2. A candidate must produce a certificate of competency, issued by the Board of Examiners for the Survey Branch of the Department of Crown Lands and Survey of Victoria, or a certificate of competency or diploma issued by one of the Federated Surveyors Boards of Australia and New Zealand.

3. He must also show that he has served for not less than three months under some authorized mining surveyor in the conduct of surveys in mines, and for three months under some experienced mining manager in actual mining operations.

4. A candidate whose application has been approved as having complied with the foregoing will be examined, and will be required to pass in each of the four following subjects:—

(a) Mining Surveying.—Connexion and reduction of bearings to datum of surface survey; survey of vertical and inclined shafts, drives, and workings; survey of mineral veins and lodes, leads, and drifts.

(b) Practical Mining.—Construction of shafts, chambers, and tunnels in rock and drift; timbering, drainage, and ventilation of mines; general principles of the strength of timber in framings; constructions in rough carpentry; construction and management of pumping, winding and other mining machinery.

(d) Geology.—Lithological structure of the principal rock formations as they occur in Victoria; modes of occurrence of gold and other valuable minerals.

5. The degree of Master of Engineering of an Australian University may, if the Board think fit, be accepted in lieu of the examination required by sub-clauses (c) and (d) of the foregoing Regulation 4.

6. Examinations are held half-yearly in April and October.

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS,
VICTORIA.

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.

(b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys.

Form of Certificate for presentation to the Board of Examiners.

I, A.B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as _____, in the practice of land surveying, for the period of _____, viz., from _____ to _____ (or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of four years, three of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

[Here describe the survey work on which C.D. was engaged.]

NOTE.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, or the United States of America, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Rules.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road, and of an area having buildings thereon in illustration of a town survey. The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

9. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

Mathematics.

(a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

(b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practices of Surveying.

(c) Details of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, subdivisional, and other surveys, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting from field notes and from co-ordinates, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Acts, writing descriptions of boundaries.

(Candidates may be required to make actual surveys.)

Engineering Surveys.

(d) Levelling; grading; measurement of earthworks. (Including practical tests.)

Use of instruments.

(e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, telemeter, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, theodolite, tachometer, and steel band.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

Determination of time, latitude, and azimuth, reduction of star places; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle. (With practical tests.)

Drawing.

(g) General plan-drawing, compilation of plans, drawing of sections and contours, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellaneous.

(h) Physics and geology (elementary); names and description of Australasian timbers of economic value (*vide voce*).

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having matriculated, or of having passed the senior examination at a University, or the Senior Civil Service examination of New Zealand, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 66 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates producing evidence of having taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University may be further exempted from working out papers in physics and geology.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate passing the examination held under these Rules shall be entitled to a certificate of competency.

13. Any surveyor qualified in Victoria prior to 1st January, 1896, or any surveyor licensed prior to 1st January, 1896, in any other Australasian State or Colony who, by reason of his absence from that State or Colony, is prevented from obtaining the certificate of competency from the Board of that State or Colony, may make application to this Board, and on his satisfying the Board that he is competent, either without examination or on such examination as the Board may require, shall be entitled to a certificate of competency; such application shall be accompanied by the fee (£2 2s.).

LICENCES TO SURVEY.

14. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as a surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 1s.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act 1895*, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by section 53 of the *Water Act* 1905 (Act No. 2016), the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, on the recommendation of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, doth by this present Order exercise the powers and authorities following:—

1st. Under the power conferred to excise any portion of an irrigation and water supply district, it is hereby ordered that there shall be excised from the Tragowel Plains Irrigation and Water Supply District the following portion of the same, which portion as on and from the first day of July last past shall be deemed to be excised accordingly, that is to say:—

That portion of the district comprised by such parts of allotments 66 and 67, parish of Tragowel, as lie to the west of Bannagher Creek, which said portion is as shown coloured red on a plan approved by the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, and deposited in the Office of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, Melbourne.

2nd. Under the power conferred to add any portion excised from an irrigation and water supply district to any other district, it is hereby ordered that the following portion excised from the Twelve Mile Irrigation and Water Supply District be added to the Tragowel Plains Irrigation and Water Supply District (and as on and from the first day of July last past such portion shall be deemed to be so added), that is to say:—

That portion commencing at a point on the existing west boundary of the Tragowel Plains District bearing south from the south-east angle of allotment 92B, parish of Tragowel; thence by a line to that angle; thence northerly by the east boundaries of allotments 92B, 92, and 67B, and a line connecting those boundaries to the existing west boundary of the said district; thence southerly by that boundary to the point of commencement.

Education Act 1890.

SECTIONS RESCINDED, AND ADDITIONS MADE
TO REGULATION No. XI.

WHEREAS by section 23 of the *Education Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1086) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind all the Sections and portions of Sections of Regulation No. XI. of the Regulations made under the *Education Act 1890*, which deal with or relate to the examinations in Drawing, and doth make the following additions to the said Regulation No. XI. in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

REGULATION XI.—EXAMINATION AND CLASSIFICATION OF
TEACHERS.

Section 1 (b) (iii.).—Drawing, Parts I., II., and III.—
(To be added after the words "Geometry, Part II.>").

Section 2.—First Class Certificate.—Drawing.—

(a) Model drawing and brush drawing, as prescribed under Drawing, Part III., section 11 below.

(b) Practice: To give a satisfactory lesson in model drawing from a group of not more than three common objects or geometric models, or a lesson in drawing simple plant forms, such as the ivy or the eucalyptus, from nature.

N.B.—(i.) Candidates who have not passed in Drawing, Parts I. and II., section 11 below, must pass in that part of the subject also. (ii.) Candidates who, within three years of their obtaining a Second Class Certificate, present themselves for examination for a First Class Certificate, will be exempted from examination in Drawing under (a) above. (See also sections 25 and 26 below.)

Section 11.—Junior Teachers.

Third Class.—Drawing, Part I.—

Freehand Drawing from the Flat.—The candidates should show a knowledge of such principles as radiation, continuity of line, &c. The examples will be of slightly greater difficulty than those recommended for Class VI. in the "Course of Free Instruction."

Practice.—To give a satisfactory lesson in freehand drawing from any example suitable for Class VI. in the "Course of Free Instruction." An intelligent use of the blackboard will be essential.

Second Class.—Drawing, Part II.—

Practical Plane and Solid Geometry.—As for Classes III., IV., V., and VI.; together with more advanced problems in orthographic projection. Good instrumental work is considered essential.

Practice.—To give a class lesson on one of the diagrams used in Class III. in the "Course of Free Instruction," explaining the use of the ruler, compasses, and set-square.

First Class.—Drawing, Part III.—

Linear model drawing as for Classes V. and VI. in the "Course of Free Instruction," the exercise to consist of not more than three objects in combination. Candidates must show a knowledge of the effect of perspective in modifying the appearance of objects.

Brushwork.—Drawing simple exercises with the brush, as for Classes V. and VI. in the "Course of Free Instruction." One colour only will be required.

Practice.—To give a satisfactory lesson in model drawing from a single object, explaining and illustrating such terms as "vanishing," "eye-level."

Section 13 (b).—Class I. Drawing, Part III.—(To be added after the words "Theory and Practice of Teaching, Part II.>").

DRAWING.

Section 25.—Candidates for a First Class or Second Class Certificate, and junior teachers, candidates for promotion, who, subsequent to the 1st January, 1905, pass the Technical Schools' examination in subjects equivalent to those prescribed under Drawing in section 2 and section 11 above, will be exempted from examination in such subject or subjects.

Section 26.—The following table shows the subjects included in the examinations for Technical Schools, which will be recognised as equivalent to those prescribed in sections 2 and 11 above:—

Section 28.—In addition to passing in the subjects named in the preceding section, candidates must pass in the "practice" and "teaching" of drawing, viz.:—

- (a) Drawing from memory or otherwise, examples included under any of the heads named in I. or II. respectively in the preceding section.
- (b) Teaching a class satisfactorily.

Section 29.—A candidate for a Certificate of Competency to Teach Drawing must also have passed the examination for the Licence to Teach Drawing, and must present a class which has been taught by the candidate for twelve months, and which can pass a satisfactory examination.

Printed forms of tender, showing estimates of requirements and conditions of contract, may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge of police at any of the above-mentioned places, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per ton of 40 cubic feet for firewood, including delivery at the offices and all charges. Prices should only be quoted for requirements where estimates are shown above.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either one or more of the above-mentioned places, and tenders for such places may be accepted or rejected separately; but if all lengths of firewood be included in one tender it may be accepted for one length only, if advisable.

Where the kind or kinds of wood is not mentioned in the tender form, tenderers must specify the kind or kinds of firewood they offer to supply.

Telegrams, or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement, will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for £10, with two approved sureties for the due performance of the contract, within ten days after the acceptance is notified.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Firewood at _____," as the case may be, and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of firewood which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must be split out of large timber, and must be perfectly sound, dry, and of the kind or kinds specified in the tender; neither burnt wood, heartwood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. The billets must be not less than 4 inches nor more than 6 inches in diameter. The long wood to be not less than 9 inches nor more than 18 inches in diameter. Delivery to be made on the written order of the chief officer of the Department requiring the supply. The ton of firewood consists of 40 cubic feet. If the firewood is obtained from a State forest timber reserve, or ordinary Crown lands, persons cutting and removing same must be provided with proper Crown licences for the particular areas concerned.

3. Orders will be issued half-yearly (except in cases where the storage is small, when they will be issued quarterly); but the contractor must have 24 hours' notice before purchases are made at his risk.

4. The contractor will be bound to place it in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. The stacks are to be 2 feet wide (or 4 feet 6 inches for long wood) by 5 feet high, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets (or lengths) are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. In the event of any inconvenience being felt, either through delay in delivery or of stacking the wood, the Department concerned will purchase the same or re-stack that delivered, at the contractor's risk, from whose account any expense incurred thereby will be deducted.

5. The officer receiving the supply shall have full power to reject any wood which he may consider not in accordance with the contract, notice of which will be given to the contractor in writing, stating the reason. The contractor may, however, claim a survey; but in that case he must, within 48 hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the wood.

6. The board of survey will be composed of persons appointed by the Honorable the Treasurer, and the decision of the board of survey is to be considered as final.

7. If the board of survey shall decide that the supply is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.

8. Accounts for firewood to be rendered to the Department receiving the supply immediately upon completion of the order, which must be attached to the accounts. Payment will be made at the receipt and pay office of the district, or at the Treasury, Melbourne, as the contractor may require.

9. In the event of any irregularity on the part of the contractor being repeated, it will be competent for the Government, in case such irregularity should be established to the satisfaction of the Tender Board, to cancel the contract forthwith.

10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

11. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract.

12. No subletting will be allowed; all work must be carried out by the contractor, and the hours of employment of any person engaged in cutting or supplying the firewood tendered for in this schedule are not to exceed 48 per week, and every such person shall be paid at a minimum wage of not less than 6s. a day; and a copy of these conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, on the premises of the contractor. Any infringement of these conditions, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from any accounts which are or may be due to the contractor, and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.

7. The interest in this licence shall not be transferred without the consent of the Minister, and the payment of a fee of Ten shillings.
