That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than fifty females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said fifty females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the Trustees of the Kiata Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all Rules and Regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. All charges must be paid when orders are given or before the ground or vault is opened.

3. The name, age, late place of residence, and cause of death of deceased must be stated at the time of giving the order.

4. The procession to arrive at the Cemetery punctually at the hour appointed for the interment.

5. The charges will be remitted for the burial of any person on evidence being produced to two of the Trustees that the relations or friends of such person are unable to pay the costs and charges, except the cost of digging the grave.

6. Application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the Cemetery to be made to the Trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to persons applying.

7. The Trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but when a brick grave or vault is required it must be constructed under the direction of the Trustees, or some person duly appointed by them; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person, the consent, in writing, of such person must be left with the order.

8. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, or covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron.

9. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and a plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription, shall be submitted to the Trustees for approval, who may withhold permission and prevent the erection of any monument which shall appear to them inappropriate or unbecoming, and shall determine and fix position of any monument which may be proposed to be erected according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said Cemetery in an appropriate manner.

10. A plan of the Cemetery and registry will be kept and may be inspected at the office of the sexton.

11. No dogs will be allowed to enter the Cemetery.

12. No grave to be of less depth than 6 ft. for the body of an adult, 4 ft. 6 in. for the body of a child under twelve years, and 4 ft. for still-born.

13. The charge for digging grave to include filling up.

14. Family vaults to be limited to 10 ft. frontage by a depth of 10 ft.

15. No coffin shall be buried within 4 ft. of the ordinary level of the ground, unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 ft. below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 ft. thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

16. No re-interment or removal from another Cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF RICH- MOND PARK.

WHEREAS by the Crown grant issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works, and the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Richmond, in respect of Richmond Park, it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted and the buildings for the time being thereon shall be maintained and used as and for a Public Park and place of recreation, and offices and conveniences connected therewith, under and in accordance with such regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor or other officer for the time being administering the Government of the Colony (now State) of Victoria, with the consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in the meantime under and in accordance with such rules, orders, by-laws, and regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Board of Land and Works, and the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the said City of Richmond, and for no other purpose whatsoever: And whereas by section 200 of the *Land Act* 1901 it is provided that where any such land has been vested in trustees or jointly with the Board of Land and Works and trustees, it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council, to make rules and regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in the said section: Now, therefore, the Board of Land and Works, and the Council of the City of Richmond, do hereby make the regulations following for the care, protection, and management of Richmond Park, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, in addition to the existing Regulations in respect of the said Richmond Park:—

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall drive nails, nor cut foot-holes or boot-holes in any tree in the Park.
2. No person shall climb any tree, whether by the assistance of nails, foot-holes, boot-holes, or otherwise.
3. No person shall take, catch, trap, or remove any bird, or rob any bird's nest of eggs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 200 of the *Land Act* 1901, on conviction before any Justice, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence, and every person who so offends, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands or officer or servant of the Trustees or any constable, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer, or servant, or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

ADDITIONAL REGULATION RELATING TO THE EQUIPMENT OF SHIPS WITH LIFE-SAVING APPLIANCES.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by section 59 of the *Marine Act* 1890, the Marine Board of Victoria, with the consent of His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby make the following additional Regulation, that is to say:—

Such Regulation shall form portion of "The Regulations for the Equipment of Ships with Life-Saving Appliances" made by the Board on the 3rd day of February, 1899, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 24th day of February, 1899, and shall be read in connexion therewith and as number fourteen thereof, shall take effect from the date of publication hereof in the *Government Gazette*.

ADDITIONAL REGULATION.

(14) Penalty.—A breach of the foregoing Regulations shall be punishable if the owner or agent of any ship

appears to be in fault by a fine not exceeding One hundred pounds, and if the master appears to be in fault by a fine not exceeding Fifty pounds.

The foregoing additional Regulation was made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria held this thirteenth day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and seven.

Health Act 1890.

REGULATION FOR THE INTRODUCTION INTO VICTORIA OF STUD PIGS FROM NEW SOUTH WALES.

WHEREAS by section 267 of the *Health Act 1890*, among other things, the Governor in Council is empowered to from time to time make, alter, or vary such Orders as may seem necessary for the purpose of prohibiting or regulating the introduction into Victoria from any country or colony, or part of a country or colony (in which respectively any disease in sheep, cattle, horses, dogs, swine, or other animals of the same or any other kind or kinds, whatsoever, is known to exist), and for the detention in quarantine in such place and for such period as the Governor in Council by such Order appoints or directs, of all sheep, cattle, horses, dogs, swine, or other animals of the same or any other kind or kinds whatsoever, or of meat, skins, hides, horns, hoofs, or other parts of any animals, or of hay, straw, fodder, or other articles likely to propagate

amongst men or other animals any infectious or contagious disease whatsoever: And it is also enacted that all Orders for any of the purposes in the said section mentioned shall have the like force and effect as if the same had been inserted in the now in part recited Act: And that all persons offending against any Order made under the authority of the said section shall, for each and every offence, forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Fifty pounds, or such smaller sum as the Governor in Council may in any case by such Order direct; and such sum shall go to and form part of the consolidated revenue: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this present Order, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above recited Act, and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, order as follows (that is to say):—

1. That the prohibition contained in the Regulations of 30th October, 1903, as regards the introduction into Victoria of swine from New South Wales, shall not apply to stud pigs from that State, provided such pigs are accompanied by a statutory declaration by the owner to the effect that there has been no swine fever on the property from which they came, and that they have not been in contact with any pigs affected with swine fever during the last preceding twelve months; and also by a certificate from a New South Wales Inspector of Stock, to the effect that he has examined the pigs to be imported and found them to be free from disease.

2. And provided further that notice of intention to export stud pigs be furnished by intending exporters to the Chief Inspector of Stock, Melbourne, together with the declaration and certificate as aforesaid, not later than fourteen days prior to their proposed introduction into Victoria.

3. And also that before the introduction of any stud pigs, the Chief Inspector of Stock is satisfied that every requirement specified has been carried out, and that the pigs to be introduced are healthy. Stud pigs for which the conditions before mentioned have been complied with, may be introduced into Victoria by sea at the port of Melbourne; also the introduction of stud pigs into Victoria under the above stated conditions shall be permitted at any crossing by land, but intending exporters shall give notice of the intended crossing place to the Chief Inspector of Stock, Melbourne.

Any person introducing stud pigs in accordance with aforesaid provisions shall keep such pigs in complete isolation on his own farm, or in some place approved of by the Chief Inspector of Stock, for a period of thirty days.

No. 1072, section 43) it is enacted that no cemetery or burial ground shall be established or opened in Victoria save with the approval of the Governor in Council; and that in case it shall appear to the Governor in Council that burials in any cemetery under any law relating to public cemeteries or in any other burial ground or place of burial whatsoever should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, the Governor in Council may, by an Order to be published in the *Government Gazette*, direct that after a time to be mentioned in such Order, not being less than three months from the date thereof, burials in such cemetery or burial ground or place of burial shall be discontinued wholly or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in the same or in any subsequent Order, and may from time to time postpone the time mentioned in such Order for the discontinuance of burials or otherwise vary any such Order, whether the time appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder or other operation of such Order shall or shall not have arrived: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this present Order direct that burials in Yea Public Cemetery shall be discontinued on and after the expiration of three months from the date hereof, except in that portion lying on the east side of a line drawn through the said cemetery parallel to the centre of the bed of the gully which traverses the said cemetery from south to north, and distant at all points four chains east from the bed of the said gully.

YEA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1908.

THE Commissioners of the Yea Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act* 1905, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, make the following By-law:—

1. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds annual municipal valuation or under, the sum of Twenty shillings.
2. For every house or tenement of annual municipal valuation exceeding Twenty pounds, a rate of One shilling in the pound.
3. For every unoccupied allotment of land, and for every allotment of land upon which no house or tenement has been erected, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling of the annual municipal value of such allotment.
4. For every water-trough, a charge of Ten shillings.
5. For every steam boiler, a charge of Ten shillings for every horse power of such boiler.
6. For stand-pipes or hydrant water, for each load of two hundred gallons or under, a charge of One shilling, to be paid on delivery.
7. For water supplied by the Trust by measure (other than stand-pipe or hydrant water), except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, a charge of One shilling for every thousand gallons.
8. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by measurement (other than hydrant or stand-pipe water) shall be:—
 - (i) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, a quantity for which the charge of One shilling per thousand gallons would be equal to the assessed rate which would be payable for the house or tenement so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.
 - (2) If solely for other than domestic purposes, thirty thousand gallons per half-year.
9. The above-mentioned rates and charges (except for stand-pipe or hydrant water) shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1908.
10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Yea Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose, shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

WARRACKNABEAL WATERWORKS TRUST.—
RATING BY-LAW FOR 1908.

THE Commissioners of the Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act* 1905, make the following by-law for the year 1908. The following are the rates which the occupiers and owners of land and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes by the Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust, that is to say, in regard to houses or tenements fronting any street in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements, if not on such street, are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes:—

1. For every allotment of land, whether occupied or otherwise, where water is not being used, and of less than Ten pounds sterling annual municipal value, the sum of Two shillings in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation.
2. For every house or tenement of Thirteen pounds or under municipal value, a rate of One pound shall be paid.
3. For every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Thirteen pounds per annum, the sum of Seven pounds ten shillings per centum per annum shall be paid on the annual value of such property.
4. For all tenements in the said district situate otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within one-quarter of a mile from any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half the above-mentioned rate, and where such tenements are more than one-quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half-a-mile, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rate.
5. Such occupiers or owners of tenements as are supplied with water by meter shall pay at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons up to the quantity they would be entitled to receive according to their assessment, and at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons for anything over that quantity.
6. Such occupiers or owners of tenements not within the trust area, and who have agreed with the Trust to be supplied with water by meter, shall pay at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.
7. Such occupiers or owners of gardens, steam-engines, or stock who are supplied from the Trust reservoir with water, shall, if the Commissioners of the Trust think fit, pay an extra rate beyond that which they are already paying (if any) if, in the opinion of the Trust, such occupiers or owners are not paying a just proportionate rate for the water they are using. Such occupiers or owners to be notified in writing of such charge.
8. Such rates are hereby made payable half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1908. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

4. A special charge of Two pounds per annum shall be made for water supplied to St. Joseph's Convent and school in connexion therewith.

5. All Government buildings not connected with the Victorian Railway Department and supplied with water by the Trust, shall be charged a fixed sum of Three pounds each per annum.

6. All steam-engines using water must be supplied through a meter.

7. Rateable consumers may at their option be supplied by meter, in which case they may have as many pipes as they may see fit, provided that all water used by each such consumer shall pass through the meter, and each such consumer shall be charged at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons, until a sum has been reached equal to the amount of his rates; and at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons for all water used over and above that sum. Provided that no such consumer shall pay less than the amount of his rates, although he may not use sufficient water at One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons to equal the amount of his rates.

That the foregoing charges be paid in half-yearly payments on the 30th day of June and the 31st day of December in each and every year.

- (f) On buildings in course of erection, when water is required for building purposes, the rate shall be Ten shillings per centum on the contract price of the work, or by special agreement: wooden houses shall be charged half rate. Payment to be made before supply is given.
- (g) The supply of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the Trust will in each case determine, and the preliminary payment must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken or used.
- (h) In case of any dispute as to the sub-section applying to any particular case, the Trust shall have the power to decide or to make a special rate.
- (i) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic purposes, shall be the quantity which at Fourpence per 100 gallons measure for domestic or other purposes, shall be the quantity which at Fourpence per 100 gallons equals the amount of assessed rate for the year which would be payable for the premises or land so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (j) The rate hereby made shall be payable in equal moieties, half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1908.
- (k) Such person or persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rate and charges.

For all tenements or allotments of land, whether occupied or otherwise, in the said district, situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for the supply of water has been laid down, and which tenements or allotments of land, whether occupied or otherwise, are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenements or allotments of land, whether occupied or otherwise, are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

5. For every steam boiler supplied with water, except by special agreement, a charge of Twenty shillings per each horse-power shall be made.

6. For every trough in a paddock supplied with water, except by special agreement, a charge of One pound per annum shall be made.

7. For water supplied to siphon pumps, One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, or as may be decided upon by the Commissioners, in addition to a supply for domestic or other purposes.

8. In all cases of water supply, the Trust reserves the right of putting on a meter at the consumer's expense, and supplying water by measure, and in all cases where water is supplied to drinking or other troughs, or reservoirs, the Trust may compel the use of a floating-ball tap, or other improved device, to regulate the supply of such drinking or other troughs or reservoirs, to prevent the same overflowing.

9. Water supplied to the Government Departments, charitable or other public institutions, and religious denominations, shall be by measure, or by special agreement.

10. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, or at such price as may be specially agreed upon, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners and occupiers of gardens and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation or ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

One-sixteenth of an acre or less, per annum, 8,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-sixteenth of an acre, but not exceeding one-eighth of an acre, per annum, 12,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-eighth of an acre, but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum, 16,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half-an-acre, per annum, 28,000 gallons.

Exceeding half-an-acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons.

For every additional acre, and proportionately according to the foregoing scale, for every fraction of an acre.

That the before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1908, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1908, and shall be payable in one moiety, in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1908.

Where water meters are affixed, payment shall be made at the end of each quarter in the year, or at such time or times as may be demanded by the Trust.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rates.

TATURA WATERWORKS' TRUST.

BY-LAW NO. 1 FOR 1908.

THE Tatura Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act* 1905, doth hereby make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates and charges for the year 1908 which the occupiers and owners of all lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust (that is to say):—

1. For every house and tenement, whether occupied or not a rate of One shilling and tenpence in the pound sterling, provided that such rate or charge shall not in any case be less than twenty shillings sterling per annum.

2. For every allotment and lesser piece of land upon which no building is erected or which is unoccupied or vacant, and which is not supplied with water, a rate of not less than ten shillings sterling per annum.

3. In no case will water be supplied to any person whatsoever at a lesser rate or charge than twenty shillings sterling per annum.

4. For water supplied by measurement a charge of one shilling and tenpence per one thousand gallons shall be made. Nevertheless it shall be competent for the Trust (without any obligation so to do) from time to time to agree upon a special charge with any person or persons, Government Departments, Clubs, Associations, and other institutions of a public nature for the supply of water.

5. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in every case where the water is supplied by measure shall be—

(a) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes the quantity for which the charge at One shilling and tenpence per one thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(b) All water used over and above the amount allowed by the rate of one shilling and tenpence per one thousand gallons shall be paid for at the end of each half-year.

6. The foregoing rate is hereby made payable in moieties half-yearly in advance on the first days of January and July which will be in the year 1908.

7. Such person or persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose is or are hereby authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rate and charges, or any moiety or part thereof respectively.

- (d) Write, paint, print, stencil, place, or affix any letter, figure, device, poster, sign, or advertisement upon any part or parts of such building.

2. No person shall, at any meeting or gathering held in any such building, or any part thereof—

- (a) Stand upon any chair or seat, or stand or sit upon any window-sill, corner, balcony, or staircase railing, or
- (b) Disturb or interrupt any such meeting or gathering, or take part or in any manner connive at or assist in such disturbance or interruption, or
- (c) Use any threatening, abusive, indecent, obscene, or insulting words, or
- (d) Behave in a riotous, indecent, offensive, threatening, or insulting manner, or
- (e) Be drunk.

3. Every person who shall, by any wilful act or default, be guilty of any breach of any of the foregoing By-law shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for any such breach.

BOROUGH OF CLUNES.

BY-LAW No. 23.

A By-law of the Borough of Clunes, made under subsection 29 of section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, for prohibiting or regulating the use on any public highway of traction engines or other vehicles having projections on their wheels, and under section 594 of the said Act for regulating the conditions on which traction engines may proceed over any public highway.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Clunes order as follows:—

1. No person shall use or cause or procure any other person to use on any public highway any traction engine or other vehicle having on its wheels any bars, spikes, grips, or other projections—

This prohibition, however, shall not apply to—

- (a) Any traction engine, used only for hauling agricultural machinery, or hauling a vehicle containing such machinery only, if the projections on the driving wheels of such engine consist only of bars at least two and three-quarter inches in width and not more than one and one-sixteenth of an inch in thickness, and the space intervening between such bars does not exceed five inches; or,

- (b) Any traction engine, the driving wheels of which are cylindrical and smooth soled, and having no projections thereon other than diagonal bars of not less than three inches in width nor more than three-quarters of an inch in thickness, and extending the full width of the tire, and the space intervening between such cross bars not exceeding three inches; provided in such last-mentioned case—

- (i.) That the owner of such engine has previously obtained from the Council, or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf, a permit in writing specifying the public highways on which it may be used, and that the engine is being used on one of the highways so specified.

- (ii.) That the owner has agreed in writing to pay to the Council the cost of making good any damage done to any roadway, bridge, or culvert, by such engine, or any vehicle drawn by it.

- (iii.) That such engine is not being used (unless with the written consent of the Council, or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf) to haul more than two vehicles, exclusive of any vehicle solely used for carrying water for such engine.

- (iv.) That the loading of any vehicle drawn by such engine does not exceed nine tons in weight, including the weight of such vehicle.

- (v.) That the weight carried by any vehicle drawn by such engine (including the weight of such vehicle) does not exceed three hundredweight for each half-inch of bearing surface of the tire or felloe of each wheel of such vehicle.

2. Every owner of a traction engine shall cause to be painted in legible letters not less than one inch long, on a plate attached to the engine, or on a conspicuous place on the engine, the exact and true weight thereof, and the maximum weight of water and fuel necessary for its propulsion.

3. So long as the fires of a traction engine are alight, or the traction engine contains in itself sufficient motive power to move it, one person shall remain in attendance whilst it is on any public highway, although it is stationary.

4. No person shall take any traction engine across or along any bridge, culvert, or embankment, so as to meet or pass thereon any other traction engine, or any person with a horse, or vehicle drawn by a horse.

5. No person shall halt (unless through unforeseen circumstances, or unless actually engaged in loading or unloading) in any part of a road where the traffic way is narrowed by fences, excavations, embankments, dangerous depressions, or such like, but shall draw off at least twenty feet from the middle of the formation in the case of a made road, or the middle of the surveyed road if unmade.

6. No person shall permit any traction engine, or any vehicle attached to, or drawn thereby, to stop on any bridge or culvert for the purpose of drawing water, or for any other purpose whatever.

7. No person shall drive any traction engine between sunset and sunrise, unless by written permission of the Council, or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf, defining the route to be travelled, and the extended hours during which such travelling is permissible, such permission to be withdrawable at any time upon written

notice to that effect being served on the owner or driver of the engine, or being forwarded to him by registered letter. No person who has received such written permission shall drive any traction engine between sunset and sunrise, unless there shall be exhibited on such engine proper and sufficient carriage or other approved lights, one at each side on the front, and one in the rear, or when a vehicle, or vehicles, are being drawn by such engine, then in the rear of the last vehicle.

8. No person shall use, or cause, or procure to be used, on any public highway, any traction engine, unless there is carried on such engine, or some vehicle drawn by the same, at least four strong and perfectly sound wooden planks twelve inches in width, four inches in thickness, and at least twelve feet in length, and when crossing any bridge or culvert, the driver, or the person in charge of such engine, shall lay down such planks, and no engine shall be permitted to cross over any bridge or culvert except on such planks.

9. The driver of a traction engine shall shut off steam immediately the driving wheels of the engine commence to skid, and he shall not start the engine again until he has taken all necessary and proper means to prevent damage being done to the highway by the skidding of the wheels.

10. Any person shall for any wilful act or default contrary to this By-law be liable to the following penalty:—

- (a) For the first offence, a fine not exceeding Three pounds.
- (b) For the second offence, a fine not exceeding Five pounds.
- (c) For any subsequent offence, a fine not exceeding Ten pounds.

11. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.
