NOTICE TO MARINERS.—VICTORIA.

 POINT GELLIBRAND LIGHT, PORT PHILLIP.

REFERRING to General Notice to Mariners, dated 24th September, 1901, page 81, mariners and others are hereby notified that the Point Gellibrand Floating Light-vessel will be removed on or about the 12th February, 1906, to allow of the work of erection of a Pile Lighthouse in the position of the present vessel. It is also hereby intimated that simultaneously with the removal of the light-vessel a gas buoy showing a fixed red light will be temporarily moored about 400 feet eastward of the present light-vessel, and a vessel will also be moored about 400 feet southward of such gas buoy for the purpose of maintaining the system of signalling the position thereof by means of firing rockets in foggy weather.

Vessels must pass at least half-a-cable eastward of the gas buoy and signalling vessel, and at a moderate speed so as not to interfere with pile-driving operations.

A red square flag will be hoisted to indicate that pile-driving operations are in progress, and that care is necessary in connexion with the navigation of vessels passing.

During the course of the erection of the Pile Lighthouse, a white light will be exhibited by night from a mast on the easterly portion of the structure to indicate its position.

Factories and Shops Act.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Act 1905*, and after due inquiry, I, being the responsible Minister for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of sub-section (1) of section 40 of the said Act in the

FACTORY OR WORK ROOMS OF THE BRITISH-AUSTRALASIAN TOBACCO CO. PROPY. LTD., 14-20 A'BRICKETT-STREET, MELBOURNE,

for a period of eight weeks from the 30th January, 1906, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than thirty-six females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said thirty-six females shall not be employed for more than fifty-four hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.

Health Act 1890.

BY-LAW No. 14.

By virtue of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, the Council of the Shire of Flinders and Kangerong, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, make the following By-law, being By-law No. 14, that is to say:—

1. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the area bounded as follows, viz.:—Commencing at a point on the shore of Port Phillip Bay in a line with the north-eastern boundary of allotment 7, section 1, parish of Kangerong; thence along that boundary to the north-east corner of the said allotment; thence S.W. along the three-chain road and S.E. boundary of the said allotment to a

point on S.E. boundary of allotment 6 in line with boundary between allotments 11 and 12; thence S. along that line to its termination at road; thence west to the eastern angle of allotment 13, 1; thence westerly to the S.E. corner of section 17, township of Dromana; thence west to S.W. corner of section 11; thence S.W. along sections 4, 5, and 10 to the S.W. corner of section 10; thence in a straight line along the S.W. boundary of sections 10, 9, and 8 to the shore of Port Phillip Bay; thence north-easterly along the shore to the point of commencement.

2. This By-law shall come into force upon its allowance and confirmation by the Board of Public Health and the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

3. On and after 1st December, 1905, every closet shall be furnished with a double-pan service, to be provided by the council, under which at least once a week the pan in every closet shall be closed with a tight-fitting lid and removed from the premises, and a clean pan shall be left in its place.

4. All cess-pans shall be removed in a cart or covered conveyance, and so constructed that the pans shall be properly covered from observation, and so as to prevent the escape therefrom of any noxious or offensive effluvia.

5. All night-soil when removed shall be re-deposited only at such place or places and in such manner as the Health Officer or Inspector of Nuisances shall approve.

6. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of every house or tenement on any premises shall keep in use in every closet a suitable disinfectant or deodorant.

7. To provide for the proper removal of night-soil, the occupier of every house or tenement on any premises shall pay to the council such sum, half-yearly, as shall from time to time be fixed by resolution of the council for emptying and removing night-soil, and such charge shall be payable and paid by each occupier of any premises in advance.

8. The Council of the said Shire of Flinders and Kangerong may, at any time, and from time to time, license or authorize any person to remove night-soil from premises in the above described area, and may at any time revoke such licence or authority.

9. When any person is licensed or authorized, as aforesaid, such person shall be employed to remove all night-soil, and no occupier or person having management or control of any premises shall contract for the removal of night-soil with, or permit or cause the same to be removed by, any unlicensed or unauthorized person.

10. Any person who shall be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

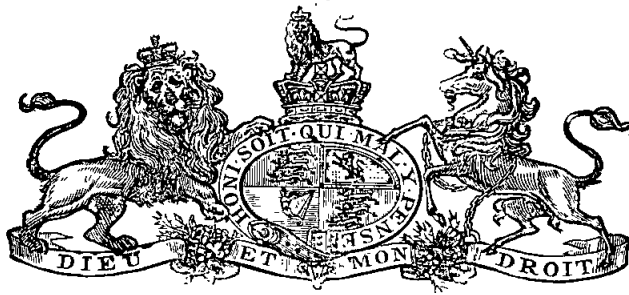
