RULES, REGULATIONS, AND SCALE OF FEES OF THE MOONLIGHT HEAD PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

- In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Cometeries Act 1890, the Trustees of the Moonlight Head Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—
- 1. These rules and regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the Government Gazette, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.
- 2. The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.
- 3. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.
- 4. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the Trustees therefor, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B) which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right on obtaining the permission of the Trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.
- 5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other crection shall apply to the Trustees for permission to do so, and, submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such crection shall be made without the written approval of the Trustees.
- 6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths has been delivered to the Secretary (gatekeeper or sexton).
- 7. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.
- 8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child

under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

- 9. The hours for burials shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m. On Sundays throughout the year from Eight to Ten a.m., or from Two to Five p.m.
- ro. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.
- 11. The Trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person having paid the fee for a private grave and requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the Trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.
- 12. No private grave shall be re-opened or any inter-ment permitted therein without the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give the same.
- 13. No person employed by the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment, or for which he has special authority from the Trustees.
- 14. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Seven a.m. to Sunset daily throughout the year.
- 15. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cometery, unless with the previous authority of the Trustees.
- 16. No smoking shall be allowed, nor any firearms discharged, within the cemetery.
 - 17. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.



2. No person shall lay private services and attach the same to the pipes of the Council or to any private service already connected with the pipes of the Council without being duly approved, licensed, and authorized by the Council to do such work.

3. No private service whatsoever to be laid by any authorized person unless he has ascertained at the Council's office that the person for whom such work is insteaded has received the consent of the Engineer to execute

such work.

4. After private services are laid and attached to the

such work.

4. After private services are laid and attached to the pipes of the Council, or otherwise to private service-pipes already connected, each authorized person shall, within twenty-four hours after each service has been completed, report all work done by him at the office, and sign in a book kept for the purpose his name and the date when each service was completed.

5. Each authorized person shall be held solely responsible to the Council for any injury occasioned by him from whatsoever cause to the street mains, or other property whilst attaching private services, or to private services already laid and connected with the Council's water supply. And any water lost by the Council through such injury or its ascertained value, together with the cost of all repairs necessitated thereby, shall be paid by such person to the Council within twenty-four hours after the time of such injuries having occurred.

6. Each authorized person shall be held solely responsible to the Council for such service-pipes being laid and completed by him in a sound, workmanlike, and durable manner, and to remain in that condition (sound and water-tight) for a period of three (3) months after each service-pipe has been completed.

7. Every competent person, previous to being authorized to lay private services, shall deposit with the Council the sum of £1, which shall be retained during the pleasure of the Council as a guarantee against damage; and shall also pay annually a sum of Five shillings sterling as a fee for a licence, and the Council may at any time withdraw such licence and forfeit such deposit, when the same shall be absolutely void, and the name of such person shall be at once struck off the roll of those authorized to lay private services, and be published in the local paper.

8. If any person shall be guilty of a breach of any of the characterized delayers the shall be light to a penalty.

8. If any person shall be guilty of a breach of any of the above-mentioned clauses he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling (f_5) .

The whole of the works herein referred to shall be carried out under the superintendence and according to

the directions of the Engineer or any other person the Council may appoint, and any dispute between the various parties concerned as to the quality of work and labour done, or as to the exact meaning of this specification and the general conditions, shall be referred to any officer the Council may appoint, whose decision in all cases shall be final and binding on all parties.

Quality of Materials required in Laying Private Services. The whole of the pipes, tees, thimbles, bends, reducing couplings, plugs, &c., to be of the best galvanized wrought iron.

All pipes and pieces to be true in sectional form, straight iongitudinally, and of equal strength and thickness throughout the entire body of same.

All ends of pipes, &c., to be properly and truly threaded, and capable of being screwed into thimbles, tees &c.

The whole of the pipes, tees, bends, &c., to be sound and free from all defects, and capable of standing a hydrostatic pressure equal to a column of water of 350

All delivery cocks to be high pressure, and made of brass of the best quality and workmanship, and of approved pattern to screw into elbow bends, &c. All cocks to stand the same pressure as the pipes.

All meters required to be fixed on private ground to be of the best manufacture and pattern, and no meter to be

provided and fixed unless previously approved by the Engineer.

No service-pipe shall be laid at a depth below the surface of the ground less than 10 inches.

All jointings between pipes, thimbles, bends, couplings, elbows, meters, and cocks to be made with red lead and flax only.

No person shall put or keep, or cause or allow to be put or kept, in any room, chamber, compartment, or place for the purpose of freezing, preserving, chilling, or storing:—

(a) any meat other than such is fresh and free from putrefaction, decomposition, fly-blow, phos-phorescence, clammy, slimy, and other unwhole-some conditions; or

- (b) any unclean, unwashed, or foul-smelling substance, offal, or viscera; or
