IN compliance with an application in writing under the previsions of the Factorics and Shops Act 1905, and after due inquiry, I, being the responsible Minister for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of sub-section (1) of section 40 of the said Act in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF THE C. M. RRAD CO., DRESS-MAKERS AND WHITEWORKERS, CHAPEL-STREET, PRAHRAN,

for a period of four weeks from the 2nd January, 1906, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

In That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than sixteen females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said sixteen females shall not be employed for more than fifty-four hours in any one week, nor for more than fifty-four hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
 That every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wageworker shall be paid for such overtine at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
 That every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
 That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.

HOPETOUN CHANNEL.

MARINERS and others are hereby informed, in connexion with dredging operations now in progress in Hopetoun Channel, that in order to indicate the side on which vessels navigating the channel are to pass the dredger, there will be exhibited (by day) a basket ball from the port or starboard side of the dredger, and (by night) two red lights in a vertical position one over the other, not less than 6 feet apart. Two white mast-head anchor lights will also be exhibited by night, one near the stem and the other near the stem of the dredger.

Mariners and others must pass the dredger at the slowest possible speed, and must stop the engines when passing the chains of the dredger.

HEALESVILLE WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1906.

N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, the Commissioners of the Healesville Waterworks Trust hereby make the following Regulation:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Waterworks District of the said Trust shall pay for the year 1906 in respect of water supplied by the said Trust:—

I. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Twenty pounds or under, the sum of Twenty shillings.

II. For every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Twenty pounds, the sum of One shilling in the pound sterling.

III. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied township or subdivisional allotments shall be Sixpence in the pound sterling of the annual municipal value, provided that no rate be less than Ten shillings.

If any person does, or causes, or permits, allows, or suffers to be done, anything in contravention of this Regulation, or fails to do anything which under this Regulation ought to be done for the prevention of the water, misuse, undue consumption, or contamination of the water, he shall be liable (where no penalty is otherwise herein provided for such offence) to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (\$\mathcal{L}^2\oldsymbol{O}\) for every day such misfensance or non-fensance shall continue after notice of the offence from the Waterworks Trust, and the Trust may cut off the water supply from the premises of such person or persons by cutting the pipes by or through which the water is supplied or otherwise, and may discontinue the supply so long as the the pipes by or through which the water is supplied or otherwise, and may discontinue the supply so long as the cause or injury remains, or is not remedied to the satisfaction of the Trust. (c) use any threatening, abusive, indecent, obscene, or insulting words, or (d) behave in a riotous, indecent, offensive, threatening, or insulting manner, or

(e) be drunk.

(e) be drunk.

3. Every person who shall, by any wilful act or default, be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of the foregoing By-law, shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, nor less than Five shillings for any such breach.

This By-law shall come into operation and commence to have effect immediately upon its publication in the Government Gasette, as provided by the Local Government Act 1903.
