2. That every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

## Health Act 1890.

## BOROUGH OF PORTLAND.

## BY-LAW NO. 46.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, and of every power enabling them in this behalf, the Council of the Borough of Portland, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the said borough, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within its jurisdiction, do hereby make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. By-law No. 43 of the said council, made on the 6th day of December, 1893, and published in the *Government Gazette* of 16th February, 1894, shall be and is hereby wholly rescinded.

2. This By-law, No. 46, shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

## PART 1.

3. This part of this By-law shall have operation and apply to the whole of the area within the Borough of Portland enclosed by the left bank of the Salt Creek, commencing at its confluence with Portland Bay, and following up its course and that of the "Swamp" until it meets the prolongation of a line drawn in the centre of Blair-street; thence northwards along the said line drawn in the centre of Blair-street to the intersection of a line drawn in the centre of Townsend-street; thence eastwards by such line drawn in the centre of Townsend-street and produced until it strikes the sea-coast of Portland Bay; and thence by the said sea-coast of Portland Bay to the point of commencement; and shall apply and extend to every occupier of a tenement therein.

4. The ordinary system of pans for night-soil is hereby abolished, and instead thereof, every closet shall be furnished with a double-pan service, to be provided by the council.

5. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no place less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room, or common lodginghouse, shall be paved or flagged with non-absorbent material having an inclination or fall from the riser of the seat towards the back of the building of half an inch to the foot. All privies shall have proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation.

6. No closet door or trap shall abut or open upon any street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding ten feet in width.

7. Once at least in each week, or so much more frequently as the council may from time to time direct, the pan in use in every earth closet shall be closed with a tight-fitting lid, and removed at such time and to such place as the council may have appointed. No person, except that authorized by the said council, shall be employed to remove the same.

8. The occupier of every tenement as aforesaid shall from time to time provide and keep in use in the privy or privies attached to his tenement a suitable disinfectant or deodorant.

9. To provide for the proper removal of night-soil the occupier of every tenement within the aforesaid boundaries shall pay to the Council of the Borough of Portland such sum as may from time to time be fixed by resolution of the said council for supplying, removing, emptying, and cleansing closet pans.

10. Such charge shall be payable by each occupier on the 1st day of January, April, July, and October in each year, commencing from the date of the coming into operation of this By-law, and such charge shall be paid to the Town Clerk of the said Council, at the Town Hall, Charles-street, Portland.

## PART 2.

11. This part of this By-law, No. 46, shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Borough of Portland.

12. The occupier of every house and premises within the said borough shall cause the yard and ground belonging to such premises, or occupied in connexion therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be removed from time to time from such yard or ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such rubbish, filth, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the council may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

13. The occupier of any land in the said borough on which shall be erected any stable, cow-yard, cattle shed, or pigstye, shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other

manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to two cubic yards. And if at any time the occupier of such premises fail or neglect to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said council at the expense of such occupier.

14. All blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and deposited in such place or places as the council may from time to time appoint for the reception of the same.

15. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited or spread, or assisting in placing or depositing or spreading on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any cesspool or other place, shall, immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof, cover the same or cause the same to be covered with a layer of earth not less than twelve inches in thickness.

16. The occupier of any premises within the borough used for the purpose of any noxious trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether as an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon, once in every twenty-four hours to be removed therefrom, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health or to exhale any offensive effluvia; and if such occupier shall neglect to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said council at the expense of such occupier.

17. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of Five pounds (£5) for every such breach, or of Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such portion not being less than Five shillings (5s.), to be paid; and any person committing any breach aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty notwithstanding that the council may be empowered by this By-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether the council has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

#### BY-LAW No. 43.

A By-law of the Borough of Maryborough, made under the provisions of sections 31, 32, 35, 253, and 259 of the *Health Act* 1890, and numbered 43, for regulating the removal and disposal of night-soil, and the description of pans for night-soil to be used in the said borough; also for rescinding By-law number 3 and portion of By-law number 1 of the Local Board of Health.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act* 1890, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Maryborough make the following By-law:—

1. That the whole of By-law No. 3 and portion of By-law No. 1 made by the Local Board of Health under the powers contained in the Public Health Amendment Statute 1883, so far as it relates to the matters and things provided for in this By-law be, and are hereby repealed, except as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings pending at the time of this By-law coming into operation.

2. This By-law shall come into force on the first day of April, 1906, after its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the municipal boundaries of the Borough of Maryborough.

4. The council may exempt any premises within the Borough of Maryborough from the operation of this By-law.

5. That the present system of pans for night-soil shall be and is hereby abolished.

6. That from and after the By-law coming into force every closet shall be forthwith furnished with a double-pan service, such pans to be constructed of such materials, size, and design as the said council may approve, and to have tight-fitting lids similarly approved for use during the removal of the night-soil therein.

7. That at least once a week, or so much more frequently as the council may from time to time direct, the pans in use shall be closed with a tight-fitting lid, and removed between such hours as the council may direct in a suitable cart, and the council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate for the removal of the night-soil, to make a charge on each occupier for such service, the amount, in default of payment, to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

8. That a pan cleansed by efficient means, approved of by the council, shall be left in place of the one removed.

9. Every closet within the municipality shall consist of a suitable privy building constructed with proper openings or flues to provide due ventilation. The floor of such closet shall be at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and be provided with requisite means for the application of earth or some deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be so constructed and placed as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan and emptying and cleansing the same.

10. The night-soil removed shall be rendered inoffensive by being trenched or ploughed into land in such locality as may be provided by the council.

11. No occupier or person shall use a closet pan for depositing any house or yard rubbish or any other material in (except for deodorizing) other than night-soil, or shall damage such pan and lids in any manner whatsoever.

12. No individual householder shall contract for the removal of night-soil from their respective premises in any other manner than is herein provided, except in cases of exemption.

13. Occupiers of premises in the said borough shall obtain and use such a number of pans and lids, as aforesaid, as may be necessary for use on their premises, and shall permit the officers of the council, and all workmen and servants and contractors employed by it, to have access to and upon their premises during such time as the council may direct for the purpose of performing the necessary service in connexion with the removal of night-soil therefrom.

14. Stringent supervision shall be exercised by the council over all premises which may be inspected by the council or its officers from time to time, or by any person duly authorized by the council.

15. Every such occupier or person shall cause to be kept in every closet a proper supply of dry earth, ashes, cinders, lime, sawdust, charcoal, or some other effective deodorant for effectually deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan placed in such closet to be immediately on such deposit covered with a quantity of deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly disinfect the contents of such pan.

16. Every person committing a breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings for every breach thereof, or not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

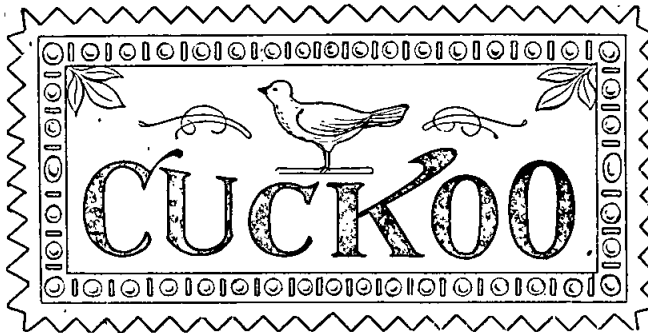

**T**HE Auditor-General of the State of Victoria, being in possession of the property of the Cohuna Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, doth hereby in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the following Regulation providing for the sale of water from and after the 1st day of January, 1906:—

1. All water supplied from the works of the Trust shall be paid for by measure; the forms of measurement shall be as hereunder determined.

**GRAVITATION WATER.**

2. The rate or price to be charged for gravitation water delivered from the works of the Trust shall be as follows:—

- For cereal crops, Sixpence per inch per acre for the first watering, and Fourpence per inch per acre for a second or subsequent watering; three inches in each case to be deemed a watering.
- For fodder crops (including amber-cane, sorghum, lucerne, &c.), Fourpence per inch per acre for the first watering, and Threepence per inch per acre for a second or subsequent watering, when the River Murray is 10 feet or over above summer level; and when the said river is below 10 feet above summer level, Sixpence per inch per acre; three inches in each case to be deemed a watering.
- For grass land, Twopence per inch per acre, three inches to be deemed a watering.
- For fallow land, Fourpence per inch per acre, three inches to be deemed a watering.
- For filling tanks within the Trust District a charge of Ten shillings for each tank shall be made.

**PUMPED WATER.**

3. The rate or price to be charged for pumped water delivered from the works of the Trust shall be as follows:—

- For the irrigation of all lands when the River Murray is five feet or over above summer level, Tenpence per inch per acre; and when the River Murray is below five feet above summer level, One shilling per inch per acre; three inches in all cases to be deemed a watering.
- For filling tanks within the Trust District, the charge shall be One pound for each tank, with an additional fee of Ten shillings per mile for each mile or portion of a mile distant from the distributory channel of the Trust from which the supply is being delivered.

**GARDEN RIGHTS.**

4. Garden rights may be issued for the supply of water to orchards, vineyards, and vegetable gardens not exceeding in extent an area of twenty-five (25) acres each, and the charge for each such right shall be at the rate of Ten shillings per acre or fractional part of an acre. All reasonable efforts shall be made for such supply in the months of January, February, and March. For such garden rights fees shall be paid in full by 31st March in each year. Such rights and fees covering the right of supply for the above months do not deprive those in possession of garden rights of obtaining water on other occasions, but special attention as to supply in the above months of January, February, and March is required.

**FODDER RIGHTS.**

5. Fodder rights may be issued for the supply of water to fodder crops not exceeding in extent an area of 15 acres each, and the charge for each such right shall be at the rate of Ten shillings per acre or fractional part of an acre. All such rights must be applied for before the 31st day of March in each year, and the charge in respect thereof shall be due and payable within 30 days of the date of application.

When by virtue of a fodder right an area of 15 acres is watered, only one-half of the area allowed to each person (when it is found necessary to limit the supply) shall be supplied with water; thus, an occupier entitled to a supply of 40 acres out of his 320 acres, when he has exercised his right by virtue of a fodder right, shall be only entitled to water 20 acres, and so on in like proportion.

6. Charges for water supply to persons outside of the District of the Trust shall be double the amount charged for water supplied within the Trust District as fixed by this Regulation.

7. The minimum charge for all water supplied within the Trust District shall be Ten shillings, and for water supplied outside the Trust District the minimum charge shall be One pound.

8. All water wasted shall be charged at the rate fixed by this Regulation in respect of the purpose for which the water is being supplied.

9. Gaugings of the River Murray shall be taken at the Trust's headworks.

REGULATION NO. 23.

A Regulation of the Town of Essendon, made under and pursuant to the *Local Government Act 1903*, by virtue of the *Meat Supervision Act 1900*, and numbered 23, for securing the cleanliness of places used for the preserving, freezing, chilling, or storing of meat, and the premises appurtenant thereto, and of the appliances used thereat and for securing the wholesomeness of meat preserved, frozen, chilled, or stored therein intended so to be.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, and of the *Meat Supervision Act 1900*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Essendon order as follows:—

(1) No person shall put or keep, or cause or allow to be put or kept, in any room, chamber, compartment, or place hereafter to be constructed, any meat for the purpose of freezing, preserving, or chilling or storing the same unless the benches, shelves, cupboards, and lockers therein are movable.

(2) No person shall put or keep, or cause or allow to be put or kept, in any room, chamber, compartment, or place for the purpose of freezing, preserving, chilling, or storing—

(a) any meat other than such is fresh and free from putrefaction, decomposition, fly-blown, phosphorescence, clammy, slimy, and other unwholesome conditions; or

(b) any unclean, unwashed, or foul-smelling substance, offal, or viscera; or

(c) any fish, oysters, or other molluscs, any crayfish or other crustaceans, any game, cheese, butter, vegetable, or other perishable product in such a condition as to be likely to contaminate, taint, or prejudicially affect the meat.

(3) No person shall use, or cause or allow to be used, any room, chamber, compartment, or place in which the condition known as "phosphorescence" exists for storing fresh meat unless—

(a) At least once every month during the persistence of such conditions every part of the internal surfaces of the walls, floor, ceiling, and doors and every part (including the legs, supports, back, and undersides) of all benches, shelves, cupboards, lockers, boxes, hanging bars, hooks, and other fittings and all appliances are—

(1) scrubbed with water and soft soap, the water being as hot as can be practically used, and the soap being sufficient in quantity to produce with the water a profuse lather, the scrubbing being performed in such a manner as to thoroughly cleanse such surfaces, fittings, and appliances, and to completely remove all dirt stains, greasiness, and other deposit;

(2) then dried with clean cloths; and

(3) immediately afterwards copiously washed, swabbed, or sluiced with a solution consisting of one gallon of clean cold water, three ounces of chlorinated lime of good strength, and either three ounces of vinegar or one ounce of spirit of salt, the solution being applied so as to reach every part, including all corners, crevices, and cracks of such surfaces, fittings, and appliances; and

(b) once a week at least the floors, benches, shelves, and such other parts as shall have been in contact with any meat or other food are cleaned and disinfected, as provided for under clause (a), sub-clauses (1), (2), and (3).

(4) No person shall use, or cause or allow to be used, for the storage of fresh meat for retail or shop purposes, any room, chamber, compartment, or place—

(a) unless the floors, benches, shelves, and such other parts as shall have been in contact with any meat or other food are cleaned at least once in every week by scrubbing with water and soft soap, the water being as hot as can be practically used, and the soap being sufficient in quantity to produce with the water a profuse lather, the scrubbing being performed in such a manner as to thoroughly cleanse such surfaces, fittings, and appliances, and to completely remove all dirt stains, greasiness, and other deposit;

(b) that is not kept continuously clean and free from foul smell or other unwholesome condition.

(5) If any person fails to comply with any of the provisions of this Regulation, or prevents compliance with the same on the part of any other person, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against this Regulation, and shall be liable for every such offence, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and to a further penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every day during which, after a conviction, the offence is further continued.

(6) This Regulation shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.
