NOTICE UNDER VOTING BY POST ACT 1900.

ELECTORAL DISTRICT OF BARWON.

AN Election of a Member of the Legislative Assembly is about to be held in the above-mentioned Electoral District, and any Elector thereof who appears from the rolls to reside in such District, and who resides at least five miles from the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or who has reason to believe that on the polling day he will not be within five miles of the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or that on account of ill-health or infirmity he will be prevented from voting personally thereat, who desires to vote through the post office at such Election, may, on posting an application to the Returning Officer, obtain a Postal Ballot-paper enabling him to vote through the post at such Election.

If applicant is the holder of an elector's right, such right must be attached to application.

No postage is payable thereon.

Any Elector who intends to vote through the post must apply at once, as no Postal Ballot-paper will be supplied unless the Returning Officer receives application therefor sufficiently early to admit of Postal Ballot-paper being sent to and returned by such Elector so as to reach the Returning Officer before closing of Poll.

Caution.—Any person wilfully making a false statement in an application is liable on conviction to two years' imprisonment.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, at the expiration of one month from this date, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to revoke the Proclamation issued on the 13th day of February, 1904, and published in the *Government Gazette*, page 1001, defining the area in the Moyne River in which netting is prohibited, and to issue a Proclamation defining such area to be as follows:—

The waters between Griffith Island and the mainland northward of a line running N.W. from the westernmost point of the said island to the opposite shore; also the waters between the training walls of the Moyne River from its junction with the south-west passage to the mouth at the outer extremities of such training walls; and thence seawards between imaginary lines extending therefrom N. 30 deg. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than twenty-four boys under the age of sixteen years for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said twenty-four boys under the age of sixteen years shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That every boy under the age of sixteen years so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which he works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That every boy under the age of sixteen years shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening he works overtime.
4. That none of such boys shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

MOOROOPNA PUBLIC CEMETERY.

THE subjoined Regulations and Scale of Fees, which have been made by the Trustees of the Mooroopna Public Cemetery, have, pursuant to the provisions of sections 9 and 16 respectively of the *Cemeteries Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1072), been approved by the Governor in Council.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sundays, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from Nine a.m. to Four p.m.

3. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders given.

4. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the trustees therefor, who, if the application is approved, and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B), which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of the ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right, on obtaining the permission of the trustees, as hereafter mentioned in clause 5, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the trustees.

6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary, gatekeeper, or sexton.

7. Application for an order for interment shall be made between the hours of Nine a.m. and Four p.m., at least eight working hours before the time fixed for burial.

8. No coffin shall be buried within four feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall not be less than three feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least one foot thick shall be left undisturbed above any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

9. The hours for burials shall be:—On weeks days, September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m. On Sundays, throughout the year, from Two to Five p.m.

10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or other grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

11. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any persons having paid the fee for a private grave, and requiring a brick grave or vault, shall be permitted to construct the same, subject to the approval of the trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

12. No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give the same.

13. No person employed by the trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the trustees.

14. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Nine a.m. to Six p.m., September to April inclusive; and Nine a.m. to Five p.m., May to August inclusive, daily throughout the year.

15. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the trustees.

16. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

17. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.

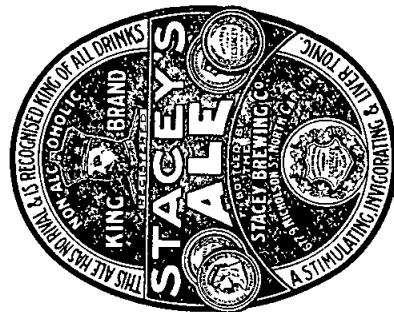

BY-LAW No. 39, MAKING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES.

THE Council of the Borough of Creswick, as the local governing body, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 600 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, makes the following Regulations:—

The following are the rates which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements within the Water Supply District of Creswick shall pay in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes, from the 1st day of July, 1906:—

1. For every house or tenement of the annual value of £12 or under, the sum of One pound per annum.
2. For every house or tenement of the annual value of £13, and not exceeding £20, the sum of One pound five shillings per annum.
3. For every house or tenement of the annual value of £21, and not exceeding £30, the sum of One pound ten shillings per annum.
4. For every house or tenement of the annual value of £31, and not exceeding £50, the sum of Two pounds per annum.
5. For every house or tenement of the annual value of £51, and not exceeding £75, the sum of Two pounds ten shillings per annum.
6. For every house or tenement of the annual value of £76, and not exceeding £100, the sum of Three pounds per annum.
7. For every house or tenement of the annual value of £101, and not exceeding £150, the sum of Three pounds ten shillings per annum.
8. For every house or tenement of the annual value of £151, and not exceeding £200, the sum of Four pounds per annum.
9. For every house or tenement above the annual value of £200, the sum of Five pounds per annum.

Hotels.

10. For every hotel of the annual value of £50 or under, the sum of Two pounds ten shillings per annum.
11. For every hotel of the annual value of £51, and not exceeding £100, the sum of Three pounds ten shillings per annum.
12. For every hotel of the annual value of £101, and not exceeding £150, the sum of Four pounds fifteen shillings per annum.
13. For every hotel of the annual value of £151, and not exceeding £200, the sum of Six pounds per annum.
14. For every hotel above the annual value of £200, the sum of Seven pounds per annum.
15. Premises, except livery or coach-horse stables, where horses are constantly kept (in addition to above), to be charged at the rate of Six shillings per stall per annum.
16. In hotels, one stall allowed for every £50 annual value; each additional stall to be charged at the rate of Six shillings per annum.
17. For water-troughs at hotels, the sum of One pound per annum; if in private paddocks, the sum of Ten shillings per annum.
18. For water supplied by meter, the sum of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.
19. The minimum charge by measure to be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, but in no case to be less than what it would amount to by valuation, with One pound in addition per annum.
20. For water supplied at stand-pipe, the sum of Sixpence per load of 180 gallons.
21. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Five shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering to be charged, with a minimum of Ten shillings.
22. For siphon pumps, the sum of One pound per annum.
23. For schools, the sum of Two pounds ten shillings per annum each.
24. All water rates and charges shall be paid, in advance, by equal moieties, on the 1st day of April and the 1st day of October in each year.
25. By-laws Nos. 32 and 37 are hereby repealed.

SHIRE OF MORTLAKE.

By-Law No. 13.

A By-law of the Shire of Mortlake, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 13, for preserving Commons and Reserves.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Mortlake order as follows:—

1. No person shall, without the consent of the Council of the shire first obtained, bring, place, deposit, or throw, or cause or suffer or permit to be brought, placed, deposited, or thrown, or assist in bringing, placing, depositing, or throwing any stone, earth, sand, dust, mill ashes, offal, manure, timber, rubbish, or any other material of whatsoever kind or nature in or upon any common or public reserve of which the management is vested in the Council or any part thereof.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Shire of Mortlake.

3. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Ten pounds.
