ACT OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Reginald Arthur James Talbot, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of the said State, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

“An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Three hundred and sixty-one thousand and ninety-one pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and six and One thousand nine hundred and seven.”

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this fourth day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and six, and in the sixth year of His Majesty's reign.

SHIRE OF LILLYDALE.

BY-LAW No. 15.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Lillydale, in the name of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. All former By-laws, so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law, are hereby repealed.
2. This By-law shall come into force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the township of Ringwood in the area set out in clause 12 hereto, but it shall cease to apply to any portion or portions of the said area that may from time to time be exempted from its operation by special order of the Council.
4. The occupier of any premises in which there is a closet or privy shall cause the space under the seat of each closet or privy on such premises to be prepared and shall permit the same to be used for the double pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.
5. The Council shall cause each closet or privy to be supplied or kept supplied with two pans for the reception of night-soil and a lid to closely fit the same, and shall cause one or other of such pans to be kept under the seat aforesaid.
6. The occupier aforesaid or other person having control or management of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil deposited in the pan of such closet or privy to be immediately, on the deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.
7. The Council shall at least once a week cause the pan in use to be closed with a lid and removed with its contents from the premises in the day-time, and the other pan to be left in its place.
8. Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy the Council shall cause the same to be cleansed by superheated steam and tar-painted inside, or by some equally efficient means.
9. The occupier aforesaid or other person shall not contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises, except in accordance with this By-law.

10. The Council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate, to make a charge on each occupier for the pans supplied and for the removal of night-soil and other work herein directed, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any court of petty sessions.

11. If any person or the Council commit a breach of the By-law, he or they shall for every breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

12. The sanitary area for Ringwood shall be as follows:—

THE MUNICIPAL CEMETERY, FAWKNER.—
REGULATIONS.

PART II.

REGULATIONS made by the Trustees of the Municipal Cemetery, Fawkner, for the management of the cemetery by the managers thereof.

1. The managers shall, at their first meeting, and thereafter annually, elect one of their number to be chairman. If any vacancy occur in the office of chairman during any year the managers shall elect one of their number to be chairman for the balance of the year.
2. The managers shall hold regular meetings for the transaction of the business of the cemetery, and shall hold at least one such meeting each calendar month.
3. Such meetings shall be held at such times and places as the managers shall by resolution direct, and two clear days' notice of all such meetings shall be given to the managers, and also to the trustees, and specifying the business to be transacted thereat.
4. At any meeting of such managers five shall form a quorum.
5. The managers shall keep proper books of record of the business transacted by them, and minutes of their proceedings.
6. The managers shall furnish to the trustees reports of the business transacted at such meeting within one week after such meetings shall have been held.
7. The managers shall keep proper books of account, and shall furnish to the trustees each month a statement of the receipts and expenditure for the preceding month; they shall also furnish in the months of July and January in each year audited statements of their receipts and expenditure for the half-years ending 30th June and 31st December in each year.
8. The managers shall in the month of June in each year appoint an auditor, to audit the books and accounts of the cemetery for the current year.
9. The managers shall, at the same meeting as they elect their chairman, also appoint one of their number, other than the chairman, to be honorary treasurer.
10. The managers shall, in the month of November in each year, prepare statements of their estimated receipts and expenditure for the ensuing year, and shall furnish copies of such statements to the trustees at least two weeks prior to adopting same.
11. The managers shall not make any payments other than for salaries and wages, except such as shall have been authorized at a duly constituted meeting of the managers.

12. All cheques shall be signed by the chairman of the managers, the hon. treasurer, and the secretary, or as the managers may from time to time direct.

13. The managers shall prepare in due course and in proper form abstracts of accounts, declarations, and returns, which the trustees are required by law to prepare and to publish or transmit to the Board of Public Health or otherwise.

14. The managers shall keep all books of record and registers which the trustees are by law required to keep.

15. All certificates of right of burial in the cemetery shall be signed by the chairman and one other of the managers and by the secretary.

16. The managers shall have power to appoint all officers, servants, and employes necessary for the management of the cemetery, and such officers, servants, and employes shall hold office at the will of the managers, and under such terms and conditions, and at such remunerations as the managers may approve.

4. On all other unoccupied allotments or pieces of land within the Waterworks District and not rated under the foregoing clause, a minimum rate of Five shillings (5s.) shall be charged.

5. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1907.

6. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose is or are hereby authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates.

KOROIT WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1907.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Koroit Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the *Water Act 1905*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following By-law, viz.:—

The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of land and tenements liable to be rated within the Trust District shall pay for the year 1907:—

1. For every house or tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds sterling or under, according to the valuation for the time being of such rateable property for the municipal rate of the Borough of Koroit, the sum of One pound per annum.
 2. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds sterling, the sum of Two shillings on each pound of such value.
 3. An annual charge of Five shillings per head shall be made for each head of stock more than two (whether horse or cattle) kept on any premises along the line of mains, unless meters are placed on the service-pipes to such premises, in which case the provision of clause 3 of the General Regulations shall apply.
 4. Such rates are hereby made payable, in equal moieties, on 1st January and 1st July, 1907.
- Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Koroit Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and collect the said rates.

SHIRE OF TUNGAMAH WATERWORKS TRUST.—
RATING BY-LAW FOR 1907 IN THE URBAN
DISTRICT OF TUNGAMAH.

By-law No. 40.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shire of Tungamah Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, do hereby make the following By-law:—

The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of land and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1907, in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of Tungamah, as such district has been proclaimed and defined:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds or under, the sum of One pound.
2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of the annual municipal value of Twenty-five pounds and not less than Ten pounds, a rate of Two shillings in the pound of such value.
3. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of One hundred pounds and not less than Twenty-five pounds, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound of such value, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Two pounds ten shillings per annum.
4. For every house or tenement of a value exceeding the annual municipal value of One hundred pounds, a rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound of such value, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Seven pounds ten shillings per annum.
5. For every allotment or piece of land vacant or not built upon, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the annual municipal value of such land, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Ten shillings.
6. For every water trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the amount of Two pounds per annum.
7. For water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust, Two shillings and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than the amount of the assessed rate that would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure (and except in cases where the Trust has made special agreements).
8. A minimum of Ten shillings and a maximum of Two pounds to every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year.
9. Such rates and charges are hereby made payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1907.
10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

WANGARATTA WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
BY-LAW FOR 1907.

THE Wangaratta Waterworks Trust, whose Waterworks District has been proclaimed an Urban District, doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the *Water Act 1905*, make the following By-law:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements situated

within the aforesaid Waterworks District shall pay for the year 1907, in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes by the Trust.

- (a) On lands and tenements of the annual municipal value of £20 or under (except in the case of land on which there is no building), the sum of One pound sterling (£1).
- (b) On lands and tenements above the annual value of £20 (except in the case of land on which there is no building), the sum of (£5) Five pounds per centum on the amount of the municipal valuation.
- (c) On land on which there is no building, the sum of Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) per centum on the amount of the municipal valuation.
- (d) The charges for the supply of water otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum, except in the case of land on which there is no building, in which case the charge shall not be less than Five shillings per annum.
- (e) For water supplied by stand-pipes or hydrant, Sixpence (6d.) per load not exceeding 100 gallons shall be paid.
- (f) Water supplied by meter shall be charged for at the rate of (2s.) Two shillings per 1,000 gallons up to the amount of the assessed rate in respect of the premises so supplied, and (1s.) One shilling per 1,000 gallons for water used over the amount of the assessed rate, subject to any special agreement for the supply of water that may be entered into by the Trust with any person. In cases where the supply of water is solely for purposes other than domestic, the minimum charge shall be for 10,000 gallons per annum.
- (g) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by meter where water is supplied for domestic purposes as well as for purposes other than domestic, shall be the quantity which, at the rate of Two shillings (2s.) per 1,000 gallons equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (h) Such rates and charges shall be payable, in advance, by two equal half-yearly instalments, on the first day of January, 1907, and the first day of July, 1907, respectively.

2. Such person or persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates and charges.

The foregoing By-law was made and passed by the Commissioners of the Wangaratta Waterworks Trust this 13th day of November, 1907.

YARRAWONGA URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.—
RATING BY-LAW FOR 1907.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, and all other powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following Regulation:—

By-law for determining the rates and charges which shall be made for water supplied within the boundaries of the Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust District:—

1. A rate of One shilling in the pound sterling on the annual municipal value of all rateable property valued at Twenty-five pounds sterling and upwards (except in cases of special arrangement with the Trust), situate within the Waterworks District of the Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust, is hereby made for the year 1907.

2. Upon properties of the annual municipal value of Thirteen pounds sterling, and not more than Twenty-four pounds sterling, a rate of One pound five shillings sterling per annum shall be payable. Upon properties valued at Twelve pounds sterling and under, a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be payable, according to the municipal value of such properties, provided that in no case shall a less rate than Twenty shillings per annum be payable, in accordance with section 261 of the *Water Act 1905*.

3. On each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust's District before mentioned, separately from any building, the annual rate of Ten pounds sterling per centum on the annual valuation of the same shall be payable.

4. Water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons up to an amount equal to that which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any premises, and at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons for any quantity of water used beyond such an amount aforesaid. Nevertheless it shall be competent for the Trust to make special arrangements from time to time for the supply of water by meter or otherwise.

5. For any public water trough supplied with water by the Trust, the sum of Forty shillings per annum shall be charged, unless supplied by measurement.

6. For any steam-boiler supplied with water by the Trust (except in cases of special arrangement with the Trust), the sum of Thirty shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam-boiler in addition to the charge for domestic use where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In case the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power, a charge by measurement shall be made.

7. Water supplied to Government Departments, cricket grounds, show grounds, cattle-yards, and similar properties shall be charged for by measure, provided the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than Thirty shillings per annum, or the charge may be made by special arrangement with the Trust.

8. For water supplied from stand-pipe or hydrant, for each load of 200 gallons or under, the sum of Sixpence, and for each additional load *pro rata* on the above scale.

9. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, repairs, or additions, Twenty shillings per centum on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or, in the absence of a contract, of the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or the Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement.

10. A minimum rate of Five shillings and a maximum rate of Forty shillings per annum shall be chargeable to persons using water for ornamental, garden, or other like purposes; and any owner or occupier using more water than (in the opinion of the Trust or its officer) they are entitled to, the Trust may compel such owner or occupier to put on a meter, or may cut off the water supply from such premises. No water shall be used for any purpose whatsoever other than purely domestic use, except between the hours of Seven o'clock a.m. and Eight o'clock p.m.

11. For each spray supplied with water by the Trust for the purpose of cooling houses, the sum of Ten shillings per annum shall be chargeable in addition to the charges under any previous clause of this Regulation, provided that such spray shall only be used between the hours of Seven o'clock a.m. and Eight o'clock p.m.

12. Such rates are hereby made for the year 1907, and are made payable in equal moieties half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in the year, excepting those by measure, which shall be paid quarterly, or as the Trust may direct.

13. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates.

LICENCES TO DIVERT WATER FROM ANY RIVER, CREEK, STREAM, OR WATER-COURSE, LAKE, LAGOON, SWAMP, OR MARSH OTHER THAN THOSE FLOWING THROUGH, SITUATE UPON, OR BOUNDED BY CROWN LANDS, OR OF WHICH THE BED AND BANKS ARE NOT VESTED IN THE CROWN.

REGULATIONS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fourth day of December, 1906.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

WHEREAS by section 370 of the *Water Act 1905*, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make regulations providing for the execution of any matter or thing arising under and consistent with the Act and for more fully carrying out the objects and purposes thereof: And whereas it is expedient that the Governor in Council should make regulations for providing for the grant to any corporation or to any person or persons whomsoever of a licence to take or divert water from any river, creek, stream, or water-course, lake, lagoon, swamp, or marsh other than those flowing through, situate upon, or bounded by Crown lands, or of which the bed and banks are not vested in the Crown for the purpose of conserving or supplying water, or of supplying water-power, or for any other purpose: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth, in the exercise of the authority conferred by the said section 370 of the said *Water Act 1905*, make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

INTERPRETATION OF TERMS.

"Governor in Council" shall mean the Governor acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council. "Minister" shall mean the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the *Water Act 1905*. "The Act" or "the said Act" means the *Water Act 1905*. "Commission" means the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission. "Authority" means any body or persons empowered by or under this Act to construct or to manage and control waterworks, and includes the Board of Land and Works, the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, any waterworks trust, any local governing body, and the Ballarat Water Commissioners, as the case may be. "Applicant" or "intending applicant" respectively means any person or body corporate applying for, or intending to apply for, a licence under these Regulations. Words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed to include females, and the singular to include the plural, unless the contrary as to number or gender is expressly provided.

COMPUTATION OF TIME.

In all cases in which any particular number of days is prescribed in these Regulations, the same shall be reckoned exclusively of the first day and inclusively of the last day, unless the last day shall fall upon a Sunday or holiday, in which case the time shall be reckoned exclusively of that day also.

REGULATIONS UNDER SECTION 370 OF THE
WATER ACT 1905, No. 2016.

LICENCES TO DIVERT WATER FROM ANY RIVER, CREEK, STREAM, OR WATER-COURSE, LAKE, LAGOON, SWAMP, OR MARSH OTHER THAN THOSE FLOWING THROUGH, SITUATE UPON, OR BOUNDED BY CROWN LANDS, OR OF WHICH THE BED AND BANKS ARE NOT VESTED IN THE CROWN.

1. *Publication of notice of intention to apply for a licence—First Schedule.*—Every intending applicant for a licence to take or divert water from any river, creek, stream, or water-course, lake, lagoon, swamp, or marsh, other than those flowing through, situate upon, or bounded by Crown lands, or of which the bed and banks are not vested in the Crown, for any purpose whatsoever other than for mining purposes, shall publish in the *Government Gazette* and in three consecutive issues of some newspaper circulating generally in the locality where the proposed point of offtake or diversion is situate, a notice in the form of the First Schedule to

these Regulations, or to the like effect, and such notice shall be dated the first day of its publication as aforesaid, and shall be signed by the intending applicant.

2. *Copy of notice to be given to Authority or Municipal Officers in certain cases.*—If the proposed point of off-take or diversion be within or adjoin the district of any Authority or Municipality, a copy of such notice shall, within seven days of the date of the first publication of the original notice, be delivered to the secretary or other proper officer of such Authority or Municipality at the corporate office of such body.

3. *Application to be forwarded to Commission—Second Schedule.*—Within a month after the first publication of such notice as aforesaid the applicant shall forward to the Commission an application in writing for such licence, containing all the information and particulars provided for in the form of the Second Schedule to these Regulations, together with a copy of each issue of the newspaper containing such notice; and the application shall be in the form or to the effect of such schedule.

4. *Commission may require further particulars.*—In addition to the notice of application, and to the particulars furnished in and by the said application, the Commission, for the purpose of dealing with such application, may require the applicant to publish or give such further notice, or to supply such further details, or such plans and descriptions of any works proposed to be carried out by the applicant in connexion with the diversion of the water as to it may appear necessary, or for the purpose aforesaid may require the applicant to have made such surveys, or such further surveys, or to do such other acts as to it (the Commission) may appear necessary.

5. *Particulars to be given of race to be constructed under licence.*—The extent to which the applicant, for the purpose of raising, conveying, or using the water to be diverted, desires to cut, construct, and use any race through or upon any lands must be shown in his published notice of intention to apply for a licence, and must set forth the situation, course, and dimensions of the proposed race; and his application for the licence must be accompanied by a plan showing the course and dimensions of such proposed race and the point of off-take or diversion.

6. *Commission in certain cases may waive the necessity for compliance with foregoing provisions.*—Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the Commission may, as it shall see fit, waive the necessity for a compliance with any of the provisions of the foregoing clauses of this part of these Regulations in any case in which the applicant shall apply for a renewal only for a licence previously obtained for the diversion of water in the same quantity and from the same source and off-take, and where the works are upon the same plan of construction, and where the term of such former licence shall not have exceeded five years, and provided that such renewal or further licence shall be applied for within three calendar months from the date at which the term of the former licence shall have expired.

7. *Notice of objection.*—Any person or corporation desirous of objecting to the issue of any licence shall, within thirty days after the date of the first publication of the notice of application for a licence required by this part of these Regulations, send written notice of objection to the Commission, and such notice shall state the grounds of objection.

8. *A copy of notice of objection to be forwarded to applicant.*—Upon receipt of any such notice of objection the Commission shall cause to be forwarded forthwith, through the post office, to the applicant a copy thereof.

9. *Commission to consider all applications and objections.*—After the expiration of the said period of thirty days, and after all necessary particulars relating to the application shall, in the opinion of the Commission, have been obtained, and all necessary inquiries made, but not before, the Commission shall consider every such application and all objections (if any) thereto, and after being satisfied that all the requirements of this part of these Regulations and of the said Act are complied with, may accordingly, as it may seem to it right to do, recommend the Governor in Council either to grant or refuse the licence applied for.

10. *Commission's recommendation to Governor in Council as to grant or refusal of licence.*—In its recommendation as aforesaid as to the granting of any licence the Commission may recommend that such licence be granted, but subject always to the provisions of the said Act, for such term not exceeding fifteen years, and upon payment of such rent or annual fee or price by measurement of water diverted, and upon such conditions and subject to such covenants as to it may seem proper.

11. *Notification of grant or refusal of licence.*—Notification of the granting or refusal of every licence shall also be published in the *Government Gazette*.

12. *Form of licence—Third Schedule.*—Every licence may be in the form or to the effect of the Third Schedule to these Regulations, or in such other form as the Governor in Council may deem to be necessary to meet the circumstances of each case, and may be issued for any term not exceeding fifteen years, and may contain all or such only of the conditions following as the Governor in Council may in each case think necessary for prescribing:—

- (a) The point of diversion or off-take.
- (b) The maximum quantity of water which, so far as the Crown has the right to divert, may be diverted within a given period of time, or during such time or times as the quantity of water in the source of supply may equal or exceed a given quantity, or regulated according to the months or season of the year.
- (c) The purpose or purposes for which the water is to be diverted.
- (d) The point at which water diverted, if for motive power purposes only, is to be returned to the source of supply.
- (e) The manner and condition in which such water shall be returned.
- (f) The number, nature, and situation of the appliances, gauges, or meters (if any) to be used in measuring the water diverted or returned.
- (g) The price to be paid to the Commission by the licensee for the water diverted, whether by a rent, fixed annual payment, or by payment by measurement of water diverted, and where the water in the source of supply may be either increased in quantity, regulated in volume, or improved in quality by the works of any other person, or any body corporate, the amount to be paid by the licensee in addition to the said payment to the Commission to such person or body corporate, and the times and mode of such payment.
- (h) The works, machinery, apparatus, or appliances by means of which the water is to be diverted.

13. *Provisoes.*—Every licence, in whatever form the same may be issued, shall contain provisions for—

- (a) The revocation of the licence by the Governor in Council at any time upon payment of the compensation provided for in section 217 of the said Act, and no other compensation whatsoever, to the body or person entitled to the benefit of the licence.
- (b) The removal by the licensee, when required, of all works, appliances, and machinery used for the purpose of the licence, at the expiration or sooner determination of the licence, whether such earlier determination be by revocation of the licence, by forfeiture, or otherwise.
- (c) The determination of the licence upon breach by the licensee of any of the covenants or conditions thereof, and the removal or destruction by any person duly authorized in that behalf by the Commission of the works, appliances, and machinery which may have been used for the purposes of the licence, without any claim for outlay or compensation by the licensee, or body, or person entitled to the benefit of the licence.

And of such other or additional conditions, stipulations, and provisos, consistent with the provisions of the said Act, as the Governor in Council, having regard to the purposes and circumstances of each licence, may think fit to impose.

14. *Plan to be indorsed upon licence.*—Every licence under this part of these Regulations shall have indorsed thereon, or attached thereto, a plan showing the position of all works to be constructed or used in connexion with the purposes of the licence, including the course of all races to be cut or constructed, and the point of diversion and of return (if any) of water diverted.

15. *Fee for preparation of licence.*—Such reasonable fee shall be paid for the preparation of any licence granted under this part of these Regulations as shall in each case be determined by the Commission.

SECOND SCHEDULE.—CLAUSE 3 OF REGULATIONS.

To the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission,
I, the undersigned, hereby make application as hereunder for a licence authorizing me to divert certain water from the _____ at a point situate in the parish of _____ for the purpose of—

16. *License in special form may be granted.*—Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the Governor in Council may, should he see fit, in any case in which all the requirements of this part of these Regulations have been fully complied with, and in which the Governor in Council shall consider that the special circumstances so require, on the recommendation of the Commission, grant a licence in such special form, whether by deed or otherwise, as may be applicable thereto; and such licence shall be issued in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, upon such terms, and subject to such conditions and stipulations, and upon payment to the Commission of such rent, annual payment, or payment by measurement of the water diverted, as the Governor in Council may think fit.

17. *Transfer of licence.*—Upon the application in writing of any proposed transferor and transferee of any licence under this part of these Regulations, the Governor in Council may, on the recommendation of the Commission, by indorsement upon any licence issued under these Regulations, authorize the transfer of such licence to such proposed transferee for the residue of the term thereof; and the same may thereupon be transferred by indorsement accordingly.

18. *Notification of transfer.*—A notification of every such transfer shall be published in the *Government Gazette*.

19. *Fee for transfer.*—The fee for every such transfer shall be One pound, and shall be payable to any officer named in that behalf by the Commission.

20. *Commission may require applicant to deposit money as security for compensation.*—The Commission may, before recommending the granting of any licence, if it think fit, require the applicant to deposit such sum of money as it may think may be sufficient to be held by him as security for the payment by the applicant of the compensation to any person entitled to compensation under section 217 of the Act, in consequence of any entry or of the cutting, construction, or using of any races under any licence; and the Commission may apply such sum or part thereof in payment or in part payment of any sum or sums awarded or fixed in accordance with the provisions of the *Lands Compensation Act 1890*, as such Act is incorporated with and modified by the *Water Act 1905*.

21. *Notification of revocation of licence.*—The revocation of any licence granted under these Regulations before the expiration of the term thereof shall be notified in the *Government Gazette*.

22. *Renewal of licence.*—Every licence granted under these Regulations may, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be renewed from time to time by indorsement upon the original licence; for such further term, and subject to such consideration, as the Governor in Council, on the recommendation of the Commission, shall think fit, and every such renewal shall be notified in the *Government Gazette*.

And, also licence and authority to divert water from—(Here describe the source from which the water is to be taken, stating off-take and all other particulars—to the extent specified as follows—(Here describe the maximum quantity and provide for the return of the minimum proportion to be returned (if any) at a point lower down the stream, referring to plan or schedule as necessary for clearness). To hold and enjoy the licence hereby granted unto the licensee, his executors, administrators, and assigns for the term of _____ years from the day of _____, determinable, however, as hereinafter provided. Yielding and paying unto His Majesty, his heirs and successors during the continuance of the said term at the times and in the manner hereinafter provided the rent following, that is to say—(Here set out the rent or price to be paid for the water, whether by fixed rent, annual payment, or price by measurement of water diverted. If the water is to be used for any specific purpose, here set out the purpose, commencing with the words, "and the water to be so diverted under this licence shall be used for the purpose following, that is to say." Here, if required, a clause authorizing distress for water rent may be inserted). And the said licensee doth hereby for himself, his executors, administrators, and assigns, covenant with His Majesty, his heirs and successors, in manner following, that is to say, that he will pay the said rent on the days and in the manner hereinbefore reserved during the continuance of the said term, and a proportionate part of such rent if the said term shall be determined between any two of such

periodical days of payment. And further, that the licensee, his executors, administrators, and assigns will, to the satisfaction of the Commission or of such officer as the Commission may appoint, erect, maintain, cleanse, and keep in good working order all such meters, water gauges, and other apparatus as the Commission may consider necessary to effectually measure (or where water has to be returned all water returned), and so that not merely the rent to be paid may be ascertained and recorded, but also whether any excess of water beyond the maximum quantity of water allowed by this licence has been at any time diverted. And further, that the said licensee, his executors, administrators, or assigns will not at any time divert any greater quantity of water than the maximum quantity authorized to be diverted under this licence (in case of important streams this covenant may be made in detail). And it is agreed that these presents and the licence hereby granted are made upon this express condition that if the licensee, his executors, administrators, or assigns shall at any time during the said term, either through wilfulness, carelessness, negligence, or unskillfulness divert or cause to be diverted any water in excess of the maximum quantity which can be diverted under the authority of these presents, then and in any such case this licence and the term granted by these presents shall cease and determine and become of none effect. And the said licensee, his executors, administrators, and assigns further covenants with His Majesty, his heirs and successors that he will not during the said term without permission in writing of the Governor in Council assign the water right the subject of these presents. Provided also that these presents are upon this further express condition, that, if and whenever the said rent shall be in arrear for twenty-one days, whether the same shall have been demanded or not, or if and whenever there shall be a breach of any of the covenants or conditions by the licensee herein contained, the licence hereby granted shall absolutely determine. And these presents are upon this further condition, that, if at any time during the continuance of the licence hereby granted His Majesty, his heirs and successors, or the Commission shall desire to revoke licence and to put an end to the term hereby granted, His Majesty, his heirs and executors, or the Commission shall be entitled to do so upon giving three months' notice in writing of such intention under the seal of the Commission. And upon the expiration of three months from the giving of such notice this licence and the term hereby granted shall cease and determine.

REGULATIONS WITH RESPECT TO THE INTRODUCTION INTO VICTORIA FROM THE STATE OF NEW SOUTH WALES OF LIVE STOCK IN CONNEXION WITH THE DISEASE KNOWN AS ANTHRAX.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fourth day of December, 1906.

HIS Excellency the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers conferred upon him by section 267 of the *Health Act 1890*, and section 4 of the *Stock Diseases Act 1890*, and all other powers him enabling in that behalf, deeming it necessary and expedient to further regulate the introduction into Victoria from the State of New South Wales, where the disease of anthrax (being a disease in sheep, cattle, horses, and other animals) is known to exist, of sheep, cattle, and horses (which said sheep, cattle, and horses are hereinafter included under the term stock): Doth now therefore ordain as follows (that is to say):—

1. The Regulations made by the Governor in Council under the *Health Act 1890* and the *Stock Diseases Act 1890*, on the eighth day of October, 1900, and on the twenty-first day of October, 1901, respectively, and clause 1 of the Regulations made on the thirtieth day of October, 1899, are hereby repealed.

2. No unvaccinated stock shall be introduced into Victoria from that part of New South Wales included in schedule A, or from such other parts as may from time to time be proclaimed by the Governor in Council, unless the stock is accompanied by a certificate, in the form of schedule B, from the New South Wales Inspector of Stock of the district from which the stock came that such stock is free from anthrax, and that the property from which such stock came, and the roads or routes by which such stock will travel, or have travelled, to the Victorian border while passing through the district under his charge are free from anthrax. Should any such stock travel by road through any district in New South Wales other than that from which the stock came, the Inspector of every such district shall indorse the original certificate to the effect that the roads or routes by which such stock will pass or have passed while travelling through his district are free from anthrax. Such certificate must be produced and handed over to the Victorian Inspector of every such district shall indorse the original to introduce any such stock into Victoria.

3. If it is desired to introduce any vaccinated stock from New South Wales into Victoria, all such vaccinated stock must be accompanied by a certificate of successful vaccination from an operator approved by the Chief Inspector of Stock, and the owner, or agent for the owner, of any such stock shall make and deliver to the Victorian Inspector of Stock, at the crossing at which it is desired to introduce such stock, a declaration in the form or to the effect of schedule C.

4. Such of the Regulations for the time being in force under the *Stock Diseases Act 1890* as are not inconsistent herewith shall be read and construed as incorporated in these Regulations.

And the Honorable George Swinburne, His Majesty's Minister of Agriculture for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the *Thistle Act 1893*, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation declare a certain plant named—

Ulex Europæus, commonly known as "Farze,"

to be a thistle within the meaning of the *Thistle Act 1890* throughout the Shire of Templestowe.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this fourth day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and six, and in the sixth year of His Majesty's reign.

2. The quantities stated in the schedule are only approximate, and the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned. Should new telegraph stations be formed or additional horses be required at any station, the contractor will be required to supply the extra forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, and also forage for any extra horses that may be at any time stabled at the depot for police purposes, at the same rates. The contract for the supply of forage to the Military Barracks may be terminated by three months' notice being given by the Secretary to the Tender Board to the contractor of such determination.

4. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

5. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

6. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.

7. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue to either party by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, but he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 4.

8. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.

TOWN OF PORT MELBOURNE.

By-Law No. 87.

A By-law of the Town of Port Melbourne, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, for the purpose of regulating traffic.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Port Melbourne, order as follows:—

1. No person shall at one and the same time act as driver or have the sole charge of more than one cart, dray, or other vehicle drawn by animal power on any public road or street of the town, and no person in charge of any such horse, cart, dray, or other vehicle shall during the time he is in charge of and whilst such cart, dray, or other vehicle is in motion ride in any cart, dray, or other vehicle other than the one which he is charge of or be at such time more than 6 feet away from such vehicle.

2. No person under the age of sixteen years shall act as the driver of any vehicle driven within the said town for business or trade purposes.

3. This by-law to apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Town of Port Melbourne.

4. Any person offending against the provisions of this by-law to forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

The resolution for passing this by-law was agreed to by the Council on the 23rd day of October, 1906, and confirmed on the 4th day of December, 1906.

SHIRE OF ARARAT.

By-Law No. 5.

A By-law of the Shire of Ararat, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered five, for regulating or prohibiting the keeping of any place or the keeping or storage of any animal (including birds) or thing in the opinion of the Council offensive, injurious to health, or dangerous.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Ararat order as follows:—

1. That from and after the date of coming into operation of this by-law, no pig or pigs shall be kept within a radius of half-a-mile of the railway station in the township of Willaura.

2. That every person guilty of any breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding the sum of Five pounds for every day during which he so offends.
