PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Reginald Arthur James Talbot, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1903* (3 Edw. VII. No. 1893) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Municipality of the City of Bendigo has requested that the lands hereinafter mentioned, which have been reserved, used, or acquired by the said Council for the purpose of making streets in the City of Bendigo, be so declared public highways: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this notice declare the lands reserved, used, or acquired for the streets hereinafter named and described, and situate within the City of Bendigo aforesaid, to be Public Highways within the meaning of the said Act, viz. :-

The security must be completed and contract signed within five days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contracts for Government supplies for a period of twelve months, such disqualification to date from the notification of acceptance of tender. It is also stipulated that if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, then his tender is to be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual; and that for breach of this condition the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and the tender declared informal.

Tenders, enclosed in a separate envelope, and having the words "Tender for —" (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however,

require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedule, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Commonwealth manufacture, provided the quality is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the department requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown districts are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of 6 miles from the General Post Office; and Williamstown district will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officers ordering the goods.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in Condition 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

8. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form at the time of the delivery of the goods, and the account shall be accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

10. All goods forwarded under these contracts shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor or contractors by whom consigned.

11. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any department except the Defence Department, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carrier to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. (In the case of the Defence Department, however, the consignment note only which accompanies the order must be used.) Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 14 of these conditions.

12. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in Condition 7.

13. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the State for the time being, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in Condition 7.

14. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in Condition 7. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and declare forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of twelve months from the date of such disqualification.

15. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government. If it is found during the currency of the contract that the contractor has not conformed to the condition of advertisement—which stipulates that if a tenderer be a member of a firm, and such firm be interested in the contract, then the tender is to be in the name of the firm, and not in that of the individual—then the Honorable the Treasurer may determine the contract, and forfeit the security money.

16. A By-law of the City of Footscray, made under subsection 1 of section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered Twenty-eight, for the adoption of certain provisions of the Thirteenth Schedule of the said Act, as more particularly set forth hereunder:—

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Footscray order as follows:—

1. That the By-laws numbered Two, Three, Four, Five, Six, Seven, Eight, Nine, Ten, Eleven, Twelve, Thirteen, Fourteen, Fifteen, Sixteen, Seventeen, Eighteen, Nineteen, Twenty, Twenty-one, Twenty-two, and Twenty-three, made by this Council under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1874*, be and are hereby repealed excepting as to Acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this By-law coming into operation.

2. That the following provisions of the Thirteenth Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1903* be and are hereby adopted, viz.:—

IV.—Places of improvement and recreation, &c.

- Subdivision 1. Public libraries and museums.
- " 2. Public gardens.

Part V.—Regulation, &c., of buildings (clauses one to eight inclusive).

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A BOTANIC GARDEN, KNOWN AS THE "EASTERN PUBLIC PARK," IN THE TOWN OF GEELONG.

WHEREAS by the Crown Grant issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works, and the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Burgesses of the town of Geelong, in respect of the Reserve for a Botanic Garden, known as the "Eastern Public Park," in the town of Geelong, it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted and the buildings for the time being thereon, shall be maintained and used as and for a Botanic Garden and offices and conveniences connected therewith, under and in accordance with such regulations as shall from time to time be made in pursuance of the provisions of such Crown Grant. Now, therefore, the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Burgesses of the town of Geelong do hereby make the regulations following in respect of the said Reserve, for a Botanic Garden, known as the "Eastern Public Park," in the town of Geelong:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Park shall be open to the public daily, free of charge, from 1st October to 31st March, both days inclusive, from Six o'clock a.m. to Eight p.m., and from 1st April to 30th September, both days inclusive, from sunrise to sunset.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Park, who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall in any way interfere with the trees, shrubs, flowers, statuary, fountains, or other property in the Park, or with the fish or birds therein, or throw stones, or birdnest, or commit any nuisance in the Park, or leave any bottles, orange or banana peel, paper, cast-off clothing, or other litter, or light fires therein, or smoke when walking off the paths, or in the nursery or any other reserved place.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates of the Park, or stick bills thereon, or alter the names, letters, or marks, or write on the trees, pavilions, seats, gates, posts, or fences, or other buildings.

5. No person shall erect or place any dwellings in the Park or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, or offer for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

6. Every person riding or driving shall keep to the portions of the Park laid out as carriage drives, and no person shall at any time ride or drive any animal at a greater speed within the Park than at the rate of seven miles an hour.

7. No person shall cycle in the Park at a greater speed than at the rate of ten miles an hour, nor shall any motor car, motor cycle, or any other motor vehicle be driven in the Park at a greater speed than at the rate of ten miles an hour.

8. During wet weather the curator of the Park shall be at liberty to close for such time as may be considered necessary the carriage gates thereof, to preserve the carriage drives therein.

9. No person shall bring into the Park any dog, unless led by a chain or cord. All dogs found at large within the conservatory and nursery of the Park shall be liable to be destroyed.

10. All picnic parties shall be located in such portions of the Park as may be arranged with the curator thereof.

11. The conservatory and nursery shall be open on Sundays from Two o'clock p.m. to Five o'clock p.m., and on each of the other days of the week from Seven o'clock a.m. to Five o'clock p.m.

12. No child under Ten years of age shall be allowed to enter the conservatory and nursery in the Park unless accompanied by an adult.

13. Perambulators, go-carts, cycles, and other vehicles shall not be admitted to the conservatory and nursery in the Park.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 200 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction, before any justice, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence, and every person who so offends, and, who, after he has been warned by any officer or servant of the trustees or by any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such officer, servant, or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

2. No person shall ride, drive, or impel any motor car, motor cycle, bicycle or tricycle along or across any footpath within the said shire, save across such footpath direct to or from any premises abutting thereon.

3. Every person riding, driving, or impelling any motor car, motor cycle, bicycle, or tricycle shall keep the same on the near, or left side of the road in meeting any vehicle coming from the opposite direction thereof, and whenever overtaking any buggy, waggon, cart, or other vehicle or any horse or beast of burden such person over-taking such buggy, waggon, cart, or other vehicle or other beast of burden or horse or any foot passenger proceeding along the road shall pass the same on the off, or right side thereof, and shall within a reasonable distance from and before passing such buggy, waggon, cart, or other vehicle or such horse or other beast of burden or such foot passenger, by sounding a bell or horn, give audible and sufficient warning as he may approach.

4. In every case where a person riding, driving, or im-pelling a motor car, motor cycle, bicycle, or tricycle meet any horse or other beast of burden, and where such horse or other beast of burden shall become restive or alarmed, or shall cease to be under the full control of the person for the time being in charge thereof, such person riding or driving such motor car, motor cycle, bicycle, or tricycle shall dismount as speedily as possible, and shall continue dismounted as long as may be reason-ably necessary.

5. Any person offending against this By-law shall for-feit a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds.
