CHAPTER 30.

An Act to declare the law with respect to a marriage between a man and his deceased wife's sister domiciled in parts of the British Possessions where such a marriage is legal. [4th August, 1906.]

BE it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

Legalisation of Colonial Marriages with Deceased Wife's Sister.—1. For removing doubts, it is hereby declared that where a man has, whether before or after the passing of this Act, married his deceased wife's sister, and at the date of the marriage each of the parties was domiciled in a part of the British Possessions in which at that date such a marriage was legal, the marriage if legal in other respects shall be, and shall be deemed always to have been, legal for all purposes, including the right of succession to real property and to honours and dignities, within the United Kingdom, unless either party to the

marriage has subsequently, during the life of the other, but before the passing of this Act, lawfully married another:

Provided that nothing in this Act shall affect any right, interest, or estate to or in any property, dignity, or honour the title to which, whether vested or contingent, and whether in possession, reversion, or remainder, accrued before the passing of this Act, and no claim by the Crown for duties leviable on or with reference to death, and before the passing of this Act due and payable, and no payment, commutation, composition, discharge or settlement of account in respect of any duties leviable on or with reference to death before the passing of this Act duly made or given, shall be prejudicially affected hereby.

Short Title.—2. This Act may be cited as the Colonial Marriages (Deceased Wife's Sister) Act 1906.

THE VICTORIAN POLICE FORCE.

AN Examination of persons who are desirous of being employed in the Victorian Police Force will be held at the Police Depot, St. Kilda-road, Melbourne, at Nine o'clock a.m., on Tuesday, 4th December, 1906.

The forms must be filled up in the candidates' own handwriting, and must be returned to the Depot on or before Tuesday, 27th November, 1906.

Candidates must be over 20 and under 25 years of age, and must be at least 5ft. 9in. in height. They must be smart and active, and free from any bodily complaint or defect. Weight, chest measurement, &c., without clothing, must be in accordance with the following scale:—

They will be subjected to a strict medical examination before being finally selected, and, in addition, will have to undergo another medical examination when they are called in for appointment.

Any candidate found making a false statement to the medical officer will be struck off the list, or, if appointed to the Force prior to the discovery of such false statement, he will be immediately discharged therefrom.

Candidates must be able to read and write well, and must indispensably produce satisfactory testimonials of character.

Applicants who fail to comply with any one or more of the conditions herein stated will not be eligible for examination.

Successful candidates will be enrolled on the condition that their names will be removed from the list should they attain the age of 25 years before they are required for service.

Pensions in the Police Force having been abolished, candidates must effect an insurance on their lives before they can be sworn in.

AMENDMENT IN REGULATION No. X.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-third day of October, 1906.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

WHEREAS by section 23 of the *Education Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1086) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind section 10 of Regulation X. made under the Education Acts, and doth substitute the following section in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

REGULATION X.—CONTINUATION SCHOOL FOR THE TRAINING OF JUNIOR TEACHERS.

10. Notwithstanding anything contained in Regulations No. VII. and No. XI., pupils who have attended for two years at a continuation school for junior teachers, and have passed the examination in the full course of study, and pupils who have passed the Junior Public Examination or some higher examination of the Melbourne University, and have attended for one year at a continuation school for junior teachers, and have passed the examination in the full course of study, shall be held to have preferential claim over all other candidates for appointment as junior teachers, and upon appointment shall without further examination be classified and paid as junior teachers of the third class. The Director shall have power to regard a pass in any subject of the Junior Public Examination or higher examination of the Melbourne University as satisfying the conditions of a pass in any subject of the examination in the full course of study.

And His Excellency, with the advice aforesaid, doth also add the following new sections to Regulation X.:—

12. Training College studentships not exceeding twelve in number in any one year will be granted to pupils of continuation schools who have been in attendance for two years, and who, in addition, have passed the Junior Public Examination or some higher examination of the Melbourne University.

13. Studentships shall be determined by competitive examination held in the last term of the year, and no studentships will be awarded to any candidate who fails to pass a meritorious examination and to secure from the principal a satisfactory report as to conduct and teaching aptitude.

14. The subjects of the competitive examination shall be those prescribed for students at continuation schools who desire to be trained as teachers.

15. Studentships shall be tenable for three years, the first of which shall be spent in gaining practical teaching experience as a junior teacher in an approved school. Students thus employed in the first year of their studentship shall receive the salary of junior teachers of the third class.

16. Holders of studentships who during their first year pass a meritorious examination in methods of teaching the subjects of the Course of Free Instruction as prescribed under Regulation I., shall be admitted to the Training College without further examination, and shall be entitled to all of the privileges of holders of studentships under section 4a of Regulation No. XII.

17. Holders of studentships who at the end of the first year of their studentships fail to enter the Training College may be classified as First Class Junior Teachers from the 1st January next succeeding.

And the Honorable Arthur Otto Sachse, His Majesty's Minister of Public Instruction for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
