ACT OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Reginald Arthur James Talbot, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of the said State, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say :—

IT is intended, at the expiration of one month from this date, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to issue a Proclamation revoking Proclamations dated 26th day of June, 1878, and 29th day of September, 1879, relative to use of nets, &c., in Back Lake, Bunga Lake, Lake Reeves, McMillan's Straits, McLellan's Straits, Avon and La Trobe Rivers, and in lieu thereof to issue a Proclamation prohibiting the use of Trammels, Trawls, or other Nets or Engines, as follows:—

Reeves Lake.—The whole year, westward of a line running N.W. and S.E. through a point on the extreme S.W. of Rotamah Island.

McMillan's Straits and Newland Backwater.—From the 1st October to 31st March in each year, within a line running S.E. of the eastern extremity of the land S.E. of Eagle Point Bay, to the northernmost point of Raymond Island, and also within a line running from the westernmost point of Raymond Island, due west to a point on the opposite shore.

Duck or Lady Bay.—The whole year, within a line running from Lady Point, on the N.E. extremity of Banksia Peninsula, due north to a point on the opposite shore.

Jones' Bay and Victoria Lagoon.—The whole year, within a line running S.W. from the southernmost point of the shore between Jones' and Blond Bays, to another point on the opposite shore.

McLennan's Straits — Western Entrance.—The whole year, in Lake Wellington, within half-a-mile from any point or portion of a line starting from the northernmost point of the western bank, and extending N.E. to another point on the opposite bank.

Eastern Entrance.—The whole year, in Lake Victoria, within half-a-mile from any point or portion of a line running from the extreme or outward point of either bank or side to the opposite extreme seaward or outward point where the waters of the straits herein specified enter Lake Victoria or any bay thereof.

Avon and La Trobe Rivers.—The whole year, within half-a-mile from any point or portion of a line running from the extreme seaward or outward point of either bank or side to the opposite extreme seaward or outward point where the waters of the rivers specified herein enter Lake Wellington or any bay thereof.

N.B.—All the above bearings are magnetic.

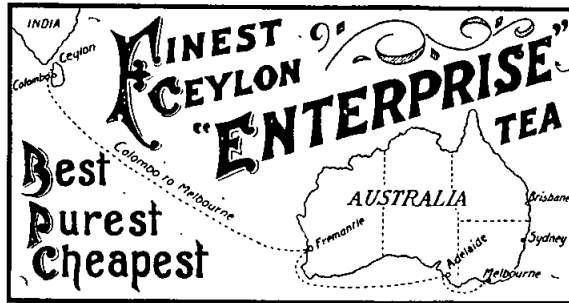

TOWN OF WILLIAMSTOWN.

BY-LAW NO. 69.

A By-law of the Town of Williamstown made under the *Health Act 1890*, and numbered 69, for the proper treatment, removal, and disposal of house and yard refuse.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Williamstown order as follows:—

The following portion of By-law No. 13, for keeping free from noisome matter, yards, stables, and places used for noxious trades, slaughter yards, &c., and for regulating management of earth-closets, privies, &c., disinfecting and deodorizing night-soil and other offensive matter and for regulating its removal and final deposit, is hereby repealed.

"Clause 4. The occupier of every house and premises within the said borough shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto or occupied in connexion therewith to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground, and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the local board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier."

1. The occupier of any house within the town of Williamstown shall cause to be provided a covered receptacle not exceeding four cubic feet in contents properly and wholly constructed of galvanized iron, or some other material approved of by resolution of the Council, riveted, and soldered so as to be watertight, with handles affixed on the outside, so that the same may, with the contents thereof, be readily and conveniently handled by the public scavenger, or such other person or persons, as the Council may appoint for the purpose.

2. The occupier of such house shall cause to be placed into such receptacle, with the least possible delay, all house and yard refuse produced, collected, or accumulated upon such premises.

3. The occupier of such house shall cause a sufficient quantity of dry and efficient deodorant to be placed upon the refuse so deposited in such receptacle when necessary, and shall cause such receptacle at all times to be kept covered and in a dry and cleanly condition.

4. The occupier of such house shall cause such receptacle to be made available once a week for the public scavenger, or such other person or persons, as the Council may so appoint, and on such day or days as may be from time to time appointed by the Council, so that the contents thereof may be readily and conveniently discharged and removed by such public scavenger, or other person or persons, so appointed.

5. The occupier of such house shall be held responsible for the keeping of such receptacle in an inoffensive and watertight condition.

6. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or Five pounds for every day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties—such portion to be not less than Five shillings—to be paid.

7. This By-law shall come into operation at the expiration of three months after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Council the eighteenth day of April, 1905; and confirmed by the Council the sixteenth day of May, 1905.

Commencing on the sea-coast where the east boundary of the parish of Nirranda abuts thereon; thence northerly by that parish and the parishes of Nullawarre, Laang, Garvoc, Keilambete, Kolora, Mortlake, Toorak, Ligar, Filyar, Nerrin Nerrin, Tara, Streatham, Mininera, Tatyoon, Helendoite, Langi-Logan, Burrumbecp, Lexington, Jallukar, Bellellen, and Bellaura, westerly by the parishes of Bellaura, Boroka, and Burrong North, and northerly by the parishes of Warung, Golton-Golton, and Longerenong to the south boundary of the parish of Ashens; thence east and north by that parish and the parishes of Kewell East, Kellalac, Werrigar, Warracknabeal, and Batchica, east and north by the parishes of Kurdgweechee, Byanga, and Gutchu, east, north, and west by the parishes of Cronomby, Minapree, Bitchigal, and Boorong, north by the parishes of Tyenna, Pirro, and Woornak, east by the parishes of Wagant and Panitya, and north by the parishes of Panitya, Gingimrick, and Wemen to the Murray River; thence easterly and south-easterly by that river to the west boundary of the parish of Tyntynder; thence south by that parish and the parish of Castle Donnington, and easterly by the latter parish to the west boundary of the parish of Kunat Kunat; thence southerly and easterly by the parishes of Kunat Kunat, Bael Bael, Dartagook, and Meran to the Loddon River; thence southerly by that river to the south boundary of the parish of Derby; thence east by that boundary, south by the west boundary of the parish of Woodstock, and west by the north boundary of the parish of Laanecoorie to the Loddon River; thence southerly by that river to the west boundary of the parish of Baringhup; thence further southerly by the parishes of Baringhup, Tarrengower, Strangways, Yandoit, Franklin, and Wombat, and easterly by the last-named parish to the source of the Werribee River; thence southerly and south-easterly by that river to Port Phillip Bay; and thence southerly, south-westerly, and westerly by the shore of that bay and the sea-coast to the commencing point.

WARRNAMBOOL DISTRICT.

Commencing on the sea-coast where the west boundary of the State of Victoria abuts thereon; thence north by the said boundary to the Murray River; thence easterly by that river to the west boundary of the parish of Walle; thence south by that parish and the parishes of Geera and Kulwin, west and south by the parishes of Mittyack, Pier-Millan, and Bimbourie, and east by the last-mentioned parish to the west boundary of the parish of Bourka; thence south by that parish and the parishes of Burupga, Wortongie, and Bunu, west and south by the parishes of Watchupga, Curyo, Kinabulla, and Ballapur, west and south by the parishes of Beya, Bangerang, Nullan, and Rupanyup, west and southerly by the parishes of Marma, Warranook, Warra Warra, and Ledcourt, and east by the parishes of Ledcourt and Gampola to the west boundary of the parish of Illawarra; thence southerly by the parishes of Illawarra, Mokepilly, Concongella South, Ararat, Gorrinn, Colvinby, Ballyrogan, Yalla-y-poor, Walla Walla, Caramballuc North, Kornong, Terrimallum, Jellalabad, Darlington West, Wooriwyrite, Glenormiston, Terang, Ecklin, Brucknell, and Narrawaturk to the sea-coast; and thence westerly by the sea-coast to the commencing point.

SOUTH GIPPSLAND DISTRICT.

Commencing on the shore of Port Phillip Bay where the south boundary of the parish of Mordialloc abuts thereon; thence east, north, and east by the parishes of Mordialloc and Mulgrave to the Dandenong Creek; thence northerly and easterly by that creek to the east boundary of the parish of Ringwood; thence north by that parish and the parish of Warrandyte to the Yarra River; thence easterly by that river to Walshes Creek, and further easterly by that creek and the Dampier Creek and the Great Dividing Range to the west boundary of the parish of Binnuc; thence southerly by the parishes of Binnuc, Butgulla, Wurutwun,

Walhalla, Numbruk, Boola Boola, Traralgon, and Callignee, and easterly by the parishes of Callignee, Carrajung, Mullungdung, and Darriman to the sea-coast; and thence westerly and northerly by the sea-coast and the shore of Port Phillip Bay to the commencing point.

NORTH GIPPSLAND DISTRICT.

Commencing on the sea-coast where the north boundary of the parish of Woodside abuts thereon; thence westerly by the parishes of Woodside, Boodyarn, and Bulga, and northerly by the parishes of Jeeralang, Hazelwood, Maryvale, Tanjil East, Moondarra, Telbit, Baw Baw, Toombon, and Moolpah to the Great Dividing Range; thence north-easterly and easterly by that range to the south boundary of the parish of Theddora; thence easterly by that parish and the parishes of Bundara-Munjie and Bingo-Munjie north, southerly, easterly, and north-easterly by the parishes of Cobungra and Hinno-Munjie, and easterly by the parishes of Gattamura, Enano, and Forest Hill to the boundary between the States of Victoria and New South Wales; thence south-easterly by that boundary to the sea-coast; and thence south-westerly by the sea-coast to the commencing point.

WHEREAS by section 414 of Part III. of the *Water Act 1890*, No. 1156, it is enacted that the Governor in Council shall have power from time to time, on the application of any Trust authorized by this part of this Act to construct waterworks and after any such Trust has by Order in Council been duly appointed, to make additional Orders relating to such Trust not inconsistent with the provisions of the said Act, and the Governor in Council may, in such additional Orders in Council, among other things—

Make any order which might have been made in the Order in Council originally appointing such Trust.

Repeal any of the provisions of any previous Order in Council relating to such Trust.

And whereas by a certain Order in Council dated the 10th day of April, 1893, the Macorna North Irrigation and Water Supply Trust was duly constituted: And whereas the said Macorna North Irrigation and Water Supply Trust has made application to have its rating powers increased: And whereas it is deemed expedient to repeal clause 9 of the aforesaid Order in Council dated the 10th day of April, 1893, and to substitute a new clause in lieu thereof: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth order as follows:—

That clause 9 of the Order in Council before-mentioned bearing date the 10th day of April, 1893, shall be and the same is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following shall be, and be deemed to be, and may be cited as, clause 9 of the said Order in Council:—

9. That the amount of moneys which may be borrowed by the said Macorna North Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall not at any time, together with any balances due from the Trust to the Board of Land and Works or upon any Trust loan, exceed the sum of Nineteen thousand two hundred and ninety-seven pounds sterling (£19,297); and no rate made by the Macorna North Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall exceed the sum of Six shillings in the £1 upon the annual value of the property rated within the Trust District.

And the Honorable George Swinburne, His Majesty's Minister of Water Supply for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, has, by Orders made on the 1st day of August, 1905, under the provisions of section 148 of the *Local Government Act 1903* (3rd Edw VII. No. 1893), and pursuant to the petitions of the Councils of the Municipalities of the Cities of Ballaarat, Bendigo, and Footscray, directed that the provisions of the *Voting by Post Act 1900*, applicable and severally referred to in the underwritten Schedules, shall apply to the elections of Councillors for the Municipalities of the said cities of Ballaarat, Bendigo, and Footscray, with the alterations of such provisions as shown or indicated in the said Schedules, the same being alterations deemed necessary for the purpose of carrying into effect such provisions as so applied, and to give effect to the requirements of sub-section (1) of section (2) of the said Act.

His Excellency has also directed that the officials to give the public notices required by the said section as altered shall be the Municipal Clerks respectively of the said Cities of Ballaarat, Bendigo, and Footscray.

And His Excellency, by the Orders heretofore mentioned, has further directed that the Regulations following shall have effect:—

1. The following persons are hereby appointed officers within the meaning of section 21 of the *Voting by Post Act 1900* as applied to Municipal Elections, viz:—

All Justices of the Peace, All Councillors of any City, Town, Borough, or Shire; All Municipal Clerks, All Clerks of Courts, All Head-masters of State Schools, And every member of the Police Force,	} throughout the State of Victoria.
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2. Every letter or envelope transmitted through the post-office, pursuant to the *Voting by Post Act* as applied to Municipal Elections, either by or to a Returning Officer, shall have the necessary postage upon same prepaid.

REGULATION OF COOKED MEAT DEALERS'
SHOPS IN THE CITY OF BALLARAT.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition certified by the municipal clerk of the municipal district of the City of Ballarat as signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers of the particular class to be affected, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

It shall be lawful for the shop of any Cooked Meat Dealer within the municipal district of the City of Ballarat to keep open on the evenings of Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday in each week from Seven o'clock until Ten o'clock, and on the evening of Saturday in each week from Ten o'clock until half-past Eleven o'clock.

REGULATIONS FOR GRANTING CERTIFICATES
TO MINING MANAGERS, ETC.

WHEREAS by section 47 of the *Mines Act 1904* (4 Edw. VII. No. 1961) it is amongst other things provided that the Board of Examiners for mining managers shall hold examinations, and that the subjects of such examinations, the fees chargeable therefor, and the mode in which they are to be conducted, may be prescribed by Regulations made and published pursuant to sections 77 and 78 of the Principal Act (*Mines Act 1890*): Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby approve of the following Regulations, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS FOR GRANTING CERTIFICATES TO MINING MANAGERS, UNDERGROUND FOREMEN, BATTERY MANAGERS, CYANIDE WORKS MANAGERS, CHLORINATION WORKS MANAGERS, ETC., BY THE BOARD OF EXAMINERS FOR MINING MANAGERS.

1. Examinations will be conducted by the board at such time and place as may from time to time be notified by the secretary in the *Government Gazette*, and in a newspaper published or circulated in the locality, and candidates will be examined according to priority of receipt of notice as required by clause 2. Each candidate will be duly notified of the time and place of the examination.

2. Any person desiring to present himself for examination shall notify the Secretary for Mines, Melbourne, on an application form, which may be obtained from the secretary to the board, such notice to be given not less than 21 clear days prior to the date of the examination. The notice shall be accompanied by the fee prescribed in Regulation 5A or 5B, as the case may be. This fee shall admit to one examination only.

3. Should the applicant pass the prescribed examination, the deposit shall, in each instance, go towards payment of the fee for certificate. In the event, however, of the failure of the candidate to pass the examination such amount shall be forfeited to the consolidated revenue.

4. No certificate shall be issued until full payment of the additional fee required by Regulation 5C or 5D, as the case may be, shall have been made to the Secretary for Mines.

5. The fees to be paid by an applicant for a certificate shall be as follows:—

6. No person shall be eligible for a certificate under these Regulations unless he has attained the age specified in the following schedule:—

(a) For a first class certificate as mining manager	25
(b) For a second class certificate as mining manager	23
(c) For a certificate as underground foreman	21
(d) For a certificate as battery manager	21
(e) For a certificate as cyanide works manager	20
(f) For a certificate as chlorination works manager	20

7. If a candidate shall fail to pass the examination prescribed, he shall not again present himself until a period of not less than 3 months shall have elapsed from the date of his last examination.

8. The examinations may be conducted partly by means of written papers, and partly *viva voce*.

9. Every candidate for a certificate shall produce evidence satisfactory to the board that he has had experience as follows:—

- (a) For a first class certificate as mining manager, 5 years' practical mining experience.
- (b) For a second class certificate as mining manager, 3 years' practical mining experience.
- (c) For a certificate as underground foreman, 2 years' practical mining experience.
- (d) For a certificate as battery manager, 1 year in charge of works, or under a competent manager.
- (e) For a certificate as cyanide works manager, 1 year in charge of works, or under a competent manager.
- (f) For a certificate as chlorination works manager, 1 year in charge of works, or under a competent manager.

10. Every candidate shall produce to the board testimonials in proof of the nature and extent of his practical experience, sobriety, and general good character, and stating that he is not subject to any mental or bodily infirmity likely to interfere with the efficient discharge of his duties, such testimonials to be signed by his previous employers; and in the case of a registered company, by the legal manager and chairman of directors of the company.

11. No candidate for any certificate shall be entitled to be examined by the board unless he produces evidence to comply with Regulation 9.

12. The board shall grant a certificate of competency to any person who has complied with Regulations 6, 9, and 10, and who shall produce to the board a certificate of having passed the requisite examinations from and under the seal of any School of Mines or educational institution whose curriculum, training, and subjects for and mode of examination are approved of by the said board; and every such certificate shall state that it is issued on the certificate of a School of Mines or educational institution approved by the board, and also the name of such school or institution.

13. Every candidate for a certificate shall, upon presenting himself before the board for examination, make a statutory declaration that the testimonials he produces are genuine and true and correct in every particular; such declaration, together with copies of the testimonials produced, to be retained by the board.

The original testimonials must be produced as well as copies, but the originals will be returned after perusal.

14. If in any case the board does not deem as satisfactory the evidence submitted by any candidate as required by Regulations 9 and 10, they shall refuse to allow such candidate to present himself for examination; but this will not disqualify him from again making application to the board in connexion with any subsequent examination.

15. If a candidate attempt to obtain a certificate by means of false testimonials, he shall forfeit his application fee, and shall not be allowed to again present himself for examination until a period of two years has elapsed from the date of his last appearance before the board.

16. Every holder of a certificate as second class mining manager or underground foreman under these Regulations must produce such to the board previous to his being examined for a higher certificate, and in the event of the latter being granted, the certificate he holds shall be surrendered and delivered up to the board.

17. Whenever any person proves to the satisfaction of the Board of Examiners that he has, without fault on his part, lost or been deprived of any certificate previously granted to him under these Regulations, such board shall, upon payment of the fee specified in Regulation 5E, cause a copy of the certificate to which the applicant appears to be entitled to be made out and certified to by the secretary to the board, and delivered to the applicant; and any copy so made and certified to as aforesaid, shall have the effect of the original certificate. The fee herein referred to shall be paid to the Secretary for Mines in cash or post-office order, and shall by him be paid into the consolidated revenue.

18. Any person holding a certificate under these Regulations, and who is charged with any offence or misconduct likely to be detrimental to the efficient discharge of his duties, may render himself liable to have his certificate suspended or cancelled by the board.

19. The board will issue first and second class mining managers' certificates for lode, alluvial, and coal mines, and certificates for underground foremen, battery managers, cyanide works managers, and chlorination works managers.

20. Mining managers, 1st class.—Candidates for examination for a first class certificate as mining manager must pass in all the following subjects under the heading of Group "A," and also in all the subjects of one at least of Groups "B," "C," and "D," depending upon the certificate applied for and the nature of the practical experience. The details specified are intended to serve merely as a guide to candidates:—

GROUP "A"—GENERAL.

Arithmetic.—Elementary rules and simple mensuration.
Surveying.—Knowledge of surface and underground surveying, adjustment, and use of level, compass, and theodolite, making of mine plans, and measurement of ore bodies.

Mining.—(a) The laying out and construction of shafts, chambers, levels, winzes, and other underground workings; the methods of timbering or otherwise supporting the workings, and of filling old workings; the tapping of water under pressure.

(b) The drainage of mines and construction of underground dams; the construction and use of safety cages, detaching hooks, apparatus for preventing over-winding, and other safety appliances; the strength of ropes, chains, timber, and other materials.

Blasting, and the nature, properties, and uses of explosives.

Ventilation.—Theory and practice of the various methods of ventilation, construction of air-ways, and the effect of friction; the nature and composition of explosive and dangerous gases.

Machinery.—The principles of action, methods of inspection and testing, and the care of winding and pumping machinery, condensing and non-condensing, air compressors and boilers, electrical appliances.

Surface Work.—Erection of mining plant, and the laying out and construction of tramways, water races, and flumes, and generally all subjects connected with surface works.

Mining Geology.—Methods of testing useful minerals; general principles of geology; knowledge of the more common country rocks; modes of occurrence of lodes, beds, leads, and other mineral deposits; location of shafts; effects of faults.

Book-keeping, mine accounts and cost sheets.

Mining Law.—A knowledge of the regulations under the Mines Acts.

"First Aid."—A knowledge of the principles and practice of "first aid" (oral).

GROUP "B"—LODE MINES.

Lode mine workings; sampling of lodes and ore products; principles of ore dressing; construction, erection, use, and care of appliances for crushing and concentrating.

GROUP "C"—ALLUVIAL MINES.

Alluvial mine workings; construction, erection, use, and care of pumping, puddling, sluicing, and other appliances; hydraulic sluicing.

GROUP "D"—COAL MINES.

Coal mine workings and ventilation; the construction, erection, use, and care of mechanical appliances; screening and weighing of coal.

21. Mining managers, 2nd class.—Candidates for examination for a second class certificate as mining manager must pass in the following subjects, under the heading of Group "A":—Arithmetic, surveying, ventilation, blasting, mining (a) and (b), mining law, and "first aid."

22. Underground foreman.—Candidates for examination for a certificate as underground foreman must pass in the following subjects under the heading of Group "A":—Arithmetic, blasting, mining (a), simple ventilation, mining law, and "first aid."

23. Battery managers.—Candidates for examination for a certificate as battery manager must pass in the following subjects:—Mineral composition of ores; sampling of ore products; construction, adjustment, use, and care of appliances for crushing and concentrating; amalgamating, care, and treatment of copper plates; cleaning up, retorting, and smelting.

24. Cyanide works managers.—Candidates for examination for a certificate as cyanide works manager must pass in the principles and practice of the process, sampling, assaying, design, erection, and working of plant.

25. Chlorination works managers.—Candidates for examination for a certificate as chlorination works manager must pass in the principles and practice of the process, sampling, assaying, design, erection, and working of plant.

And the Honorable Donald McLeod, His Majesty's Minister of Mines for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per ton of 40 cubic feet for firewood, including delivery at the offices and all charges. Prices should only be quoted for requirements where estimates are shown above.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either one or more of the above-mentioned places, and tenders for such places may be accepted or rejected separately; but if all lengths of firewood be included in one tender it may be accepted for one length only, if advisable.

Where the kind or kinds of wood is not mentioned in the tender form, tenderers must specify the kind or kinds of firewood they offer to supply.

Telegrams, or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement, will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for £10, with two approved sureties for the due performance of the contract, within ten days after the acceptance is notified.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Firewood at _____," as the case may be, and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of firewood which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.
2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must be split out of large timber, and must be perfectly sound, dry, and of the kind or kinds specified in the tender; neither burnt wood, heartwood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. The billets must be not less than 4 inches nor more than 6 inches in diameter. The long wood to be not less than 9 inches nor more than 18 inches in diameter. Delivery to be made on the written order of the chief officer of the Department requiring the supply. The ton of firewood consists of 40 cubic feet. If the firewood is obtained from a State forest timber reserve, or ordinary Crown lands, persons cutting and removing same must be provided with proper Crown licences for the particular areas concerned.
3. Orders will be issued half-yearly (except in cases where the storage is small, when they will be issued quarterly); but the contractor must have 24 hours' notice before purchases are made at his risk.
4. The contractor will be bound to place it in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. The stacks are to be 2 feet wide (or 4 feet 6 inches for long wood) by 5 feet high, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets (or lengths) are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. In the event of any inconvenience being felt, either through delay in delivery or of stacking the wood, the Department concerned will purchase the same or re-stack that delivered, at the contractor's risk, from whose account any expense incurred thereby will be deducted.
5. The officer receiving the supply shall have full power to reject any wood which he may consider not in accordance with the contract, notice of which will be given to the contractor in writing, stating the reason. The contractor may, however, claim a survey; but in that case he must, within 48 hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the wood.
6. The board of survey will be composed of persons appointed by the Honorable the Treasurer, and the decision of the board of survey is to be considered as final.
7. If the board of survey shall decide that the supply is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.
8. Accounts for firewood to be rendered to the Department receiving the supply immediately upon completion of the order, which must be attached to the accounts. Payment will be made at the receipt and pay office of the district, or at the Treasury, Melbourne, as the contractor may require.
9. In the event of any irregularity on the part of the contractor being repeated, it will be competent for the Government, in case such irregularity should be established to the satisfaction of the Tender Board, to cancel the contract forthwith.
10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.
11. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract.
12.
