# KIATA PUBLIC CEMETERY.—RULES, REGULATIONS, AND SCALE OF FEES.

Rules and Regulations.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Cemeteries Act 1890, the Trustees of the Kiata Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is

to say):—

1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the Government Gazette, and from and after such publication all Rules and Regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby

rescinded.

2. All charges must be paid when orders are given or before the ground or vault is opened.

3. The name, age, late place of residence, and cause of death of deceased must be stated at the time of giving

the order.

the order.

4. The procession to arrive at the Cemetery punctually at the hour appointed for the interment.

5. The charges will be remitted for the burial of any person on evidence being produced to two of the Trustees that the relations or friends of such person are unable to pay the costs and charges, except the cost of digging

grave. 6. Application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the Cemetery to be made to the Trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to persons applying.

7. The Trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but when a brick grave or vault is required it must be constructed under the direction of the Trustees, or some person duly appointed by them; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person, the consent, in writing, of such person must be left with the order.

8. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, or covered with a slab of stone, slate, or

g. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and g. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and a plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription, shall be submitted to the Trustees for approval, who may withhold permission and prevent the erection of any monument which shall appear to them inappropriate or unbecoming, and shall determine and fix position of any monument which may be proposed to be erected according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said Cemetery in an appropriate manner.

no. A plan of the Cemetery and registry will be kept and may be inspected at the office of the sexton.

11. No dogs will be allowed to enter the Cemetery.

12. No grave to be of less depth than 6 ft. for the body of an adult, 4 ft. 6 in. for the body of a child under twelve years, and 4 ft. for still-born.

13. The charge for digging grave to include filling up. Family vaults to be limited to to ft. frontage by a depth of 10 ft.

15. No coffin shall be buried within 4 ft. of the ordinary level of the ground, unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 ft. below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 ft. thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF RICHMOND PARK.

WHEREAS by the Crown grant issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works, and the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Richmond, in respect of Richmond Park, it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted and the buildings for the time being thereon shall be maintained and used as and for a Public Park and place of recreation, and offices and conveniences connected therewith, under and in accordance with such regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor or other officer for the time being administering the Government of the Colony (now State) of Victoria, with the consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in the meantime under and in accordance with such rules, orders, by-laws, and regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Board of Land and Works, and the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the said City of Richmond, and for no other purpose whatsoever: And whereas by section 200 of the Land Act 1901 it is provided that where any such land has been vested in trustees or jointly with the Board of Land and Works and trustees, it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council, to make rules and regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in the said section: Now, therefore, the Board of Land and Works, and the Council of the City of Richmond, do hereby make the regulations following for the care, protection, and management of Richmond Park, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, in addition to the existing Regulations in respect of the said Richmond Park :—

## REGULATIONS.

RECULATIONS.

1. No person shall drive nails, nor cut foot-holes or boot-holes in any tree in the Park.

2. No person shall climb any tree, whether by the assistance of nails, foot-holes, boot-holes, or otherwise.

3. No person shall take, catch, trap, or remove any bird, or rob any bird's nest of eggs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in acordance with section 200 of the Land Act 1901, on conviction before any Justice, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence, and every person who so offends, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands or officer or servant of the Trustees or any constable, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer, or servant, or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

WHEREAS by section 267 of the Health Act 1800, among other things, the Governor in Council is empowered to from time to time make, alter, or vary such Orders as may seem necessary for the purpose of prohibiting or regulating the introduction into Victoria from any country or colony, or part of a country or colony (in which respectively any disease in sheep, cattle, horses, dogs, swine, or other animals of the same or any other kind or kinds whatsoever, is known to exist), and for the detention in quarantine in such place and for such period as the Governor in Council by such Order appoints or directs, of all sheep, cattle, horses, dogs, swine, or other animals of the same or any other kind or kinds whatsoever, or of meat, skins, hides, horns, hoofs, or other parts of any animals, or of hay, straw, fodder, or other articles likely to propagate

amongst men or other animals any infectious or contagious disease whatsoever: And it is also enacted that all Orders for any of the purposes in the said section mentioned shall have the like force and effect as if the same had been inserted in the now in part recited Act: And that all persons offending against any Order made under the authority of the said section shall, for each and every offence, forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Fifty pounds, or such smaller sum as the Governor in Council may in any case by such Order direct; and such sum shall go to and form part of the consolidated revenue: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this present Order, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above recited Act, and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, order as follows (that is to say):—

And provided turner that nonce of mention to ex-port stud pigs be furnished by intending exporters to the Chief Inspector of Stock, Melbourne, together with the declaration and certificate as aforesaid, not later than fourteen days prior to their proposed introduction into

And also that before the introduction of any stud pigs, the Chief Inspector of Stock is satisfied that every requirement specified has been carried out, and that the pigs to be introduced are healthy. Stud pigs for which the conditions before mentioned have been compiled with, may be introduced into Victoria by sea at the port of Melbourne; also the introduction of stud pigs into Victoria under the above stated conditions shall be permitted at any crossing by land, but intending exporters shall give notice of the intended crossing place to the Chief Inspector of Stock, Melbourne.

Any person introducing stud pigs in accordance with aforesaid provisions shall keep such pigs in complete isolation on his own farm, or in some place approved of by the Chief Inspector of Stock, for a period of thirty

- For stand-pipes or hydrant water, for each load of two hundred gallons or under, a charge of One shilling, to be paid on delivery.
- 7. For water supplied by the Trust by measure (other than stand-pipe or hydrant water), except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, a charge of One shilling for every thousand gallons.
- 8. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by measurement (other than hydrant or stand-pipe water) shall be :-
  - (1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, a quantity for which the charge of One shilling per thousand gallons would be equal to the assessed rate which would be payable for the house or tenement so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.
  - (2) If solely for other than domestic purposes, thirty thousand gallons per half-year.
- o. The above-mentioned rates and charges (except for stand-pipe or hydrant water) shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1908.

3. For every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Thirteen pounds per annum, the sum of Seven pounds ten shillings per centum per annum shall be paid on the annual value of such property.

4. For all tenements in the said district situate otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within one-quarter of a mile from any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half the above-mentioned rate, and where such tenements are more than one-quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half-a-mile, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rate.

5. Such occupiers or owners of tenements as are supplied with water by meter shall pay at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons up to the quantity they would be entitled to receive according to their assessment, and at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons for anything over that quantity.

6. Such occupiers or owners of tenements not within the trust area, and who have agreed with the Trust to be supplied with water by meter, shall pay at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

7. Such occupiers or owners of gardens, steam-engines, or stock who are supplied from the Trust reservoir with water, shall, if the Commissioners of the Trust think fit, pay an extra rate beyond that which they are already paying (if any) if, in the opinion of the Trust, such occupiers or owners are not paying a just proportionate rate for the water they are using. Such occupiers or owners to be notified in writing of such charge.

8. Such rates are hereby made payable half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1908. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust said have and charges.

#### TATURA WATERWORKS TRUST. BY-LAW NO. 1 FOR 1908.

THE Tatura Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1905, doth hereby make the following By-law:—

Nevertheless it shall be competent for the Trust (without any obligation so to do) from time to time to agree upon a special charge with any person or persons, Covernment Departments, Clubs, Associations, and other institutions of a public nature for the supply of water.

5. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in every case where the water is supplied by measure shall be—

(a) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes (a) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes
the quantity for which the charge at One shilling
and tenpence per one thousand gallons would
be equal to the amount of the assessed rate
which would be payable for the premises supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
 (b) All water used over and above the amount allowed by the rate of one shilling and tenpence
per one thousand gallons shall be paid for at
the end of each half-year.

6. The foregoing rate is hereby made payable in moieties half-yearly in advance on the first days of January and July which will be in the year 1908.

7. Such person or persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose is or are hereby authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rate and charges, or any moiety or part thereof respectively.

  - (a) Stand upon any chair or seat, or stand or sit upon any window-sill, corner, balcony, or stair-case railing, or
    (b) Disturb or interrupt any such meeting or gathering, or take part or in any manner connive at or assist in such disturbance or interruption,
  - (c) Use any threatening, abusive, indecent, obscene, or insulting words, or
    (d) Behave in a riotous, indecent, offensive, threatening, or insulting manner, or
    (e) Be drunk.

3. Every person who shall, by any wilful act or default, be guilty of any breach of any of the foregoing By-law shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for any such breach.

A By-law of the Borough of Clunes, made under subsection 29 of section 197 of the Local Government Act 1903, for prohibiting or regulating the use on any public highway of traction engines or other vehicles having projections on their wheels, and under section 594 of the said Act for regulating the conditions on which traction engines may proceed over any public highway. highway.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1903, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Clunes order as follows:—

1. No person shall use or cause or procure any other person to use on any public highway any traction engine or other vehicle having on its wheels any bars, spikes, grips, or other projections—

This prohibition, however, shall not apply to-

- This prohibition, however, shall not apply to—

  (a) Any traction engine, used only for hauling agricultural machinery, or hauling a vehicle containing such machinery only, if the projections on the driving wheels of such engine consist only of bars at least two and three-quarter inches in width and not more than one and one-sixteenth of an inch in thickness, and the space intervening between such bars does not exceed five inches; or,

  (b) Any traction engine, the driving wheels of which are cylindrical and smooth soled, and having no projections thereon other than diagonal bars of not less than three inches in width nor more than three-quarters of an inch in thickness, and extending the full width of the tire, and the space intervening between such cross bars not exceeding three inches; provided in such last-mentioned case—

  (i.) That the owner of such engine has previously obtained from the Council, or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf, a permit in writing specifying the public highways on which it may be used, and that the engine is being used on one of the highways so specified.

  (ii.) That the owner has agreed in writing to pay

  (ii.) That the owner has agreed in writing to pay to the Council the cost of making good any damage done to any roadway, bridge, or culvert, by such engine, or any vehicle drawn by
- it.

  (iii.) That such engine is not being used (unless with the written consent of the Council, or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf) to haul more than two vehicles, exclusive of any vehicle solely used for carrying water for such engine.

  (iv.) That the loading of any vehicle drawn by such engine does not exceed nine tons in weight, including the weight of such vehicle.

  (v.) That the weight carried by any vehicle drawn by such engine (including the weight of such vehicle) does not exceed three hundredweight for each half-inch of bearing surface of the tire or felloe of each wheel of such vehicle.

  Every owner of a traction engine shall cause to be

- 2. Every owner of a traction engine shall cause to be painted in legible letters not less than one inch long, on a plate attached to the engine, or on a conspicuous place on the engine, the exact and true weight thereof, and the maximum weight of water and fuel necessary for its propulsion propulsion.
- 3. So long as the fires of a traction engine are alight, or the traction engine contains in itself sufficient motive power to move it, one person shall remain in attendance whilst it is on any public highway, although it is
- 4. No person shall take any traction engine across or along any bridge, culvert, or embankment, so as to meet or pass thereon any other traction engine, or any person with a horse, or vehicle drawn by a horse.
- 5. No person shall halt (unless through unforescen circumstances, or unless actually engaged in loading or unloading) in any part of a road where the traffic way is narrowed by fences, excavations, dangerous depressions, or such like, but shall draw off at least twenty feet from the middle of the formation in the case of a made road, or the middle of the surveyed road if unmade.
- 6. No person shall permit any traction engine, or any vehicle attached to, or drawn thereby, to stop on any bridge or culvert for the purpose of drawing water, or for any other purpose whatever.
- for any other purpose whatever.

  7. No person shall drive any traction engine between sunset and suarise, unless by written permission of the Council, or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf, defining the route to be travelled, and the extended hours during which such travelling is permissible, such permission to be withdrawable at any time upon written

notice to that effect being served on the owner or driver of the engine, or being forwarded to him by registered letter. No person who has received such written permission shall drive any traction engine between sunset and sunrise, unless there shall be exhibited on such engine proper and sufficient carriage or other approved lights, one at each side on the front, and one in the rear, or when a vehicle, or vehicles, are being drawn by such engine, then in the rear of the last vehicle.

8. No person shall use, or cause, or procure to be used, on any public highway, any traction engine, unless there is carried on such engine, or some vehicle drawn by the same, at least four strong and perfectly sound wooden planks twelve inches in width, four inches in thickness, and at least twelve feet in length, and when crossing any bridge or culvert, the driver, or the person in charge of such engine, shall lay down such planks, and no engine shall be permitted to cross over any bridge or culvert except on such planks.

9. The driver of a traction engine shall shut off steam immediately the driving wheels of the engine commence to skid, and he shall not start the engine again until he has taken all necessary and proper means to prevent damage being done to the highway by the skidding of the wheels.

ro. Any person shall for any wilful act or default contrary to this by-law be liable to the following penalty:---

(a) For the first offence, a fine not exceeding Three pounds.
(b) For the second offence, a fine not exceeding Five

pounds.

(c) For any subsequent offence, a fine not exceeding Ten pounds.
