PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Reginald Arthur James Talbot, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Public Half-Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz. :—

THURSDAY, THE 24TH DAY OF MAY, 1906, throughout the Town of Warrnambool and the Shire of Chiltern, and from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, throughout the City of Bendigo*.

SHIRE OF DUNMUNKLE RE-SUBDIVIDED.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-third day of May, 1906.

PRESENT :

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

Mr. Bent	Mr. Murray
Sir Samuel Gillott	Mr. Swinburne.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1903* (3 Edw. VII. No. 1893), it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make Orders exercising certain powers therein set forth, amongst others, to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight, and that every such Order shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall take

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effect as from the day of such publication : And whereas a petition purporting to be signed by more than one-fourth of the ratepayers whose names are on the municipal roll of the Shire of Dunmunkle has been presented to the Governor in Council, notice of which was published in the *Government Gazette* of the 7th day of February, 1906, and no counter petition received : Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby re-subdivide the said shire into three separate ridings, to be named the East Riding, the West Riding, and the North Riding, the several boundaries of which are herein set forth and described, that is to say :—

SHIRE OF DUNMUNKLE RE-SUBDIVIDED.

EAST RIDING.

Commencing at a point on the south boundary of the shire at the south-east angle of allotment 71, parish of Marma; thence north by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 101A; thence east by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 99B; thence north by a road to the north-east angle of allotment 95, parish of Rupanyup; thence west by the north boundary of that allotment to the south-east angle of allotment 89; thence north by the east boundary of that allotment to the south-east angle of allotment 124; thence north by a road to the north-east angle of allotment 125; thence north by the east boundary of allotment 130A to the south boundary of allotment 130; thence east by the south boundary of that allotment and north by its east boundary and the east boundary of allotment 131 to the north-east angle of allotment last named; thence easterly by the three-chain road from Pimpinio to St. Arnaud to the south-east angle of allotment 158, parish of Rupanyup; thence north and east by the east side of said allotment to the west boundary of allotment 154A; thence south by a road to the south-west angle of said allotment; thence east and north-easterly by the south boundaries of allotments 154A, 153, and 152 to the south-east angle of the allotment last named; thence east and south-easterly by the three-chain road from Pimpinio to St. Arnaud to the western boundary of the parish of Burrum Burrum; thence northerly and easterly by the west and north boundaries of the said parish to the eastern boundary of the shire; thence following the shire boundary southerly and westerly to the commencing point.

WEST RIDING.

Commencing at a point on the south boundary of the shire at the south-east angle of allotment 71, parish of Marma; thence north by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 101A; thence east by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 99B; thence north by a road to the north-east angle of allotment 95, parish of Rupanyup;

thence west by the north boundary of that allotment to the south-east angle of allotment 89; thence north by the east boundary of that allotment to the south-east angle of allotment 124; thence north by a road to the north-east angle of allotment 125; thence north by the east boundary of allotment 130A to the south boundary of allotment 130; thence east by the south boundary of that allotment and north by its east boundary and the east boundary of allotment 131 to the north-east angle of allotment last named; thence westerly by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 161; thence northerly by the eastern boundary of the parish of Ashens to its north-east angle; thence west by the north boundary of said parish to the south-west angle of allotment 125, parish of Kewell East; thence north by a road to the north-west angle of the allotment last named; thence south-westerly by a three-chain road to the south-west angle of allotment 128; thence north by a road to the north-west angle of allotment last named; thence westerly by a three-chain road to the western boundary of the shire; thence following the shire boundary southerly and easterly to the point of commencement.

NORTH RIDING.

Commencing at a point on the western boundary of the shire at the north-west angle of allotment 5C, parish of Kewell East; thence easterly along a three-chain road to the north-east angle of allotment 129; thence south along a one-chain road to the south-east angle of said allotment; thence north-easterly along a three-chain road to the north-east angle of allotment 126; thence south along a one-chain road to the north boundary of allotment 23, parish of Ashens; thence east along the north boundary of the said parish to the north-east angle of same; thence south by the east boundary of the said parish to the south-east angle of allotment 75; thence easterly along a three-chain road from Pimpinio to St. Arnaud to the south-east angle of allotment 158, parish of Rupanyup; thence north and east by the east side of said allotment to the west boundary of allotment 154A; thence south by a road to the south-west angle of said allotment; thence east and north-easterly by the south boundaries of allotments 154A, 153, and 152 to the south-east angle of the allotment last named; thence east and south-easterly by the three-chain road from Pimpinio to St. Arnaud to the western boundary of the parish of Burrum Burrum; thence northerly and easterly by the west and north boundaries of the said parish to the east boundary of the shire; thence following the shire boundary northerly, westerly, and southerly to the commencing point.

The shire boundary above referred to is that described in the *Government Gazette* of the 24th October, 1890.

And the Honorable Ewen Hugh Cameron, His Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

No. 1893), it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make Orders exercising certain powers therein set forth, amongst others, to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight, and that every such Order shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition purporting to be signed by more than one-fourth of the ratepayers whose names are on the municipal roll of the Shire of Shepparton has been presented to the Governor in Council, notice of which was published in the *Government Gazette* of the 24th day of January, 1906, and no counter petition received: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby re-subdivide the said shire into four separate ridings, to be named the Shepparton Riding, the North Riding, the South Riding, and the Dookie Riding, the several boundaries of which are herein set forth and described, that is to say:—

SHIRE OF SHEPPARTON RE-SUBDIVIDED.
SHEPPARTON RIDING.

Commencing on the Goulburn River at a point nearest to the north-west corner of allotment 17, parish of Shepparton; thence in a direct line to the north-west corner of said allotment; thence easterly by a road along the northern

boundary of that allotment and allotments 16 and 15 to the north-east angle of the allotment last named; thence southerly by a road, being the eastern boundaries of allotments 15, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, 4B, 5B, and 14 to the Broken River; thence north-westerly by that river to its intersection with the Goulburn River; thence northerly by the river last named to the commencing point.

SOUTH RIDING.

The Shire boundary above referred to is that described in the *Government Gazette* of the 23rd December, 1903.

And the Honorable Ewen Hugh Cameron, His Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
