Caution.—Any person wilfully making a false statement in an application is liable on conviction to two years' imprisonment.

# BOORT WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING BY-LAW FOR 1907.

**B**y virtue of the *Water Act 1905*, By-law for imposing, levying, and receiving water rates and charges within the Boort Waterworks Trust District.

1. The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Boort Waterworks Trust District shall pay for the year 1907, namely:—

2. On every house or tenement abutting or fronting every street within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the purpose of supplying water, and such house or tenement being of the annual value of Eighteen pounds or less, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement for the said year, the sum of One pound seven shillings.

3. On every house or tenement abutting or fronting any street within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the purpose of supplying water, and such house or tenement being above the annual value of Eighteen pounds, according to the municipal valuation for the said year, the sum of One shilling and sixpence in the pound of such valuation.

4. On every house or tenement not abutting or fronting a street within which the Trust shall have laid down a main pipe for the supply of water, and to which house or tenement the water shall not have been laid on, a rate of Thirteen shillings and sixpence shall be paid where the municipal valuation of such house or tenement does not exceed Eighteen pounds. Where such valuation exceeds Eighteen pounds, a rate of Ninepence in the pound shall be paid, provided that in no case shall a rate of less than Thirteen shillings and sixpence be paid.

5. In every case where the water shall have been laid on to a house or tenement not abutting or fronting a street within which the Trust shall have laid down a pipe for the purpose of supplying water, the rates provided by clauses 2 and 3 of this Regulation shall be paid. Also that any ratepayer who may be considered to be using an undue quantity of water shall be compelled by the Trust to provide a meter; water to be charged for at the rate of One shilling per (1,000) thousand gallons.

6. The above rate shall be due and payable on the 1st day of May, 1907.

7. Such persons or person as the Trust may appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates.

# ELMORE WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1907.

**T**HE Commissioners of the Elmore Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the *Water Act 1905*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the By-law following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1907 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Water Supply District:—

1. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments of the annual municipal value of Sixteen pounds (£16) and under, the sum of £1 per annum shall be paid.

2. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments of the annual municipal value of Seventeen pounds (£17) and upwards, a rate of One shilling and threepence (1s. 3d.) in the pound shall be paid.

3. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant lands shall be One shilling and threepence (1s. 3d.) in the pound, according to the municipal valuation, provided that in no case shall a rate of less than Twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.) be paid.

4. For water supplied to public troughs, a charge of Two pounds (£2) shall be made, provided that no person shall be charged for more than one trough.

5. Any water supplied to troughs, other than public troughs, must be paid for by meter, or by special agreement, at such rates, upon such terms, and subject to such conditions as the Trust and the person requiring such supply may agree to adopt.

6. For water supplied by measure, a charge of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons shall be made, except in the case of special agreement with the Trust.

7. The foregoing rates are made payable in equal moieties on 1st January and 1st July, 1907.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

THE Commissioners of the Heathcote Waterworks Trust, in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, hereby make the following By-law:—

A By-law for the making of a rate for the year 1907 on all rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Heathcote Waterworks Trust; also dealing with the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust:—

1. A rate of One shilling in the pound sterling shall be paid on the annual value of all rateable property fronting streets in which a main pipe has been laid, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of McIvor, but no such rate in any case shall be less than One pound.

2. A rate of Five shillings shall be charged on all unoccupied lands facing the mains.

3. Tenements not facing a street within which a main pipe is laid, but are situated within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe, shall be charged half the amount of the assessed rate.

4. Tenements exceeding one-quarter, but not exceeding half a mile distant from a stand-pipe, shall be charged one-quarter of the amount of the assessed rate.

5. For water supplied by measure, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for where water is used for other than domestic purposes solely shall be 20,000 gallons, and shall be paid for in advance or as the Trust may deem necessary.

6. Where water is supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic use the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate payable for the year in respect of the premises supplied.

7. The foregoing rate is made payable in moieties on the first of January and first of July, 1907.

8. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

This By-law was made and passed by the Commissioners of the Heathcote Waterworks Trust at a meeting held on the first day of October, 1906.

#### THE ST. ARNAUD BOROUGH WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING BY-LAW FOR 1907.

REGULATION NO. 12.

THE Commissioners of the St. Arnaud Borough Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, do hereby make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1907 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within its Waterworks District, that is to say:—

1. The rates and charges specified are those which the occupiers or owners of land and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes.

2. On every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence and under, the sum of One pound per annum.

3. On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence, the sum of Seven pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation.

4. On each unoccupied allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District separately from any building of the annual value of Ten pounds and under, the sum of Ten pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.

5. On every such unoccupied allotment or piece of land above the annual value of Ten pounds and not exceeding Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence, the sum of One pound.

6. On every such unoccupied allotment or piece of land above the annual value of Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence, the sum of Seven pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of valuation.

7. The rates and charges hereinbefore specified shall be due and payable in advance, in equal moieties, on the first day of January and the first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and seven.

8. In the construction of this Regulation the word "Commissioners" shall mean the Commissioners of the St. Arnaud Borough Waterworks Trust.

9. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

## BY-LAW No. 197.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf under the provisions of the Railways Acts, do hereby make the following By-law, and do hereby repeal so much of the provisions of all previous By-laws as conflicts therewith:—

## RATES FOR THE CARRIAGE OF AGRICULTURAL PRODUCE, Etc.

REBATES ON WHEAT GRISTED *EN ROUTE*.

3. Special rebates on wheat consigned to country flour mills and reconsigned thence in the shape of flour, bran, pollard, or sharps will be allowed in accordance with the following provisions:—

- (a) Wheat consigned by rail from any country station for any flour mill at any other country station, including Geelong, and there manufactured and reconsigned thence by rail in the shape of flour, bran, pollard, or sharps to Melbourne, or to any station situate within a radius of ten (10) miles thereof, or to Portland Geelong, Warnambool, or Port Fairy, or to any station intermediate between Geelong and Port Fairy, or to any station on the Queenscliff, Beeac, Forrest, Beech Forest, Timboon, or Mortlake line, shall, subject to the provisions of sub-clause (d), be charged the mileage rate for the total distance from the forwarding station to the destination station, plus 1s. per ton.
- (b) Wheat consigned by rail from any country station for any flour mill at any other country station, with the exception of Geelong, which is provided for in sub-clause (c), and there manufactured and reconsigned thence by rail in the shape of flour, bran, pollard, or sharps to any station situate outside of a radius of ten (10) miles of Melbourne on the Eastern or South-eastern line, or on any branch thereof, shall, subject to the provisions of sub-clause (d), be charged the mileage rate for the total distance from the forwarding station to the destination station, plus 1s. per ton.
- (c) Wheat consigned by rail from any country station for any flour mill at Melbourne, or at any station within a radius of ten (10) miles thereof, or at Geelong, and there manufactured and reconsigned thence by rail in the shape of flour, bran, pollard, or sharps to any station situate outside of a radius of ten (10) miles of Melbourne on the Eastern or South-eastern line, or on any branch thereof, shall, subject to the provisions of sub-clause (d), be charged the mileage rate for the total distance from the forwarding station to the destination station, plus 2s. 6d. per ton.
- (d) In respect to sub-clauses (a), (b), and (c), the mileage rate for each portion of the journey shall (subject to the provisions of clause 2 above) be charged in the first instance for the total quantity of flour, bran, pollard, and sharps consigned by rail from each flour mill, and rebate to the amount of the charges computed as specified in sub-clauses (a), (b), and (c), respectively, will afterwards be granted on all or so much of the tonnage of the flour, bran, pollard, and sharps consigned by rail from the flour mill to the stations prescribed in sub-clauses (a), (b), and (c) as does not exceed the tonnage of the wheat consigned by rail from any country station or stations for the flour mill.

In determining the amount of the rebate due, the quantity of wheat consigned by rail from the most distant despatching station to the flour mill and the quantity of flour, bran, pollard, and sharps forwarded from the flour mill to the most distant destination station will first be taken into account, and then the quantity of wheat similarly consigned from each succeeding despatching station and the quantity of flour, bran, pollard, and sharps forwarded to each destination station in the order of greatest distance.

## EXPORT GRAIN, FLOUR, BRAN, POLLARD.

## 4. EXPORT GRAIN, FLOUR, BRAN, POLLARD, AND COMPRESSED FODDER IN 30-TON CONSIGNMENTS.

- (a) Export grain, previously carried by rail, loaded at Melbourne, South Kensington, Kensington, Newmarket, Moreland, Newport, North Carlton, and Victoria Park, for Williamstown Pier, Port Melbourne Pier, or the Victoria Dock; also export grain transferred between Williamstown Pier, Port Melbourne Pier, and the Victoria Dock, will (subject to the conditions of clause (d)) be charged 1s. per ton.
- (b) Export flour, bran, and pollard, also compressed fodder, manufactured from grain or produce previously carried by rail, loaded at Melbourne, Kensington, Burnley, Arden-street, Newport, Fitzroy, and Victoria Park, for Williamstown Pier, Port Melbourne Pier, or the Victoria Dock, or loaded at Williamstown Pier for Port Melbourne Pier or the Victoria Dock, will (subject to the provisions of clause (d)) be charged 1s. per ton.

Compressed fodder, loaded at Williamstown Pier and forwarded to Melbourne for shipment *via* the Yarra Wharf, will be charged 1s. per ton (subject to the provisions of clause (d)).

- (c) At the close of the export grain season each year, grain may be forwarded from Williamstown Pier or Port Melbourne Pier to Melbourne or suburban stations within a radius of 10 miles of Melbourne at the rate of 1s. per ton (subject to the provisions of clause (d)).
- (d) In respect of clauses (a), (b), and (c), the rate quoted in each case will be granted only on condition that the grain or the flour, bran and pollard, or the compressed fodder, is forwarded in consignments of not less than 30 tons at a time, and in full truck-loads, and that they are carried entirely at the risk of the owner, and that the loading and unloading are performed by the owners. If the loading or unloading be performed by the Commissioners, an additional charge of 6d. per ton will be made for each service.

NOTE.—The rates in this clause will not be granted in respect of agricultural produce rejected at the shipping ports during the currency of the export grain season.

## COMPUTATION OF THE WEIGHT OF WHEAT.

The freight charges for the carriage of wheat shall be based on the actual weight of the wheat and of the bags containing the same in each and every case in which such actual weight can be ascertained to the satisfaction of the Commissioners, and in every case in which it is impracticable to so ascertain the actual weight of the wheat and of the bags containing the same, the freight charges shall be based on a computed weight as may from time to time be determined by the Commissioners.

## GRAVEL, METAL, METAL SCREENINGS (DRY), AND SPALLS FOR CITY, TOWN, BOROUGH, AND SHIRE COUNCILS.

The following rates shall be charged for the carriage of Gravel, Metal, Metal Screenings (dry), and Spalls for City, Town, Borough, and Shire Councils. The trucks shall be fully loaded, and the minimum charge shall be as for 6 tons per each 4-wheeled truck :—

#### CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or oat, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oat straw of the best quality. As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

2. The quantities stated in the schedule are only approximate, and the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned. Should new telegraph stations be formed or additional horses be required at any station, the contractor will be required to supply the extra forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, and also forage for any extra horses that may be at any time stabled at the depot for police purposes, at the same rates. The contract for the supply of forage to the Military Barracks may be terminated by three months' notice being given by the Secretary to the Tender Board to the contractor of such determination.

4. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

5. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

6. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.

7. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue to either party by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, but he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 4.

8. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.

9. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

10. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

11. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.

## By-Law No. 19.

A By-law of the Borough of Sale, made under the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered nineteen, to regulate fishing in Lake Guthridge.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Sale order as follows:—

That no person shall use in Lake Guthridge any weir, net, implement, device, or contrivance fixed to the soil or made stationary or partly stationary in any way or manner, for the purpose of taking fish.

That no person shall angle for or remove or take from the said lake any fish which may be therein before the first day of October, 1908, and after that date during the months of May, June, July, August, and September, in each and every year.

That no person shall angle with or use more than two artificial baits of any kind whatsoever upon or in the said lake at one and the same time, save and except artificial flies, and, further, that no person shall angle in the said lake with more than two hooks covered with live bait at one and the same time.

That the hours during which fishing shall be permitted in Lake Guthridge during the fishing season shall be from four o'clock a.m. to nine o'clock p.m.

That no person shall use ground bait of any kind whatsoever in the said lake for the purpose of attracting fish to any particular spot, or for any other purpose whatsoever.

That all persons catching any fish in the said lake under six ounces in weight shall forthwith return such fish to the lake.

That no person shall:—or take away or cause or procure to be removed and taken away from the said lake any ova or spawn without the consent of the Council of the Borough of Sale being first obtained.

That no person shall angle for or by any other means endeavour to take fish from the said lake on Sunday.

That no provision of this By-law shall prohibit the use of traps or meat bait for the purpose of catching eels in the said Lake Guthridge.

That any person detected in leaving any weight, stone, tin or other obstacle at the bottom of the lake, shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

If any person shall be guilty of any wilful offence or misfeasance or wilful or negligent act of commission or omission, contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law, such person shall, where not otherwise provided, forfeit the sum of Five pounds.

That the fee for the right to angle for fish in Lake Guthridge be Five shillings for the season during which it is lawful to so angle for each respective kind of fish.

That this By-law shall come into full force and operation immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

## SHIRE OF DANDENONG.

## By-Law No. 15.

A By-law of the Shire of Dandenong, made under sub-section (a) (b) of section 635 and sub-section 9 of section 107 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 15, for regulating the market-place, and for fixing the days and the hours during each day on which the market shall be held, and for regulating public sales.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903* the President, Councillors, and ratepayers of the Shire of Dandenong order as follows:—

The gates of the market will be open for receiving animals for sale as follows:—On the day of sale: For milking cows, up to 11.30 o'clock a.m., and for dry cattle, up to 12.30 o'clock p.m. All milking cows entering the gates of the market after 11.30 o'clock a.m., and dry cattle after 12.30 p.m., shall be kept separate and apart from cattle received prior to the time herein fixed, and shall not be offered for sale by public auction until after all stock aforesaid shall have been submitted for sale; with this exception, however: that milking cows received for sale after the hour of 11.30 o'clock a.m. shall be submitted for sale immediately following milking cows received for sale prior to that hour.

That the owner and drover bringing cattle into the market must give the name of the auctioneer selling and the number of milking cows or dry cattle, either or both, he has for sale to the market gatekeeper before entering the market yard therewith.

Each auctioneer shall yard or cause to be yarded all cattle after they have been submitted for sale, whether sold or not, in the yard or yards from which such cattle have been brought for purpose of sale.

That the sales of calves and pigs must be continuous and without any breaks or adjournments of such sales until the whole sales or intended sales thereof shall have been fully completed and ended.

That all poultry coming into the market for sale after the hour of 10.30 o'clock a.m. shall not be offered for sale until all poultry arriving in the market yard for sale before that hour shall have first been submitted for sale, and then the order of sale thereof shall be regulated as to precedence of sale as and in accord with the time of such poultry arriving in the market yard for sale.

On each day of sale there shall be a drawing by lot by auctioneers desirous of selling milking cows in the market for priority of sale, which shall take place at 11.25 o'clock a.m., and also a like drawing as to dry cattle at 12.25 o'clock p.m.

The timekeeper or his assistant shall on each day of sale ring a bell at 11.30 o'clock a.m., and the auction sales of milking cows and dry cattle shall then commence in the order and subject to the conditions provided by By-law No. 14 of the Shire of Dandenong, save and except only that the auctioneer or firm of auctioneers having priority of sale shall commence selling not later than 11.30 o'clock a.m.

Any auctioneer or agent not proceeding with his sale as provided herein shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.
