## NOTICE UNDER VOTING BY POST ACT 1900.

## ELECTORAL DISTRICT OF LOWAN.

AN Election of a Member of the Legislative Assembly is about to be held in the above-mentioned Electoral District, and any Elector thereof who appears from the rolls to reside in such District, and who resides at least five miles from the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or who has reason to believe that on the polling day he will not be within five miles of the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or that on account of ill-health or infirmity he will be prevented from voting personally thereat, who desires to vote through the post office at such Election, may, on posting an application to the Returning Officer, obtain a Postal Ballot-paper enabling him to vote through the post at such Election.

Printed forms of application may be obtained at any post office, or the application may be in writing.

If applicant is the holder of an elector's right, such right must be attached to application.

Any Elector who intends to vote through the post must apply at once, as no Postal Ballot-paper will be supplied unless the Returning Officer receives application therefor sufficiently early to admit of Postal Ballot-paper being sent to and returned by such Elector so as to reach the Returning Officer before closing of Poll.

Caution.—Any person wilfully making a false statement in an application is liable on conviction to two years' imprisonment.

for a period of four weeks from the 18th June, 1906, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than twenty females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said twenty females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That every female so employed shall receive not less than eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Three-pence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

PORT PHILIP HEADS.—DEEPENING OF FAIRWAY.

REFERRING to General Notice to Mariners, Victoria, dated 24th September, 1901, pages 59 and 61, and subsequent notice dated 12th August, 1904, mariners are hereby notified that, consequent upon the improvements effected by blasting operations at the Heads, the least depth abreast of Point Lonsdale along the line of leading lights, and for about 2,000 feet eastward therefrom, is now 37 feet at ordinary low water.

The least water for 250 feet to the westward of the line of leading lights is now also 37 feet at ordinary low water.

The line of the obelisk and high light bearing N. 30½ deg. E. now marks, approximately, the middle of deep-water channel.

To insure keeping within the limits of the deep-water channel, mariners are directed, when crossing the Rip bank, not to keep eastward of the line of the obelisk showing midway between the high light and look-out house, bearing N. 28½ deg. E., when entering Port Phillip Heads, and not westward of the line of leading lights when clearing the Heads.

The look-out house is situated about 60 feet N.W. by W. from the high lighthouse.

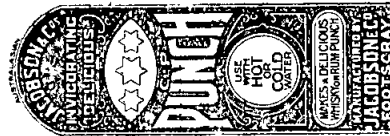

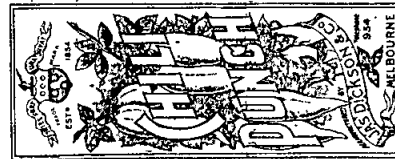

**THE MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST.**

REGULATION REPEALED. REGULATION MADE. QUAYAGE RATES.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1890*, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners (hereinafter called the "Commissioners") make the following Regulation, namely:—

Sub-clause (a) of the clause numbered 348 made by the Commissioners on the seventh day of February, One thousand nine hundred and six, is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following sub-clause shall be substituted, and read as part (a) of the said clause:—

(a) In addition to any other toll or penalty which may be or may become due under the Regulations for the time being in force a rate shall be paid in respect of every vessel during the time such vessel uses any wharf of the Commissioners of one twenty-fourth of one halfpenny per ton of the net register tonnage (British Standard) of such vessel for every hour of the first 144 hours during which any such vessel uses any such wharf, and if any vessel without having left the port in the interim shall use one or more wharfs for more than 144 hours in the whole, and shall have paid the rates for such 144 hours of one twenty-fourth of one farthing per ton of such net register tonnage for every hour in excess of such 144 hours, subject to a minimum charge of one halfpenny per ton of such net register tonnage, provided that—

1. If any vessel without having left the Port of Melbourne in the interim shall first use either the railway pier or the town pier at Port Melbourne, or the break-water pier at Williamstown, and subsequently any wharf of the Commissioners

- for more than 144 hours in the aggregate, the charge which shall be paid for any time such vessel uses any wharf of the said Commissioners in excess of such 144 hours in the aggregate shall be one twenty-fourth of one farthing per ton of such net register tonnage per hour, subject to a minimum charge at any wharf of the said Commissioners of one halfpenny per ton of such net register tonnage.
- 2. This sub-clause shall not apply to any vessel subject to sub-clause (d) of this Regulation, or to any vessel licensed under clause numbered 349 hereof, or to any ferry boat plying within the Port.
- 3. In lieu of the preceding rates, a lump sum of Three pounds per annum may be paid in respect of any sailing vessel the net register tonnage of which does not exceed fifty tons.
- 4. Subject to the minimum charges hereinbefore mentioned in computing the charges due under the provisions of this sub-clause any part of an hour, thirty minutes or less shall not be charged for, and any part of an hour over thirty minutes shall be charged for as one hour.
- 5. A vessel lying in tier outside a vessel moored to or alongside any wharf of the Commissioners shall be liable to the preceding rates as if she were directly moored to the wharf.
- 6. Sundays and public holidays unless where the vessel casts off from the wharf on such Sunday or public holiday, or receives or delivers any cargo, shall be excluded from the operation of this sub-clause.
- 7. This sub-clause shall not apply to those berths at the wharfs, on the north and south sides of the Yarra Yarra, known as No. 16 on the north side, and A, B, C, D, E, F, and G coal berths on the south side which have been specially appropriated for the exclusive accommodation of the lessees of such berths so long as the leases thereof are in force respectively, and the said berths are being used only by the vessels of such lessees respectively.

Nothing herein shall affect the right of the Commissioners to recover any money payable under the said sub-clause (a) made by the Commissioners on the seventh day of February, One thousand nine hundred and six, for which the preceding sub-clause is substituted.

In witness whereof the said Commissioners have caused their common seal to be hereunto affixed this thirteenth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and six.

**RULES, REGULATIONS, AND SCALE OF FEES OF THE SMYTHESDALE GENERAL CEMETERY.**

**RULES AND REGULATIONS.**

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the trustees of the Smythesdale General Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say) —

- 1. These rules and regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.
- 2. The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.
- 3. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.
- 4. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the trustees thereof, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B) which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right on obtaining the permission of the trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the trustees.

6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths has been delivered to the secretary (gatekeeper or sexton).

7. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.

8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

9. The hours for burials shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.; May to August inclusive, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. On Sundays throughout the year from 8 to 10 a.m., or from 2 to 5 p.m.

10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

11. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person having paid the fee for a private grave and requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

12. No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent in writing of the person entitled to give the same.

13. No person employed by the trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the trustees.

14. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from 7 a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.

15. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the trustees.

16. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

17. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by section 35 of the *Teachers Act 1905, No. 2006*, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say :—

REGULATION NO. XXVIII.—CLASSIFIED ROLL.—  
RELATIVE ORDER OF SENIORITY.

1. The seniority of every teacher who was in the first, second, or third sub-class of any class in the revised Classified Roll in force on the twenty-ninth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and six shall, unless and except otherwise provided by the Public Service Acts, be deemed to have been determined and shall be determined by length of service in such sub-class provided that, in all Classified Rolls published on and after the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and six—

- (a) the relative seniority of all teachers in the first class, of female teachers in the second class, and of all teachers in the eighth class shall in the Classified Roll to be issued on the thirtieth day of June, 1906, be determined by length of service in their respective classes. In subsequent rolls the seniority of such teachers shall, unless otherwise provided by the Public Service Acts or Regulations thereunder, be determined by their length of service in the sub-class of the class in which their names appear;
- (b) any teacher reduced in sub-classification shall when placed in a lower sub-class be placed therein below all teachers retained in such sub-class;
- (c) any teacher reduced two sub-classes shall rank senior to teachers reduced at the same time one sub-class only;
- (d) any teacher recorded for reduction to any sub-class of a lower class shall be placed at the bottom of the sub-class of such lower class to which he has been reduced;
- (e) any teacher promoted to a higher sub-class shall in his relative order of seniority before promotion rank below teachers retained in such higher sub-class;
- (f) any teacher promoted one sub-class only shall in the sub-class to which he is promoted rank as senior to teachers promoted at the same time two sub-classes to the same sub-class;
- (g) in entering the names of additional teachers appointed or promoted to any sub-class of the fifth or any lower class, the names of teachers who have obtained the trained teacher's certificate or who have obtained first or second class honours shall, subject to the provisions of section twelve of the *Teachers Act 1905*, be placed in their relative order of seniority below the names of those retained in such sub-class, but above the names of all added to the sub-class at the same time.

2. In the case of teachers who have been pupil teachers (junior teachers) any period in excess of one year during which such teachers have been paid as first class pupil teachers (junior teachers) shall count as service, and in the case of trained teachers the second year of training shall so count.

## REGULATION NO. XXIII.—COMPULSORY CLAUSE.

*General Certificates of Exemption for Children attending Schools other than State Schools.*

6. The Minister of Public Instruction may grant a General Certificate of Exemption for children attending any school in which he has been satisfied that the following conditions are being complied with:—

- (a) That on each school day at least two hours instruction is given before noon, and two hours after noon.
- (b) That the attendances of the children are marked on the rolls provided by the Department in strict accordance with the directions printed thereon.
- (c) That an Inspector of schools has certified in writing that instruction in the subjects of the Standard of Education as prescribed by the Regulations under the Education Act is efficiently and regularly given in such school.

7. Such General Certificate of Exemption shall be in the following form:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE  
BOORT COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council, on the 8th day of January, 1902, the Managers of the Boort Common having drafted the following Regulations for the management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Lands and Works, and approved by the Governor in Council.

REGULATIONS.

1. Ratepayers, holders of Miners' Rights, Business Licences or Carriers' Licences, and farmers residing within five miles from the Common may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle or the equivalent of the whole or portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him, may depasture on the Common one additional head of large cattle or the equivalent in small cattle for every (10) acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. The fees for depasturing stock on the Common shall be as follow, and shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in every year:-

For every horse, 10s. per annum.

For every head of other large cattle, 8s. per annum.

For every head of small cattle, 6s. per annum.

Progeny under six months old of stock legally depasturing on Common, free.

3. The Managers of the Common shall appoint certain times and places for registering and branding stock, and shall give due notice thereof; and the Managers or Herdsman shall attend at such times and places for the purposes aforesaid. All persons desirous of depasturing stock upon the Common shall be in attendance therewith at the times and places appointed, for the purpose of giving a full and correct description of such stock and assisting to brand the same, and shall pay the prescribed fees for such stock before the same are registered or branded with the Common brand.

4. All cattle, excepting horses, depasturing on the Common shall have round the neck the Common chain, padlock, and brand.

5. All stock found depasturing on the Common, not registered, or without the Common brand, except travelling cattle, shall be liable to be immediately impounded or the owners thereof prosecuted.

6. No bull, entire horse, or pig shall be depastured on the Common without the consent in writing of the managers.

7. All cattle suspected of being diseased shall be removed by the owners within 24 hours after notice to do so has been given to them, and in default of compliance with such notice the managers shall be at liberty to destroy such cattle at the expense of the owners thereof.

8. Carriers and other travellers shall be allowed to depasture teams 24 hours on the Common free of charge; after that time a fee of One shilling (1s.) per week, or Threepence (3d.) per night for part of week will be charged.

9. The managers reserve the right to muster at any time all or any part of the herd depasturing on the Common, the expense of such musters to be paid out of the Common fund.

10. The herdsman shall immediately report to the managers any disease in the stock on the Common. The managers shall not be liable for any neglect or irregularity of the herdsman, or for the loss of or injury to any stock depasturing on the Common. The herdsman shall visit and inspect all stock depasturing on the Common three times at least in each week, and in the event of any having strayed, he shall give notice in writing to the owners of such stock, within 24 hours after missing same, and in the event of stock straying from the Common and being impounded the herdsman shall be responsible to the owners thereof for the impounding expenses and the safe return of such stock, if the foregoing notice shall not have been given.

Every person offending against any of the preceding Regulations shall, on conviction before any Justice of the Peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for each offence.

REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE CLUNES UNITED MUNICIPAL AND GOLD-FIELD COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to commons made by the Governor in Council on the 8th day of January, 1902, the managers of the Clunes United Municipal and Gold-field Common, having drafted the following Regulations for the management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works, and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such common:—

REGULATIONS.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licences or carriers' licences, and farmers residing within five miles from the common may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle or the equivalent of the whole or portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on the common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten (10) acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. Holders of miners' rights, business licences, or carriers' licences shall produce their respective miners' rights, business or carriers' licences to the managers of the common for inspection immediately prior to requiring their stock to be registered, otherwise the managers may refuse registration.

3. No person shall depasture on the common stock of which he is not the *bonâ fide* owner.

4. The managers of the common shall be at liberty to appoint certain times and places for registering and branding or renewing registration of stock, and shall give due notice thereof, and the managers or herdsman shall attend at such times and places for the purpose aforesaid. Every person entitled to commonage shall, before depasturing any stock on the common, give to the herdsman thereof a true and correct description of such stock and their brands or other distinctive marks, and shall obtain from the herdsman a certificate to that effect, and after having paid the prescribed commonage fees shall obtain from the herdsman the necessary number of badges and chains, which shall be at all times the absolute property of the managers. Every such person shall then be responsible and liable to be charged for stock equivalent to the number of badges and chains from the time of receiving such badges and chains until they are returned to the herdsman. No person shall use other than the authorized or registered badge and chain in connexion with stock legally depasturing on the common. In addition to the fee for depasturing stock, the sum of One shilling shall be paid to the herdsman, at the time of registration, for the hire of each badge and chain; but should any person cease at any time to depasture stock on the common the amount paid for each badge and chain shall be refunded to such person, provided the badge and chain be returned to the herdsman in good order and condition. Should any such badge be from any cause removed or lost from any stock every such badge so removed or lost shall be at once replaced by a new badge at the sole expense of the owner of the stock, and the sum of One shilling shall be paid to the herdsman for such extra badge; but no refund shall be made by the managers for any badge removed or lost. No person shall place or allow to be placed or remain on any stock on the common a lost badge, or one removed from another animal, without the authority of the herdsman, and any stock wearing or carrying a lost badge, or one feloniously removed from other stock, shall be treated as illegally depasturing on the common, and shall be liable to be impounded by the herdsman without notice to the owner.

5. All stock legally depasturing on the common shall (as far as possible) be branded by their respective owners with some distinctive brand or mark for the purpose of identification.

6. The managers shall be at liberty from time to time to call upon the owners of stock on the common, by advertisement in any newspaper circulating in the district, to muster their stock at the appointed yards for the purpose of registration, or see that all the stock depasturing on the common are duly registered and carrying the correct badges, and the herdsman shall give every assistance at every such mustering.

7. All fees as hereinafter set forth shall be paid on registration of stock, and unless the prescribed fees are paid for renewal of registration within seven (7) days from the due date the unregistered stock remaining on the common shall be liable to at once be impounded by the herdsman.

8. The financial year of the common shall commence on the first day of June in each year, and all registrations shall be made and fees paid within seven days from the

said first day of June. No rebate or reduction shall be made in the fees for registration of stock for a portion or portions of the said financial year.

9. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable annually in advance, on the first day of June in every year:—For every calf, Two shillings (2s.) per annum. For every horse, mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, or mule, Six shillings (6s.) per annum. For every head of other large cattle, Four shillings (4s.) per annum. For every head of small cattle, Three shillings (3s.) per annum. Calves under the age of six (6) months, the progeny of cows legally depasturing on the common, free.

10. No bull, entire horse, or swine shall be allowed to depasture on the common without the special permission, in writing, of the managers, and all other swine found on the common shall be liable to be impounded, and all geese thereon shall be liable to be destroyed.

11. All unregistered stock found on the common with or without badges shall be liable to be forthwith impounded.

12. The licences to depasture stock on the common and the badges shall not be transferable. Substitution licences may, however, be granted in respect of stock placed on the common in lieu of stock permanently removed therefrom; but only in cases in which the owner shall give notice, in writing, to the herdsman of such removal, as well as the full description and brands or marks of the new stock.

13. Whenever the managers have reason to believe that any animal on the common is affected with any contagious disease, the owner of such animal shall within six (6) hours after receiving notice, in writing, to that effect from the managers or herdsman, remove such animal from the common, and in case of neglect or refusal to so remove such animal, the managers shall be at liberty to order its immediate destruction and burial (if necessary) at the expense of the owner thereof, and the managers shall be at liberty to refuse registration of any other stock of such owner until he shall have paid the expenses. No compensation shall be allowed for the destruction of any diseased animal.

14. No dead animal shall be allowed to remain on the common, and if a carcass be not removed after six (6) hours' notice has been given to the owner thereof, the managers shall be at liberty to cause such carcass to be removed and buried (if necessary) at the expense of the owner thereof, and to refuse the registration of any other stock of such owner until the expense so incurred has been paid.

15. Owners of registered stock will be required to give immediate notice, in writing, to the herdsman of any stock sold or permanently removed from the common.

16. The managers shall not be responsible for the safe custody of stock depasturing on the common, or for loss or damage sustained through neglect or mistake of the herdsman, or from any other cause whatsoever.

17. No person shall unnecessarily disturb any stock depasturing on the common.

18. The herdsman shall give notice to the owner (if known by him) of stock impounded in any pound where the common brand or badge is registered, within twenty-four (24) hours after receiving notice of such impounding; but the cost of releasing impounded stock shall in all cases be paid by the owner thereof.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice of the peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £20 for each offence.

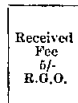
