DETERMINATION OF THE WICKER BOARD.

Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE WICKER BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a manufacturer of bamboo or wicker goods, has made the following Determination, namely:—

That all previous Determinations of the Wicker Board shall be cancelled and annulled from and after the date upon which this present Determination comes into force and is operative.

WAGES.

That the lowest prices or rates of payment payable to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a manufacturer of bamboo or wicker goods, shall be—

Bamboo or wicker workers	48s. per week of 48 hours
Upholsterers	45s. " "
Upholsterers under the age of 21 years (other than apprentices or improvers)—			
For the 1st year's experience	25s. per week of 48 hours
" 2nd " "	35s. " "

IMPROVERS.

NUMBER.

That the number or proportion of improvers who may be employed within any factory or work-room, or shop, or place, shall be in the following proportion to the number of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a manufacturer of bamboo or wicker goods, and receiving not less than 48s. per week, or piece-work rates fixed in the schedules to this Determination, that is to say:—

1 improver to 2 or 3 such persons	
2 improvers to 4, 5, or 6	"
3 " 7, 8, or 9	"
4 " 10, 11, or 12	"

and thereafter 1 improver to every 6 such persons.

APPRENTICES OR IMPROVERS.

WAGES.

That the lowest prices or rates of payment payable to apprentices or improvers employed in the process, trade, or business of a manufacturer of bamboo or wicker goods shall be as follow:—

For the 1st year's experience	5s. per week of 48 hours
" 2nd " "	10s. " "
" 3rd " "	15s. " "
" 4th " "	22s. 6d. " "
" 5th " "	30s. " "
" 6th " "	40s. " "

and thereafter either the wages or piece-work rates provided by this Determination.

OVERTIME.

That any male person (other than apprentices or improvers) over the age of sixteen years, engaged in the process, trade, or business of a manufacturer of bamboo or wicker goods, who works for any time in excess of the maximum number of 48 hours per week, shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a quarter.

That any male apprentice or improver over the age of sixteen years, engaged in the process, trade, or business of a manufacturer of bamboo or wicker goods, who works for any time in excess of the maximum number of 48 hours shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of 3d. per hour, in addition to the rates fixed for apprentices or improvers by this Determination.

PIECE-WORK RATES.

That the lowest price or rate of payment payable to any person for wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing any article of the description referred to in the following schedules of rates, shall be the price or rate fixed by such schedules in respect of such article.

That where the material is not stated in the schedules the article may be made of willow or cane.

In this Determination the following terms shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them (that is to say):—

- "S." shall mean sticks.
- "L.B." shall mean length on bottom.
- "W.B." shall mean width on bottom.
- "D." shall mean depth.
- "L.T." shall mean length on top.
- "W.T." shall mean width on top.
- "S.S." shall mean side stakes.
- "E.S." shall mean end stakes.
