RULES AND REGULATIONS.

Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the Trustees therefor, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B) which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right on obtaining the permission of the Trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.
5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the Trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the Trustees.
6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths has been delivered to the Secretary (gatekeeper or sexton).
7. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.
8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child



under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

9. The hours for burials shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m. On Sundays throughout the year from Eight to Ten a.m., or from Two to Five p.m.

10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

11. The Trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person having paid the fee for a private grave and requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the Trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

12. No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give the same.

13. No person employed by the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment, or for which he has special authority from the Trustees.

14. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Seven a.m. to Sunset daily throughout the year.

15. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the Trustees.

16. No smoking shall be allowed, nor any firearms discharged, within the cemetery.

17. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.

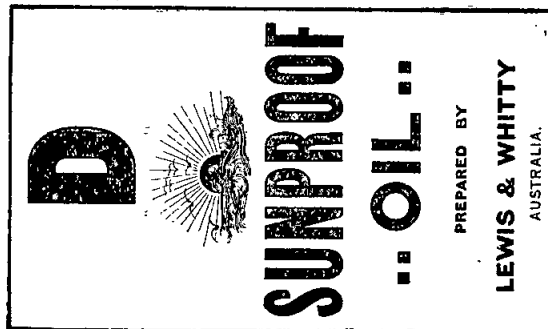

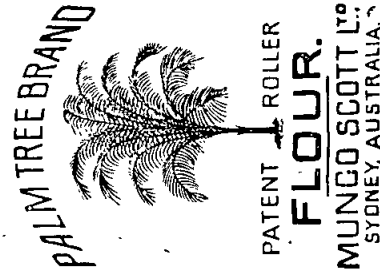

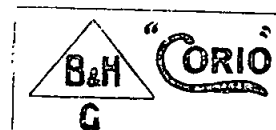

PORT OF PORT PHILLIP.

*Submarine Mining in the Vicinity of Swan Island.*

For the purpose of permitting practice in submarine mining, vessels shall not, on and after the 26th day of March, 1906, until and including the 30th day of April, 1906, be navigated in the waters to the northward and westward of the No. 3 (Swanspit) buoy, West Channel, within the area bounded by a supposed line running south-easterly from Swan Beacon to No. 3 (Swanspit) buoy; thence northerly to small black can buoy moored east by north 5 cables from the north-east end of Swan Island; thence westerly to the outer pile which marks the entrance to the channel leading to Swan Island jetty; thence due south to Swan Point; and from thence southerly along the shore to the starting point.

It is also stipulated that if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, then his tender is to be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual; and that for breach of this condition the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and the tender declared informal.

Tenders, enclosed in a separate envelope, and having the words "Tender for ——" (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne.

#### CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedule, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.
2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Commonwealth manufacture, provided the quality is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.
3. The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.
4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.
5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown districts are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of 6 miles from the General Post Office; and Williamstown district will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra.
6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officers ordering the goods.
7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in Condition 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.
8. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form at the time of the delivery of the goods, and the account shall be accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.
9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.
10. All goods forwarded under these contracts shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor or contractors by whom consigned.
11. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any department except the Defence Department, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carrier to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. (In the case of the Defence Department, however, the consignment note only which accompanies the order must be used.) Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 14 of these conditions.

12. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in Condition 7.

13. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the State for the time being, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in Condition 7.

14. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in Condition 7. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and declare forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of twelve months from the date of such disqualification.

16. **STAWELL BOROUGH WATER SUPPLY.**

  2. No person shall lay private services and attach the same to the pipes of the Council or to any private service already connected with the pipes of the Council without being duly approved, licensed, and authorized by the Council to do such work.
  3. No private service whatsoever to be laid by any authorized person unless he has ascertained at the Council's office that the person for whom such work is intended has received the consent of the Engineer to execute such work.
  4. After private services are laid and attached to the pipes of the Council, or otherwise to private service-pipes already connected, each authorized person shall, within twenty-four hours after each service has been completed, report all work done by him at the office, and sign in a book kept for the purpose his name and the date when each service was completed.
  5. Each authorized person shall be held solely responsible to the Council for any injury occasioned by him from whatsoever cause to the street mains, or other property whilst attaching private services, or to private services already laid and connected with the Council's water supply. And any water lost by the Council through such injury or its ascertained value, together with the cost of all repairs necessitated thereby, shall be paid by such person to the Council within twenty-four hours after the time of such injuries having occurred.
  6. Each authorized person shall be held solely responsible to the Council for such service-pipes being laid and completed by him in a sound, workmanlike, and durable manner, and to remain in that condition (sound and water-tight) for a period of three (3) months after each service-pipe has been completed.
  7. Every competent person, previous to being authorized to lay private services, shall deposit with the Council the sum of £1, which shall be retained during the pleasure of the Council as a guarantee against damage; and shall also pay annually a sum of Five shillings sterling as a fee for a licence, and the Council may at any time withdraw such licence and forfeit such deposit, when the same shall be absolutely void, and the name of such person shall be at once struck off the roll of those authorized to lay private services, and be published in the local paper.
  8. If any person shall be guilty of a breach of any of the above-mentioned clauses he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling (£5).
- The whole of the works herein referred to shall be carried out under the superintendence and according to

the directions of the Engineer or any other person the Council may appoint, and any dispute between the various parties concerned as to the quality of work and labour done, or as to the exact meaning of this specification and the general conditions, shall be referred to any officer the Council may appoint, whose decision in all cases shall be final and binding on all parties.

*Quality of Materials required in Laying Private Services.*

The whole of the pipes, tees, thimbles, bends, reducing couplings, plugs, &c., to be of the best galvanized wrought iron.

All pipes and pieces to be true in sectional form, straight longitudinally, and of equal strength and thickness throughout the entire body of same.

All ends of pipes, &c., to be properly and truly threaded, and capable of being screwed into thimbles, tees, &c.

The whole of the pipes, tees, bends, &c., to be sound and free from all defects, and capable of standing a hydrostatic pressure equal to a column of water of 350 feet.

*Meat Supervision Act, No. 1652.*

**REGULATION NO. 19.—CLEANLINESS IN MEAT STORES.**

**U**NDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Meat Supervision Act 1900* and all other powers it enabling the Council of the City of Hawthorn, with the approval of the Board of Public Health, doth hereby make the following Regulations with respect to maintenance of cleanliness of places used for the preserving, freezing, chilling, or storing of meat, and the premises appurtenant thereto, and of the appliances used thereat, and for securing the wholesomeness of meat preserved, frozen, chilled, or stored therein, or intended so to be:—

1. No person shall put or keep, or cause or allow to be put or kept, in any room, chamber, compartment, or place hereafter to be constructed, any meat for the purpose of freezing, preserving, chilling, or storing the same, unless the benches, shelves, cupboards, and lockers therein are movable.
2. No person shall put or keep, or cause or allow to be put or kept, in any room, chamber, compartment, or place for the purpose of freezing, preserving, chilling, or storing:—  
(a) any meat other than such is fresh and free from putrefaction, decomposition, fly-blow, phosphorescence, clammy, slimy, and other unwholesome conditions; or

- (b) any unclean, unwashed, or foul-smelling substance, offal, or viscera; or
- (c) any fish, oysters, or other molluscs, any crayfish or other crustaceans, any game, cheese, butter, vegetable, or other perishable product in such a condition as to be likely to contaminate, taint, or prejudicially affect the meat.

3. No person shall use, or cause or allow to be used, any room, chamber, compartment, or place in which the condition known as "phosphorescence" exists for storing fresh meat, unless—

- (a) at least once every month during the persistence of such condition every part of the internal surfaces of the walls, floor, ceiling, and doors, and every part (including the legs, supports, back, and undersides) of all benches, shelves, cupboards, lockers, boxes, hanging bars, hooks, and other fittings, and all appliances are—

1. scrubbed with water and soft soap, the water being hot as can be practically used, and the soap being sufficient in quantity to produce with the water a profuse lather; the scrubbing being performed in such a manner as to thoroughly cleanse such surfaces, fittings, and appliances, and to completely remove all dirt, stains, greasiness, and other deposit;
2. then dried with clean cloths; and
3. immediately afterwards copiously washed, swabbed, or sluiced with a solution consisting of one gallon of clean cold water, three ounces of chlorinated lime of good strength, and either three ounces of vinegar or one ounce of spirit of salt, the solution being applied so as to reach every part, including all corners, crevices, and cracks of such surfaces, fittings, and appliances; and

- (b) once a week at least the floors, benches, shelves, and such other parts as shall have been in contact with any meat or other food, are cleaned and disinfected as provided for under clause (a), sub-clauses 1, 2, and 3.

4. No person shall use, or cause or allow to be used, for the storage of fresh meat for retail or shop purposes any room, chamber, compartment, or place—

- (a) unless the floors, benches, shelves, and such other parts as shall have been in contact with any meat or other food, are cleansed at least once in every week by scrubbing with water and soft soap, the water being as hot as can be practically used, and the soap being sufficient in quantity to produce with the water a profuse lather; the scrubbing being performed in such a manner as to thoroughly cleanse such surfaces, fittings, and appliances, and to completely remove all dirt, stains, greasiness, and other deposit;

- (b) that is not kept continuously clean and free from foul smell or other unwholesome condition.

5. If any person fails to comply with any of the provisions of these regulations, or prevents compliance with the same on the part of any other person, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these regulations, and shall be liable for every such offence, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and to a further penalty, not exceeding Two pounds, for every day during which, after a conviction, the offence is further continued.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Meat Supervision Act 1900* and all other powers enabling it, the Council of the City of Richmond, with the approval of the Board of Public Health, doth hereby make the following Regulations with respect to maintenance of cleanliness of places used for the preserving, freezing, chilling, or storing of meat and the premises

appurtenant thereto, and of the appliances used thereat, and for securing the wholesomeness of meat preserved, frozen, chilled, or stored therein or intended so to be:—

1. No person shall put or keep, or cause or allow to be put or kept, in any room, chamber, compartment, or place hereafter to be constructed, any meat for the purpose of freezing, preserving, chilling, or storing the same unless the benches, shelves, cupboards, and lockers therein are movable.

2. No person shall put or keep, or cause or allow to be put or kept in any room, chamber, compartment, or place for the purpose of freezing, preserving, chilling, or storing—

- (a) any meat other than such is fresh and free from putrefaction, decomposition, fly-blow, phosphorescence, clammy, slimy, and other unwholesome conditions; or

- (b) any unclean, unwashed, or foul-smelling substance, offal, or viscera; or

- (c) any fish, oysters, or other molluscs, any crayfish or other crustaceans, any game, cheese, butter, vegetable, or other perishable product in such a condition as to be likely to contaminate, taint, or prejudicially affect the meat.

3. No person shall use, or cause or allow to be used, any room, chamber, compartment, or place in which the condition known as "phosphorescence" exists for storing fresh meat, unless—

- (a) at least once every month during the persistence of such condition every part of the internal surfaces of the walls, floor, ceiling, and doors, and every part (including the legs, supports, back, and undersides) of all the benches, shelves, cupboards, lockers, boxes, hanging bars, hooks, and other fittings and all appliances are—

- (1) scrubbed with water and soft soap, the water being as hot as can be practically used, and the soap being sufficient in quantity to produce with the water a profuse lather, the scrubbing being performed in such a manner as to thoroughly cleanse such surfaces, fittings, and appliances, and to completely remove all dirt, stains, greasiness, and other deposit;
- (2) then dried with clean cloths; and
- (3) immediately afterwards copiously washed, swabbed, or sluiced with a solution consisting of one gallon of clean cold water, three ounces of chlorinated lime of good strength, and either three ounces of vinegar or one ounce of spirit of salt, the solution being applied so as to reach every part, including all corners, crevices, and cracks of such surfaces, fittings, and appliances; and

- (b) once a week at least the floors, benches, shelves, and such other parts as shall have been in contact with any meat or other food are cleaned and disinfected, as provided for under clause (a), sub-clauses (1), (2), and (3).

4. No person shall use, or cause or allow to be used for the storage of fresh meat for retail or shop purposes, any room, chamber, compartment, or place—

- (a) unless the floors, benches, shelves, and such other parts as shall have been in contact with any meat or other food are cleansed at least once in every week by scrubbing with water and soft soap, the water being as hot as can be practically used, and the soap being sufficient in quantity to produce with the water a profuse lather, the scrubbing being performed in such a manner as to thoroughly cleanse such surfaces, fittings, and appliances, and to completely remove all dirt, stains, greasiness, and other deposit,

- (b) that is not kept continuously clean and free from foul smell or other unwholesome condition.

5. If any person fails to comply with any of the provisions of these Regulations, or prevents compliance with the same on the part of any other person, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these Regulations, and shall be liable for every such offence, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and to a further penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every day during which, after a conviction, the offence is further continued.

6. This Regulation shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Richmond.

A By-law of the Shire of Orbost, made under subdivision 2 of Part VII. of the *Local Government Act 1903*, for suppressing nuisances.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Orbost, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, hereby made the following By-law, being By-law No. 17 of the said shire:—

1. This By-law may be cited as a By-law to control and regulate the deposit of rubbish or refuse matter within the Shire of Orbost, and shall come into operation immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. For the purpose of this By-law the term public place shall mean and include any street, road, right-of-way, lane, passage, footway (whether dedicated to the public or not), and any drain, water channel, creek, river, reservoir, water-course, river frontage, and any unsold or reserved Crown lands or any private property, and any public place within the meaning of the words in this By-law although not hereinbefore specified.

3. No person shall deposit in any public place within the Shire of Orbost, rubbish or refuse matter of any kind whatsoever, including dust, mud, ashes, bones, bottles, filth, offal, manure, dung, soil, and clippings of trees or hedges.

4. All such refuse shall be conveyed to and deposited at the depot set apart for that purpose, and duly gazetted as a place for the deposit of rubbish within the said shire.

5. Every person guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds, nor less than Five shillings.
