## NOTICE UNDER VOTING BY POST ACT 1900.

ELECTORAL DISTRICT OF GLENELG.

Caution.—Any person wilfully making a false statement in an application is liable on conviction to two years' imprisonment.

INVESTIGATOR STRAIT.

REFERRING to Notice to Mariners, No. 24 of 1905, masters of vessels and others are informed that the master of the ketch *Scaflower* reports that when coming through Investigator Strait, on the 22nd inst., he noticed a spar about 14in. in diameter floating end up, and at times appearing from 8 feet to 10 feet above water.

The bearings are approximately—Cape York, N.N.W., distant nine miles; and Althorpes, west, distant 20 miles.

The wreckage is in the same position as that of the *Cygnat*, reported in August last. Mariners are cautioned to avoid the locality.

REFERRING to Notice to Mariners, No. 3 of 1906, the attention of masters of vessels and others is directed to the following particulars:—

SPENCER GULF.

*Middle Bank Light-ship.*

This vessel was removed on the 1st March for repairs and overhaul, and has been relieved by a three-masted vessel painted black. The light is shown from the foremast in a position under the forestay. During daylight a diamond-shaped object, painted red, is shown under her foretopmast stay.

*Shoalwater Point Obelisk.*

A white ball has been placed on the top of this obelisk to distinguish it from that on Plank Point, which has no ball.

*Port Victoria.—Rocky Island Channel.*

This channel is marked by two red cheese buoys. The N.W. buoy is just off the end of Rocky Island Reef, in 12 feet L.W.S. The S.E. buoy is placed off the end of the sand-bank in 8 feet L.W.S.

*Ward Spit.*

A pile beacon, having a square black head, has been erected in lieu of the buoy in 12 feet L.W.S. The beacon which was situated inside the position of this buoy has disappeared.

*Tumby Bay.*

The north end of Tumby Island Reef has been marked by a black can buoy with square-shaped cage head, moored in 3½ fathoms.

*Jarrolld Point.*

The red buoy which was placed at this point temporarily has been removed, and the bell buoy replaced.

## KANGAROO ISLAND.

*Kingscote.*

A pile beacon has been erected on the end of the spit inside bell buoy in 6 feet L.W.S., surmounted by circular red head.

*Cape Kersaint.*

A heavy break has been seen bearing S. by E. and distant three miles from Cape Kersaint, in a position which has about 30 fathoms on it by the Chart.

*Cape Bouguer.*

Two distinct breaks have been seen between Douglas Rock and Cape Bouguer, where from 14 to 20 fathoms are shown on Chart, making it unsafe for vessels of any size to pass inside Douglas Rock.

## ERROR IN CHARTED POSITION OF COAST-LINE BETWEEN CAPE KIDNAPPERS AND BLACK HEAD.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 11 of 1906, dated 9th February, 1906, Captain Bollons, of the Government steamer *Hinemoa*, reports that Bare Island lies one mile from the nearest part of the mainland, but that the contour of the coast-line in its vicinity is not accurately laid down. Both Captain Bollons and Captain David, of the s.s. *Corinthic*, agree with the previous report in making the bearing between Cape Kidnappers and Bare Island to be S. 1 deg. E.

The Surveyor-General's observations, which were sent to the Hydrographer to the Admiralty in November, 1903, show that the land between Cape Kidnappers and Tuki-tuki River is changed about 1 minute north of correct position. Cape Kidnappers about one mile N. 20 deg. E., and Bare Island S. 55 deg. W., of correct position. This gives the distance between Cape Kidnappers and Bare Island as 11½ miles, instead of 13 miles as shown on the Admiralty Chart.

The Surveyor-General's observations also show that the coast-line to the southward, between Black Head and Bare Island, is inaccurately plotted on the Admiralty Chart, Paorui Point being shown 2.3 miles S. 55 deg. W. of the correct position.

## ACHERON POINT BREASTWORK (AUCKLAND).

THE Auckland Harbor Board reports that large quantities of rock are being deposited off Acheron Point, Freeman's Bay, to form a breastwork about 2,000 feet in length from high-water mark. A wall of rock is also being made from the breastwork 500 feet in an easterly direction. Masters of vessels are warned against navigating or anchoring their vessels near these works.

For some time this ridge has had 2½ fathoms at L.W.O.S. The main channel is improving in depth, there being 4½ fathoms at L.W.O.S. where formerly there was 4½ fathoms.

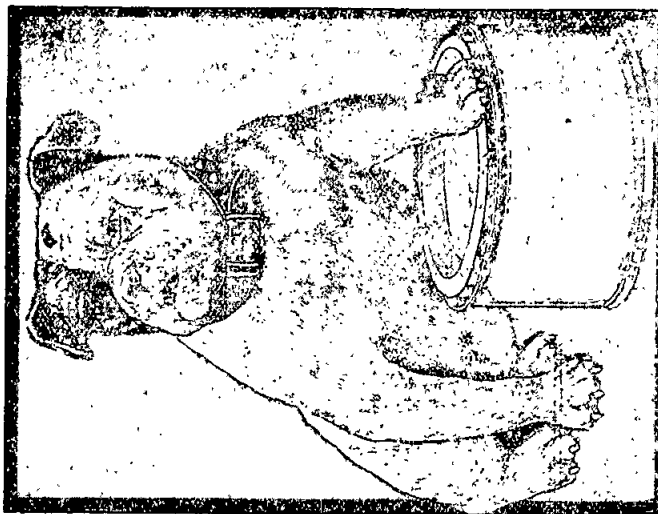

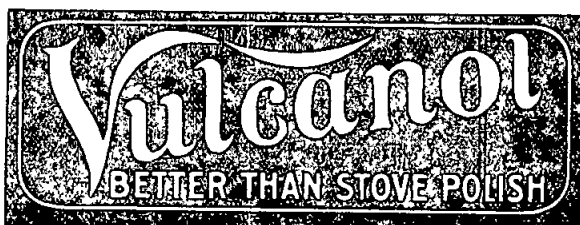

#### CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best condition, and to be delivered in sound packages, free from all charges for cartage, freight, &c. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

2. Supplies for country stations for which no local contract may have been taken, or for which the contract has been terminated, may be ordered under the Melbourne contract.

3. The Melbourne District will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office; Williamstown District will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra, and all Government vessels which may be in Hobson's Bay during the currency of the contract; the Ararat, Beechworth, and Ballarat Districts will include the Hospitals for the Insane, Gaols, Police Gaols, and Lock-ups at these places; and the Geelong District embraces a radius of two miles from the Post Office.

The lock-ups at City Watch-House, Bourke-street West, Brunswick, Carlton, Colburg, Collingwood, Fitzroy, Fitzroy North, Hotham Hill, Little Bourke-street, North Melbourne, Port Melbourne, Prahran, Richmond, St. Kilda, South Melbourne, and South Yarra are included in the contracts for the Melbourne District.

4. Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the price demanded, except brandy casks, porter cases, hogsheds, butter firkins or boxes, and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps), flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for. The empties to be removed from the place of delivery at the contractor's expense.

5. The meat supplied under these conditions must, if practicable, be slaughtered at abattoirs which are under proper authorized inspection and supervision. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, on report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account, or from the security money.

6. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of department concerned or any officer authorized by him.

7. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor, and the account is to be rendered as soon as possible after the delivery of the supplies, accompanied by the receipted delivery order. For the supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts, the account is to be rendered monthly for such quantities only as are issued, the difference between the supply and issue to be kept at the contractor's credit. Supplies not issued at the termination of the contract to be removed by the contractor. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.

8. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the times mentioned in the order, they or any like supplies suitable for the service will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account or from the security money.

9. If the officer in charge of stores be not satisfied as to the quantity or quality of the stores, or if, after taking delivery of any stores or material, he shall discover any deficiency or defect therein, he may return such deficient or defective stores or material to the contractor, and shall report the same to the head of his department and to the Tender Board.

10. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a board of survey composed of persons named by the Treasurer of the State for the time being; and the decision of the board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 8.

11. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 8.

12. In the case of supplies for Hospitals for the Insane, it will also be competent for two or more of the official visitors, in conjunction with the medical superintendent, to reject any supplies that they may consider not in accordance with contract; and in such cases the reference to a board of survey will not be deemed to be necessary on the part of the contractor.

13. In the case of supplies for Hospitals for the Insane, it will be competent for a board of survey, consisting of the medical superintendent (or, in his absence, of the medical officer) and any two officers named by him, to examine and reject any supplies that may be objected to. It must be distinctly understood, however, that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the Treasurer of the State for the time being; but, pending such appeal, he must take back the rejected articles and at once supply others of approved quality; failing which, the supplies required or any like supplies suitable for the service may be obtained by the officer concerned, and the expense charged to the contractor. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

14. As the exact quantity of any article of provisions which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same as ordered.

15. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the persons to whom the rations are due or to the contractor in waiting for a board to survey, the head of the department or officer authorized to take delivery will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service, will be obtained by the officer requiring it. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies so rejected or returned.

16. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in condition 8. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any part of the security money.

17. **I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Coburg order that section I., Part V., Thirteenth Schedule, *Local Government Act 1903*, is hereby adopted as a By-law, in and for the Borough of Coburg, as follows:—

##### Part V.—Regulation, &c., of Buildings.

1. It shall be lawful for the Council from time to time to make regulations for all or any of the purposes following, that is to say:—

For regulating or restraining the use of combustible materials in the construction, alteration, repair, or renewal of buildings, roofs, or chimneys, flues, smoke-vents, or stove-pipes, hereinafter in this subdivision called in common "chimneys," or of parts thereof respectively, to be specified in the regulations.

For regulating the distance from any other building at which it shall be lawful to construct any building.

For regulating the distance from any class of building at which it shall be lawful to erect or construct a building for burning clay or other materials.

For regulating the height, thickness, construction, or materials of the party walls of buildings adjoining each other, and of the external walls of buildings and of chimneys, and the materials for and the mode of enclosing same.

For regulating the construction, materials, and enclosing by building or otherwise of fire-places or furnaces to be used in the working of engines by steam, or in any mill, brewery, bakehouse, or gas work, or manufactory whatsoever, although a steam engine is not used therein respectively.

For regulating the erection of tents.

For limiting a time, not in any case less than seven years from the coming into force of the limiting regulation, after which it shall not be lawful, without the consent of the Council, to use, keep, continue, or suffer to remain, any building, roof, fire-place, furnace, or chimney, or the enclosure of any fire-place, furnace, or chimney originally constructed or made without violation of the law and existing at the time of such coming into force, being of any such construction, height, thickness, material, or description, or within any such distance of other buildings as respectively are contrary to any regulation existing at the time of such coming into force.

For appointing fees, not in any case exceeding the sum of Two pounds, which may be charged and received on account of the municipal fund by the proper officer of the Council for any inspection, superintendence, or other service made or performed by him under any such regulations as hereinbefore in this section provided for.

And every such regulation may be made to apply to the whole or separately to a part or parts of the municipal district described by boundaries in such regulation, and may provide with respect to the several matters prohibition, restraint, and regulation hereinbefore in this section mentioned, either absolutely or with relation to classes, rates, situations, distances, or other like data to be laid down or referred to in general terms therein, and with or without relation to a right of approval, disapproval, or inspection to be vested in the Council or some proper officer of the Council.

The Council may, on application in writing by the owner or occupier of any yard or premises within the borough, which shall, in the opinion of the Council, be suitable and efficient as a place for the sale of cattle, license any such yard or premises for such time and upon such terms as the Council may think fit, as a place for the sale of cattle, provided the Council shall have the same powers with regard to any such yard or premises as are hereby vested in them with regard to the Market, and no cattle shall be sold within the borough unless in such yards or premises as have been so licensed by the Council.

4. The sum of Two shillings and sixpence per annum shall be the amounts to be paid for such yard or premises so licensed, and shall be paid by the person applying for such licence before the same is granted.

5. That the following tolls, dues, and sums of money be demanded, received, and had by the said Council from every auctioneer who shall at any time use the said Cattle Market, or any licensed yard or premises within the borough for all cattle sold therein, that is to say:—

For every horse, mare, gelding, ass, or mule—Sixpence.

For every mare with foal at foot sold as one lot—Sixpence.

For every foal under 12 months, without dam—Threepence.

For every fat cattle or working bullock—Threepence.

For every store cattle or springer—Twopence.

For every cow with calf sold as one lot—Twopence.

For every cattle under 12 months—One penny.

For every pig—One farthing.

For every sow with litter sold as one lot—Sixpence.

For every fat sheep or goat—One half-penny.

For every store sheep—One farthing.

For every ewe with lamb at foot sold as one lot—One farthing.

6. Every auctioneer selling cattle within the Market or any licensed yards or premises shall, at the close of every month, furnish to the Council a return showing the number of cattle sold by him during that month, and shall at the same time pay to the Council an amount reckoned according to the above scale of charges.

7. All cattle not removed from the said Market by the hour of Twelve o'clock noon on the day next after any sale shall have been held in the said Market, shall be provided with sufficient food by the person placing or

entering them in the Market for sale, failing which the Council may do so at the expense of such person, or the said cattle may, if the Council think fit, be impounded at the expense and risk of the owner of such cattle.

8. No auctioneer shall sell or offer for sale any cattle within the said Market without the written permission of the Council so to do first had and obtained, for which privilege each auctioneer shall pay a fee of One pound per annum; and no auctioneer shall charge more than Five per cent. commission on any cattle sold within the Market.

9. All cattle brought into the Market for sale or otherwise shall be at the risk of the owner of such stock, and the Council shall not be liable for any damage sustained to such stock whilst within the said Market.

10. By-law number 53 of the Borough of St. Arnaud is hereby repealed.

11. Every person committing a breach of any one of the provisions contained in this By-law shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty or sum not exceeding Ten pounds, and not less than Five shillings; or, if such breach be a continuing act or default, shall pay a penalty or sum not exceeding Five pounds, and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

12. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.
