IMPORTATION OF TOBACCO INTO THE BRITISH SOLOMON ISLANDS PROTECTORATE.

#### KING'S REGULATION

(Made by His Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific in accordance with the provisions of the Pacific Order in Council, 1893.)

TO PROVIDE FOR THE IMPOSITION OF A DUTY ON TOBACCO IMPORTED INTO THE BRITISH SOLOMON ISLANDS PROTEC-

1. (1) On and after the passing of this Regulation there shall be paid on all tobacco, manufactured or unmanufactured, including cigars and cigarettes, imported into the British Solomon Islands Protectorate, a duty at the rate of One shilling per pound.

(2) Payment of the duty shall be made to His Britannic Majesty's Resident Commissioner for the Protectorate or to such other person as shall be appointed by the High Commissioner to receive the same.

2. This Regulation may be cited for all purposes as "The Solomons (Tobacco) Import Duty Regulation 1906." Published and exhibited in the Public Office of the High Commissioner for the Western Pacific this third day of October, One thousand nine hundred and six.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the previsions of the Factories and Shops Act 1905, and after due inquiry, I, being the responsible Minister for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of sub-section (1) of section 40 of the said Act in the

  1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than twelve females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said twelve females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.

  2. That every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wageworker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.

  3. That every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.

# BOROUGH OF DAYLESFORD WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING BY-LAW FOR 1907.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Act 1905, make the following by-law.

#### BY-LAW NUMBERED 26.

Fixing the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied within the Trust District, such rate being made for the year commencing on the 1st day of January and ending on the 3st day of December, 1907.

The rates and charges which shall be payable by the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust District, who are supplied with water by the Trust, shall be as follows:—

r. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel or wine shop, of the annual value of Twenty pounds or under, the sum of One pound one shilling per annum.

- 2. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel or wine shop, above the annual value of Twenty pounds, and not exceeding the annual value of Two hundred pounds, the sum of Five pounds per cent, per annum on the valuation.
- 3. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel or wine shop, above the annual value of Two hundred pounds, the sum of Four pounds ten shillings per cent, on the valuation.
- 4. On every hotel or wine shop of the annual value of Thirty pounds and under, a minimum rate of Two pounds pot annum.
- 5. On every hotel or wine shop above the annual value of Thirty pounds, the sum of Six pounds per cent, per annum on the valuation, provided that the charge shall not in any case be less than Two pounds.
- 6. On unoccupied lands, and lands on which no tenements are creeted, nor water laid on, the sum of Five pounds per cent, on the annual valuation. Should water be laid on, the charge to be in accordance with the rates fixed in this by-law for tenements.
- 7. On livery, coach, and hotel stables, at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for the first stall, and Seven shillings and sixpence per annum for each additional stall. In open sheds used for stabling, each 6 feet to be considered as one stall. For horses kept on private premises, Ten shillings per annum for the first horse kept, and Seven shillings and sixpence per annum for each additional horse.

Cows to be paid for at the rate of One shilling each per annum.

Water-troughs, Ten shillings each per annum.

- S. Water supplied by meter to be at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, except to manufactories, aerated water makers, &c., to whom the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, provided that not less than 60,000 gallons per annum is consumed, failing which the charge shall be Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.
- 9 Water supplied for irrigation of gardens, nurseries, cricket grounds, &c., to be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum quantity charged for shall be 20,000 gallons per arenum.
- 10. For water supplied to buildings in course of erection, the charge shall be Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of the contract for brickwork, stonework, or plastering; or, should the Trust require a meter to be affixed, the rate shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.
- 11. For water supplied to steam-boilers, the charge shall be at the rate of Ten shillings per horse-power per annum.
- 12. The charge for water supplied for mining purposes shall be as per agreement.
- 13. These rates and charges shall be payable by equal half-yearly instalments, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1907, except in cases where the Trust may have made a special agreement regarding the times of payment for water supplied by measure or for mining purposes.
- 14. Such person or persons as the Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.
- 15. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure, except in the cases of special agreement with the Trust, shall be the quantity for which the charge, at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, wou'd be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate if water was supplied otherwise than by measure.

The foregoing By-law, numbered 26, was made and adopted by the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust this 28th day of September, 1906.

BY-LAW FOR 1907.

A BY-LAW of the Romsey Waterworks Trust, made under the powers conferred by the Water Act 1905, for the purpose of imposing, levying, and receiving a rate.

A rate of One shilling and ninepence in the pound (£1) sterling shall be imposed and levied on all rateable property in the Romsey Waterworks District, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of Romsey in which such lands and tenements are situated, for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1907, and ending on the 3rst day of December, 1907.

The rate hereby made shall be payable and collected in two portions or instalments of Elevenpence and Tenpence respectively, and the first portion or instalment shall be due and payable on 2nd January, 1907, and the econd portion or instalment shall be due and payable on 2nd July, 1907.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Romsey Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover all rates and charges due to the said Trust.

#### CARISBROOK WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1907.

THE Commissioners of the Carisbrook Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the Water Act 1905, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following by-law, viz.:—

#### BY-LAW NO. 14.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1907, in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said Urban District:—

- 1. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds or under, the sum of One pound sterling.
- 2. For every house or tenement of above Ten pounds, and not more than Fifteen pounds annual municipal value, of a rate of Two shillings in the pound according to such value.
- 3. For every house or tenement of above Fifteen pounds, and not more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.
- 4. For every house or tenement of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal value and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound ner annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.
- 5. For every house or tenement, not being used as a domicile, of Ten pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.
- 6. For every house or tenement, not being used as a domicile, of above Ten pounds, and not more than Fifteen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings in the pound, according to such value.
- 7 For every house or tenement, not being used as a domicile, of above Fifteen pounds, and not more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.

- 8. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile, of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal valuation and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound per annum upon the municipal value of such property.
- o. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling; over Twenty pounds municipal value, One shilling in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.
- ro. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement for domestic and other than domestic purposes, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at the price named, would be equal to the rate payable in respect of the property so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- 11. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent, on the amount of contract for stone work, or brick work, and plastering, or, if there be no contract, then upon the value of the amount charged or fixed for such stone work, brick work, and plastering.
- 12. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement, the charge shall be One shilling per 1.000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the cylinder of the engine.

BY-LAW FOR MAKING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES.

# REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE EDENHOPE TOWN COMMON.

N pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Compress in Commons The pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the 8th day of January, 1902, the managers of the Edenhope Towa Common, having drafted the following Regulations for the management of the said Common, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such Common.

#### REGULATIONS.

No. 1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licences, or carriers' licences, and farmers residing within five (5) miles of the Common may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole, or a portion thereof, in small cattle, on the basis that one (1) head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle.

No. 2. No person shall be allowed to depasture on the Common stock of which he is not the bond fide owner.

No. 3. The fees for depasturing stock on the Common shall be as follow, and shall be payable quarterly, in advance, on the 1st day of January, the 1st day of April, the 1st day of July, and the 1st day of October in every year, and the owners of stock registered during the currency of any quarter shall pay the agistment fees for the whole of such quarter:-

- (a) For every horse, mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, or mule, 2s. 6d. per quarter.
   (b) For every head of other large cattle, 2s. per

- (b) For every nead of quarter, quarter, (c) For every head of small cattle, is, per quarter, (a) Fillies, colts, and calves, under the age of six (6) months, the progeny of dams, on the Common,

No. 4. No entire house over six (6) months old shall be allowed on the Common, nor any bull over the age of six (5) months, nor any other animal which, in the opinion of the managers, is likely to prove a nuisance.

No. 5. All stock depastured on the Common and registred the previous quarter, on which the fees shall remain unpaid for a period of seven (7) days after the commencement of the next quarter, shall be liable to be treated as trespassers, and all stock not registered the previous quarter shall forthwith be treated as trespassers.

No. 6. All horned cattle, after the fees in respect thereof are paid, shall have the proper tags attached by the owners, unless instructions have been given by the managers to attach the tags to such cattle before being placed on the Common.

No. 7. The herdsman shall, at his own expense; release from the pound all stock registered for the Common.

No. S. No bullocks or horses belonging to carriers, unless entitled to commonage, shall remain more than twenty-four (24) hours on the Common, unless detained by accident or stress of weather.

No. 9. No person shall remove registered stock from the Common without the consent, in writing, of the herdsman or the managers.

No. 10. No animal affected with any contagious disease shall be allowed to depasture on the Common, and any animal so affected, if not removed by the owner thereof within twenty-four (24) hours after notice to do so, shall be liable to be destroyed at the discretion of the managers.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for each offence.

Every person driving, riding, or impelling any motor car, motor, cycle, or beycle shall keep the same upon the near or left-hand side of the road, and whenever overtaking any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, such person shall keep to the right or off side thereof; and any such person overtaking any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, or any foot passenger proceeding along the road, such person shall within a reasonable distance from or before passing such waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle or such horse or other beast of burden, or such foot passenger, by sounding a bell or horn, give audible and sufficient warning of his or her approach.
