accounts for firewood to be rendered to the Department receiving the supply immediately upon completion of the order, which must be attached to the accounts. Payment will be made at the receipt and pay office of the district, or at the Treasury, Melbourne, as the contractor may require.

9. In the event of any irregularity on the part of the contractor being repeated, it will be competent for the Government, in case such irregularity should be established to the satisfaction of the Tender Board, to cancel the contract forthwith.

10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

11. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract.

12.
