## Health Act 1890.

## SHIRE OF SHEPPARTON.

## BY-LAW No. 33.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Shepparton, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. All former By-laws, so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law, and including By-law No. 25 of the said shire, are hereby repealed save as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this By-law coming into operation.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shepparton Riding of the Shire of Shepparton.

4. All night-soil, blood, offal, or other refuse or offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and buried as hereinafter provided, in the manure depôt appointed by the Council from time to time for the final reception of the same, and in no other place.

5. No person shall place, deposit, spread, or bury or cause or suffer to be placed or deposited or spread or buried, or assist in placing, depositing, spreading, or burying in any place except the manure depôt appointed, and to be from time to time appointed by the said Council, any night-soil, blood, offal, or other refuse or offensive matter or thing whether by way of manure or otherwise.

6. Any person or persons removing night-soil, blood, offal, or other refuse or offensive matter or thing to the manure depôt appointed and to be appointed by the Council from time to time as aforesaid, shall bury the same in a trench to be dug out or excavated by such person or persons in such place in said manure depôt as shall be appointed by the Inspector of the said Council, which trench shall not be less in measurements than three feet deep by one foot six inches in width by six feet in length, and such person or persons shall cover the night-soil, blood, offal, or other refuse or offensive matter or thing buried in such trench with at least eighteen inches of soil at the same time as such burial takes place. Any surplus earth from such excavation after the burying of such night-soil, blood, offal, or other refuse or offensive matter or thing, and covering the same with eighteen inches of soil, shall be spread evenly and regularly on the surface of such trench.

7. The occupier of any premises in which there is a closet or privy shall cause the space under the seat of each closet or privy on such premises to be prepared and fitted with a middenstead in accordance with the specification hereto annexed, and the drawings therein referred to, and shall permit the same to be used for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.

8. The Council shall cause every closet or privy to be supplied and kept supplied with two pans for the reception of night-soil, and a lid to closely fit the same, and the occupier shall cause one or other of such pans to be kept under the seat aforesaid.

9. The occupier aforesaid or other person having the control or management of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in such closet or privy to be, immediately on the deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

10. The Council shall at least once a week cause the pan in use to be closed with a lid and removed with its contents from the premises, and the other pan to be left in its place.

11. Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy the Council shall cause the same to be cleansed by superheated steam and tar-painted inside or by some equally efficient means.

12. The occupier aforesaid or other person shall not contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises except in accordance with this By-law.

13. The Council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate, to make a charge on each occupier for the pans supplied, and for the removal of night-soil and the other work herein directed, the amount, in default of payment, to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

14. Any person who shall by any act or default be guilty of a breach of this By-law shall, for every such breach, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued. And any person guilty of such a breach as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty notwithstanding that the Council may be empowered by this By-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such Council has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

## SPECIFICATION FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF WATER-CLOSET MIDDENSTEAD.

The work to be executed in strict accordance with the drawings Nos. 1 and 2, deposited in the office of the Council, and signed by the Council's Surveyor, and to the dimensions shown and figured thereon.

The brickwork shall be founded on (3) three inches in depth of sand at the depth shown on the drawings, or to such other depth as may be required to obtain a solid foundation. Walls to be four and one-half inches thick except at the front, where the bricks shall be moulded or cut to the shape of a segment of a circle, having a radius of seven inches, leaving the wall at its thinnest part two and one-half inches thick, as shown. The floor to be formed of brick laid flat, on sand three inches in depth, firmly bedded, and well grouted in cement mortar. The internal surface of the walls and floor shall receive a coat of cement plaster three-eighths inch thick on the walls and on the floor, varying from three-fourths inch at the front to three-eighths inch at the back, so as to give a fall of three-eighths inch from front to back. Bricks to be laid one-fourth inch joints, in mortar composed of one part sound Portland cement of approved brand to three parts sharp clean washed sand. Plaster to be mixed in the proportion of one of cement to one of sand, and to be trowelled to a smooth surface. Four wrought-iron straps one inch by one-eighth inch by one foot six inches shall be built into the brickwork (two on each side), as shown, for the purpose of holding down the seat. All bricks used in the work to be sound, hard burnt, and of good shape. All timber to be pine, sound and free from all defects. The seat to be constructed as shown on drawings and firmly planted in mortar on the top of the brickwork, to which it shall be secured by wrought-iron straps, specified above. The several parts of the seat to be secured together with two-inch wrought-iron screws. The opening to be at least five and one-half inches back from the exterior face of the front wall. A three-inch galvanized iron ventilation pipe shall be fixed to the seat, as shown, to extend upwards through the roof, to be perfectly air-tight at all joints, and at its junction with the seat. The brickwork immediately below the pipe shall be cut away, as shown on the marginal sketch on said drawings. The seat cover shall be formed, fitted, tenoned, and glued together, as shown, and shall be attached to the seat with a pair of two-inch brass butt hinges; when down it shall fit the seat and bear on every part closely so as to exclude the passage of air. The rear of the middenstead shall be closed with a tight-fitting flapdoor constructed similarly to the seat cover, perforated, as shown, with thirteen one-inch diameter holes, spaced as shown, and covered on the inner side with stout perforated zinc. An iron guide bracket, consisting of stout galvanized hoop-iron one and one-half inches by one-twentieth inch, bent to the shape shown, shall be fixed to the flap-door with four three-sixteenths inch bolts.

## PUBLIC HEALTH.

## SHIRE OF RUTHERGLEN.

BY-LAW No. 1/1907.

A By-law of the Shire of Rutherglen, made under the Health Acts, and numbered 1/1907, for the regulation of and prevention of nuisances in or about slaughter-yards.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Acts, the Council of the Shire of Rutherglen, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, hereby orders as follows, that is to say:—

(1) All buildings or yards in which cattle or other stock for slaughtering are kept, and also all pig-styes and pig-yards shall be cleansed daily, and all manure and other filth removed therefrom and placed in such receptacles as the Council shall by order from time to time direct, and all such receptacles shall be emptied at least once a week.

(2) In every slaughter-yard the slaughter-pen and the hanging and dressing shed shall be used exclusively for the purpose proper to each, and all offal, blood, and other refuse shall, as soon as may be after slaughtering, be removed from them and disposed of as hereafter provided.

(3) At the end of each slaughtering day, after the carcasses are hung, and before refuse begins to decay, the slaughter-pen and hanging and dressing shed, together with all drains and blood receptacles connected therewith shall be, where necessary, thoroughly washed down with clean water and left in a sweet and wholesome condition.

(4) All the water used in cleansing carcasses shall be either clean roof water or other water properly cleared and well boiled.

(5) The bone store or yard shall be emptied at such regular and frequent intervals as the Council may from time to time direct.

(6) The boiling-down apparatus and brickwork shall be thoroughly cleansed and emptied and scrubbed at such regular and convenient intervals as the Council may prescribe.

(7) No blood or uncooked offal shall under any circumstances be fed to the pigs. All blood shall as soon as practicable after slaughtering, and at least once daily, be collected and buried.

(8) All materials intended to be passed through digestors shall be kept in a sweet and wholesome condition until so treated.

(9) All stock intended for slaughtering and all pigs kept on slaughtering premises shall be provided with a

sufficient supply of good water free from contamination by drainage of slaughter-yards, piggeries, and residences into the catchment area of such supply.

(10) All yards and buildings on slaughtering premises shall be kept clean, and shall be whitewashed with lime regularly, and at least as frequently as may be prescribed from time to time by the Council.

(11) Any person found guilty of infringing any of the provisions of this By-law shall be subject to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings for every breach of such By-law, or a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

(12) This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Council the 1st day of June, 1907, and confirmed the 6th day of July, 1907.

Printed forms of tender, showing estimates of requirements and conditions of contract, may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge of police at any of the above-mentioned places, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per ton of 40 cubic feet for firewood, including delivery at the offices and all charges. Prices should only be quoted for requirements where estimates are shown above.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either one or more of the above-mentioned places, and tenders for such places may be accepted or rejected separately; but if all lengths of firewood be included in one tender it may be accepted for one length only, if advisable.

Where the kind or kinds of wood is not mentioned in the tender form, tenderers must specify the kind or kinds of firewood they offer to supply.

Telegrams, or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement, will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for £10, with two approved sureties for the due performance of the contract, within ten days after the acceptance is notified.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Firewood at \_\_\_\_\_," as the case may be, and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by Gazette notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of firewood which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must be split out of large timber, and must be perfectly sound, dry, and of the kind or kinds specified in the tender: neither burnt wood, heartwood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. The billets must be not less than 4 inches nor more than 6 inches in diameter. The long wood to be not less than 9 inches nor more than 18 inches in diameter. Delivery to be made in the written order of the chief officer of the Department requiring the supply. The ton of firewood consists of 40 cubic feet. If the firewood is obtained from a State forest timber reserve, or ordinary Crown lands, persons cutting and removing same must be provided with proper Crown licences for the particular areas concerned.

3. Orders will be issued half-yearly (except in cases where the storage is small, when they will be issued quarterly); but the contractor must have 24 hours' notice before purchases are made at his risk.

4. The contractor will be bound to place it in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. The stacks are to be 2 feet wide (or 4 feet 6 inches for long wood) by 5 feet high, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets (or lengths) are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. In the event of any inconvenience being felt, either through delay in delivery or of stacking the wood, the Department concerned will purchase the same or re-stack that delivered, at the contractor's risk, from whose account any expense incurred thereby will be deducted.

5. The officer receiving the supply shall have full power to reject any wood which he may consider not in accordance with the contract, notice of which will be given to the contractor in writing, stating the reason. The contractor may, however, claim a survey; but in that case he must, within 48 hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the wood.

6. The board of survey will be composed of persons appointed by the Honorable the Treasurer, and the decision of the board of survey is to be considered as final.

7. If the board of survey shall decide that the supply is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor: failing which, it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.

8. Accounts for firewood to be rendered to the Department receiving the supply immediately upon completion of the order, which must be attached to the accounts. Payment will be made at the receipt and pay office of the district, or at the Treasury, Melbourne, as the contractor may require.

9. In the event of any irregularity on the part of the contractor being repeated, it will be competent for the Government, in case such irregularity should be established to the satisfaction of the Tender Board, to cancel the contract forthwith.

10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

11. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract.

12. No subletting will be allowed: all work must be carried out by the contractor, and the hours of employment of any person engaged in cutting or supplying the firewood tendered for in this schedule are not to exceed 48 per week, and every such person shall be paid at a minimum wage of not less than 6s. a day: and a copy of these conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, on the premises of the contractor. Any infringement of these conditions, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulet, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from any accounts which are or may be due to the contractor, and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.
