NOTICE UNDER VOTING BY POST ACT 1900.

ELECTORAL DISTRICT OF GLENELG.

Any Elector who intends to vote through the post must apply at once, as no Postal Ballot-paper will be supplied unless the Returning Officer receives application therefor sufficiently early to admit of Postal Ballot-paper being sent to and returned by such Elector so as to reach the Returning Officer before closing of Poll.

Caution.—Any person wilfully making a false statement in an application is liable on conviction to two years' imprisonment.

THE MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN BOARD OF WORKS.

BY-LAW No. 10.

THE Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works (hereinafter called the Board), pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on the Board by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Acts, and by so much of the *Water Act* 1890 as is incorporated therewith, and in exercise and execution of any statutory and other powers and authorities in anywise enabling the said Board in that behalf, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. Clauses 2 and 3 of By-law No. 4, which By-law was made and passed by the Board on the 29th day of May, 1894, and duly published in three consecutive numbers of the *Victorian Government Gazette*—namely, on the 1st, 8th, and 15th days of June, 1894, shall be and the same are hereby repealed.
2. The rate to be paid for the several lands and tenements to be supplied otherwise than by measure with water for domestic purposes on and after the 1st day of July, 1906, is hereby determined as follows, that is to say:—

1. For all such lands and tenements a rate of Sevenpence in the Pound of the valuation of such lands and tenements.

Provided that where a rate of Sevenpence in the Pound of such valuation would amount to less than 10s., the sum of 10s. is fixed as the amount of the rate to be paid in respect of any such lands and tenements.

The valuation of the said lands and tenements for the purpose of such water supply shall in every year be the valuation of such lands and tenements during such year or the previous year by the corporation of the City of Melbourne or the Council of the borough or municipal district in which such lands or tenements are situated, or if there be no such valuation the valuation of such lands and tenements by some Police Magistrate.

The foregoing By-law was made and passed by The Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works, and the common seal of the said Board was hereunto affixed the third day of April, One thousand nine hundred and six, in the presence of—

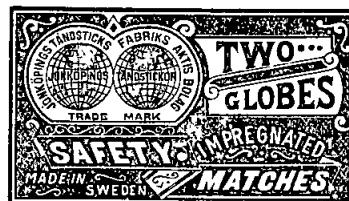

**REGULATION RESCINDED.—NEW REGULATION
MADE.**

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the
second day of April, 1906.*

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

WHEREAS by section 21 of the *Education Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1086) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind Regulation No. XXIII. of the Regulations made under the Education Acts, and doth make the Regulation following in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

REGULATION XXIII.—COMPULSORY CLAUSE.

1. The following returns shall be furnished by Head Teachers:—

- (a) The Head Teacher of every full-time State school shall, on the last Saturday in each month, furnish a certified return showing the names and ages of, and other particulars (as set forth in the form issued by the Department) in regard to, all children of school age who attended the Head Teacher's school during that month, but who failed to attend the number of times required by the *Education Act 1905* during any week or weeks in the said month. The Head Teacher shall also furnish, as often as may be necessary, a return of all children of school age who were absent from school for a full week, and who were not under efficient instruction in some other manner. This return must include children known to be not attending any school, whether on the roll or not.
- (b) The Head Teacher of every part-time State school shall, on the last Saturday in each month, furnish a certified return showing the names and ages of, and other particulars (as set forth in the form issued by the Department) in regard to, all children of school age who were or should have been in attendance at the Head Teacher's school during that month. The Head Teacher shall also furnish, as often as may be necessary, a return of all children of school age who were absent from school for any ten

consecutive school half-days, and who were not under efficient instruction in some other manner. This return must include children known to be not attending any school, whether on the roll or not.

2. Should any child on the roll be absent on any school day, the Head Teacher shall, in writing, require the parent or guardian of such child to forward an excuse for such non-attendance, and the excuse offered shall be reduced to writing and entered in the certified monthly return. All such excuses shall be filed by the Head Teacher for inspection by the truant officer. In the event of a parent or guardian, after being called upon to do so by the Head Teacher, neglecting or refusing to furnish such excuse, an entry to that effect must be made in the return.

3. Parents or guardians are to be permitted to transfer their children from a State school to any other State school at the commencement of the half-year ending the 30th June, or the 31st December, or at any time in the event of the parent or guardian removing his residence to another school district. Should, however, transfer be desired under any other circumstances, the written consent of the Board of Advice in whose district the school from which transfer is desired is situated must first be obtained, and Head Teachers shall not receive children presented for enrolment who fail to produce such written consent.

4. In the event of a child leaving a State school to attend any other State school, and such child having complied with the conditions of section 3 above, the Head Teacher shall provide such child with a transfer note giving the particulars of the last week's attendance of such child, and the number of half-days the school was open during such period, and the Head Teacher of the school to which transfer is desired shall not enrol any child who fails to produce a transfer note.

5. When a child is admitted to any school, the parent or guardian shall be required to fill up and sign the admission form supplied by the Department. It shall be the duty of the Head Teacher to enter the name of the child and all necessary information in the *School Register* at once.

All admission forms are to be kept for inspection by the truant officer on his visits to the school. No child's name shall be removed from the roll unless a satisfactory reason has been given for the child's permanent withdrawal from the school. The truant officer must be notified of all names removed. Teachers must revise the addresses of parents frequently, so that the *Register* may contain accurate information for the truant officer.

And the Honorable Arthur Otto Sachse, His Majesty's Minister of Public Instruction for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions hereinafter accordingly.

The security must be completed and contract signed within five days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contracts for Government supplies for a period of twelve months, such disqualification to date from the notification of acceptance of tender. It is also stipulated that if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, then his tender is to be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual; and that for breach of this condition the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and the tender declared informal.

Tenders, enclosed in a separate envelope, and having the words "Tender for ——" (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedule, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Commonwealth manufacture, provided the quality is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon, the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown districts are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of 6 miles from the General Post Office; and Williamstown district will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officers ordering the goods.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in Condition 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

8. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form at the time of the delivery of the goods, and the account shall be accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

10. All goods forwarded under these contracts shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor or contractors by whom consigned.

11. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any department except the Defence Department, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carrier to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. (In the case of the Defence Department, however, the consignment note only which accompanies the order must be used.) Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 14 of these conditions.

12. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In case of the rejection or return

of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in Condition 7.

13. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the State for the time being, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in Condition 7.

14. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in Condition 7. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and declare forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of twelve months from the date of such disqualification.

15. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government. If it is found during the currency of the contract that the contractor has not conformed to the condition of advertisement—which stipulates that if a tenderer be a member of a firm, and such firm be interested in the contract, then the tender is to be in the name of the firm, and not in that of the individual—then the Honorable the Treasurer may determine the contract, and forfeit the security money.

16. STAWELL BOROUGH WATER SUPPLY.

THE Council of the Borough of Stawell doth hereby, pursuant to and in execution of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the following Regulations for the due administration and the carrying out of the powers conferred on the said Council respecting the Stawell Water Supply:—

1. No person shall be authorized to lay service-pipes and attach the same to any pipe of the Council or to any private service already laid and connected with the pipes of the Council, unless he can satisfy the Council or its officers that he is competent and licensed to execute such work.

2. No person shall lay private services and attach the same to the pipes of the Council or to any private service already connected with the pipes of the Council without being duly approved, licensed, and authorized by the Council to do such work.

3. No private service whatsoever to be laid by any authorized person unless he has ascertained at the Council's office that the person for whom such work is intended has received the consent of the Engineer to execute such work.

4. After private services are laid and attached to the pipes of the Council, or otherwise to private service-pipes already connected, each authorized person shall, within twenty-four hours after each service has been completed, report all work done by him at the office, and sign in a book kept for the purpose his name and the date when each service was completed.

5. Each authorized person shall be held solely responsible to the Council for any injury occasioned by him from whatsoever cause to the street mains, or other property whilst attaching private services, or to private services already laid and connected with the Council's water supply. And any water lost by the Council through such injury or its ascertained value, together with the cost of all repairs necessitated thereby, shall be paid by such person to the Council within twenty-four hours after the time of such injuries having occurred.

6. Each authorized person shall be held solely responsible to the Council for such service-pipes being laid and completed by him in a sound, workmanlike, and durable manner, and to remain in that condition (sound and water-tight) for a period of three (3) months after each service-pipe has been completed.

7. Every competent person, previous to being authorized to lay private services, shall deposit with the Council the sum of £1, which shall be retained during the pleasure of the Council as a guarantee against damage; and shall also pay annually a sum of Five shillings sterling as a fee for a licence, and the Council may at any time withdraw such licence and forfeit such deposit, when the same shall be absolutely void, and the name of such person shall be at once struck off the roll of those authorized to lay private services, and be published in the local paper.

8. If any person shall be guilty of a breach of any of the above-mentioned clauses he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling (£5).

The whole of the works herein referred to shall be carried out under the superintendence and according to the directions of the Engineer or any other person the Council may appoint, and any dispute between the various parties concerned as to the quality of work and labour done, or as to the exact meaning of this specification and the general conditions, shall be referred to any officer the Council may appoint, whose decision in all cases shall be final and binding on all parties.

Quality of Materials required in Laying Private Services.
The whole of the pipes, tees, thimbles, bends, reducing couplings, plugs, &c., to be of the best galvanized wrought iron.

All pipes and pieces to be true in sectional form, straight longitudinally, and of equal strength and thickness throughout the entire body of same.

All ends of pipes, &c., to be properly and truly threaded, and capable of being screwed into thimbles, tees, &c.

The whole of the pipes, tees, bends, &c., to be sound and free from all defects, and capable of standing a hydrostatic pressure equal to a column of water of 350 feet.

All delivery cocks to be high pressure, and made of brass of the best quality and workmanship, and of approved pattern to screw into elbow bends, &c. All cocks to stand the same pressure as the pipes.
