

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Reginald Arthur James Talbot, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1903 (3 Edw. VII. No. 1893) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Municipality of the City of Bendigo has requested that the lands hereinafter mentioned, which have been reserved, used, or acquired by the said Council for the purpose of making streets in the City of Bendigo, be so declared public highways: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this notice declare the lands reserved, used, or acquired for the streets hereinafter named and described, and situate within the City of Bendigo aforesaid, to be Public Highways within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

5. No person shall erect or place any dwellings in the Park or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, or offer for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

6. Every person riding or driving shall keep to the por-tions of the Park laid out as carriage drives, and no per-son shall at any time ride or drive any animal at a greater speed within the Park than at the rate of seven miles an

7. No person shall cycle in the Park at a greater speed than at the rate of ten miles an hour, nor shall any motor car, motor cycle, or any other motor vehicle be driven in the Park at a greater speed than at the rate of ten miles an hour.

3. During wet weather the curator of the Park shall be at liberty to close for such time as may be considered necessary the carriage gates thereof, to preserve the carriage drives therein.

o. No person shall bring into the Park any dog, unless led by a chain or cord. All dogs found at large within the conservatory and nursery of the Park shall be liable to be destroyed.

10. All picnic parties shall be located in such portions of the Park as may be arranged with the curator thereof.

12. No-child under Ten years of age shall be allowed 12. Note in the conservatory and nursery in the Park unless accompanied by an adult.
