AVOCA WATER TRUST .-- RATING BY-LAW BY THE AUDITOR-GENERAL FOR THE YEAR 1907.\*

W HEREAS default having been made in payment by the Avoca Water Trust of the interest due by the said Trust on loans granted by the Governor in Council to such Trust; and the said Trust having also failed to form a redemption fund for the liquidation of such loans in accordance with the Acts of Parliament in that behalf that behalf.

And the Auditor-General of Victoria, having done all things necessary under the powers in that behalf him enabling, has entered upon and taken possession of the lands, tenements, and works of the said Trust: And whereas notices that the district of the said Avoca Water Trust is supplied with the water have been duly given in the Government Gazette:

Now therefore the Auditor-General of the State of Victoria, being in possession of the said Water Trust, doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1905, for the purpose of discharging the obligations of the said Trust to the Governor in Council in respect of unpaid interest upon the said loan, and to provide for the other payments required to be made by the said Trust for the maintenance and management of its works and for other purposes under the said Act, make the following By-law for the year 1907:—

A rate for the year 1907 is hereby made of One shilling in the pound sterling on the annual value of all rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Avoca Water Trust, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rates of the municipal district within which such lands and tenements are respectively situated.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC GARDENS AND GENERAL RECREATION PURPOSES IN THE TOWN OF NEWSTEAD.

THE Council of the Shire of Newstead, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Gardens and General Recreation purposes, in the Town of Newstead, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the Land Act 1901:—

#### REGULATIONS.

- (1) The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for entertainments, fêtes, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling (1s.) may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

  (2) No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- conduct.

- (3) No person shall in any way damage the trees; shrubs, flowers, buildings, or fences in or around the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
- (4) No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve.
- (5) No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works of Land and Works.
- (6) No person shall bring any horse or any vehicle into the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
- (7) No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, the Committee of Management first obtained.
- (8) No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed as plantations for young trees or shrubs.

be enclosed as plantations for young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the Land Act 1991, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown Lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith and rehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

A By-law of the City of Hawthorn, made under and pursuant to the Local Government Act 1903, by virtue of section seven of the Coal and Firewood Act 1904, and numbered 59, for regulating for the purposes of the last-named Act the sale of firewood in quantities not exceeding ten cubic feet.

- 2. Until firewood sold by weight in any quantity not 2. Onth frewood sold by weight it any quantity not exceeding ten cubic feet shall be delivered to the purchaser thereof the seller of such firewood shall cause the same to be kept separate from other frewood in such a manner that the same can be readily distinguished from other firewood.
- .3. Every person guilty of any breach of this By-law No. 59 shall be liable to a penalty recoverable summarily, and not exceeding in each case Five pounds.
