## LIGHTS AND SIGNALS OF FISHING VESSELS.

THE following Order in Council, which has been received by His Excellency the Governor from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, is published for general information, together with the accompanying Schedule.

WHEREAS His Majesty was pleased, by His Commission dated the second day of March, 1906, to nominate and appoint the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, the Prime Minister, and the Lord President of the Council, in His Majesty's absence from His Realm in Foreign Parts, to hold, on His Majesty's behalf, His Privy Council, and to signify thereat His approval of any matter or thing whereunto they should be so authorized by writing under His Majesty's Sign Manual, and to do further on His behalf any matter or thing for the purposes of the said Commission whereunto they should be authorized in manner aforesaid:

And whereas by section 418 of the *Merchant Shipping Act 1894* His Majesty is empowered from time to time, on the joint recommendation of the Admiralty and the Board of Trade by Order in Council, to make regulations for preventing collisions at sea:

And whereas by an Order in Council dated the 11th day of August, 1884, Her late Majesty was pleased to direct that the regulations contained in the First Schedule thereto (being regulations for preventing collisions at sea) should be substituted for the regulations in that behalf then existing:

And whereas by Article 10 of the said regulations provision was made as to the lights and signals of fishing vessels and boats:

And whereas by Orders in Council dated respectively the 30th day of December, 1884, and the 24th day of June, 1885, Her late Majesty was pleased to direct among other things that the said regulations contained in Article 10 as above mentioned should, as regards British fishing vessels and boats, be modified, as is in the said Orders respectively mentioned:

And whereas by an Order in Council dated the 27th day of November, 1896, Her late Majesty was pleased to direct that on and after the 1st day of July, 1897, the said regulations scheduled to the said Order of the 11th August, 1884, except the said Article numbered 10

in such regulations should be annulled, and that the regulations for preventing collisions at sea contained in the first schedule to the said Order of the 27th day of November, 1896, should be substituted therefor (with the exception aforesaid) and come into operation as regards British ships and boats:

And whereas by an Order in Council, dated the 23rd day of October, 1905, His Majesty was pleased to direct that the said regulations contained in the said Article 10 of the said regulations of the 11th day of August, 1884, should be amended as in the said Order mentioned:

And whereas the Admiralty and the Board of Trade have jointly recommended to His Majesty that as regards British ships and boats the provisions hereinafter set forth referring to lights and signals of fishing vessels shall be substituted for the provisions of the said Article 10 in the schedule to the said Order in Council dated the 11th day of August, 1884, contained as modified and amended as aforesaid:

And whereas the provisions of section 1 of the *Rules Publication Act 1893* have been complied with:

Now, therefore, the Lord Chancellor, the Prime Minister, and the Lord President being authorized in that behalf by writing under His Majesty's Sign Manual, by virtue of the powers vested in His Majesty by the said recited Act and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, do hereby, on His Majesty's behalf, direct that on and after the 1st day of May, 1906, the provisions of the said Article 10 in the schedule to the said Order in Council dated the 11th day of August, 1884, contained, and also the regulations scheduled to the said Orders in Council of 30th day of December, 1884, the 24th day of June, 1885, and the 23rd day of October, 1905, so far as the same affected the provisions in the said Article 10, shall be annulled and the provisions with regard to lights and signals of fishing vessels contained in the schedule hereto annexed shall be substituted therefor and come into operation as regards the British ships and boats therein mentioned.

## SCHEDULE.

ART. 9.—Fishing-vessels and fishing boats, when under way and when not required by this Article to carry or show the lights hereinafter specified shall carry or show the lights prescribed for vessels of their tonnage under way.

- (a). Open boats, by which is to be understood boats not protected from the entry of sea water by means of a continuous deck, when engaged in any fishing at night with outlying tackle extending not more than 150 feet horizontally from the boat into the sea-way, shall carry one all-round white light.

Open boats, when fishing at night, with outlying tackle extending more than 150 feet horizontally from the boat into the seaway, shall carry one all-round white light, and, in addition, on approaching or being approached by other vessels, shall show a second white light at least 3 feet below the first light and at a horizontal distance of at least 5 feet away from it in the direction in which the outlying tackle is attached.

- (b) Vessels and boats, except open boats as defined in subdivision (a), when fishing with drift nets, shall, so long as the nets are wholly or partly in the water, carry two white lights where they can best be seen. Such lights shall be placed so that the vertical distance between them shall be not less than 6 feet and not more than 15 feet, and so that the horizontal distance between them, measured in a line with the keel, shall be not less than 5 feet and not more than 10 feet. The lower of these two lights shall be in the direction of the nets, and both of them shall be of such a character as to show all round the horizon, and to be visible at a distance of not less than 3 miles.

Within the Mediterranean Sea and in the seas bordering the coasts of Japan and Korea sailing fishing vessels of less than 20 tons gross tonnage shall not be obliged to carry the lower of these two lights; should they, however, not carry it, they shall show in the same position (in the direction of the net or gear) a white light, visible at a distance of not less than one sea mile, on the approach of or to other vessels.

- (c) Vessels and boats, except open boats as defined in subdivision (a), when line-fishing with their lines out and attached to or hauling their lines, and when not at anchor or stationary within the meaning of subdivision (h), shall carry the same lights as vessels fishing with drift-nets. When shooting lines, or fishing with towing lines, they shall carry the lights prescribed for a steam or sailing vessel under way respectively.

Within the Mediterranean Sea and in the seas bordering the coasts of Japan and Korea sailing fishing vessels of less than 20 tons gross tonnage shall not be obliged to carry the lower of these two lights; should they, however, not carry it, they shall show in the same position (in the direction of the lines) a white light, visible at a distance of not less than one sea mile on the approach of or to other vessels.

- (d) Vessels, when engaged in trawling, by which is meant the dragging of an apparatus along the bottom of the sea—

1. If steam-vessels, shall carry in the same position as the white light mentioned in Article 2 (a), a tricoloured lantern so constructed and fixed as to show a white light from right ahead to two points on each bow, and a green light and a red light over an arc of the horizon from two points on each bow to two points abaft the beam on the starboard and port sides respectively; and not less than 6 nor more than 12 feet below the tricoloured lantern a white light in a lantern, so constructed as to show a clear uniform and unbroken light all round the horizon.

2. If sailing-vessels, shall carry a white light in a lantern, so constructed as to show a clear uniform and unbroken light all round the horizon, and shall also, on the approach of or to other vessels, show, where it can best be seen, a white flare-up light or torch in sufficient time to prevent collision.

All lights mentioned in subdivision (d) 1 and 2 shall be visible at a distance of at least 2 miles.

- (e) Oyster dredgers and other vessels fishing with dredge-nets shall carry and show the same lights as trawlers.
- (f) Fishing-vessels and fishing-boats may at any time use a flare-up light in addition to the lights which they are by this Article required to carry and show, and they may also use working lights.
- (g) Every fishing-vessel and every fishing-boat under 150 feet in length, when at anchor, shall exhibit a white light visible all round the horizon at a distance of at least one mile.

Every fishing-vessel of 150 feet in length or upwards, when at anchor, shall exhibit a white light visible all round the horizon at a distance of at least one mile, and shall exhibit a second light as provided for vessels of such length by Article 11.

Should any such vessel, whether under 150 feet in length, or of 150 feet in length or upwards, be attached to a net or other fishing gear, she shall, on the approach of other vessels, show an additional white light at least 3 feet below the anchor light, and at a horizontal distance of at least 5 feet away from it in the direction of the net or gear.

- (h) If a vessel or boat when fishing becomes stationary in consequence of her gear getting fast to a rock or other obstruction, she shall, in day-time, haul down the day-signal required by subdivision (k); at night, show the light or lights prescribed for a vessel at anchor; and during fog, mist, falling snow, or heavy rain-storms make the signal prescribed for a vessel at anchor. (See subdivision d, and the last paragraph, of Article 15.)
- (i) In fog, mist, falling snow, or heavy rain-storms, drift-net vessels attached to their nets, and vessels when trawling, dredging, or fishing with any kind of drag-net, and vessels line fishing with their lines out, shall, if of 20 tons gross tonnage or upwards, respectively, at intervals of not more than one minute, make a blast; if steam-vessels, with the whistle or syren, and if sailing-vessels with the fog-horn; each blast to be followed by ringing the bell. Fishing vessels and boats of less than 20 tons gross tonnage shall not be obliged to give the above-mentioned signals; but if they do not, they shall make some other efficient sound signal at intervals of not more than one minute.
- (k) All vessels or boats fishing with nets or lines or trawls, when under way, shall, in day-time, indicate their occupation to an approaching vessel by displaying a basket or other efficient signal where it can best be seen. If vessels or boats at anchor have their gear out, they shall, on the approach of other vessels, show the same signal on the side on which those vessels can pass.

The vessels required by this Article to carry or show the lights hereinbefore specified shall not be obliged to carry the lights prescribed by Article 4 (a), and the last paragraph of Article 11.

This Article shall be read and construed as part of the regulations contained in schedule I. to the Order in Council, under section 418 of the *Merchant Shipping Act* 1894, made the 27th day of November, 1896, and as if it had formed one of such regulations and been numbered 9 among the Articles containing the same.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Reginald Arthur James Talbot, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of the said State, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of One million and twenty-two thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and six and One thousand nine hundred and seven."

NOTICE UNDER VOTING BY POST ACT 1900.  
ELECTORAL DISTRICT OF LOWAN.

AN Election of a Member of the Legislative Assembly is about to be held in the above-mentioned Electoral District, and any Elector thereof who appears from the rolls to reside in such District, and who resides at least five miles from the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or who has reason to believe that on the polling day he will not be within five miles of the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or that on account of ill-health or infirmity he will be prevented from voting personally thereat, who desires to vote through the post office at such Election, may, on posting an application to the Returning Officer, obtain a Postal Ballot-paper enabling him to vote through the post at such Election.

Any Elector who intends to vote through the post must apply at once, as no Postal Ballot-paper will be supplied unless the Returning Officer receives application therefor sufficiently early to admit of Postal Ballot-paper being sent to and returned by such Elector so as to reach the Returning Officer before closing of Poll.

*Caution.*—Any person wilfully making a false statement in an application is liable on conviction to two years' imprisonment.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION,  
AND MANAGEMENT OF A RESERVE FOR  
PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF  
KOO-WEE-RUP.

WE, William Reynolds, Henry Woodman, Edward Marshall, John Bethune, Hugh Pollock, Denis McNamara, William Mallcott, David Mickle, and Robert Lees Laidlaw, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 31st March, 1905, as a site for Public Recreation, in the parish of Koo-wee-rup, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by Section 199 of the *Land Act 1901* :—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.
2. The maximum scale of fees for admission to the Reserve on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for races, fêtes, or sports shall be as follows :—

For the admission of every adult, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding One shilling (1s.).

For the admission of every saddle horse, exclusive of rider, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding One shilling (1s.).

For the admission of every carriage, cart, or other vehicle drawn by one horse, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Two shillings (2s.).

For the admission of every additional horse attached to every such carriage, cart, or other vehicle, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Sixpence (6d.).

3. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

4. No society, club, picnic party, or other combined body shall be allowed to use the Reserve without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

5. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, or stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or in any way damage any of the buildings, gates, fences, or other property in or around the Reserve, or pollute any water therein, or remove from the Reserve any soil, sand, or manure.

6. No person shall interfere with the trees, shrubs, or other property in the Reserve, or commit any nuisance, or leave therein any bottles, orange peel, paper, cast-off clothing, or any litter.

7. No person shall erect any booth or other structure in the Reserve, or hawk, or offer for sale therein, any goods or articles of any description, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall light any fire in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein, which may be inclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

10. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management, and all dogs, goats, and poultry found trespassing on the Reserve shall be liable to be destroyed.

11. No person shall place in the Reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

12. No person shall on Sundays engage in any game or sport, or in dancing, in the Reserve, or use the bicycle track therein.

13. No person shall carry on the trade, business, calling, or occupation of a bookmaker in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

14. Every person hiring or erecting in the Reserve any booth, tent, table, or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, or for the purpose of any game or amusement, shall pay such fee as the Committee of Management from time to time determine.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with Section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or any constable, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION,  
AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A  
BOTANIC GARDEN, KNOWN AS THE "EAST-  
ERN PUBLIC PARK," IN THE TOWN OF  
GEELONG.

WHEREAS by the Crown grant issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Geelong in respect of the Reserve for a Botanic Garden, known as the "Eastern Public Park," in the Town of Geelong, it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted, and the buildings for the time being thereon, shall be maintained and used as and for a Botanic Garden, and offices and conveniences connected therewith, under and in accordance with such regulations as shall from time to time be made in pursuance of the provisions of such Crown grant: Now therefore the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Geelong do hereby make the regulations following in respect of the said Reserve for a Botanic Garden, known as the "Eastern Public Park," in the Town of Geelong:—

REGULATIONS

1. The Park shall be open to the public daily free of charge from 1st October to 31st March, both days inclusive, from Six o'clock a.m. to Eight o'clock p.m., and from 1st April to 30th September, both days inclusive, from sunrise to sunset.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Park who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall in any way interfere with the trees, shrubs, flowers, statuary, fountains, or other property in the Park, or with the fish or birds therein, or throw stones, or birdnest, or commit any nuisance in the Park, or leave any bottle, orange or banana peel, paper, cast-off clothing, or other litter, or light fires therein, or smoke when walking off the paths, or in the nursery, or any other reserved place.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates of the Park, or stick bills thereon, or alter the names, letters, or marks, or write on the trees, pavilions, seats, gates, posts, or fences, or other buildings.

5. No person shall erect or place any dwelling in the Park, or any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, or offer for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

6. Every person riding or driving shall keep to the portions of the Park laid out as carriage drives, and no person shall at any time ride or drive any animal at a greater speed within the Park than at the rate of Seven miles an hour.

7. No person shall cycle in the Park at a greater speed than at the rate of ten miles an hour, nor shall any motor car, motor cycle, or any other motor vehicle be driven in the Park at a greater speed than at the rate of ten miles an hour.

8. During wet weather the curator of the Park shall be at liberty to close for such time as may be considered necessary the carriage gates thereof to preserve the carriage drives therein.

9. No person shall bring into the Park any dog unless led by a chain or cord. All dogs found at large within the Conservatory and Nursery of the Park shall be liable to be destroyed.

10. All picnic parties shall be located in such portions of the Park as may be arranged with the curator thereof.

11. The Conservatory and Nursery shall be open on Sundays from Two o'clock p.m. to Five o'clock p.m., and on each of the other days of the week from Seven o'clock a.m. to Five o'clock p.m.

12. No child under ten years of age shall be allowed to enter the Conservatory and Nursery in the Park unless accompanied by an adult.

13. Perambulators, go-carts, cycles, and other vehicles shall not be admitted to the Conservatory and Nursery in the Park.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with Section 200 of the *Land Act* 1901, on conviction before any Justice, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence, and every person who so offends, and who, after he has been warned by any officer or servant of the Trustees, or by any constable, does

not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such officer, servant, or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

# REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE TREASURY GARDEN.

WHEREAS by Section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make rules and regulations, or to rescind any rules and regulations, for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby rescind the regulations made by the said Board on the 9th day of June, 1892, in regard to the Treasury Garden, and doth hereby make the regulations following in respect thereof:—

## REGULATIONS.

1. No person in a state of intoxication, or who is disorderly or not decorously dressed, shall enter or remain in the Garden, and no person shall commit therein any act of indecency.
2. No person shall interfere with, damage, or destroy the seats, trees, shrubs, grass, flowers, birds, fish, or any property in the Garden, or throw stones or other missiles, or beat carpets, or commit any nuisance, or light fires in the Garden, or leave therein any bottles, orange peel, paper, cast-off clothing, litter, or refuse of any kind, or smoke when off the paths.
3. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or seats in or around the Garden, or lie on the seats or grass, or stick bills on the fences, gates, seats, or trees, or cut names, letters, or marks on the trees, seats, gates, posts, or fences, or otherwise deface the same or write thereon.
4. No person shall bring into the Garden any dog, unless held by a chain or cord, and all goats or poultry found therein shall be liable to be destroyed by any bailiff of Crown lands or constable.

5. No person, except workmen employed in the Garden, shall enter any plots of ground specially inclosed for plantations or for other purposes in the Garden, and no assemblies for fêtes, picnics, or concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or meetings of a like character, shall take place in the Garden without the permission, in writing, of the Minister of Lands first obtained.

6. No bicycle or tricycle, other than children's bicycles or tricycles, shall be ridden in or through the Garden, and no carriage, cart, or other vehicle, except perambulators or go-carts, shall be allowed to enter or remain in the Garden unless such cart or other vehicle be used or required in connexion with works therein.

7. No person, unless authorized by the Minister of Lands, shall offer for sale in the Garden any article.

8. Any person found removing or taking any plants, flowers, seeds, fruits, or other property from the Garden, or injuring any property therein, shall be liable to be removed from the Garden, and to be prosecuted.

9. Cricket, football, or other games or sports shall not be played or take place in the Garden.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with Section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

## TOWN OF NORTHCOTE.

## REGULATION No. 13.

**A** REGULATION of the Town of Northcote made under section 44 of the *Meat Supervision Act* 1900. Under the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Meat Supervision Act* 1900 and all other powers it enabling the Council of the Town of Northcote, with the approval of the Board of Public Health, doth hereby make the following Regulations with respect to maintenance of cleanliness of places used for the preserving, freezing, chilling, or storing of meat and the premises appurtenant thereto and of the appliances used thereat, and for securing the wholesomeness of meat preserved, frozen, chilled, or stored therein, or intended so to be:—

1. No person shall put or keep or cause or allow to be put or kept in any room, chamber, compartment, or place hereafter to be constructed any meat for the purpose of freezing, preserving, chilling, or storing the same unless the benches, shelves, cupboards, and lockers therein are movable.

2. No person shall put or keep or cause or allow to be put or kept in any room, chamber, compartment, or place for the purpose of freezing, preserving, chilling, or storing—

- (a) any meat other than such as is fresh and free from putrefaction, decomposition, fly-blow, phosphorescence, clammy, slimy, and other unwholesome conditions; or
- (b) any unclean, unwashed, or foul-smelling substance, offal, or viscera; or
- (c) any fish, oysters, or other molluscs, any crayfish or other crustaceans, any game, cheese, butter, vegetable, or other perishable product in such a condition as to be likely to contaminate, taint, or prejudicially affect the meat.

3. No person shall use or cause or allow to be used any room, chamber, compartment, or place in which the condition known as "phosphorescence" exists for storing fresh meat unless—

- (a) at least once every month during the persistence of such condition every part of the internal surfaces of the walls, floor, ceiling, and doors, and every part (including the legs, supports, backs, and undersides) of all benches, shelves, cupboards, lockers, boxes, hanging bars, hooks, and other fittings and all appliances are—

- (1) scrubbed with water and soft soap, the water being as hot as can be practically used, and the soap being sufficient in quantity to produce with the water a profuse lather, the scrubbing being performed in such a manner as to thoroughly cleanse such surfaces, fittings, and appliances, and to completely remove all dirt, stains, greasiness, and other deposit;

- (2) then dried with clean cloths; and

- (3) immediately afterwards copiously washed, swabbed, or sluiced with a solution consisting of one gallon of clean, cold water, three ounces of chlorinated lime of good strength, and either three ounces of vinegar or one ounce of spirit of salt, the solution being applied so as to reach every part, including all corners, crevices, and cracks of such surfaces, fittings, and appliances; and

- (b) once a week at least the floors, benches, shelves, and such other parts as shall have been in contact with any meat or other food are cleaned and disinfected as provided for under clause (a), sub-clauses (1), (2), and (3).

4. No person shall use or cause or allow to be used for the storage of fresh meat for retail or shop purposes any room, chamber, compartment, or place—

- (a) unless the floors, benches, shelves, and such other parts as shall have been in contact with any meat or other food are cleansed at least once in every week by scrubbing with water and soft soap, the water being as hot as can be practically used, and the soap being sufficient in quantity to produce with the water a profuse lather, the scrubbing being performed in such a manner as to thoroughly cleanse such surfaces, fittings, and appliances, and to completely remove all dirt, stains, greasiness, and other deposit,

- (b) that is not kept continuously clean and free from foul smell or other unwholesome condition.

5. If any person fails to comply with any of the provisions of these Regulations, or prevents compliance with the same on the part of any other person, he shall be

deemed guilty of an offence against these Regulations, and shall be liable for every such offence, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and to a further penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every day during which, after a conviction, the offence is further continued.
