Pure Food Act 1905.—Health Acts.
REGULATIONS EXEMPTING PACKAGES OF ARTICLES OF FOOD FROM CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF THE PURE FOOD ACT 1905 RELATING TO LABELLING.

THE Board of Public Health of the State of Victoria, by virtue of the powers conferred by the Health Acts and of every other power enabling the said Board in this behalf, doth, on the recommendation of the Food Standards Committee, hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

- (1) Packages of articles of food named or indicated hereunder shall be exempt from all the provisions of section 15 of the *Pure Food Act 1905*, relating to labelling:—

Articles of food (including biscuits, cakes, confectionery, and pastry, but not including mixed articles of food within the meaning of section 46 of the *Health Act 1890*) weighed, counted, or measured, and packed in the presence of the purchaser.

Articles of food delivered in receptacles provided by the purchaser.

Bread.
 Meat (not including tinned meat or other hermetically sealed packages of meat).
 Fresh fruit.
 Eggs.

- (2) Packages of the articles of food named or indicated hereunder shall be exempt from such of the provisions of section 15 of the *Pure Food Act 1905* as require information, by an accompanying or attached label, tag, or statement, as to the weight or number or measure or volume of the contents:—

Anchovies in oil.
 Calves' feet jelly in tins or bottles.
 Capers in bottles.
 Chutney in bottles.
 Confectionery-chocolate in fancy packages or in tablets, not sold by weight.
 Curry powder in bottles.
 Dried culinary herbs.

 Jam, marmalade, jelly, honey, when packed in fancy bottles or fancy jars or other receptacles of intrinsic value.

PORTS IN VICTORIA. — AMENDMENTS OF CLAUSES 26 AND 27 OF THE RULES AND REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Marine Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1165) it is amongst other things provided that the Governor in Council, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, may from time to time frame rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of ports in Victoria, and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public wharfs, and that any such rules and regulations may from time to time be in like manner altered, amended, or repealed and others substituted in their stead: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby repeal clauses 26 and 27 of the Rules and Regulations for the Ports in Victoria, and substitute others as follows in their stead, viz. :—

- 26. For the preservation of the submarine electric cables laid between Swan Island and the southern shore of Port Phillip, no vessel shall anchor within two (2) cables' length on either side of an imaginary line from Swan Beacon to Pope's Eye Fort, and thence to the Quarantine West Boundary Flagstaff.
- 27. For the preservation of the submarine electric cable laid between the South Channel Fort and the southern shore of Port Phillip crossing the South Channel about 1½ cables N.W. of No. 5 buoy and 1½ cables S.E. of No. 2 buoy, no vessel shall anchor within four cables' length on either side of an imaginary line from the South Channel Fort to No. 2 buoy, and thence to the southern shore midway between Point Franklin and Point Arthur.

PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH.—LAND AT MERINO.—POWER TO DISPOSE.

Tenders for supply of forage to more than five separate stations in any one district must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit of 10s. for each and every station over and above five, except in the case of the Melbourne District, the preliminary deposit for which shall be £25 with each tender, irrespective of the number of stations tendered for, in bank notes, or a bank draft payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the necessary bond within a reasonable time after the acceptance is notified.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or oat, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oat straw of the best quality. As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

2. The quantities stated in the schedule are only approximate, and the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned. Should new telegraph stations be formed or additional horses be required at any station, the contractor will be required to supply the extra forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, and also forage for any extra horses that may be at any time stabled at the depot for police purposes, at the same rates. The contract for the supply of forage to the Military Barracks may be terminated by three months' notice being given by the Secretary to the Tender Board to the contractor of such determination.

4. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

5. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

6. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.

7. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue to either party by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, but he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 4.

8. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.

9. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

10. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

11. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.

JOINT BY-LAW NO. 1.

A Joint By-law of the City of Ballaarat, the Town of Ballaarat East, and the Borough of Sebastopol, made under the provisions of the Tramways Act and the Second Schedule, Clause 14, and in conformity with Part VII. of the *Local Government Act 1903*.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903* and the *Tramways Act 1890* and Second Schedule thereto, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Ballaarat, and the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Ballaarat East, and the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Sebastopol jointly order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall extend and apply to all tramcars and other vehicles of the Electric Supply Company of Victoria Limited, or used in connexion with the tramways, and to all tracks, poles, wires, fixtures, or other appurtenances used in operating the tramways, and all plant, buildings, waiting-rooms, and generally, and to all premises of the said company within the municipalities of the City of Ballaarat, the Town of Ballaarat East, and the Borough of Sebastopol.

2. No person shall smoke in or upon any tramcar or platform thereof, except on such portions as are from time to time set apart for that purpose.

3. No passenger or other person, while riding in or upon any car, shall solicit alms, play or perform upon any musical instrument, distribute handbills or advertisements, or, without having first obtained the permission of the company in writing, offer for sale any article.

4. No person who in the opinion of the conductor or officer is in a state of intoxication shall be allowed to enter or mount upon any car, and if found in or upon any car shall at the request of the conductor leave the car, and if he does not at once leave the car, he may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor, and in such case he shall also be liable to the penalty provided by this By-law.

5. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any car, or interfere with the comfort of any passenger. Any person who, in the opinion of the conductor, shall have committed a breach of this By-law, shall leave the car on the request of the conductor to do so, and if he does not leave the car at once, he may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor, and he shall also be liable to the penalty fixed by this By-law.

6. No person shall in any way obstruct, impede, interfere with, threaten, intimidate, or hinder any officer or servant of the company in the execution of his duty.

7. No person shall in any way soil or damage any motor or car, or remove or interfere with any fastenings on any motor or car, or remove, affix, or deface any number, plate, printed notice, or advertisement, or writing on any part of, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise damage any motor or car. Any person acting in contravention shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by this By-law, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

8. No person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor, soil or injure the dress or clothing of any passenger, or who for any other reason

might be offensive to passengers, shall be entitled to enter or remain in or upon any car, nor shall he enter any car after being requested not to do so by the conductor, and any such person may be prevented from entering any car, and if found on any such car, he shall, on the request of the conductor, leave the car upon the fare (if previously paid) being returned, and if he does not at once leave the car, he may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor, and in such case he shall also be liable to the penalty provided by this By-law.

9. No person shall, without lawful excuse (the proof whereof shall lie on him), do any of the following things, namely:—Persist in riding, driving, or leading any horse, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any sheep, cattle, pigs, or other stock, on the tramway line in front of or in such a way as to interfere with or hinder or impede any motor or car after the bell on such motor or car shall have been rung as a warning that the motor or car is coming behind or overtaking such horse, cart, carriage, or vehicle, sheep, cattle, pigs, or other stock.

10. If any person without lawful excuse (the proof whereof shall lie on him) wilfully does any of the following things, namely:—Interferes with, removes, or alters any part of the tramway, or of the works connected therewith; places or throws any stones, dirt, wood, refuse or other material on any part of the tramway; does or causes to be done anything in such manner as to obstruct any carriage using the tramway, or to endanger the lives of persons therein or thereon; or knowingly aids or assists in the doing of any such thing, he shall for every such offence be liable (in addition to any proceedings by way of presentment, indictment, or otherwise to which he may be subject) to the penalty not exceeding Five pounds provided by this By-law.

11. Each passenger having entered a car shall pay to the conductor the fare legally due for the journey, and shall upon demand exhibit and deliver up his ticket, or pay another fare.

12. If any person travelling or having travelled in any carriage on the tramway of the said company avoids or attempts to avoid payment of his fare, or if any person having paid his fare for a certain distance knowingly and wilfully proceeds in any such carriage beyond such distance, and does not pay the additional fare for the additional distance or attempts to avoid payment thereof, or if any person knowingly and wilfully refuses or neglects on arriving at the point to which he has paid his fare to quit such carriage, every such person shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings.

13. It shall be lawful for any officer or servant of the company and all persons called by him to his assistance to seize and detain any person discovered either in or after committing or attempting to commit any such offences as in the next preceding clause is mentioned, and whose name or residence is unknown to such officer or servant, until such person can be conveniently taken before a justice, or until he be otherwise discharged by due course of law.

14. Each passenger on paying his fare upon lines where the cash fare system is in operation will be furnished with a ticket which he will show on demand to the conductor or inspector at any time during the journey for which such ticket was issued.

15. Personal or other luggage (including the tools of workmen) shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the platform, and not in the interior or on the roof of any car.

16. Every passenger who shall take upon a car any article or articles which shall exceed altogether the weight of twenty-eight (28) pounds, or whose size exceeds eighteen (18) inches square, shall pay to the conductor on demand the sum of Threepence (3d.) for every such article, or for each package of luggage so in excess.

17. Where luggage, light goods, or parcels are sent in charge of the conductor, the like fare shall be paid as for a passenger for each article or package so sent.

18. No person, not being a servant of the company, shall enter or mount any motor, or stand on the platforms of any car, or travel on the steps of any car, and any person so doing shall in addition to the penalty provided for breach of this By-law be liable to an action for damages for any accident which may result therefrom.

19. No person shall enter or attempt to enter, or leave or attempt to leave any car while such car is in motion.

20. No person except a passenger or intending passenger shall enter or mount any car, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of the car or motor. Any person so holding or hanging on by or to any part of the car or motor shall in addition to the penalty hereby provided be liable for all or any damage which he may suffer as the result of any accident, or which may be caused to other passengers by his act or conduct.

21. When any tramcar contains the full number of passengers which it is computed to carry, no additional person shall enter or remain in or upon any such tramcar when warned by the conductor not to do so, and any person having so entered who shall refuse to leave at the request of the conductor may be removed by the conductor, and shall also be liable to the penalty provided for a breach of this By-law, and shall also be liable to an action for damages for any accident which may result therefrom.

22. No person shall travel in or on any car with loaded firearms, paints, oils, glass, live stock, poultry, or anything which the conductor may consider dangerous or offensive, or anything which shall project beyond the car, or which may, in the opinion of the conductor, be liable to damage the car or the person or property of any person.

23. No person shall be entitled to have any dog or other animal in or on any car.

24. Any servant of the company guilty of incivility or discourtesy to any person or persons using the tramcars of the company, or failing to collect the fares or tickets of all passengers, or who shall be in a state of intoxication while on duty, shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by this By-law.

25. The conductor of every tramcar shall enforce this By-law and Regulations to the best of his ability, and if any such conductor fails to enforce the same as aforesaid he shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this By-law.

26. Any person offending against, or committing a breach or any offence under this By-law, shall, unless otherwise provided for in this By-law, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence.

27. In the interpretation of this By-law, the following terms shall have the meanings set against them respectively, unless the context otherwise requires:—

“Company,” the Electric Supply Company of Victoria Limited.

“Conductor,” any conductor, driver, inspector, or other duly authorized employé, officer, or servant of the company.

“Tramcar,” any vehicle used by the company upon or in connexion or conjunction with the tramways of the company.

“Tramway,” the tramway lines of the company or any portion thereof.
