## NOTICE UNDER VOTING BY POST ACT 1900.

## ELECTORAL DISTRICT OF BARWON.

If applicant is the holder of an elector's right, such right must be attached to application.

Any Elector who intends to vote through the post must apply at once, as no Postal Ballot-paper will be supplied unless the Returning Officer receives application therefor sufficiently early to admit of Postal Ballot-paper being sent to and returned by such Elector so as to reach the Returning Officer before closing of Poll.

Caution.—Any person wilfully making a false statement in an application is liable on conviction to two years' imprisonment.

**I**N pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Acts, and of every other power enabling them in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of East Loddon (hereinafter called the "Council"), for the purpose of carrying the said Acts into execution within their jurisdiction, do hereby make the following By-law (that is to say):—

1. Registration of cowkeepers, dairymen, and purveyors of milk.—Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairymen, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of July in every year, register himself with the Council in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the Shire Secretary an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall, with every such application, pay the fee hereunder specified:—

(a) If the person to be registered keep cows, and the number of cows so kept be—

(b) If the person to be registered do not keep cows, a fee of Two shillings.

## REGULATION RELATING TO SHEDS, ETC.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1890*, The Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners (hereinafter called the "Commissioners") make the following Regulation:—

Regulation number 228 of Part 11 of the Regulations made and passed by the Commissioners on the 28th day of March, 1900, is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following Regulation is made:—

228. No person shall soil, deface, mark, or injure or, without the consent of the Commissioners, write or paint or place any placard or other document upon any shed, waiting-room, barricade, railing, fence, wharf, or wharf-post; nor shall any person place or deposit any rubbish or refuse matter in or upon any of the wharfs, wharf-roads, sheds, or other buildings of the Commissioners except at the places and in the manner pointed out by the Harbor Master, nor commit any nuisance in or upon any such wharfs, wharf-roads, sheds, or other buildings, nor discharge therein or thereon any excrement, urine, or other matter of an offensive character or likely to create a nuisance.

This Regulation shall be read and construed with and form part of Part 11 of the said Regulations of the Commissioners.

## GULF OF ST. VINCENT.—PT. ADELAIDE RIVER.

NOTICE is hereby given that, in accordance with Notice to Mariners, No. 1 of 1906, eight extra beacons have been placed on the north and east side of the cutting. The beacons are painted black, and the lanterns green, from which a green light showing towards the cutting is exhibited; a white light is also exhibited from the back of each lantern showing towards the shore.

All the green light beacons are numbered from the first or seaward beacon with the letter "G" added, as follows:—No. 0G being outside beacon; No. 1G, near the reflecting beacon; No. 2G, opposite the old boat channel. This light indicates the turning point from No. 2 (red) lead towards No. 3. All the others, that is Nos. 3G to 9G, both inclusive, are placed opposite the corresponding numbers of the white light beacons on the other side of the cutting.

All the single light beacons are placed about 15 feet back from the cutting, and painted red to starboard and black to port. The lights are white to starboard and green to port from seaward.

The red light on the pile beacon south of No. 3 being no longer required, will, on and after the 1st June, 1906, be discontinued.

In consequence of the above alterations the sailing directions have been amended to read as follows:—

## Sailing Directions.

*By Night.*—In approaching the Anchorage, vessels of deep draught should not bring the white light on the old structure to bear north of N.E. by E. in order to avoid the four-fathom patch, which bears N.W. half N. from the light on Wonga Shoal; then get No. 1 lead (which consists of two red lights vertical 10 feet apart, and two white lights vertical 11 ft. 9 in. apart) in line; keep these in line passing between the occulting light on the red buoy and the outer green light on the north bank, also between the other green lights on the north bank and the white lights on the revetment mound.

Steer on the same line until the two red lights of No. 2 lead are coming on; then steer with them in line until abreast of No. 2G beacon; then direct the course to pass between No. 3 and No. 3G beacons; and so on from beacon to beacon round the point until No. 9 is reached. From a safe distance off No. 9 the lights of No. 10 lead will be seen; keep them in line until the red light is about a quarter of a point open to the right of the white light of No. 11 lead; then gradually alter the course to bring the lights of No. 11 lead in line; keep them in line (a sharp lookout being kept for the mooring buoys on the starboard hand) until the lights of No. 12 lead are seen coming into line; proceed as before by altering the course before the lights are on with each other. The same applies in the change from No. 12 to No. 13 lead. When the lights on the wharfs are seen opening out off Luff Point, alter the course so as to round the point at a safe distance, and then up the centre of the channel, looking out for the mooring buoys on the starboard hand.

In going outwards the directions are just the opposite to those given for those coming inwards; but in such case, in changing from one lead to another, the course should be gradually altered when abreast of the low (red) beacon of each lead, excepting No. 2 lead. In this case, when abreast of No. 3 beacon, gradually alter the course to a safe distance off No. 2G until the two red lights of No. 2 lead are in line, then proceed outwards with No. 2 lead in line.

*By Day.*—The directions by day are the same as by night, merely substituting the beacons for the lights.

This affects Admiralty Charts 2389a and B, 1750 and 1752.

During the progress of the work at the Light's Passage Harbor Works, masters of vessels exempt from pilotage may, if they so desire, avail themselves of the services of a pilot to assist them in passing such works, either in or out, at one-half the usual rates.

If the usual exemption flag is not hoisted it will be taken as a signal that a pilot is required. At night if a pilot is required the usual signal for a pilot should be shown.

N.B.—Owing to the nature of the work in progress, this notice may require to be amended from time to time, and therefore should be treated as tentative only.

### REGULATIONS FOR GRANTING CERTIFICATES TO MINING ENGINE-DRIVERS.

THE Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the provisions of section 142 of the *Mines Act 1897*, has, by an Order made on the 5th day of June, 1906, cancelled the Orders of the 1st August, 1898, and the 13th May, 1902, making Regulations for granting Certificates to Mining Engine-drivers, and has made the following Regulations in lieu thereof, viz:—

#### REGULATIONS.

##### PRELIMINARY REQUIREMENTS.

1. Each applicant for a certificate of competency must forward to the Secretary for Mines, Mining Department, Melbourne, notice in writing of his intention to present himself for examination, such notice to be given not less than fourteen (14) clear days prior to the date of examination.

The notice must be accompanied by cash, post-office order, or postal notes to the amount or value of 10s.

Should the applicant pass the prescribed examination, the deposit shall, in each instance, go towards payment of the fee for certificate; in the event, however, of the failure of the candidate to pass the examination, such amount shall be forfeited to the consolidated revenue.

No certificate shall be issued until full payment of the fee required shall have been made to the Secretary for Mines.

##### CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

2. The certificates of competency to be issued by the Board of Examiners shall be of three classes, namely, *first*, *second*, and *third*—

A first-class certificate shall entitle the holder thereof to drive any engine used for mining purposes, unless the certificate be qualified as provided for in clause 5b.

A second-class certificate shall entitle the holder thereof to drive any engine used for mining purposes except a winding engine, unless the certificate be qualified as provided for in clause 4b.

A third-class certificate shall entitle the holder thereof to drive any engine used for mining purposes not being a winding engine, and the cylinder of which does not exceed 12 inches in diameter, or a double-cylinder engine, the cylinders of which have a combined area not exceeding that of a single cylinder of not more than 12 inches in diameter, unless the certificate be qualified as provided for in clause 3b.

3. An applicant for a third-class certificate must produce to the Board satisfactory evidence—

(a) Of his respectability of character.

(b) That within a period of three (3) years prior to the date of examination he has, during not less than twelve months, been assisting to drive engines used for mining purposes for not less than twelve (12) hours per week.

Where the applicant has had experience only on one engine or class of engine, the Board may grant a conditional certificate for that engine or class of engine only.

(c) That he is at the date of examination not under the age of eighteen (18) years, nor over the age of fifty (50) years. This latter age not to apply to persons who had experience in driving engines previous to their attaining the age of fifty years.

(d) That neither his eyesight nor his hearing is defective, and that he is not subject to any mental or other bodily infirmity likely to interfere with the efficient discharge of his duties. A document signed by the mining manager or engineer of the company or mine-owner, and by the engine-driver by whom the applicant has been taught, bearing on this clause, may be considered satisfactory evidence of his having had the necessary experience at a mine; provided the document signed by the engine-driver be declared by such engine-driver before a justice of the peace or a commissioner for taking declarations and affidavits to be true and correct in every particular.

4. An applicant for a second-class certificate must produce to the Board satisfactory evidence—

(a) Of his respectability of character.

(b) That he has been the holder of a third-class certificate under these Regulations, or a second-class certificate under the *Factories and Shops Acts*, for a period of not less than twelve (12) months, and that he has had at least six (6) months' experience during that period in driving a third-class mining engine or engines, such driving experience to have been for not less than twelve (12) hours per week; or that he has within a period of three (3) years prior to the date of examination assisted to drive a steam-engine the cylinder of which is more than twelve (12) inches in diameter, or a double-cylinder steam-engine the cylinders of which have a combined area equal to that of a single cylinder of more than twelve (12) inches in diameter for a period of not less than twelve (12) months, and for at least twelve hours per week: The examination to be equivalent to that undergone by a candidate for a first-class factory certificate.

Where the applicant has had experience only on one engine or class of engine, the Board may grant a conditional certificate for that engine or class of engine only.

(c) That he is at the date of examination not under the age of nineteen (19) years, nor over the age of fifty (50) years. This latter age not to apply to persons who had experience in driving engines previous to their attaining the age of fifty years.

(d) That neither his eyesight nor his hearing is defective, and that he is not subject to any mental or other bodily infirmity likely to interfere with the efficient discharge of his duties. A document signed by the mining manager or engineer of the company or mine-owner, and by the engine-driver by whom the applicant has been taught, bearing on this clause, may be considered satisfactory evidence of his having had the necessary experience at a mine; provided the document signed by the engine-driver be declared by such engine-driver before a justice of the peace or a commissioner for taking declarations and affidavits to be true and correct in every particular.

5. An applicant for a first-class certificate must produce to the Board satisfactory evidence—

(a) Of his respectability of character.

(b) That he has been the holder of a second-class certificate under these Regulations, or that he has been the holder of a first-class certificate of competency or service issued under the *Factories and Shops Acts*, for a period of not less than twelve months, and that he has had at

least six months' experience during that period in assisting to drive both loose eccentric and link-motion winding engines.

Such experience to be for not less than twelve (12) hours per week.

Where only one class of the above engines or any other class of winding gear has been driven, the Board may grant a conditional certificate for that class of engine only.

(c) That he is at the date of examination not under the age of twenty-one (21) years, nor over the age of fifty (50) years. This latter age does not apply to persons who had experience in driving winding engines previous to their attaining the age of fifty years.

(d) That neither his eyesight nor his hearing is defective, and that he is not subject to any mental or other bodily infirmity likely to interfere with the efficient discharge of his duties. A document signed by the mining manager or engineer of the company, or mine-owner, and by the engine-driver by whom the applicant has been taught, bearing on this clause, may be considered satisfactory evidence of his having had the necessary experience at a mine; provided the document signed by the engine-driver be declared by such engine-driver before a justice of the peace or a commissioner for taking declarations and affidavits to be true and correct in every particular.

#### EXAMINATIONS.

6. Examinations will be conducted by the Board at such time and place as may from time to time be notified by the Secretary in the *Government Gazette*, and in a newspaper published or circulated in the locality, and candidates will be examined according to priority of receipt of notice required by clause 1; each candidate will be duly notified of the time and place of examination.

7. Candidates for certificates of competency will be examined as to their practical knowledge and working of machinery, including steam and other engines, boilers, furnaces, winding and pumping gear, or any other machinery used for mining purposes.

8. If a candidate shall fail to pass the examination prescribed, he shall not again present himself until a period of not less than three months shall have elapsed from the date of his last examination.

9. The holder of a first-class certificate of competency or of service under the Mines Acts shall be entitled to drive any engine at a mine or any engine under the Factories and Shops Acts.

10. The holder of a first-class certificate of competency or of service under the Factories and Shops Acts shall be entitled to drive any engine at a mine except a winding engine.

11. The holder of a second-class certificate of competency or of service under the Mines Acts shall be entitled to drive any engine under the Factories and Shops Acts.

12. The holder of a second-class certificate of competency or of service under the Factories and Shops Acts shall be entitled to drive any engine used for mining purposes not being a winding engine, and the cylinder of which does not exceed 12 inches in diameter, or a double-cylinder engine the cylinders of which have a combined area not exceeding that of a single cylinder of not more than 12 inches in diameter.

13. The holder of a third-class certificate under the *Mines Act 1897* shall be entitled to drive any second-class engine under the Factories and Shops Acts.

#### COPIES OF CERTIFICATES.

14. Whenever any person proves to the satisfaction of the Board of Examiners that he has, without fault on his part, lost or been deprived of any certificate previously granted to him under the provisions of the Mines Acts, such Board shall, upon payment of such fee, if any, as they may direct, but not exceeding the fee specified in the Schedule hereto, cause a copy of the certificate to which the applicant appears to be entitled to be made out and certified by the Secretary to the Board, and delivered to the applicant, and any copy so made and certified as aforesaid shall have the effect of the original certificate. The fee, if any, herein referred to shall be paid to the Secretary for Mines in cash or post-office order, and shall by him be paid into the consolidated revenue.

15. If a candidate attempt to obtain a certificate by means of false testimonials, he shall not be allowed to again present himself to the Board of Examiners for examination until a period of not less than twelve months shall have elapsed from the date of his last examination.

16. Every holder of a third-class certificate under these Regulations must produce such certificate to the Board previous to his being examined for a second-class one, and, in the event of the latter certificate being granted, his third-class one shall be surrendered and delivered up to the Board.

17. Every holder of a second-class certificate under these Regulations must produce such certificate to the Board previous to his being examined for a first-class one, and, in the event of the latter certificate being granted, his second-class one shall be surrendered and delivered up to the Board.

18. Any person holding a mining engine-driver's certificate issued in any other State of the Commonwealth, and who takes up his residence in Victoria, may be granted a registration slip of equal grade to his certificate, upon payment of the fee prescribed by the following Schedule, and without undergoing any examination. This registration slip shall entitle the holder to drive the same class or classes of engine that he had been qualified to take charge of under his certificate in the issuing State, and these particulars will be shown on the face of the registration slip.

19. Every candidate for a certificate of competency shall, upon presenting himself before the Board for examination, make a statutory declaration that the testimonials he produces are genuine and true and correct in every particular; such declaration, together with testimonials produced, to be retained by the Board.

#### EXTRACT FROM MINES ACT 1897.

##### PENALTY ON UNQUALIFIED PERSON TAKING CHARGE OF MACHINERY.

143. After the coming into operation of this Act any person who is not the holder of a certificate of competency as an engine-driver under this Act or the holder of a certificate of competency or of service as an engine-driver under the Principal Act or who is wholly or partially deaf or whose sight is defective or who is subject to fits, giddiness, or any other infirmity likely to interfere with the efficient discharge of his duties, and who takes charge of machinery in which steam, water, electricity, or air, or any two or more of them, are used as motive power except water power used for pumping, and every other person who employs any such person as aforesaid shall be guilty of an offence against this Division of this Part of this Act. Air winches, sinking pumps, and boring machines or puddling engines when fixed on an elevated puddling brace shall not be deemed to be "machinery" within the meaning of this section.

##### DISQUALIFICATION OF HOLDER OF CERTIFICATE.

144. (1) Any person holding a certificate of competency or of service under this or the Principal Act or under *The Regulation of Mines and Mining Machinery Act 1883* as an engine-driver and who is charged with any offence or misconduct likely to be detrimental to the proper or efficient discharge of his duties may be called upon by the Board of Examiners for engine-drivers to show cause why he should not be disqualified as a certificated engine-driver.

(2) If such person fails to satisfy such Board why he should not be disqualified the Governor in Council by order published in the *Government Gazette* may disqualify such person for any specified period from acting as an engine-driver or may alter suspend or cancel such certificate.

(3) Any such person shall after such order deliver into the charge of the said Board his certificate of competency or of service, which shall be retained by the said Board during the period of his disqualification, and no such person shall during the period of such disqualification take charge of any machinery in which steam, water, electricity, or air, or any two or more of them, are used as motive power.

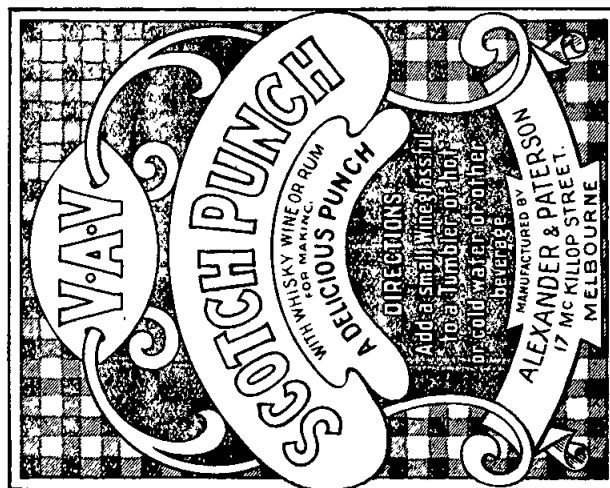

No. 1893) it is amongst other things enacted that if the council of any municipality prove to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable that any road should be deviated, and that such deviation can be conveniently made through Crown land or land held by licensees or pastoral lessees under the *Land Act 1890* or any Act amending the same, the Minister may cause such road to be deviated accordingly at the cost of the municipality: And whereas it has been proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable to deviate a certain road in the parish of Barwongemoong: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of provisions contained in section 477 of the Act No. 1893 aforesaid, doth hereby declare the new road in the parish of Barwongemoong, indicated by pink tint on a plan marked B.4.1.06, attached to correspondence marked C.30959, and deposited in the Office of Lands and Survey, Melbourne, to be a public highway in lieu of the existing road in the same parish, denoted by blue colour on the aforesaid plan.

And the Honorable John Murray, His Majesty's Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

**W**HEREAS by section 153 of the *Water Act 1905*, it is enacted that "from and after the commencement of this Act the Irrigation and Water Supply Districts constituted under the provisions of *The Irrigation Act 1886* by the names in the Ninth Schedule hereto shall cease to be Irrigation and Water Supply Districts within the meaning of the said Act, or of the *Water Act 1890*, or of any Act amending that Act; and thereupon the Irrigation and Water Supply Trusts having jurisdiction within such Irrigation and Water Supply Districts shall be and the same are hereby abolished, and the Commissioners thereof shall go out of office.

"Immediately upon such cessation and abolition and going out of office such Irrigation and Water Supply Districts shall be and become Waterworks Districts within the meaning of this Act, and any Urban Divisions within such districts shall be and become Urban Divisions within the meaning of this Act.

"At any time within three months after the commencement of this Act the Governor in Council may, by Order, specify the number of Commissioners to be thereafter elected or appointed for each of such Waterworks Trusts, and the time and mode of their election or appointment under the provisions of this Act."

And whereas the Bairnsdale Irrigation and Water Supply Trust was duly constituted under the provisions of *The Irrigation Act 1886*, and the Irrigation and Water Supply District thereof was duly defined by Order in Council:

And whereas by the Ninth Schedule to the said *Water Act 1905*, it is set forth that the Bairnsdale Irrigation and Water Supply District is to be abolished, and to become a Waterworks District under the jurisdiction of the Bairnsdale Waterworks Trust:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the herein recited

provisions of the said *Water Act 1905*, doth hereby order and specify as follows:—

That the Bairnsdale Waterworks Trust shall consist of five Commissioners, three of whom shall be the Councillors for the time being representing the Centre Riding of the Shire of Bairnsdale, and two other persons to be appointed by Order in Council.

And the Honorable George Swinburne, His Majesty's Minister of Water Supply for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

# REGULATIONS.—TEACHERS OF WOODWORK AND TEACHERS OF COOKERY.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by section 11 (b) of Act No. 1777, and by section 35 (b) of Act No. 2006, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulation relating to the appointment of Teachers of Woodwork and Teachers of Cookery, and prescribing the conditions to be followed by the Classifiers classifying such teachers, that is to say:—

## REGULATION NO. XXVII.—TEACHERS OF WOODWORK AND TEACHERS OF COOKERY.

1. Candidates for appointment as teachers of woodwork or of cookery must possess a certificate of qualification to teach woodwork or cookery, as the case may be, and such other qualifications, such as a first or a second class certificate, or a trained teacher's certificate, as may from time to time be specified by the Director.

2. Subject to the provisions of section 9 of Act 2006, qualified teachers of woodwork or of cookery may, on their appointment as teachers of either of these subjects, be classified and paid as teachers of the sixth class. If at the time of the appointment of a teacher of either woodwork or cookery there is no position vacant in Class VI., then a qualified teacher of some class below the sixth may be appointed, and, subject to the provisions of section 18 of Act No. 2006, such teacher shall, when a vacancy occurs, be appointed to a position in the Sixth Class.

3. When a teacher of woodwork or of cookery is promoted to a class higher than the Sixth Class, he may, as a condition of such promotion, be required to take up the ordinary duties, whether as head teacher or as assistant teacher, of a teacher of such higher class, or, at the discretion of the Director, and with the approval of the Minister, he may be retained in his position as a teacher of woodwork or of cookery respectively, as the case may be.

4. Prior to his appointment as a teacher of woodwork or of cookery, every teacher shall be required to enter into an agreement to continue to serve and discharge the duties of a teacher of woodwork or of cookery, as the case may be, for a period of not less than four years. On the recommendation of the Director, and with the approval of the Minister, this period may be reduced should the interests of the service justify such reduction.

5. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding sections of this Regulation, teachers who, prior to the 1st January, 1906, had passed the examination prescribed for teachers of cookery, and who, on the date named above, were temporarily employed as acting teachers of cookery in charge of cookery centres, may, on their permanent appointment as teachers of the said subject, be classified and paid as teachers of the fifth class, provided that they hold the qualifications required by Part II. of the Second Schedule of Act No. 2006 to be held by teachers of such said Fifth Class, and provided that there are vacant positions in that class to which such temporary teachers of cookery may be appointed.

And the Honorable Arthur Otto Sachse, His Majesty's Minister of Public Instruction for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedule, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular description indicated in the schedule of tenders. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture.

3. The value of all packages, cases, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, &c. The net quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores, and the stores shall be packed in such a manner as shall secure them from injury during transit, and until delivery such stores shall be at the risk of the contractor.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the Education Department. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of this contract, Melbourne will include a radius of 6 miles from the General Post Office. The cost of all postage, however, shall be defrayed, and printed forms required under the contract shall be supplied by the Education Department.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the Secretary for Education or such other officer whom he may appoint.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in Condition 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

8. All orders shall be returned to the Education Department at the end of each month, accompanied by an account under the Audit Act and Regulations for the articles supplied during the month, and, on receipt of same, the contractor shall be entitled to payment when receipts, showing the due delivery of the goods, have been received from the teacher, due time being allowed for the examination and verification of the claim.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

10. All goods forwarded under this contract shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor by whom consigned.

11. When the contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any school he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carrier to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Department.
