With reference to the Marquess of Ripon's Circular despatch of the 15th December, 1893, I have the honour to transmit to you, for information and publication in the Colony under your government, a copy of an Order* of His Majesty in Council revoking the Orders in Council of the 30th September, 1873, the 14th February, 1883, and the 23rd November, 1893, in regard to the mode of estimating the net registered tonnage of Italian ships, and recognising in His Majesty's Dominions the tonnage of such ships denoted on their certificates of registry or other national papers dated on and after the 10th February, 1906.

PRESENT:

The King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by section 84, sub-section 1, of the *Merchant Shipping Act 1894*, it is enacted that whenever it appears to His Majesty the King in Council that the tonnage regulations of the said Act have been adopted by any foreign country, and are in force there, His Majesty in Council may order that the ships of that country shall, without being re-measured in His Majesty's dominions, be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry or other national papers in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purposes as the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of a British ship is deemed to be the tonnage of that ship:

And whereas it appears to His Majesty that the tonnage regulations of the said Act have been adopted by the

Government of His Majesty the King of Italy, and are now in force in that country, having come into operation on the 10th February, 1906:

His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order that the merchant ships of the said Kingdom of Italy, the measurement of which shall, after the 10th February, 1906, have been ascertained and denoted in the certificates of registry or other national papers of such ships, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such certificates of registry or other national papers, in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purposes as the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of a British ship is deemed to be the tonnage of that ship:

And His Majesty is further pleased to direct that the Orders of Her late Majesty in Council, dated respectively the 30th day of September, 1873, the 14th day of February, 1883, and the 23rd day of November, 1893, be, and the same are hereby revoked.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Act 1905*, and after due inquiry, I, being the responsible Minister for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of sub-section (1) of section 40 of the said Act in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF SWALLOW & ARIELL LTD., PRESERVING DEPARTMENT, PRINCES-STREET, FORT MELBOURNE,

for a period of six weeks from the 30th July, 1906, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than seventy-five females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said seventy-five females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

for a period of eight weeks from the 1st August, 1906, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than fifty-six females or more than twelve boys under the age of sixteen years for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said fifty-six females and twelve boys under the age of sixteen years shall not be employed for more than fifty-three hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That every boy under the age of sixteen years and every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which he or she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That every boy under the age of sixteen years and every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening he or she works overtime.
4. That none of such females or boys shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-room for the information of all concerned.

SHIRE OF TRARALGON.

BY-LAW No. V.

FOR regulating earth-closets and the emptying and cleansing of pans within all that portion of the parish of Traralgon, county of Buln Buln: Commencing at the south-western angle of allotment Nineteen, parish of Traralgon; thence by a line bearing south to the Melbourne to Traralgon Railway; thence by the said railway to the western boundary of the township of Traralgon; thence southerly and easterly by the said township boundary to Traralgon Creek; thence northerly by the said creek to the north-western angle of allotment 83, township

of Traralgon; thence easterly by the north boundaries of allotments 83 and 91, township of Traralgon, to the eastern boundary of the said township; thence northerly and westerly and southerly and westerly by the said township boundary to the south-east corner of allotment 17, parish of Traralgon; thence by the southern boundaries of allotments 17, 18, and 19 of the said parish to the commencing point.

All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.

In pursuance of the provisions of the *Health Act 1890* and of every other power enabling them in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Traralgon hereby make the following By-law number V. of the said shire, that is to say:—

1. The ordinary system of pans for night-soil is hereby abolished, and instead thereof every earth-closet shall be furnished with a double-pan service, such pans to be supplied and provided by the said Council; and the cost of such pans shall be included in the charge made by the Council of the said shire for the disposal of the night-soil as hereinafter provided for.
2. No such occupier and no person whatsoever shall deposit in any such closet-pan any house or yard rubbish or any material (except for deodorizing) other than night-soil, and shall not place or use therein any pan which may be damaged or defective. The said Council or any person duly authorized by them in that behalf may at any time, without notice, remove from any such premises any damaged or defective pan, and replace the same by providing a good pan.
3. Every such occupier of any premises within the said portion of the said parish shall at least once in every week allow each pan to be removed by a person or persons duly authorized in that behalf by the said Council.
4. No individual householder within the said portion of the said parish shall contract for the removal of night-soil from their respective premises within such portion of such parish in any other manner than is herein provided.
5. Every such occupier of any such premises shall from time to time provide and keep in use in the privy or closet or privies or closets attached to such premises a suitable disinfectant.
6. To provide for the proper removal of night-soil every such occupier of any such premises from which night-soil is removed within the aforesaid boundaries shall pay to the Council of the said Shire of Traralgon such charge as may from time to time be fixed by resolution of the said Council, for supplying, removing, emptying, and cleansing closet-pans, and in default of payment of such charge the amount thereof may be recovered by the said Council in any Court of Petty Sessions, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Health Act 1890*.
7. This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the prescribed area as hereinbefore mentioned, and shall come into operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
8. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty of a sum not exceeding Ten pounds, and not less than Five shillings, for every breach thereof, or not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued; and any person committing any breach aforesaid shall be liable to the penalties therefor, notwithstanding that the said Council may be empowered by this By-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether the said Council has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

The foregoing By-law was duly made, ordered, and passed by the Council of the Shire of Traralgon this 25th day of April, 1906; and confirmed this 23rd day of May, 1906.

Meat Supervision Acts No. 1652.

REGULATION No. 3 FOR SECURING CLEANLINESS IN MEAT STORES.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Meat Supervision Act 1900*, and under all other powers it enabling, the Council of the Borough of Oakleigh, with the approval of the Board of Public Health, doth hereby make the following Regulation No. 3 with respect to maintenance of cleanliness of places used for the preserving, freezing, chilling, or storing of meat, and the premises appurtenant thereto, and of the appliances used thereat, and for securing the wholesomeness of meat preserved, frozen, chilled, or stored therein, or intended so to be:—

1. No person shall put or keep, or cause or allow to be put or kept in any room, chamber, compartment, or place hereafter to be constructed, any meat for the purpose of freezing, preserving, chilling, or storing the same unless the benches, shelves, cupboards, and lockers therein are movable.

2. No person shall put or keep, or cause or allow to be put or kept in any room, chamber, compartment, or place for the purpose of freezing, preserving, chilling, or storing—

(A) any meat other than such as is fresh and free from putrefaction, decomposition, fly-blow, phosphorescence, clamminess, sliminess, and other unwholesome conditions; or

(B) any unclean, unwashed, or foul-smelling substance, offal; or viscera; or

(C) any fish, oysters, or other molluscs, any crayfish or other crustaceans, any game, cheese, butter, vegetable, or other perishable product in such a condition as to be likely to contaminate, taint, or prejudicially affect the meat.

3. No person shall use, or cause or allow to be used, any room, chamber, compartment, or place in which the condition known as phosphorescence exists for storing fresh meat unless—

(A) at least once every month during the persistence of such condition every part of the internal surfaces of the walls, floor, ceiling, and doors, and every part (including the legs, supports, back, and undersides) of all benches, shelves, cupboards, lockers, boxes, hanging bars, hooks, and other fittings, and all appliances are—

(1) scrubbed with water and soft soap, the water being as hot as can be practically used, and the soap being sufficient in quantity to produce with the water a profuse lather, the scrubbing being performed in such a manner as to thoroughly cleanse such surfaces, fittings, and appliances, and to completely remove all dirt, stains, greasiness, and other deposit;

(2) then dried with clean cloths; and.

(3) immediately afterwards copiously washed, swabbed, or sluiced with a solution consisting of one gallon of clean cold water, three ounces of chlorinated lime of good strength, and either three ounces of vinegar or one ounce of spirit of salt, the solution being applied so as to reach every part, including all corners, crevices, and cracks of such surfaces, fittings, and appliances; and

(B) once a week at least while in use the floors, benches, shelves, and such other parts as shall have been in contact with any meat or other food are cleansed and disinfected, as provided for under clause (A), sub-clauses (1), (2), and (3).

4. No person shall use, or cause or allow to be used for the storage of fresh meat for retail or shop purposes, any room, chamber, compartment, or place—

(a) unless the floors, benches, shelves, and such other parts as shall have been in contact with any meat or other food are cleansed at least once in every week by scrubbing with water and soft soap, the water being as hot as can be practically used, and the soap being sufficient in quantity to produce with the water a profuse lather, the scrubbing being performed in such a manner as to thoroughly cleanse such surfaces, fittings, and appliances, and to completely remove all dirt, stains, greasiness, and other deposit;

(b) that is not kept continuously clean and free from foul smell and other unwholesome freedom.

5. If any person fails to comply with any of the provisions of this Regulation, or prevents compliance with the same on the part of any other person, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against this regulation, and shall be liable for every such offence, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds; and to a further penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every day during which, after a conviction, the offence is further continued.

Regulation No. 2 passed at a meeting of the Council on the 8th day of January, 1906, and confirmed on the 6th day of February, 1906, is hereby revoked.

REGULATIONS FOR SECURING CLEANLINESS IN MEAT STORES.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Meat Supervision Act 1900* and all other powers it enabling, the Council of the Borough of Newtown and Chilwell, with the approval of the Board of Public Health, doth hereby make the following Regulations with respect to maintenance of cleanliness of places used for the preserving, freezing, chilling, or storing of meat, and the premises appurtenant thereto, and of the appliances used thereat, and for securing the wholesomeness of meat preserved, frozen, chilled, or stored therein, or intended to be:—

1. No person shall put or keep, or cause or allow to be put or kept in any room, chamber, compartment, or place hereafter to be constructed, any meat for the purpose of freezing, preserving, chilling, or storing the same, unless the benches, shelves, cupboards, and lockers therein are movable.

2. No person shall put or keep, or cause or allow to be put or kept in any room, chamber, compartment, or place for the purpose of preserving, freezing, chilling, or storing—

(a) any meat other than such is fresh and free from putrefaction, decomposition, fly-blow, phosphorescence, clammy, slimy, and other unwholesome conditions; or

(b) any unclean, unwashed, or foul-smelling substance, offal, or viscera; or

(c) any fish, oysters, or other molluscs, any crayfish or other crustaceans, any gunc, cheese, butter, vegetable, or other perishable product in such a condition as to be likely to contaminate, taint, or prejudicially affect the meat.

3. No person shall use, or cause or allow to be used, any room, chamber, compartment, or place in which the condition known as "phosphorescence" exists for storing fresh meat unless—

(a) at least once every month during the persistence of such condition every part of the internal surfaces of the walls, floor, ceiling, and doors, and every part (including the legs, supports, back, and undersides) of all benches, shelves, cupboards, lockers, boxes, hanging bars, hooks, and other fittings and all appliances are—

(1) scrubbed with water and soft soap, the water being as hot as can be practically used, and the soap being sufficient in quantity to produce with the water a profuse lather, the scrubbing being performed in such a manner as to thoroughly cleanse such surfaces, fittings, and appliances, and to completely remove all dirt, stains, greasiness, and other deposit;

(2) then dried with clean cloths; and

(3) immediately afterwards copiously washed, swabbed, or sluiced with a solution consisting of one gallon of clean cold water, three ounces of chlorinated lime of good strength, and either three ounces of vinegar or one ounce of spirit of salt, the solution being applied so as to reach every part, including all corners, crevices, and cracks of such surfaces, fittings, and appliances; and

(b) once a week at least the floors, benches, shelves, and such other parts as shall have been in contact with any meat or other food are cleansed and disinfected, as provided for under clause (a), sub-clauses (1), (2), and (3).

4. No person shall use, or cause or allow to be used, for the storage of fresh meat for retail or shop purposes, any room, chamber, compartment, or place—

(a) unless the floors, benches, shelves, and such other parts as shall have been in contact with any meat or other food are cleansed at least once in every week by scrubbing with water and soft soap, the water being as hot as can be practically used, and the soap being sufficient in quantity to produce with the water a profuse lather, the scrubbing being performed in such a manner as to thoroughly cleanse such surfaces, fittings, and appliances, and to completely remove all dirt, stains, greasiness, and other deposit.

(b) that is not kept continuously clean and free from foul smell or other unwholesome condition.

5. If any person fails to comply with any of the provisions of these regulations, or prevents compliance with the same on the part of any other person, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these regulations, and shall be liable for every such offence, on conviction, to a

penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds; and to a further penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every day during which, after a conviction, the offence is further continued.
