- That every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
- That every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
- That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
- That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

Factories and Shops Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Act 1905*, and after due inquiry, I, being the responsible Minister for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of sub-section (1) of section 40 of the said Act in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF BALL AND WELCH PROPY. LTD., DRESSMAKERS, MILLINERS, AND TAILORS, FLINDERS-STREET, MELBOURNE.

for a period of six weeks from the 14th June, 1906, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

- That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than one hundred females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said one hundred females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.

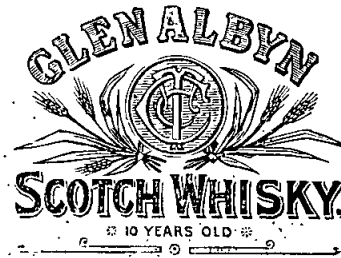

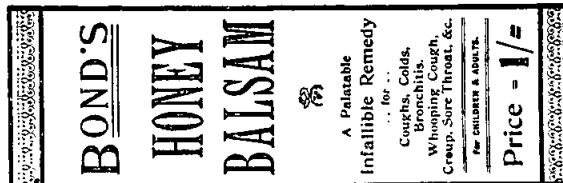

### SHIRE OF MOORABBIN.

REGULATION No. 2.

A Regulation of the Shire of Moorabbin, numbered 2, made under the First Section of Part V. of the Thirteenth Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1903*, No. 1803, in force in the Shire of Moorabbin, by virtue of a By-law of the above-named Shire, numbered 23, for prohibiting or restraining the use of combustible materials in the construction, alteration, repair, or renewal of buildings, roofs, or chimneys, flues, smoke vents, or stove-pipes (hereinafter in this Regulation called in common chimneys), or of parts thereof respectively as specified in this Regulation.

**F**OR regulating the distance from any other building at which it shall be lawful to construct any building.

For regulating the height, thickness, construction, or materials of the party walls of buildings adjoining each other, and of the external walls of buildings, and of chimneys, and the materials for and mode of enclosing the same.

For appointing fees, not in any case exceeding the sum of Two pounds sterling, which may be charged and received on account of the municipal fund by the proper officer of the Council for any inspection, superintendence, or other service made or performed by him under this Regulation.

#### Application of Regulation.

1. The whole of this Regulation shall apply to and have force and effect throughout the following areas of the Shire of Moorabbin:—(1) The whole of the West Riding of the said shire; (2) the whole of the South Riding of the said shire; (3) that portion of the East Riding enclosed within the following boundaries: Commencing at the intersection of Centre Dandenong-road and Point Nepean-road; thence along Point Nepean-road to Chesterville-road; thence along Chesterville-road to Patrick-street; thence along Patrick-street to Wilson-street; thence along Johnston-street and Stephen-street to Centre Dandenong-road; thence along Centre Dandenong-road to commencing point. (4) That portion of the East Riding enclosed within the following boundaries: Commencing at the intersection of Point Nepean-road and Warren-street; thence along Warren-street to East Boundary-road; thence along East Boundary-road to Mordialloc Creek; thence along Mordialloc Creek to Point Nepean-road; thence along Point Nepean-road to commencing point. (5) That portion of the North Riding enclosed within the following boundaries: Commencing at the north-west corner of Heights of North-road Estate; thence

along North-road to Jasper-road; thence along Jasper-road to Centre-road; thence along Centre-road to Railway; thence along the Railway to Fitzroy-street; thence along Fitzroy-street to Wheatley-street; thence along Wheatley-street to McKinnon-road; thence along McKinnon-road to Wheatley-road; thence along Wheatley-road to Murray-road; thence along Murray-road to south-western corner of Caulfield Cup Estate; thence along the western boundaries of Caulfield Cup and Heights of North-road Estates to commencing point. (6) Those portions of the North Riding enclosed within the boundaries of East Brighton Park Estate and East Brighton Village Estate.

2. The following works and buildings shall be exempt from the operation of this Regulation:—

All party fences and greenhouses, so far as the necessary woodwork of the sashes, doors, and frames; and all fernhouses, so far as the necessary framing and lattice-work.

All buildings on land, the property of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Moorabbin.

All buildings on land, the property of the Government of the State of Victoria, the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia, or of the Victorian Railways Commissioners, provided such buildings are intended to be used solely for public purposes.

All temporary offices and sheds used by builders during the erection of any building at or about the site of such building, for a period not exceeding twelve months.

#### Wooden Buildings.

3. Buildings may be erected or constructed of wood, or if already built, may be added to in wood on land abutting on any street or road, provided that—

(i.) In the case of the erection of new buildings, the external walls shall be distant from the boundaries of the land upon which the same stand, and land not in the same possession or occupation, at the least four feet.

(ii.) In the case of buildings already erected, additions may be made up to or on the same alignment if such alignment be less than the four feet referred to in sub-clause number 1, but otherwise such sub-clause number 1 shall apply to such additions as if they were new buildings.

(iii.) Two or more dwelling-houses may be erected in one block on land belonging to the same owner, and shall then be separated from each other by a wall of brick or stone at least eight and a half inches in thickness, and carried up to at least one foot above the roof covering or gutter adjoining the same, and projecting at least one inch beyond the face of the woodwork or spouting.

(iv.) The external walls of such wooden buildings shall be covered with good sound weatherboards or good galvanized corrugated iron or other approved material.

(v.) The interiors of all walls and ceilings to be finished in lath and plaster, or any material approved by the Council.

(vi.) Stables or sheds, the external walls and roofs of which are covered with galvanized corrugated iron or other approved material, may be built flush with the boundaries of the land on which they stand, if more than (15) fifteen feet distant from any dwelling.

4. For the purpose of this Regulation, the re-erecting of any building, pulled down to or below the ground floor, or of any frame building of which only the framework is left down to the ground floor, or the conversion into a dwelling-house of any building not originally constructed for human habitation, or the conversion into more than one dwelling-house of a building originally constructed as one dwelling-house only, shall be considered the erection of a new building.

#### Materials to be used in Repairs.

5. If any old external walls or other external enclosures of any building already built in any street be not built of the materials required by this Regulation for external walls or other external enclosure (except the enclosure of roofs, the flats, gutters, dormers, turrets, lantern lights, and other erections thereon), may be at all times thereafter repaired with materials of the same sort as those of which such external wall or enclosure has been already built; and any plates, studs, or other part of the framing of the walls which may be decayed or injured may be replaced with sound timber, but this shall not be deemed to authorize the entire reconstruction of any room or building, the greater portion of which has been destroyed or removed, of other materials than those required by this Regulation.

#### Walls of whatever kind other than Wooden Walls.

6. Every wall of whatever kind must be built upon a constructed footing, based upon solid ground or upon other sufficient foundation approved by the surveyor.

#### Footings of Walls.

(i.) Materials.—Every footing must be built of brick or stone, or of such bricks and stones together, laid in and with mortar or cement, or of concrete, in such manner as to produce solid work.

(ii.) Width.—The footing of every wall must be at the least eight inches wider than the wall standing thereon.

(iii.) Height above ground.—The foundation of every wall carrying the ground floor plates shall be at the least six inches above the ground line, except in the case of shops erected flush with the building line of any street, when the height may be less if approved by the Surveyor.

(iv.) Damp-proof Course.—Every wall shall have a damp-proof course above the surface of the ground throughout its whole thickness of rubberoid, of sheet lead, not less than 4 lbs. per square foot, or two courses of best BB slates laid in cement, asphalt, or material impervious to moisture, or approved turred sand half an inch thick; and in cases where it is not desirable to place the same throughout the building at one uniform level, then the said damp-proof course must be laid in horizontal layers, connected at the ends by a vertical course of the same material.

(v.) The space under the ground floor of every building shall have a sufficiency of openings through all the walls under the floor to thoroughly ventilate the same.

7. All new buildings or additions to existing buildings shall be constructed of good sound materials of their respective kinds, of uniform quality, and of dimensions proportioned to the stresses to which the same shall be subject, in accordance with the best trade usages and to the approval of the Surveyor.

#### Construction and Materials.

8. Every external wall to buildings must be built of brick or stone not less than  $8\frac{1}{2}$  inches thick for buildings not exceeding (22) twenty-two feet in height, and such additional thickness for buildings exceeding that height as the Surveyor shall direct, or of bricks and stone together, properly bonded, and laid in with mortar or cement, in such a manner as to produce solid work; and every such wall must be carried up to its full thickness to the underside of the plate under the roof. Hollow walls shall be bonded with hoop-iron at every four (4) feet rise, and cross-tied with iron ties at every (2) two feet in height, not more than (3) three feet apart in each row, and made as per sketch, or otherwise as approved by the Surveyor.

9. Nevertheless, in such walls, besides all requisite openings for doors and windows, recesses may be formed so that the back thereof be of the thickness of  $8\frac{1}{2}$  inches at the least, provided that such recess or recesses shall be arched over with an arch having a rise at least equal to one-fourth of its span; and provided, further, that such recess or recesses shall in no case exceed 6 feet in width and 8 feet in height, measured to the springing, and that the aggregate of such recesses shall in no case exceed one-third of the superficial area of the wall in which such recess or recesses are constructed; and further, that the stability and sufficiency of the wall be not, in the opinion of the Surveyor, injuriously affected by making such recesses.

10. And with regard to the component materials of external walls, such wood and iron may be put in them as shall be necessary; and every plate, lintel, bond, corbel, being of wood, and every wood, brick laid into any external wall, and all the ends of joists or girders, and of the heads and sills of partitions running into any external wall must be fixed at a distance from the external face of the wall of 4 inches at the least, except the joists of the upper ceiling, which may go through the wall, provided a sufficient corbel be formed to separate one building from another at the line of the party and external walls. And the frames of doors and windows must be fixed in reveals at a distance from the external face of the wall of four (4) inches at the least, and shop fronts must be fixed in such manner as is herein specially directed, and the tiers of door cases to warehouses must be fixed in the opening left in such walls, at a distance from the external face of the wall of two (2) inches at the least; but no timber shall be laid into any external wall in such manner or of such lengths as to render the part of the wall above it wholly or in great part dependent upon the wood for support, or so that such wood might not be withdrawn without endangering the safety of the superincumbent structure, except in the case of brestsummers.

#### Height and Thickness of Parapets.

11. If any external wall be built within (3) three feet of ground in occupation of another, or of any building separately occupied or intended for separate occupation, then such external wall must be carried up and remain 18 inches at the least above its own adjoining roof or gutter, and the thickness of an external wall so carried up above the level of the underside of the gutter plate or roof and forming parapet, must be at the least in every such wall  $8\frac{1}{2}$  inches thick.

#### Brestsummers.

12. Every brestsummer must have a bearing in the direction of its length of 6 inches at the least at each end upon a sufficient pier of brick or stone, and the brestsummer must be supported, at the discretion of the Surveyor, on one or more timber or iron story posts, fixed

upon solid foundations; and the ends of such brestsummer, if of wood, shall not be placed nearer to the centre line of the party wall than  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inches. Every brestsummer bearing upon any wall must be borne by a template or corbel of stone or iron, tailed throughout at least one-half the thickness of such wall and of the full breadth of the brestsummer.

#### PARTY WALLS.

##### *External Wall Used as a Party Wall.*

13. And with regard to external walls to be used as party walls to any building adjoining thereto:—

If such external wall to any building already built, be at least  $8\frac{1}{2}$  inches in thickness in every part, and be of sound and proper materials and in good condition, then such wall may, at the discretion of the Surveyor with the consent in writing of the adjoining owner, be used as a party wall; but if the house of which such wall forms a part be re-built, then such wall shall become subject, to the provisions of this Regulation in respect of party walls.

##### *Dividing Existing Building.*

14. If it be intended to divide any building into two or more distinct parts, then every wall for that purpose must be built as a party wall, and in the manner, and of the materials, and of the several heights and thicknesses for party walls as prescribed in this Regulation.

15. And if any building already built, or which shall be hereafter built, be converted, used, or occupied as two or more separate buildings, each having a separate entrance or staircase, such conversion, use, or occupation, not having been made, or not having taken place prior to this Regulation coming into operation, then every such building shall be deemed to be two or more separate houses, and such separate houses may be divided from each other by a party wall, or party arch or arches, built in the manner and of the materials required for party walls, or for party arches.

##### *Construction and Materials.*

16. Every part of every party wall must be built of brick or stone, not less than  $8\frac{1}{2}$  inches thick, or as set forth in clauses 7 and 9 of this Regulation, or of bricks and stone together, properly bonded and laid in with mortar or cement in such manner as to produce solid work; and the top of every such party wall must be finished with one course of sound hard bricks set on edge with good sound cement, or by a coping of any other properly secured and sufficient waterproof and fireproof covering.

17. The bearing ends of wooden beams, brestsummers, girders, trimming joists, and the ends of partition heads and sills, and the bearing ends of the main timbers of a roof, and wood bricks, may be laid into the substance of a party wall; but no such beam, brestsummer, girder, joist, partition, head and sill, nor any part of roof being wood, nor any wood brick shall be laid or placed within  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inches of the centre of any party wall; and no other woodwork of any kind shall be laid into, placed upon, or be run or driven into any part of the substance of any party wall. But if the ends of timbers be carried on iron shoes, or stone corbels, then such iron shoes or stone corbels must be built into the wall, at the least one-half of the thickness of such wall.

##### *Height of Party Walls above Roof.*

18. And with regard to party walls in reference to the height thereof:—

i. If a party wall adjoin any roof, then such party wall must be carried up and remain one foot six inches at the least above the part where the party wall and roof adjoin, measured at a right angle with the back of the rafters of such roof.

ii. And if any party wall adjoin a gutter, then such party wall must be carried up and remain one foot two inches at the least above the highest part of any such gutter.

19. No cornice shall project a greater distance than the thickness of the wall of the story surmounted by the same, and every such cornice must have one course of stone flagging tailed through to the inside of the said wall, unless the method of construction of such cornice shall have previously been submitted to the Surveyor, and shall have been approved of by him, and all such projections shall be set in cement.

##### *Wooden Shop Fronts, Shutters, Signs, and Show Boards.*

20. i. No part of any shop front, constructed of other materials than brick or stone, except the cornice, must project from the face of a wall, whether there be an area or not, more than 4 inches, nor must the cornice project therefrom more than 12 inches. And the woodwork of any shop front must not be fixed nearer than  $4\frac{1}{2}$  inches to the centre line of a party wall.

ii. And with regard to such woodwork: put up at such distance of  $4\frac{1}{2}$  inches, then a pier or corbel built of stone, or of brick, or incombustible material, of the width of

$8\frac{1}{2}$  inches at the least, must be fixed in the line of the party wall so as to be as high as such woodwork, and so as to project one inch at the least in front of the face thereof.

iii. And no showboard or signboard shall be affixed to the iron of or upon any building except by leave of the Council.

#### CHIMNEYS AND FIREPLACES.

##### *Construction.*

21. With regard to chimneys and chimney-stacks, except angle chimneys, in reference to the construction thereof:—

Every chimney and chimney-stack must be constructed of brick or stone or other incombustible material; the jambs, breast and flue in any single chimney may be built upon stone or iron corbels above the ceiling of the ground floor of every building, and no such corbels shall have their beds upon timber, but the projection, both of jambs and breast must not in any case exceed 14 inches before the face of the wall to which the same shall adjoin.

22. And with regard to angle chimneys, such chimneys may be built in the internal angle of any building so that the width of the breast thereof do not exceed 8 feet, and so that it be properly supported on iron girders, with brick arches, or on strong stone landings, not less than 4 inches thick, and tailed at least 9 inches into each of the two walls forming such angle.

##### *Dimensions and Materials.*

23. The jambs of every chimney shall not be less than  $8\frac{1}{2}$  inches wide on each side of such opening.

The breast of every chimney, and the front, back, withe, or partition of every flue must be, at the least, 4 inches in thickness of bricks, and the joints of the work must be filled in with good mortar or cement, and all the inside thereof, and also the outside or face thereof next the interior of any building must be rendered or pargetted, and the backs of all chimney openings to the height of 12 inches above the soffit of the opening shall be at least  $8\frac{1}{2}$  inches thick.

No flue shall be used for a smoke flue which is of less internal diameter in any section than  $8\frac{1}{2}$  inches except by the permission in writing of the Surveyor.

##### *Timber or Woodwork.*

24. No timber shall be placed over any opening for supporting the breast of any chimney, but there must be an arch of brick or stone over the opening of every such chimney, to support the breasts thereof, and all flat and cambered arches are to have an iron bar or bars built into the jambs, at the least 9 inches on each side to tie in the abutments whenever the breast projects more than  $4\frac{1}{2}$  inches from the face of the wall, and the jamb on either side is of less width than two-thirds of the opening. And no timber or woodwork shall be placed or laid in any wall under any chimney opening within 12 inches at the least of the surface of the hearth to the fireplace of such chimney opening, or nearer any smoke flue than  $4\frac{1}{2}$  inches.

No timber or woodwork shall be fixed nearer than 1 inch to the opening of any chimney; and no timber shall be laid or placed within 1 inch of the face or breast, back, side, or jamb of any flue, or of any chimney opening where the substance of brickwork or stonework shall be less than  $8\frac{1}{2}$  inches thick; nor shall any flooring board, batten, ground skirting, or other lining or fitting of wood, nor any wood staircase, nor anything else of wood, be fixed or placed against or near to the face or breast, back, side, or jamb of any flue, fireplace, or chimney opening, unless and until the brick or stonework constituting the same shall have been thoroughly and efficiently rendered or pargetted with proper mortar or stucco, and such rendering must be, in every case, in addition to 4 inches at least of solid fireproof structure.

##### *Slabs and Hearths.*

25. And a slab or slabs of brick, tile, stone, slate, marble, or other proper and sufficient substance, at the least 12 inches longer than the opening of every chimney when finished, and at the least 16 inches in front of the arch over the same, shall be laid before the opening of every chimney. And in every floor, except the lower floor, such slab or slabs must be laid upon stone, iron, or wooden bearers or upon brick trimmers. But where they are laid other than on brick trimmers, the slab must rest at least 2 inches on the chimney breast, and be well bedded on not less than 3 inches in thickness of concrete upon a proper boxing, provided always that in case of a chimney being built upon corbels, the use of the brick trimmer or stone corbel to support the inner hearth shall be imperative: but in the lowest floor they may be laid upon a brick fender, or bedded on the solid ground.

And the inner hearth of every chimney must be laid and bedded wholly on brick or stone, or other incombustible substance, which must be solid, for a thickness

of 9 inches at the least, beneath the surface of any such hearth. And as to the chimney shaft of a stationary steam engine, such shaft shall be of a sufficient height so as to prevent nuisance, and may be of iron or other incombustible material.

*Chimney Shafts.*

26. All chimney shafts or flues hereafter built, raised, or repaired must be carried up in brick or stone work to a height of not less than 2 feet above the highest part of the roof or gutter immediately adjoining the same.

*Smoke Pipes.*

27. No metal or other pipe or funnel for conveying smoke shall be fixed against or in front of any building in any street, nor on the inside of any building nearer than 4½ inches to any timber or other combustible material.

**ROOF COVERINGS.**

*Materials.*

28. With regard to roof coverings in reference to the material thereof:—

If the external parts of any roof, flat, or gutter of any building, or of any projection therefrom, and of any turret, dormer, lantern light, or other erection on the roof or flat of any building be hereafter built or re-built, stripped, ripped, or uncovered, then every such part (except the door frames and doors, window frames, and sashes of such turrets, dormers, lantern lights, or other erections) must be covered with slates, tiles, lead, galvanized, corrugated iron, glass, artificial stone, or cement, and such excepted parts may be made of such wood as shall be necessary.

*Rain-water Pipes and Eaves Gutters.*

29. And with regard to the roof, flat, and gutter of any building, and of any projection therefrom, including balconies, verandahs, and shop fronts:—

These must be so arranged and constructed, and so supplied with gutters and pipes as to prevent the water therefrom dropping on, or running over any public way, and all such rain-water pipes and eaves gutters are to be made of metal.

**DWELLING HOUSES.**

*Attic Rooms.*

30. With regard to rooms in the roof of any building hereafter built or rebuilt, there must not be more than one floor of such rooms, and such rooms must not be of a less height than 7 feet 6 inches, except the sloping part, if any, of such roof, which sloping part must not begin at less than 3 feet 6 inches above the floor, nor extend more than 3 feet 6 inches on the ceiling of such room.

*Rooms in Other Parts.*

31. Every living room in other parts of the building must be of, at the least, the height of 9 feet from the floor to the ceiling, and contain not less than 700 cubic feet of space.

*Back Yards.*

32. Every dwelling house hereafter built or rebuilt must have an enclosed back yard or open space of, at least, two hundred square feet, exclusive of any building thereon, unless all the rooms of such house can be lighted and ventilated from the street or way.

*Privies.*

33. Every privy, closet, or urinal, whether already built or hereafter to be built, in the yard or area of any building must have a door, and be properly enclosed, screened, and fenced from public view. No privy, closet, or urinal shall be erected or remain in the front of any dwelling, or at a less distance than 3 feet from any public highway not less than 33 feet wide, or at a less distance than 6 feet from the door or window of any dwelling, or at a less distance than 2 feet from any partition fence, unless divided by an 8½-inch brick or stone wall.

*The Surveyor.*

34. The surveyor referred to in this Regulation shall be, and is, the surveyor or other officer of the Council of the Shire of Moorabbin appointed for that purpose for the time being.

*Duties of Surveyor.*

35. It shall be the duty of the surveyor, and he is hereby authorized and required to see, that all the rules and directions of this Regulation are well and truly observed and carried out in and throughout the areas of the Shire of Moorabbin to which the provisions of this Regulation are applicable, and for that purpose to proceed from time to time in due course, on receipt of any notice (or if from ignorance or neglect, or any other circumstance, notice of any work intended to be done has not been given, then upon such work being observed by or by being made known to him), to inspect the works intended to be done, or which shall have been commenced or executed, and to cause all the rules and directions of this Regulation in respect thereof to be strictly observed. And the said surveyor shall attend and perform everything required of him by this Regulation, whether notice has or has not been given to him, and take all necessary measures thereupon.

36. The surveyor is hereby authorized and instructed to prosecute in the name of the Council of the Shire of Moorabbin all persons committing a breach of this Regulation, and to recover the penalties incurred thereby.

*Notice of Intention to Build and Payment of Fees.*

37. No person shall commence any building, or any addition or alteration to any building, without delivering at the surveyor's office a written notice thereof four days before commencing, and producing to the surveyor properly prepared plans and specifications of such building, addition, or alteration. No person shall commence any building, addition, or alteration, or call upon the surveyor to examine any building, settle any dispute, inspect or report upon any party wall, or perform any special or other duties, without first paying to the treasurer or surveyor such of the fees as are provided therefor by this Regulation.
