INTERNATIONAL MARITIME EXPOSITION.

(May-November, 1907.)

Organized* by the League Maritime Française under the official patronage of the French Government, the General Council of the Gironde, the Municipality, the Chamber of Commerce, and the Philomathic Society of Bordeaux, in celebration of a century of steam navigation.

GENERAL REGULATIONS. General Arrangements.

Art. 1.—An International Maritime Exposition in celebration of a century of steam navigation will be opened in Bordeaux on 1st May, 1907, under the auspices of the League Maritime Française, recognised as an establishment of public utility by decree of 17th December, 1905.

Art. 2.—The Exposition will be held on the great square of the Quinconces. Its duration will be about six months. Its opening and closing may be advanced or delayed without liability for indemnity.

Art. 3.—The Exposition will be held under the official patronage and aid of the French Government and the Department of the Gironde, the Municipality, the Chamber of Commerce, and the Philomathic Society of Bordeaux.

Art. 4.—The Exposition is open to all countries. It will receive all industrial, agricultural, or artistic products pertaining to maritime affairs. A Colonial section will be devoted to colonial products which are intimately related to the commerce of Bordeaux. Pavilions will be devoted to ocean geography, nautical automobilism, and aerial navigation.

Art. 5.—During the Exposition the Commissioner-General intends to organize congresses, competitions, and lectures on interesting subjects concerning maritime affairs, science, art, industry, commerce, and social economy.

He will endeavour to organize also festivals of all kinds with the view of adding to the brilliancy of the Exposition. These congresses, competitions, and festivals will be under special regulations.

Art. 6.—The Commissioner-General and Deputy Commissioner-General have received the following powers:—

Art. 7.—The Commissioner-General has the direction of the Exposition. All initiative will devolve on him, and

no decision will be valid without his assent. He will have special charge of relations with the appropriate Ministerial Departments, and the Commissioners of Foreign Governments. He will have sole direction of all Departments, for which he will name chiefs and agents. He will direct the bookkeeping. He will establish forms for receipts, and will order all expenditures. All accounts must be submitted for his approval.

He will decide definitely upon the requests of exhibitors, and will deliver certificates of admission.

He is vested with power to nominate juries and all committees for that portion reserved for the administration.

The general police of the Exposition will be under his supervision.

Art. 8.—The Deputy Commissioner-General will assist the Commissioner-General, and will act in his place during his absence.

Art. 9.—Special committees of groups, and of festivals will be organized later.

Art. 10.—Each foreign country participating in the Exposition should accredit to the Commissioner-General a special Commissioner to represent its exhibitors.

Art. 11.—The Exposition will be constituted into a bonded warehouse; consequently the products exhibited will be exempt from verification, Custom-house, and octroi taxes.

Conditions of Admission.

Art. 12.—Exhibitors shall pay rent for the space they occupy according to the following tariff:—

1st. A fixed duty of 20 francs per exhibitor upon application for space.

2nd. A tax proportionate to the space to be occupied is to be established, according to a general tariff applied to industrial exhibitors, as follows:—

Each superficial meter in principal palace	60 francs.
Each superficial meter on the interior wall	40 "
Each superficial meter in the annexes	40 "
Each superficial meter on the interior walls of same	30 "
Each meter in open air, with option of construction	20 "
Each meter in open air, without option of construction	10 "

Plans for constructions to be erected must be submitted for the approval of the Commissioner-General.

For choice sites, show-cases, and corner locations, a higher tariff will be fixed for each particular place.

Art. 13.—Restaurants, shows, and all specially authorized establishments shall pay rents to be fixed by tariff.

In each special case a contract will determine the details regarding the construction and management.

Art. 14.—Rent may be required from the exhibitors, concessionaires, and others for poster advertisements, prospectuses, &c., in the interior of the Exposition. Authorization for said advertisements shall be given by the Commissioner-General.

Art. 15.—The charges due to the Exposition are payable against a receipt signed by the Commissioner-General, in two payments, to the Bank of Bordeaux; one-half within the fifteen days following the delivery of the certificate of admission, the other half on the 15th April, 1907. When the total charges shall not exceed 100 francs, payment thereof shall be made within the fifteen days following the delivery of the certificate of admission.

Art. 16.—Exhibitors who fail to pay the second instalment cannot recover their previous payment, which shall remain the property of the administration without legal formality. By the very fact of non-payment, the exhibitor's privilege to exhibit will be forfeited, the administration reserving the right to dispose of the space on or after 15th April.

Art. 17.—Requests for admission must be addressed to the Commissioner-General at Bordeaux, prior to 12th February, 1907, or dissatisfaction may result and requests may be refused.

Art. 18.—Forms of application for admission are to be prepared by the Commissioner-General, and will be at the disposal of exhibitors in Paris, Bordeaux, county towns of the Departments, and of foreign committees.

Art. 19.—The questions appearing on the application for admission must be answered correctly by the exhibitors.

Art. 20.—Dangerous material, such as fulminates and explosives, will be excluded.

Spirits and alcohol, oils, essences, corrosive materials, and generally substances which may injure other products or cause annoyance to the public, will only be received in strong and appropriate receptacles of small dimensions. Exhibitors of such products must abide by regulations to be promulgated in the interest of public health and security. Combustible material, shelves, curtains, &c., must be made fireproof, unless specially exempted.

Art. 21.—The Commissioner-General shall have the right to exclude all harmful products or such as may not appear to be consistent with the purposes of the Exposition.

Art. 22.—No object can be taken away before the close of the Exposition without special authority from the Commissioner-General. This prohibition does not apply to products that the exhibitors may be authorized to manufacture and offer for sale in public.

Art. 23.—No object of art, no product exhibited in the palaces, parks, or gardens will be permitted to be drawn, copied, or reproduced in any form whatsoever without the consent of the exhibitor, approved by the Commissioner-General. The Commissioner-General, however, may authorize the reproduction of a general view.

Art. 24.—The Administration of the Exposition will only provide general buildings and constructions. Insurance is obligatory on all products exhibited from the time they are entered at the Exposition until they are removed. Said insurance must contain a formal waiver by the insured and the insurer of any claim against the Administration of the Exposition. In default of the taking out of policies of insurance by the exhibitors, the same will be contracted for by the Administration of the Exposition at the exhibitor's cost, risk, and peril.

Art. 25.—The Administration of the Exposition will take all necessary measures for the protection of objects against damage and their general supervision, but will not be responsible for theft or damage.

Art. 26.—Exhibitors must pay for all packing, freight, unpacking, care of cases, installation, repacking, and re-shipping charges.

Art. 27.—Exhibitors who may require water, gas, electricity, or motor power must state this fact on their application for admission, giving all necessary details as to the speed required for each of their apparatus. The price of power will be fixed at the lowest possible rate.

Art. 28.—After the close of the Exposition the exhibitors must remove the products exhibited within one month (maximum), in default of which said products will be stored in a warehouse at the expense and risk of the exhibitor, without responsibility on the part of the Commissioner-General.

Juries.—Awards.

Art. 29.—The Examining Jury will be composed of authorized representatives of science, art, and industry, either in France or abroad.

Said Jury shall be appointed, one-half by the exhibitors, the other by the administration of the Exposition.

Art. 30.—The Jury shall demand all guarantees that may seem proper for the performance of their duty. They will have the right to exclude from competition any exhibitor who may attempt to deceive them.

Art. 31.—A Superior Jury will be appointed to judge all claims that may be presented.

Art. 32.—The awards shall consist of diplomas of honour, gold, silver, and bronze medals, and honorable mentions.

A.B.—The details as to the functions and duties of the Juries will be the subject of a special regulation.

(b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

9. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

Mathematics.

(a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

(b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practices of Surveying.

(c) Details of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, subdivisional, and other surveys, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting from field notes and from co-ordinates, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Acts, writing descriptions of boundaries.

(Candidates may be required to make actual surveys.)

Engineering Surveys.

(d) Levelling; grading; measurement of earthworks. (Including practical tests.)

Use of instruments.

(e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, telemeter, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer, tachometer, and steel band.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

Determination of time, latitude, and azimuth, reduction of star places; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle. (With practical tests.)

Drawing.

(f) General plan-drawing, compilation of plans, drawing of sections and contours, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellaneous.

(h) Physics and geology (elementary); names and description of Australasian timbers of economic value (*virtu*, *roce*).

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having matriculated, or of having passed the senior examination at a University, or the Senior Civil Service examination of New Zealand, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 66 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates producing evidence of having taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University may be further exempted from working out papers in physics and geology.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate passing the examination held under these Rules shall be entitled to a certificate of competency.

13. Any surveyor qualified in Victoria prior to 1st January, 1896, or any surveyor licensed prior to 1st January, 1896, in any other Australasian State or Colony who, by reason of his absence from that State or Colony, is prevented from obtaining the certificate of competency from the Board of that State or Colony, may make application to this Board, and on his satisfying the Board that he is competent, either without examination or on such examination as the Board may require, shall be entitled to a certificate of competency; such application shall be accompanied by the fee (£2 2s.).

LICENCES TO SURVEY.

14. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 1s.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act 1895*, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

REGULATIONS.

1. A candidate must give notice, in writing, not less than three weeks prior to the date of an examination, of his intention to present himself thereat; he must also forward to the Board satisfactory documentary evidence that he has complied with Regulations 2 and 3 following, and, on his application being approved by the Board, must pay the prescribed fee of £2 2s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or into a Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board, Office of Mines, Melbourne.
2. A candidate must produce a certificate of competency, issued by the Board of Examiners for the Survey Branch of the Department of Crown Lands and Survey of Victoria, or a certificate of competency or diploma issued by one of the Federated Surveyors Boards of Australia and New Zealand.
3. He must also show that he has served for not less than three months under some authorized mining surveyor in the conduct of surveys in mines, and for three months under some experienced mining manager in actual mining operations.
4. A candidate whose application has been approved as having complied with the foregoing will be examined, and will be required to pass in each of the four following subjects:—
 - (a) Mining Surveying.—Connexion and reduction of bearings to datum of surface survey; survey of vertical and inclined shafts, drives, and workings; survey of mineral veins and lodes, leads, and drifts.
 - (b) Practical Mining.—Construction of shafts, chambers, and tunnels in rock and drift; timbering, drainage, and ventilation of mines; general principles of the strength of timber in framings; constructions in rough carpentry; construction and management of pumping, winding, and other mining machinery.
 - (c) Hydraulic Engineering.—Measurement and estimation of water in natural and artificial channels; estimation of sources of water supply: dimensions and discharge of pipes and channels; construction of reservoir embankments, weirs, and aqueducts.
 - (d) Geology.—Lithological structure of the principal rock formations as they occur in Victoria; modes of occurrence of gold and other valuable minerals.

6. Examinations are held half-yearly in April and October.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

REGULATION OF THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

No. 47.

THE Victorian Railways Commissioners in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf by the Railways Acts, do hereby make the following Regulation in regard to the examination, qualifications, and selection of candidates for employment as Junior Clerks and as Apprentices in the Victorian Railways Service, and do hereby repeal so much of all previous regulations as conflicts therewith:—

1. In every case in which a vacancy exists in connexion with any position in the Railway Service which the Commissioners desire to fill by the appointment of a Junior Clerk or of an Apprentice, and a public notice is issued to that effect, every person desiring to become a candidate for employment in any of the positions referred to therein shall prepare, in his own handwriting, an application in the form prescribed, stating that he is an applicant for the position of Junior Clerk, or of Apprentice (as the case may be).

2. Every candidate shall confine himself to one application for employment either as a Junior Clerk or as an Apprentice to a particular grade, and shall enclose such application in an envelope which must be properly addressed, duly stamped, and posted, so that it will reach the Secretary for Railways, Spencer-street, Melbourne, not later than the time fixed by the Commissioners for opening and dealing with such applications.

3. The age of every candidate shall be not less than fourteen (14) and not more than eighteen (18) years, and shall be reckoned to the date fixed by the Commissioners for the opening of applications, with the exception that every youth in the temporary employment of the Commissioners, who will not be twenty years of age at the date of the opening of such applications, shall be eligible to become a candidate for the position of Junior Clerk or Apprentice, provided that he has had continuous employment in the service of the Commissioners at least from the date on which he attained his eighteenth birthday. The appointment, however, to the position of Apprentice of any candidate who has had supernumerary service in the Department, shall be subject to the following conditions, viz.:—

(a) That his service as a supernumerary employé of the Commissioners shall not be taken into consideration in determining the period of his apprenticeship.

(b) That the wage per day payable to him from year to year, during his term of apprenticeship, shall be at the respective rates of pay prescribed in clause No. 33 of this regulation, and subject to the provisions of clause No. 34, irrespective of the wage he may have been in receipt of as a supernumerary employé prior to his appointment as an Apprentice; and.

(c) That he shall enrol himself as a student at the Working Men's College, and attend the prescribed classes of instruction at such College, but shall not be eligible to compete for any prizes or scholarships provided by the Commissioners for competition by Apprentices.

4. Every candidate shall forward with his application a certified extract from the register of his birth, which may be obtained from the office of the Government Statist, Melbourne, at a cost of two shillings and sixpence. In the case, however, of a youth born outside of the State of Victoria, a statutory declaration by one of his parents or a near relative as to the date of his birth will be accepted in lieu of such certified extract.

5. Every candidate who has at any time been employed in the Railway or Public Service shall furnish particulars with his application as to the period of such employment, and the cause of his leaving such service, but no person who has been dismissed therefrom shall be eligible for employment.

6. The Secretary for Railways, hereinafter referred to as the Secretary, shall, on the day and at the hour named in the public notice, proceed to open the applications, and shall cause the name and address of the writer of each of such applications to be then and there registered in a book provided for that purpose, hereinafter called the "Register," and a consecutive number, commencing with the number one, shall be placed in the Register opposite the name of each candidate.

7. If the number of candidates for the position of Junior Clerk or for the position of Apprentice be not more than twice the number of Junior Clerks or of Apprentices (as the case may be) to be employed, the candidates for employment in such respective capacities shall thereupon be examined by the Railways Medical Officer, and such of them as are certified as free from any physical infirmity, and as up to the standard prescribed in respect of vision, colour-sense, and hearing, shall then be examined by Educational Examiners duly appointed for that purpose.

8. If the number of candidates for the position of Junior Clerk or for the position of Apprentice exceed the number of Junior Clerks or of Apprentices (as the case may be) to be employed, the number of candidates for such respective positions shall be reduced by a Board of Selectors (which shall be appointed within seven days prior to the date fixed for the selection) to a number equivalent to twice the number of Junior Clerks or Apprentices (as the case may be) to be employed.

9. The Members of the Board of Selectors shall not be informed of, nor acquaint themselves with, the names of the applicants, or any of them, and any person who either directly or indirectly attempts to influence any Member of the Board of Selectors in favor of himself, or in favor of or against any other candidate, shall be for ever disqualified for employment in the Railway Service.

10. Every candidate shall be notified in writing by the Secretary, of the place and time at which he shall present himself to the Board of Selectors.

11. Every candidate, immediately before presenting himself to the Board of Selectors, shall be furnished by the Secretary with a card bearing a number, by which number alone he shall be known to the Board of Selectors.

12. A list of the names of the candidates selected by the Board of Selectors shall be compiled, and such list shall be certified to by the

Board of Selectors, and every candidate whose name has been enrolled on such list shall be entitled to present himself for examination by the Railways Medical Officer, and, if certified as free from any physical infirmity, and as up to the standard prescribed in respect of vision, color-sense, and hearing, he shall then be examined by the Educational Examiners duly appointed for that purpose.

13. Every candidate selected by the Board of Selectors shall pass an examination by the Railways Medical Officer as free from physical infirmity, and as up to the standard prescribed in respect of vision, color-sense, and hearing, and for such examination he shall pay a fee of 5s.

14. Every candidate who has been selected by the Board of Selectors, and who has passed the physical, &c., examination, shall present himself for an examination by the Educational Examiners appointed in that behalf, at such time and place as may be notified to him by the Secretary.

15. Every candidate for the position of Junior Clerk shall be required, by the Examiners appointed for that purpose, to pass an educational examination equivalent to the examination prescribed for the State School Merit Certificate.

16. Every candidate for the position of Apprentice shall be required by the Educational Examiners to pass an examination equivalent to the examination prescribed for the State School Standard Certificate.

17. Every candidate shall produce to the Educational Examiners satisfactory written testimony that he is of respectable character, and shall furnish the name or names of any person or persons or firm or firms with whom he may have been employed during the preceding two years.

18. The Educational Examiners shall thereupon examine the selected candidates who have passed the physical, &c., examination, at such time and place as may be notified to such candidates respectively.

19. The Educational Examiners shall, immediately after the completion of the examination, forward to the Secretary the examination papers of every candidate so examined, together with a certificate as prescribed hereunder:—

We, the undersigned duly appointed Examiners under the "Railways Acts," do hereby certify that on the 190 . we examined† for the position of _____ for the position of _____ in the _____ Branch, and allotted him _____ marks, and accordingly certify that he is‡ for such employment.

Examiners.

20. After examination by the Educational Examiners, the successful candidates for the position of Junior Clerk or Apprentice (as the case may be) provided that the number of successful candidates for employment in such respective capacities be not in excess of the number required by the Commissioners, shall be employed in order of merit according to the number of marks respectively allotted them by such Examiners, but if the successful candidates for employment in the position of Junior Clerk or Apprentice (as the case may be) be in excess of the number required by the Commissioners in such respective capacities, the successful candidates in such respective capacities shall be called together at a place and time of which due notice

shall be sent them in writing, and shall then and there in the presence of the Secretary draw lots in accordance with the following method to determine the order of precedence in which their names shall be recorded for appointment:—

Two ballot boxes shall be provided, numbered 1 and 2 respectively, in each of which shall be deposited as many numbers in arithmetical progression, commencing with the number one, as shall correspond with the number of successful candidates for the position of Junior Clerk or Apprentice (as the case may be).

Every candidate shall then draw first from No. 1 box, and afterwards from No. 2 box in the numerical order ascertained by the drawing from No. 1 box. For instance, the candidate drawing No. 4 out of No. 1 box, shall be the fourth in order for drawing out of No. 2 box, and the number drawn from No. 2 box shall fix his order of precedence for appointment, and in the event of two or more such candidates being appointed on the same day such drawing shall, all things being equal, determine the relative seniority of each candidate for future promotion, &c.

21. Every successful candidate in excess of the number of Junior Clerks or Apprentices respectively required by the Commissioners shall, in the order so decided, be eligible for appointment to any vacancy in the position of Junior Clerk or of Apprentice (as the case may be) that may occur during the twelve months next ensuing from the date of such determination without further or other examination.

22. Every such Junior Clerk and Apprentice shall be appointed on probation for a period of six months, and at the expiration of that period, his appointment may be confirmed by the Commissioners, provided that his conduct, capacity, and industry in the service of the Commissioners have been satisfactory. No probationer shall have his appointment confirmed until he has effected in one of the prescribed Life Assurance Companies an assurance of his life in accordance with the regulations of the Commissioners.

23. Every Junior Clerk and Apprentice shall be appointed on the distinct understanding that his services shall, without previous notice, be liable to be dispensed with, (a) in the case of a Junior Clerk either during or after the period of probation or, (b) in the case of an Apprentice, either during or after the period of apprenticeship; and in either case without his having any claim whatsoever against the Commissioners, if at any time his services be so dispensed with.

JUNIOR CLERKS.

24. The salary of every Junior Clerk on appointment shall be £40 per annum, and after the expiration of twelve months divisional increments may be awarded in accordance with the provisions of the Regulation in operation for the time being, subject to good conduct, capacity, and industry in the performance of the allotted duties, and the acquisition of such qualifications as may be deemed essential to meet the requirements of the particular Branch in which the Junior Clerks are respectively employed.

25. Any Junior Clerk who, in consequence of his employment, may be obliged to reside away from his home, shall, in addition to his salary, be granted an allowance of ninepence (9d.) per day towards his board and lodging expenses, during such time as his salary continues to be £40 per annum.

26. Any candidate for the position of Junior Clerk may specify the particular Branch in which he desires employment, but in the event of the number of successful applicants for any particular Branch being in excess of the number of Junior Clerks required for such Branch, the Commissioners reserve the right to allot the whole or any number of the successful candidates among the different Branches according to their order of precedence for appointment as determined by the ballot hereinbefore referred to.

APPRENTICES.

27. The rate of pay of every Apprentice appointed under the provisions of this Regulation, shall be as under:—

28. Any Apprentice who, in consequence of his employment, may be obliged to reside away from home shall, in addition to his ordinary rate of pay, be granted during the first four years of apprenticeship an allowance towards his board and lodging expenses in accordance with the following scale:—

29. Every Apprentice so appointed shall immediately enrol himself as a student at the Working Men's College, and shall attend the classes of instruction at such College appertaining to the trade to which he may be apprenticed, or such other classes as the Commissioners may direct, at such hours of the day and night as may be prescribed during the complete course of training, which shall extend over a period of three years.

30. Every Apprentice so appointed shall provide the requisite books, drawing instruments, &c., at his own expense, but the Commissioners shall pay the College fees, as well as the wages of the Apprentice for such portion of the ordinary hours of duty as he may be required to be in attendance at the College.

31. Every Apprentice so appointed shall compete in the annual examinations of the aforesaid College, and shall pass in proper sequence the examination prescribed for each year of such course, and, in addition, shall do satisfactory work and be of good conduct in the service of the Commissioners, otherwise his services may be summarily dispensed with.

32. Subject to good conduct, regular attendance, zeal and industry in the service of the Commissioners, the two Apprentices who each year may be adjudged to have passed the best examination at the College up to the standard prescribed by the Commissioners shall be awarded prizes of £5 and £3 respectively according to their order of merit, with the exception that at the end of the third year the Apprentice adjudged first in order of merit shall be nominated as a student in either the Electrical or Mechanical Engineering course, and the Apprentice adjudged second shall be awarded a prize of £5.

33. The Apprentice who may be adjudged to have passed the best examination in the third year, and who possesses the highest qualifications, shall be afforded facilities to attend for two years the full day course at the Working Men's College in either Electrical or Mechanical Engineering, as may be determined by the Commissioners, and provided that such Apprentice passes the prescribed examination, and gains a diploma of the College in respect thereof, he shall thereafter be employed by the Commissioners as an Engineering Assistant. During such course of two years the College fees shall be paid by the Commissioners, and in lieu of wages the Apprentice shall be paid at the rate of £7 per month.

34. The term of apprenticeship shall be six years, and each year thereof shall be deemed to mean three hundred and thirteen (313) working days, and shall be inclusive of any proclaimed holidays on which the workshops may be closed, and any annual recreation leave of absence, as well as any other leave of absence which may be allowed for any other cause whatsoever, provided that such other leave of absence does not during the six years exceed three months in the aggregate. In the event, however, of such other leave of absence to any Apprentice during the six years exceeding three months in the aggregate, the term of his apprenticeship shall be extended beyond the six years for a period equivalent to the period of leave of absence granted in excess of the three months.

SHIRE OF SOUTH BARWON.

BY-LAW NO. 7.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Health Act 1890*, and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of South Barwon hereby make the following By-law, being By-law No. 7 of the said shire, that is to say:—

1. This By-law may be cited as a By-law for regulating pan-closets and the emptying and cleansing of cesspools and the removal of house refuse in the township of Barwon Heads, within the said shire.

2. By-law No. 2 is hereby repealed so far as it relates to the matters and things provided for in this By-law.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the undermentioned area, the boundaries of which are described as follows, namely:—Commencing on the southern side of the main road from Geelong to Barwon Heads at the north-west angle of allotment 1, parish of Comewarre, county of Grant; thence by the north boundary of that allotment and allotment 9 of the same parish, and running east to the north-east angle of said allotment 9; thence running further east in line with the north boundary of said allotment 9 to high-water mark in the River Barwon; thence south-westerly and south-easterly by the said high-water mark to a point in line with the south boundary of allotment 8 of section B of said parish; thence west by a line to the south-east angle of said allotment 8; and thence further west by the south boundary of that allotment and the south boundaries of allotments 9, 10, and 11 of said section B and allotments 21, 20, 19,

18, 17, 16, 15, 14, and 13 of section A of said parish to the south-west angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence north along the east side of a Government road, known as the Main Barwon Heads-road, forming the west boundary of said allotment 13 and allotments 12, 11, 10, and 9 of said section A, and allotments 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, and said allotment 1 to the point of commencement.

4. The contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of Eleven o'clock p.m. and Five o'clock a.m., nor until they shall have had mixed with them carbolic acid or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

5. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form a pan-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and shall have the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house shall be flagged or paved with non-absorbent material, having a fall or inclination from the riser of the seat towards the back of the building of at least half an inch to the foot. All privies shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation.

6. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every pan-closet belonging thereto, a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

7. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron or of other material, to be approved by the Council, properly riveted and soldered, or constructed so as to be water-tight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet; and such closet-pans shall always be kept in an efficient state of repair.

8. No closet door or trap shall abut or open on any street, lane, or right-of-way.

9. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be provided and kept thereon a box or other such covered receptacle, which receptacle shall be of such dimensions as that the same may with the contents thereof when full be readily and conveniently moveable by the public scavenger for the purpose hereinafter mentioned, and shall cause all dust, ashes, rubbish, or other house refuse produced, collected, or accumulated on such premises to be from time to time placed in such box or receptacle, which box or receptacle shall be kept constantly covered, except at such times as the same may or shall be opened for the deposit therein of dust, ashes, rubbish, or house refuse as aforesaid; and such box or receptacle shall be placed either in the yard of such premises and close to the entrance thereof or otherwise in the adjoining street, lane, or right-of-way contiguous to such premises, in order that the contents of such box or receptacle may be readily and conveniently discharged and removed by the public scavenger or other person or persons authorized or appointed by the Council to collect and remove the same.

10. Every person who fails to comply with or is guilty of any breach of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

SHIRE OF WINCHELSEA.—PAN SERVICE.— LORNE.

BY-LAW NO. 13.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Winchelsea, by virtue of the provisions of the *Health Act 1890*, and every other power enabling them in this behalf, hereby make the following By-law No. 13 of the said shire.

1. All former By-laws, so far as they relate to the matters and things hereinafter provided, are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law may be cited as a By-law for regulating earth-closets and the emptying and cleansing of cesspans in the township and suburbs of Lorne, and fixing a charge for the same.

3. This By-law shall come into force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

4. This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the following area, in the parish of Lorne: Commencing at Bass Straits at a point S. 63 deg. 56 min. E. distant three hundred and fourteen links from the south-east corner of Crown allotment 4, section III., parish of Lorne, county of Polwarth; thence north-westerly by a road to the north-west corner of Crown allotment 6, section XX., township of Lorne, parish of Lorne, county of Polwarth;

thence south-westerly by a road to the north-west corner of Crown allotment 2, section III., parish of Lorne, county of Polwarth; thence by the western boundary of the said allotment II., and by the western boundary of Crown allotment 1, section III., parish of Lorne, county of Polwarth, to the Erskine River; thence north-westerly by the said Erskine River to the north-west corner of Crown allotment 3, section III., parish of Lorne, county of Polwarth; thence southerly by the western boundary and easterly by the southern boundary of the said allotment; thence south-westerly by a line being the western boundary of Crown allotments 38, 39, 40, 41, 36, 37, 42, 44, 46, 47, 48, 49, 50, 51, 52, and 53, township of Lorne, parish of Lorne, county of Polwarth, to the Cherry Tree Creek; thence by the said creek to its junction with Fisher's Creek; and thence by Bass Straits to the commencing point.

5. The ordinary system of pans for night-soil is hereby abolished, and instead thereof every earth-closet shall be furnished with a double-pan service, to be provided by the Council.

6. No person shall construct, or cause to be constructed, any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and shall have the necessary apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house shall be flagged or paved with non-absorbent material, having a fall or inclination from the riser of the seat towards the back of the building of half an inch to the foot. All privies shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation.

7. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any house or premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in a pan placed in such earth-closet to be immediately on deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectively deodorize the contents of such pan.

8. No closet door or trap shall abut or open on any street or lane.

9. Once at least in each week, or so much more frequently as the Council of the said shire may from time to time direct, the pan in use in every such earth-closet shall be closed with a tightly-fitting lid, and removed in the day-time to such place as the Council may have appointed. No one except the person authorized by the Council shall be employed to remove the same.

10. The Council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate for the removal of night-soil, to make a charge on each occupier for such service and for pans supplied, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

11. Every person who fails to comply with, or is guilty of any breach of the provisions of this By-law, shall be liable for every such offence to pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

The foregoing By-law was duly made, ordered, and passed by the Council of the Shire of Winchelsea on the 1st day of June, 1906; and confirmed on this 6th day of July, 1906.

 6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
 7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve, or any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
 8. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein, which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
 9. No person shall engage in any games or sports in the Reserve on Sunday.
 10. No person shall shoot, trap, or otherwise destroy any wildfowl or birds of any description in the Reserve, or discharge any firearms therein.

RACING AND OTHER PURPOSES OF PUBLIC
RECREATION, IN THE PARISH OF ELLIMINYT.

WE, John Calvert, Humphrey Mead Hearn, Everard Browne, John Hancock, and George Harold Hills, the surviving members of the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Racing and other purposes of Public Recreation in the parish of Elliminyt, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw sticks, stones, or other missiles in the Reserve, nor remove therefrom any soil or sand.

5. No person shall bring into the Reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals, or any poultry, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall be permitted to train any horse within the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person, unless authorized by the Committee of Management, shall ride or drive any animal, with or without a vehicle, upon the part of the Reserve used for racing purposes.

9. No races, sports, or fêtes shall be held in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect thereon any dwelling, or booth, or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and such consent shall be produced if required.

11. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots or enclosures therein which may be enclosed or set apart for plantation of young trees or shrubs.

12. No person shall enter the Reserve on any day set apart for races, sports, or fêtes, nor bring therein any horse, carriage, or other vehicle, except on production of a ticket issued by the Committee of Management duly authorizing the admission of such person, horse, carriage, or other vehicle; but no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the date printed thereon, nor shall it authorize the holder thereof to enter any building, erection, enclosure, or cultivated spot within the Reserve, and every such ticket shall be surrendered on demand to the gatekeeper or other persons authorized by the Committee of Management to collect the tickets.

13. Any person being drunk or disorderly or assaulting any other person shall be liable to be removed from the Reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased a ticket of admission thereto.

14. Any person who shall be a defaulter in any engagements he enters into with either the Committee of Management, its officers, or any person or individual in the Reserve, and who shall fail to make good the sum in which he is in default immediately upon demand by the Committee of Management, officer, or person to whom

he is indebted, shall be liable to be removed from the Reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased a ticket of admission thereto.

15. Any person who has been "warned off" by any Racing Club or Association shall be liable to be removed from the Reserve.

For the admission to the Reserve of every additional horse attached to carriage, cart, or other vehicle, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding	0	0	6

17. The net proceeds of all races, sports, or fêtes, other than those given for the benefit of a public charitable institution, shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve.

18. No person shall carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker except in and upon such portions of the Reserve as may be set apart for that purpose, and then only when he shall have complied with the following conditions:—

(a) That he be registered as a bookmaker by the Committee of Management of the Reserve or the Committee or Stewards of the Colac Turf Club on payment of a fee not exceeding £1 for each race meeting held under the auspices of the Colac Turf Club in the Reserve.

(b) That during the time he shall be in or upon the Reserve carrying on the business, trade, or calling of a bookmaker he shall wear a ticket, to be supplied by the Committee of Management of the Reserve or the Committee of Stewards of the Colac Turf Club, which shall be visible to the public, and shall have thereon his name.

19. No person shall use the buildings, yards, or enclosures in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown Lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION,
AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR
CRICKET AND OTHER PURPOSES OF PUBLIC
RECREATION AT COLAC.

W^E. Andrew Strachan Murray, Joseph Gillis Wynne, John Samuel Marks, Everard Browne, and Robert Stuart Murray, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Cricket and other purposes of public recreation at Colac, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulation to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, shows, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding 2s. may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve, and a sum not exceeding 1s. may be charged and taken for the admission of every child over the age of twelve years.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve.

5. No person shall bring into the Reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

9. No person shall have the right to use any portion of the ground on which improvements have been made without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

10. No extension of improvements shall be made without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown Lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some Justice

of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

Printed forms of tender, showing estimates of requirements and conditions of contract, may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge of police at any of the above-mentioned places, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per ton of 40 cubic feet for firewood, including delivery at the offices and all charges. Prices should only be quoted for requirements where estimates are shown above.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either one or more of the above-mentioned places, and tenders for such places may be accepted or rejected separately; but if all lengths of firewood be included in one tender it may be accepted for one length only, if advisable.

Where the kind or kinds of wood is not mentioned in the tender form, tenderers must specify the kind or kinds of firewood they offer to supply.

Telegrams, or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement, will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for £10, with two approved sureties for the due performance of the contract, within ten days after the acceptance is notified.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Firewood at ..." as the case may be, and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by Gazette notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of firewood which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.
2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must be split out of large timber, and must be perfectly sound, dry, and of the kind or kinds specified in the tender: neither burnt wood, heartwood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. The billets must be not less than 4 inches nor more than 6 inches in diameter. The long wood to be not less than 9 inches nor more than 18 inches in diameter. Delivery to be made on the written order of the chief officer of the Department requiring the supply. The ton of firewood consists of 40 cubic feet. If the firewood is obtained from a State forest timber reserve, or ordinary Crown lands, persons cutting and removing same must be provided with proper Crown licences for the particular areas concerned.
3. Orders will be issued half-yearly (except in cases where the storage is small, when they will be issued quarterly); but the contractor must have 24 hours' notice before purchases are made at his risk.
4. The contractor will be bound to place it in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. The stacks are to be 2 feet wide (or 4 feet 6 inches for long wood) by 5 feet high, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets (or lengths) are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. In the event of any inconvenience being felt, either through delay in delivery or of stacking the wood, the Department concerned will purchase the same or re-stack that delivered, at the contractor's risk, from whose account any expense incurred thereby will be deducted.
5. The officer receiving the supply shall have full power to reject any wood which he may consider not in accordance with the contract, notice of which will be given to the contractor in writing, stating the reason. The contractor may, however, claim a survey; but in that case he must, within 48 hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the wood.
6. The board of survey will be composed of persons appointed by the Honorable the Treasurer, and the decision of the board of survey is to be considered as final.
7. If the board of survey shall decide that the supply is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.
8. Accounts for firewood to be rendered to the Department receiving the supply immediately upon completion of the order, which must be attached to the accounts. Payment will be made at the receipt and pay office of the district, or at the Treasury, Melbourne, as the contractor may require.
9. In the event of any irregularity on the part of the contractor being repeated, it will be competent for the Government, in case such irregularity should be established to the satisfaction of the Tender Board, to cancel the contract forthwith.
10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.
11. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract.
12. No subletting will be allowed; all work must be carried out by the contractor, and the hours of employment of any person engaged in cutting or supplying the firewood tendered for in this schedule are not to exceed 48 per week, and every such person shall be paid at a minimum wage of not less than 6s. a day; and a copy of these conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, on the premises of the contractor. Any infringement of these conditions, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from any accounts which are or may be due to the contractor, and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.

TOWN OF PORT MELBOURNE.

BY-LAW No. 86.

A By-law of the Town of Port Melbourne made under section 107 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, for the purpose of regulating traffic with regard to motor cars, motor cycles, and the like.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Port Melbourne order as follows:—

1. Throughout this By-law the expression "machine" shall mean any carriage, car, or other vehicle driven or impelled by steam, gas, electricity, oil, vapour, or other mechanical power.

2. No person shall drive a machine along or across any street or other public thoroughfare furiously or negligently, or at such a rate of speed so as to endanger the safety of or injure any person, vehicle, or property in the street or thoroughfare along or across which such machine is being driven.

3. No person driving a machine shall proceed at a greater rate of speed than 12 miles an hour upon or along any street or thoroughfare, nor shall proceed at a greater speed than 6 miles an hour upon, over, or along any crossing.

4. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable, on conviction thereof, to a penalty not exceeding £10.

BOROUGH OF GEELONG WEST.—REGULATIONS FOR SECURING CLEANLINESS IN MEAT STORES. MADE UNDER SECTION 44 OF THE MEAT SUPERVISION ACT 1900.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Meat Supervision Act 1900*, and under all other powers it enabling the Council of the Borough of Geelong West, with the approval of the Board of Public Health, doth hereby make the following Regulations with respect to maintaining the cleanliness of places used for the preserving, freezing, chilling, or storing of meat, and the premises appurtenant thereto, and of the appliances used thereat, and for securing the wholesomeness of meat preserved, frozen, chilled, or stored therein, or intended so to be:—

1. No person shall put or keep, or cause or allow to be put or kept in any room, chamber, compartment, or place hereafter to be constructed, any meat for the purpose of freezing, preserving, chilling, or storing the same unless the benches, shelves, cupboards, and lockers therein are movable.

2. No person shall put or keep, or cause or allow to be put or kept in any room, chamber, compartment, or place for the purpose of freezing, preserving, chilling, or storing—

- (a) any meat other than such as is fresh and free from putrefaction, decomposition, fly-blow, phosphorescence, clamminess, sliminess, and other unwholesome conditions; or
- (b) any unclean, unwashed, or foul-smelling substance, offal, or viscera; or
- (c) any fish, oysters, or other molluscs, any crayfish or other crustaceans, any game, cheese, butter, vegetable, or other perishable product in such a condition as to be likely to contaminate, taint, or prejudicially affect the meat.

3. No person shall use or cause or allow to be used any room, chamber, compartment, or place in which the condition known as "phosphorescence" exists for storing fresh meat unless—

- (a) immediately upon such condition becoming known, and at least once every month during the continuance of such condition, every part of the internal surfaces of the walls, floor, ceiling, and doors, and every part (including the legs, supports, back, and undersides) of all benches, shelves, cupboards, lockers, boxes, hanging bars, hooks, and other fittings and all appliances are—

- (1) scrubbed with water and soft soap, the water being as hot as can be practically used, and the soap being sufficient in quantity to produce with the water a profuse lather, the scrubbing being performed in such a manner as to thoroughly cleanse such surfaces, fittings, and appliances, and to completely remove all dirt, stains, greasiness, and other deposit;

- (2) then dried with clean cloths; and

- (3) immediately afterwards copiously washed; swabbed, or sluiced with a solution consisting of one gallon of clean cold water, three ounces of chlorinated lime of good strength, and either three ounces of vinegar or one ounce of spirit of salt, the solution being applied so as to reach every part, including all corners, crevices, and cracks of such surfaces, fittings, and appliances.

- (b) once a week at least the floors, benches, shelves, and such other parts as shall have been in contact with any meat or other food are cleansed and disinfected, as provided for under clause A, sub-clauses (1), (2), and (3).

4. No person shall use, or cause or allow to be used for the storage of fresh meat for retail or shop purposes, any room, chamber, compartment, or place—

- (a) unless the floors, benches, shelves, and such other parts as shall have been in contact with any meat or other food are cleansed at least once in every week by scrubbing with water and soft soap, the water being as hot as can be practically used, and the soap being sufficient in quantity to produce with the water a profuse lather, the scrubbing being performed in such a manner as to thoroughly cleanse such surfaces, fittings, and appliances, and to completely remove all dirt, stains, greasiness, and other deposit;

- (b) that is not kept continuously clean and free from foul smell or other unwholesome condition.

5. If any person fails to comply with any of the provisions of these Regulations or prevents compliance with the same on the part of any other person, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these Regulations, and shall be liable for every such offence, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and to a further penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every day during which, after a conviction, the offence is further continued.
