ACT OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Reginald Arthur James Talbot, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of the said State, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

“An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of One hundred and forty-five thousand four hundred and seventy-seven pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and five and One thousand nine hundred and six.”

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this thirty-first day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and six, and in the sixth year of His Majesty's reign.

AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS FOR GRANTING CERTIFICATES TO MINING ENGINE-DRIVERS.

DEPARTMENT OF TREASURER.

GENERAL REGULATIONS RESPECTING PUBLIC ACCOUNTS.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, has, by an Order made on the 31st day of July, 1906, approved that the following alterations be made in the General Regulations respecting Public Accounts, viz:—

Clause 36 (a).—After the words "Public Vaccinators" insert the following paragraph:—

"In the cases of employes of the Victorian Railways who, when their pay arrives at their usual location, are absent on annual leave or sick leave, or by reason of their having been transferred elsewhere, form HA annexed shall be used."

Clause 39 to be repealed, and the following clause to be substituted in lieu thereof:—

"39. Heads of Departments and other officers authorized by the proper Minister may be supplied by the Treasurer, in the manner hereinafter mentioned, with funds, by way of advance, to enable them to defray salaries, allowances, wages, departmental contingencies, and other expenditure which it may be deemed desirable to defray by such means. Salaries may be paid twice during each month, viz:—On the 15th and the last day thereof respectively. Whenever either of such days falls on a Saturday or Sunday payment may be made on the preceding Friday, and whenever either falls on a Public Holiday, payment may be made on the preceding day upon which the Public Offices are open for business, unless that day shall be a Saturday when the preceding Friday may be the day of payment. As regards pensions (with the exception of Old-Age Pensions) payment shall be made on the last working day other than Saturday of each month. These rules are not to be relaxed under any circumstances without the special direction of the Treasurer, but, in cases where wages are payable at a daily or weekly rate, they may be paid either weekly or fortnightly as the Head of the Department directs on the last working day of the term."

REGULATIONS AS TO THE LABELLING OF ARTICLES OF FOOD, OR OF WRAPPERS OR RECEPTACLES CONTAINING ARTICLES OF FOOD MIXED WITH PRESERVATIVE SUBSTANCES OR WITH FOREIGN COLOURING MATTERS.

THE Board of Public Health of the State of Victoria, by virtue of the powers conferred by the Health Acts, and of every other power enabling the said Board in this behalf, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

1. To every article of food mixed with a preservative substance, and to every article of food mixed with any foreign colouring matter, or to any wrapper or receptacle containing any such article so mixed, there shall be attached a label distinctly and legibly written or printed, and setting forth—

(a) The nature and amount of such preservative substance; and

(b) The nature of such foreign colouring matter.

This Regulation shall not apply to confectionery nor to the long-used, well-known condimental preservative substances, viz., common salt, sugar (sucrose or saccharose), spices, wood-smoke, and vinegar; nor, as regards wine, to the substances allowed under section 25 of the *Pure Food Act 1905*.

2. The label so required to be attached shall, where the admixture is with a preservative substance, be in the form of Schedule A hereto, and shall contain no other matter, and the written or printed matter shall be on a white ground in black capital letters of a size not less than one-sixth of an inch in length.

3. Every person who shall be guilty of a contravention of these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds for every such contravention.

4. These Regulations shall come into force on the thirty-first day of December, 1906.

REGULATIONS FOR SECURING THE CLEANLINESS AND FREEDOM FROM CONTAMINATION OF ARTICLES OF FOOD.

THE Board of Public Health of the State of Victoria, by virtue of the power conferred by the Health Acts, and of every other power enabling the said Board in this behalf, doth hereby make the following Regulations for securing the cleanliness and freedom from contamination of certain articles of food, to wit, milk, cream, butter, cheese, cooked meats, bread, pastry, confectionery, honey, jam, fruit, and other articles of food to which flies are attracted, and which are ordinarily consumed in the condition in which they are purchased:—

1. Any person who sells on any retail premises (including cafés, restaurants, and licensed premises) any of the

above-named articles of food in other than sealed packages shall, as far as practicable, protect such articles of food from dust and flies by storage in covered receptacles, or by means of metal covers, or wire gauze screens, or other effectual appliance.

2. No person shall transport through the street for sale any of the above-named articles of food unless the same is, as far as practicable, protected from dust and flies.

3. These Regulations shall take effect from the first day of November, 1906.

4. Any person contravening any of these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR SECURING THE CLEANLINESS AND FREEDOM FROM CONTAMINATION OF ARTICLES OF FOOD.

THE Board of Public Health of the State of Victoria, by virtue of the power conferred by the Health Acts, and of every other power enabling the said Board in this behalf, doth hereby make the following Regulations for securing the cleanliness and freedom from contamination of certain articles of food, to wit, bread and meat, that is to say:—

1. No person who sells bread or meat, and no employé of such person shall receive into any place or vehicle for the reception or storage of bread or meat for sale any bread or meat which has been returned after delivery at any house.

2. No person who sells bread or meat shall use or cause to be used as a material for casing, covering, enclosing, or packing bread or meat for carriage or for sale any second-hand paper, or any newspaper or part of a newspaper, or any paper or substance on which there is printing which can come into contact with the bread or meat.

3. These Regulations shall take effect from the first day of September, 1906.

4. Any person contravening any of these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

RULES, REGULATIONS, AND SCALE OF FEES OF THE WOORAK PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE WOORAK PUBLIC CEMETERY.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the trustees of the Woorak Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These rules and regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

3. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.

4. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the trustees thereof, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B) which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right on obtaining the permission of the trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the trustees.

6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths has been delivered to the secretary (gatekeeper or sexton).

7. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.

8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

9. The hours for burials shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.; May to August inclusive, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. On Sundays throughout the year from 8 to 10 a.m., or from 2 to 5 p.m.

10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

11. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person having paid the fee for a private grave and requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

12. No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent in writing of the person entitled to give the same.

13. No person employed by the trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the trustees.

14. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from 7 a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.

15. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the trustees.

16. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

17. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.

- (2) Commissioners must, as far as practicable, avail themselves of ordinary public means of conveyance in travelling to and from Trust meetings, and in such cases they will be recouped the sums actually paid by them for fares, provided that the amount of such fares does not exceed the charge of Fourpence per mile each way.
- (3) The travelling expenses of Commissioners shall not be chargeable against the loan of any Trust, but shall be wholly paid from Trust revenue.

No. 1893) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations for declaring the weight of any specified descriptions or classes of goods by measurement: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, which shall be in lieu of the Regulations approved on the 22nd day of November, 1905, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 29th November, 1905, that is to say :—

REGULATIONS.

1. Mill-owners shall keep a book, and shall enter therein all loads delivered at their mills, by whom delivered, date, measurement, and place logs were obtained, the said book to be open for inspection during working hours, and a copy of any entry therein to be evidence in any court.

2. All persons in charge of heavily laden waggons or drays shall show the inspector, when asked to do so, true and correct way-bills of their loads when such consists of any goods other than described in the undermentioned schedule, and shall, if required, make statutory declaration as to the correctness of such way-bills.

3. The weight by measurement of each of the descriptions or classes of goods named in the Schedule hereunder shall be that specified in the said Schedule in each case respectively, that is to say :—

Delivery to be made on the written order of the chief officer of the Department requiring the supply. The ton of firewood consists of 40 cubic feet. If the firewood is obtained from a State forest timber reserve, or ordinary Crown lands, persons cutting and removing same must be provided with proper Crown licences for the particular areas concerned.
3. Orders will be issued half-yearly (except in cases where the storage is small, when they will be issued quarterly); but the contractor must have 24 hours' notice before purchases are made at his risk.
