NOTICE UNDER VOTING BY POST ACT 1900.

ELECTORAL DISTRICT OF LOWAN.

AN Election of a Member of the Legislative Assembly is
about to be held in the above-mentioned Electoral District,
and any Elector thereof who appears from the rolls to reside in
such District, and who resides at least five miles from the
nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote,
or who has reason to believe that on the polling day he will
not be within five miles of the nearest polling booth at which he
is entitled to vote, or that on account of ill-health or infirmity he
will be prevented from voting personally thereat, who desires
to vote through the post office at such Election, may, on posting
an application to the Returning Officer, obtain a Postal Ballot-
paper enabling him to vote through the post at such Election.

Printed forms of application may be obtained at any post
office, or the application may be in writing.

If applicant is the holder of an elector's right, such right must
be attached to application.

No postage is payable thereon.

Any Elector who intends to vote through the post must apply
at once, as no Postal Ballot-paper will be supplied unless the
Returning Officer receives application therefor sufficiently early
to admit of Postal Ballot-paper being sent to and returned by
such Elector so as to reach the Returning Officer before closing
of Poll.

Caution.—Any person wilfully making a false statement in an
application is liable on conviction to two years' imprisonment.

SHIRE OF BULN BULN.—ROAD DEVIATION.—
ORDER CONFIRMED.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by sections 475 and 479 of the *Local Government Act* 1903, the Council of the Shire of Buln Buln do hereby order that the land hereunder described shall be a public highway from and after the date of publication of this Order in the *Government Gazette* :—

All that piece or parcel of land, the property of the Shire of Buln Buln, being part of Crown allotment 89, parish of Jindivick, county of Buln Buln, and being more particularly delineated and described in the certificate of title entered in the register-book, vol. 3079, fol. 615653: Commencing at a point on the west boundary of said allotment 89, distant five chains seventy-nine links and four-tenths in a straight line bearing south 8 deg. 36 min. west from the north-west corner thereof; thence N. 48 deg. 27 min. E. seven chains fifty-four links and eight-tenths; thence S. 81 deg. 24 min. E. one chain thirty links and two-tenths; thence S. 48 deg. 27 min. W. nine chains fifty-eight links; thence N. 8 deg. 36 min. E. one chain fifty-six links and one-tenth to the commencing point, and containing by admeasurement three roods and seventeen perches, be the same a little more or less.

And such public highway is hereby declared to be in lieu of portions of existing roads in the same parish defined in the following description :—

(a) Commencing at a point on the west boundary of said allotment 89, distant eight chains thirty-six links in a straight line bearing S. 8 deg. 36 min. W. from the north-west corner thereof; thence N. 51 deg. 19 min. E. eleven chains thirty-eight links; thence S. 81 deg. 24 min. E. one chain thirty-six links and one-tenth; thence S. 51 deg. 19 min. W. twelve chains fifty-six links; thence S. 80 deg. 48 min. W. fifty-eight links; thence N. 8 deg. 36 min. E. one chain five links to the commencing point, and containing by admeasurement one acre and thirty-six perches, be the same a little more or less.

(b) Commencing at the north-west corner of said allotment 89; thence N. 8 deg. 36 min. E. one chain; thence S. 81 deg. 24 min. E. five chains sixty-seven links and three-tenths; thence S. 48 deg. 27 min. W. one chain thirty links and two-tenths; thence N. 81 deg. 24 min. W. four chains eighty-three links and eight-tenths to the commencing point, and containing by admeasurement two roods and four perches, be the same a little more or less.

TATURA WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW NO. 2, 1906.

THE Commissioners of the Tatura Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act* 1890, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act* 1905, No. 2016, repeal the following Regulation heretofore made by them, viz. :—

Regulation No. 2, 1898, passed on the 15th day of November, 1897, and approved of by the Governor in Council on the 29th day of November, 1897, and do hereby, in further pursuance of the powers conferred by the said last-mentioned Act, make the following By-law :—

1. Any person who shall be entitled to receive water from the Trust who shall, without the permission, in writing, of the Trust or its proper officer, take or carry away water from the service-pipe to any premises of which he is the owner or occupier, and which service-pipe is affixed to a main of the Trust, or any such person who shall permit or suffer any other person to take or carry away water as aforesaid, or who shall sell or barter water taken from the Trust mains or his own service-pipe to some other person, shall render himself liable to a penalty of not exceeding Five pounds.

2. Any person who shall take or carry away water the property of the Trust from the premises of any person supplied with water by the Trust, or from any fountain, drinking tap, trough, or public or private service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty of not exceeding Five pounds.

3. The service-pipes for conducting water from the mains and pipes of the Trust to the premises of consumers shall consist of wrought iron, and be of the best galvanized quality, and shall be approved of by the

officer of the Trust before being connected with the mains of the Trust. All cocks fitted by consumers shall be of high-pressure pattern, and shall be approved of by the officer of the Trust prior to being fitted.

4. In the laying down of any water service within the District of the Tatura Waterworks Trust the pipes and fittings shall not exceed the following dimensions :— For the domestic or household supply of premises not exceeding Twenty pounds annual municipal value, one-half of an inch in diameter; for the domestic or household supply of premises exceeding Twenty pounds annual municipal value, three-quarters of an inch in diameter.

5. The sale or supply of water by the Trust for all other than domestic or household purposes shall be by measure, and in and through pipes of such diameter as the Trust in each and every case shall, by writing, authorize.

6. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of any land or tenement abutting on a street or road in the Tatura Waterworks Trust District who is entitled to be supplied with water by the Trust for the provision and laying of a service-pipe from the main or pipe of the Trust in such street or road on to such land or tenement.

7. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first affixing an efficient and approved self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or otherwise affecting the dial of any meter attached to such pipe or branch pipe.

8. No overflow pipe shall be fixed to any bath, sink, or other receptacle of a similar nature.

9. No water-closets shall be supplied with water direct from any main service or branch service-pipe. Such water shall be taken solely from a cistern so constructed that water may not flow continuously therefrom, and so that not more than two gallons of water can escape at each flush.

10. No meter shall be affixed until it has been approved of by the proper officer of the Trust; such meter must be capable of registering one million gallons, and must be fixed level with the permanent surface of the ground, whether natural or made up, and properly protected by an approved box cover.

11. Should any meter in use from any cause whatsoever cease to register, or be reported upon by the officer of the Trust as being out of repair, the Trust will, by its officer, estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period for which such meter was not in working order, and until it has been repaired and refixed, either (a) by taking an average of the quantity of water used during the previous half-year, or (b) by taking the quantity of water used during the corresponding period of the previous year.

12. Save and except with the written permission of the Trust, by resolution first obtained, not more than one house or tenement shall be supplied from a single water service. The Trust may in special cases consent to two or more houses or tenements being supplied from one water service, and in any such case the sub-services shall be so arranged that the supply to each such house or tenement shall be independent of the supply to the others of such houses or tenements, and each such supply shall be controlled by a stop-cock fitted to the sub-service pipe therefor. Any person offending against the provisions of this section of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not exceeding Five pounds.

13. No alteration or extension of a service-pipe will be permitted by the Trust without its written consent first had and obtained, and any such alteration or extension shall be under the supervision of the officer of the Trust or of such other person as by the Trust shall be authorized in that behalf.

14. No person shall use a hose attached to any pipe or tap used for the purpose of supplying water the property of the Trust for the purpose of watering any garden, grass plot, green, or grounds, or for irrigating or laying dust, or for any other purpose whatsoever, unless and until such time as an approved meter shall have been affixed to the service-pipe and water supplied therefrom by measure.

15. The service-pipes from the mains of the Trust and the meters thereto affixed, being the property of the owner or occupier, as the case may be, of any house, tenement, or premises supplied with water by such service-pipes and meters, the occupier (if any), and if none, the owner, shall, upon receiving notice that his or her service-pipe, service-tap, meter, stop-cock, and other usual appurtenances or any of them require repairing, forthwith repair or cause to be repaired the same, and shall in default thereof be liable to a penalty of not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a

further penalty of not exceeding Two pounds for each day after the receipt of such notice. The Trust may, without further notice, stop the flow of water into or through any such service-pipe, either by cutting off the service-pipe from the main or otherwise, as to the Trust may seem fit and expedient, until such time as all necessary repairs shall have been effected and completed, and with the meter affixed to the satisfaction of the officer of the Trust. The Trust may at any time cut off the supply to any service-pipe in any case where the rates are overdue and unpaid, or where any amount is overdue and unpaid for water sold by measure.

16. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow any water to run to waste or to run or flow for the purpose of irrigating, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of any person continuing to offend he shall be liable to a further penalty not exceeding Two pounds for each day after such person shall have received notice from the officer of the Trust to abate any such waste or flow for irrigation purposes.

17. Fire-plugs shall not be used or in any way interfered with without the permission of the Trust, except for the purpose of extinguishing fire; such fire-plugs shall at all times be under the absolute control of the officer of the Trust.

18. For buildings in course of erection or repairs, a charge of Twenty shillings per centum shall be charged on the cost of the stone-work, brick-work, and plastering of all descriptions, or in the alternative the Trust may cause a meter to be affixed and a charge made by measure for any water used; or in the further alternative the Trust may enter into a special agreement with the party or parties interested for the sale, purchase, and supply of water, and payment therefor shall be made to the officer of the Trust at its office, Ross-street, Tatura, or as the Trust may otherwise determine.

19. Any person, whether the holder of a licence or not, who shall break open any ground so as to uncover any main or pipe, the property of the Trust, without giving to the Trust or its officer forty-eight hours' previous notice in writing of his intention so to do, or who shall in any wise tamper with or interfere with or alter any main or pipe, the property of the Trust, without the written permission of the Trust so to do; or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any pipe, lock, cock, valve, gate, or any property of the Trust whatsoever, shall be liable to a penalty for each such offence of not exceeding Five pounds.

20. The Trust may, by notice in writing, intimate to any occupier or owner using water for other than domestic or household purposes, that water supplied to him is to be charged for by measure, and by such notice require such occupier or owner to provide a meter within twenty-eight days from the service of such notice, and thereupon such occupier or owner shall, at his own cost in all things, provide and fix a meter, such meter to be approved of by the officer of the Trust.

21. No meter shall be removed from any service-pipe in the Trust District or from any pipe connected therewith, for the supply of water outside the Trust District, by any person whatsoever, without such person giving six clear days' notice in writing to the officer of the Trust. The Trust may in its absolute discretion at any time refuse to permit the removal of a meter.

22. High-pressure screw-down stop-cocks must be provided for all service-pipes, and must be placed in the footpath five feet from the building line of the street, and the same must be provided with proper cast-iron covers.

23. All water-troughs with a service for water from the Trust must be properly fitted with self-closing valves, which must be efficiently protected by approved covers.

24. The water supplied in the Waterworks District of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with this By-law, and not otherwise.

25. No person other than a plumber licensed by the Trust will be permitted to tap or in any way interfere with the mains, pipes, and properties of the Trust. The fee for such licence shall be Five shillings per quarter, and such quarters must be uniform, and commence on the first days of the months of January, April, July, and October respectively in every year.

26. For every offence against any of the provisions of this By-law for which a penalty is not hereinbefore specially prescribed, the offender shall, upon conviction, be liable to and shall pay any sum not exceeding Five pounds.

YARRAM WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1906.

THE Commissioners of the Yarram Waterworks Trust do hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act* 1905, make the following By-law:—

By-law for the making of a rate for the year 1906 on all rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Yarram Waterworks Trust; also dealing with the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust.

1. A rate of One shilling in the pound sterling shall be paid on the annual value of all rateable property fronting streets in which a main pipe has been laid, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of Alberton; but no such rate in any case shall be less than One pound.

2. A rate of Ten shillings shall be charged on all unoccupied lands facing the mains.

3. For the water supplied by measure, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for where water is used for other than domestic purposes solely shall be 20,000 gallons, and shall be paid for in advance, or as the Trust may deem necessary.

4. Where water is supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic use, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate payable for the year in respect of the premises supplied.

5. The foregoing rate is made payable on the first of July, 1906.

6. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

THE YARRAM WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 2.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act* 1905, the Commissioners of the Yarram Waterworks Trust make the By-law following, that is to say:—

1. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall take or carry away such water from his premises, or allow any person to take or carry away such water from his premises, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty in accordance with the 33rd section hereof.

2. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, private or public service-pipe without the authority of the Trust, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

3. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers shall each have at the main a stop-cock, to which a length of not less than 3 feet of lead pipe must be attached, and another stop-cock at the footpath; and where the supply is otherwise than by measure, shall in no case, unless with the sanction of the Trust, exceed the following diameters:—

For domestic supply of premises, three-quarters of an inch diameter.

For other than domestic purposes, and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust may in case authorize in writing.

4. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of any lands or tenements who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundary of such land or tenement abutting upon the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

5. If any person shall waste water of the Trust by allowing the same to flow from a tap or otherwise, or who shall use water for purposes other than that for which he is supplied, or who shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into

such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipe from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupiers (if any), or, if none, the owner shall in every instance after notice given by an officer of the Trust in its behalf that such service-pipe requires repairing, immediately proceed to repair the same, and shall be responsible for any loss of water, and also for any damage which shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, and shall, in the event of his failing to forthwith make such repairs, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty not exceeding Two pounds per day during which such occupier or owner shall fail to effect the repairs after the service of such notice. In the event of the necessary repairs not being effected forthwith in accordance with the aforesaid notice, the Trust may proceed to make the necessary repairs, and the expenses which may be incurred or paid by it in effecting such repairs shall be paid to it by the occupier or owner, by whom such work ought to have been done, and the Trust may recover the same from such occupier or owner before two justices, or in an action of debt in any court of competent jurisdiction.

6. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, and any person committing a breach of this provision shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

7. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam-boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

8. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by a duly authorized officer of the Trust, and unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one million (1,000,000) gallons. A separate meter shall in every case be provided for each tenement when the supply is by measure.

9. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does or causes or permits to be done anything in contravention of any provision of this By-law, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which, under the provisions of this By-law, ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

10. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipes of the Trust, or alter or repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipes or service-pipes, cocks, or fittings connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with such pipes, service-pipes, cocks, or fittings as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

11. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust, the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber, and that he is thoroughly conversant with the provisions of the By-laws of the Trust, and with the sections of the Water Acts affecting his work. The Trust may at any time cancel such licence. The fee for a plumber's licence shall be Ten shillings per annum.

12. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the direction of some officer of the Trust appointed for such purpose, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipes to communicate with the pipe of the Trust of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty in accordance with section 33 hereof, and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty in accordance with such section for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

13. The quality of materials required in laying private services shall be as follows:—

- (1) The whole of the pipes, tees, thimbles, bends, reducing couplings, plugs, &c., to be of the best galvanized iron.
- (2) All pipes and pieces to be true in sectional form, straight longitudinally, and of equal strength and thickness throughout the entire body of the same.

(3) All ends of pipes, bends, &c., to be properly and truly threaded, and be capable of being screwed into thimbles, tees, &c.

(4) The whole of the pipes, tees, bends, &c., to be sound and free from all defects, and capable of withstanding a hydrostatic pressure equal to a column of water 400 feet in height.

(5) All delivery cocks and thimbles for connecting the service-pipes and mains to be high-pressure, and made of brass of the best quality and workmanship, and of approved pattern, to screw into elbow bends, &c. All cocks and thimbles to stand the same pressure as the pipes.

14. Any person other than a servant of the Trust in the execution of his duty who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust without having given to the Trust two days' notice, in writing, of his intention so to do, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break open or injure any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, weir, channel, reservoir, or engine, the property of the Trust, or who shall trespass on the Trust's work without leave, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty in accordance with the 33rd section hereof.

15. Any person appointed for that purpose by the Trust may, between the hours of Ten in the forenoon and Four in the afternoon, apply to the owner or occupier of any house or premises supplied with water by the Trust for permission to enter the same in order to examine if there be any waste or misuse of such water, and if such person at any such time be refused admittance into any such dwelling-house or premises for the purpose aforesaid, or be prevented from making such examination as aforesaid, the Trust may turn off the water supplied by it from such house or other premises.

16. The Trust may enter into a special agreement with any person requiring water for any other purposes than domestic at such rates, upon such terms, and subject to such conditions as the Trust and the person requiring such supply may agree to adopt.

17. The charge for water supplied from any stand-pipe shall be Sixpence for any quantity up to 200 gallons, and Sixpence for each additional 200 gallons or portion of 200 gallons.

18. The Trust reserves the right to sell water to any person for any purpose whatever other than domestic. If any person (1) not having from the Trust a supply of water for other than domestic purposes uses for other than domestic purposes any water supplied to him by the Trust, or (2) having from the Trust a supply of water for other than domestic purposes uses for any purposes other than those for which he is entitled to use the same, such person shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings, without prejudice to the right of the Trust to recover from him the value of the water misused.

19. In the construction of this By-law the word "Person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, "The Trust" shall mean "The Yarram Waterworks Trust," and the words "The Act" shall mean the "Water Act 1905" and every amendment thereof. Words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular to include the plural, and the plural the singular, unless the contrary as to gender or number is expressly provided.

20. Every urinal shall be supplied only through a cistern or service-box fitted with waste-preventing apparatus approved by the Trust. No service-pipe shall be suffered to communicate directly with any urinal.

21. If any meter in use cease registering, or be reported by any officer of the Trust as out of repair or registering inaccurately, the Trust may estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order, and until it is repaired and refixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter or during the corresponding period of the previous year, or during the corresponding period of the previous year, or the Trust may insert a check-meter on the service-pipe, and charge upon estimate from the registering thereof.

22. Excepting with the permission of the Trust not more than one house or tenement shall be supplied from a single water service. The Trust may in special cases consent to two or more tenements being supplied from one water service, but in such cases the sub-services shall be so arranged that the supply to each house shall be independent of the supply to the remaining houses, and be controlled by a stop-cock on such sub-service, and any person offending against the provisions of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

23. Extensions of private services will not be allowed without the consent of the Trust, and every such extension shall be made under the superintendence and according to the directions of an officer appointed for that purpose by the Trust.

24. With each application for a new service there shall be deposited with the treasurer of the Trust a sum of One pound; and with each application for repairs to service-pipes from the mains to the building line a like sum of One pound. Such moneys shall be repaid to the depositor on a certificate being produced from an officer of the Trust that the work in each case has been carried out to his satisfaction, otherwise such money shall be retained either wholly or in part by the Trust at its absolute discretion.

25. No service-pipe will be allowed to communicate with any cistern, tank, or vessel intended or used for the reception of rain water, whether above or below the surface of the ground, except where water is supplied by measure.

26. No pipe or other apparatus shall be laid through any sewer, drain, ash pit, manure tank, or other place where, in the event of the pipe becoming unsound, the water conveyed through such pipe would be liable to be fouled or to escape without observation, unless such pipe or apparatus be laid through an exterior pipe or box of sufficient length and strength to afford due protection to the same and to bring any leakage or waste within easy detection. In all cases, before being used, the exterior pipe or box must be submitted to and approved by the officer of the Trust appointed for such purpose.

27. Subject to previous written consent of the Trust, private fire services will be allowed at expense of owner, but every such service must be sealed, except in cases where the Trust's officer shall have certified, in writing, that sealing is unnecessary. For each such private fire service there shall be paid a sum of Ten shillings upon the fixing thereof and a sum of Ten shillings per annum thereafter. No water shall be taken from any sealed portion of such service except for extinction of fire. Except in case of fire no person shall, without authority of the Trust, wilfully break the seal affixed to any private fire service, and in the event of any such seal having been broken accidentally or otherwise the occupier of the tenement shall, within twenty-four hours thereafter, give notice, in writing, of the fact at the office of the Trust, and failing to do so shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds, and to a continuing penalty of Ten shillings for every day during which he shall neglect to give such notice.

28. All joints connecting lead pipes must be "wiped" joints, and in no case will "bolt" or "copper-bit" joints be allowed on water service-pipes either in the interior or on the exterior of any building or tenement, on pain of cancellation of the licence of the plumber who, by himself or his workmen, shall break this By-law.

29. A high-pressure screw-down stop-cock, properly secured and covered with an approved cast-iron cap, shall be fixed on each water service between the main and the building line at a uniform distance of one foot from the kerbing.

30. No person other than an employé of the Trust or a municipality or member of a fire brigade on duty shall, without the written permission of the Trust, be allowed to take water from the fire plugs for watering the streets or any other purpose (except in case of fire). Any person offending against this section shall be liable to a penalty in accordance with the 33rd section hereof.

31. The water supply to all public parks and gardens shall be exclusively under the control and direction of the Trust, and any person not duly authorized who shall, except with the written permission of the Trust, turn on the water or otherwise interfere with such water supply, shall be liable to a penalty in accordance with the 33rd section hereof.

32. In every case in which it is necessary to obtain the consent of the Trust before doing any act or commencing any work, such consent must be asked for by notice, in writing, addressed to the secretary of the Trust, and delivered at his office, of such length as is mentioned in the Acts or in any By-law of the Trust, and in no case less than two days prior to the time proposed for the doing of such act or the commencement of such work, and such notice must state clearly the act proposed to be done or work to be commenced, and such act shall not be done or work be commenced save upon the Trust's consent, in writing, and then only subject to and in accordance with such directions or conditions as shall be therein specified; such consent may be given by and under the hand of the chairman of the Trust, the secretary, or the engineer, who severally shall be competent to give the Trust's consent, and, on behalf of the Trust, to prescribe any directions or conditions attaching thereto, and subject to and in accordance with which only such consent shall be deemed to have been given. The giver of ever such consent shall notify the same to the next following meeting of the Trust for confirmation.

33. For every breach of or offence against any provision of this By-law, not herein expressly provided for, the offender shall, upon conviction, be liable to and shall pay any sum not exceeding Five pounds.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of section 4 of the *Game Act 1896*, and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do, by this my Proclamation, direct that, in that part of the State of Victoria comprised in lots 60, 61, 62, 72, A, B, C, D, G, H, I, and J, in the parish of Lara, in the county of Grant, sections 5 and 7 of the *Game Act 1890* shall not be in operation as regards Pheasants, from the first day of April to the thirty-first day of August, both days inclusive, in each and every year.

(2) Every person who exposes or offers for sale or sells or delivers from any vehicle, and every person who conveys in any vehicle for delivery to a purchaser coal in quantities not exceeding five hundredweight, or firewood by weight in quantities not exceeding ten cubic feet, shall carry and deliver, or cause to be carried and delivered, such coal or firewood made up in boxes, sacks, or other receptacles, or parcelled up, covered or enclosed and kept separate and apart in such vehicle. And every such box, sack, receptacle, parcel, cover, or enclosure, shall be labelled or marked in such a manner as to indicate the weight of coal or firewood which each such box, sack, receptacle, parcel, cover, or enclosure contains.

3. That in clause 7 of By-law No. 57, after the word "receptacle," wherever it occurs, the word "cover" or "enclosure" shall be and are hereby added, and after the word "receptacles," wherever it occurs, the words "covers or enclosures" be and are hereby added.
