WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1906, it was amongst other things enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the

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surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient :

And whereas a Treaty was concluded on the twenty-sixth day of June, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, between Her late Majesty Queen Victoria and His Majesty the King of Sweden and Norway, for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, in the case of which Treaty the Extradition Acts of 1870 and 1873 were applied by Order in Council of the thirtieth September, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-three :

And whereas an Agreement was concluded on the second day of July, One thousand nine hundred and seven, between the British and Swedish Governments, providing that the said Treaty shall remain in force between the Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and the Kingdom of Sweden, in so far as its provisions apply to the Kingdom of Sweden alone; and also declaring that certain additions shall be made to the offences set out in Article II. of the said Treaty, which Agreement is in the terms following :—

The British and Swedish Governments, who agree that the Treaty signed at Stockholm on the 26th of June, 1873, between the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and the Kingdoms of Sweden and Norway for the mutual surrender of fugitive criminals, shall remain in force between the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and the Kingdom of Sweden, in so far as its provisions apply to the Kingdom of Sweden alone, and who deem it desirable to make certain additions to the said Treaty, have authorized the undersigned to declare that the following additions should be made to the offences set out in Article II. of the said Treaty for which, under the circumstances and conditions stated in the said Treaty, extradition is to be granted :—

19. Perjury and subornation of perjury.
20. Receiving any money, valuable security, or other property, knowing the same to have been stolen or embezzled.
21. Malicious wounding or inflicting grievous bodily harm.
22. Unlawful carnal knowledge of a girl under the age of fifteen years.
23. Bigamy.
24. Indecent assault.
25. Administering drugs or using instruments apt to procure the miscarriage of women, with intent to procure such miscarriage.
26. Any malicious act done with intent to endanger the safety of any person travelling or being upon a railway.

27. Knowingly making, without lawful authority, any instrument, tool, or engine adapted and intended for the counterfeiting of the coin of the realm.

28. Malicious injury to property, if such offence be indictable.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to him by the said Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1906, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the twenty-sixth day of August, 1907, the said Acts shall apply in the case of Sweden under and in accordance with the said Treaty as supplemented by the said Agreement above set forth:

Provided always that the operation of the said Acts shall be and remain suspended within the Dominion of Canada so long as an Act of the Parliament of Canada, being Part I. of chapter 155 of the Revised Statutes of Canada, 1906, and entitled "An Act respecting the Extradition of Fugitive Criminals," shall continue in force there, and no longer.

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1906, it was amongst other things enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient;

And whereas a Treaty was concluded on the twenty-fifth day of August, One thousand nine hundred and

six, between His Majesty and the President of the Republic of Panamá, for the extradition of criminals, which Treaty is in the terms following:—

Extradition Treaty between the United Kingdom and Panamá.

His Majesty the King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, and the President of the Republic of Panamá, having determined, by common consent, to conclude a Treaty for the extradition of criminals, have accordingly named as their Plenipotentiaries:

His Majesty the King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India.

Claude Coventry Mallet, Esquire, Companion of His Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, and His Consul for the Republic of Panamá, and

The President of the Republic of Panamá.

His Excellency Ricardo Arias, Secretary of State for the Department of Government and Foreign Affairs;

Who, after having exhibited to each other their respective full powers and found them in good and due form, have agreed upon the following Articles:

ARTICLE I.

The High Contracting Parties engage to deliver up to each other, under certain circumstances and conditions stated in the present Treaty, those persons who, being accused or convicted of any of the crimes or offences enumerated in Article II., committed in the territory of the one Party, shall be found within the territory of the other Party.

ARTICLE II.

Extradition shall be reciprocally granted for the following crimes or offences:—

1. Murder, or attempt or conspiracy to murder.
2. Manslaughter.
3. Administering drugs or using instruments with intent to procure the miscarriage of women.
4. Rape.
5. Carnal knowledge, or any attempt to have unlawful carnal knowledge of a girl under the age of 16 years, so far as such acts are punishable by the law of the State upon which the demand is made.
6. Indecent assault.
7. Kidnapping and false imprisonment, child stealing.
8. Abandoning, exposing, or detaining children.
9. Abduction.
10. Bigamy.
11. Maliciously wounding or inflicting grievous bodily harm.
12. Assault occasioning actual bodily harm.
13. Threats, by letter or otherwise, with intent to extort money or other things of value.
14. Perjury, or subornation of perjury.
15. Arson or attempt to commit arson.
16. Burglary or housebreaking, robbery with violence, larceny, or embezzlement.
17. Fraud by a bailee, banker, agent, factor, trustee, director, member, or public officer of any Company.
18. Obtaining money, valuable security, or goods by false pretences; receiving any money, valuable security, or other property, knowing the same to have been stolen or unlawfully obtained.
19. (a) Counterfeiting or altering money, or bringing into circulation counterfeited or altered money.
(b) Knowingly making without lawful authority any instrument, tool, or engine adapted and intended for the counterfeiting of the coin of the realm.
20. Forgery, or knowingly uttering what is forged.
21. Crimes against bankruptcy law.
22. Any malicious act done with intent to endanger the safety of any persons travelling or being upon a railway.
23. Malicious injury to property, if such offence be indictable.
24. Piracy and other crimes or offences committed at sea against persons or things which, according to the laws of the High Contracting Parties, are extradition offences.
25. Dealing in slaves in such manner as to constitute a criminal offence against the laws of both States.

Extradition shall also be granted for participation in any of the aforesaid crimes, provided such participation be punishable by the laws of both Contracting Parties.

Extradition may also be granted at the discretion of the State applied to in respect of any other crime for which, according to the law of both the Contracting Parties for the time being in force, the grant can be made.

ARTICLE III.

Neither Party is obliged to surrender its own subjects or citizens to the other Party.

ARTICLE IV.

Extradition shall not take place if the person claimed on the part of His Britannic Majesty's Government, or of the Government of Panamá, has already been tried and discharged or punished, or is waiting trial in the territory of the United Kingdom or in the Republic of Panamá respectively, for the crime for which his extradition is demanded.

If the person claimed on the part of His Britannic Majesty's Government, or of the Government of Panamá, should be awaiting trial or undergoing sentence for any other crime in the territory of the United Kingdom, or in the Republic of Panamá respectively, his extradition shall be deferred until after he has been discharged, whether by acquittal or on expiration of sentence or otherwise.

ARTICLE V.

Extradition shall not be granted if exemption from prosecution or punishment has been acquired by lapse of time, according to the laws of the State applying or applied to.

Neither shall it be granted if, according to the law of either country, the maximum punishment for the offence charged is imprisonment for less than one year.

ARTICLE VI.

A fugitive criminal shall not be surrendered if the offence in respect of which his surrender is demanded is one of a political character, or if he proves that the requisition, for his surrender has, in fact, been made with a view to try or punish him for an offence of a political character.

ARTICLE VII.

A person surrendered shall in no case be kept in prison or be brought to trial in the State to which the surrender has been made for any other crime, or on account of any other matters, than those for which the extradition shall have taken place, until he has been restored, or has had an opportunity of returning to the State by which he has been surrendered.

This stipulation does not apply to crimes committed after the extradition.

ARTICLE VIII.

The requisition for extradition shall be made through the Diplomatic Agents or Consuls-General of the High Contracting Parties respectively.

The requisition for the extradition of an accused person must be accompanied by a warrant of arrest issued by the competent authority of the State requiring the extradition, and by such evidence as, according to the laws of the place where the accused is found, would justify his arrest if the crime had been committed there.

If the requisition relates to a person already convicted, it must be accompanied by a copy of the judgment passed on the convicted person by the competent Court of the State that makes the requisition for extradition.

A sentence passed in *contumacia* is not to be deemed a conviction, but a person so sentenced may be dealt with as an accused person.

ARTICLE IX.

If the requisition for extradition be in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the competent authorities of the State applied to shall proceed to the arrest of the fugitive.

ARTICLE X.

A criminal fugitive may be apprehended under a warrant issued by any competent authority in either country, on such information or complaint, and such evidence, or after such proceedings, as would, in the opinion of the authority issuing the warrant, justify the issue of a warrant if the crime had been committed or the person convicted in that part of the dominions of the two Contracting Parties in which the said authority exercises jurisdiction; provided, however, that in the United Kingdom the accused shall, in such case, be sent as speedily as possible before a competent Magistrate.

He shall, in accordance with this Article, be discharged, as well in the Republic of Panamá as in the United Kingdom, if within the term of sixty days a requisition for extradition shall not have been made by the Diplomatic Agent or Consul-General of his country in accordance with the stipulations of this Treaty. The same rule shall apply to the cases of persons accused or convicted of any of the crimes or offences specified in this Treaty, and committed in the high seas on board any vessel of either country which may come into a port of the other.

ARTICLE XI.

The extradition shall take place only if the evidence be found sufficient according to the laws of the State applied to, either to justify the committal of the prisoner for trial, in case the crime had been committed in the territory of the same State, or if extradition is claimed in respect of an offence of which the fugitive has been already convicted, to prove that the prisoner is the person convicted, and that the crime of which he has been convicted is one in respect of which extradition could, at the time of such conviction, have been granted by the State applied to.

ARTICLE XII.

The extradition of fugitives under the provisions of this Treaty shall be carried out in His Britannic Majesty's Dominions and in the Republic of Panamá, respectively, in conformity with the laws regulating extradition for the time being in force in the surrendering State.

ARTICLE XIII.

In the examinations which they have to make in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the Authorities of the State applied to shall admit as valid evidence the sworn depositions or the affirmations of witnesses taken in the other State, or copies thereof, and likewise the warrants and sentences issued therein, and certificates of, or judicial documents stating the fact of a conviction, provided the same are authenticated as follows:—

1. A warrant must purport to be signed by a Judge, Magistrate, or Officer of the other State.

2. Depositions or affirmations, or the copies thereof, must purport to be certified, under the hand of a Judge, Magistrate, or Officer of the other State, to be the original depositions or affirmations, or to be true copies thereof, as the case may require.

3. A certificate of or judicial document stating the fact of a conviction must purport to be certified by a Judge, Magistrate, or Officer of the other State.

4. In every case such warrant, deposition, affirmation, copy, certificate, or judicial document must be authenticated either by the oath of some witness, or by being sealed with the official seal of the Minister of Justice or some other Minister of the other State; but any other mode of authentication for the time being permitted by the law of the country where the examination is taken may be substituted for the foregoing.

ARTICLE XIV.

If the individual claimed by one of the High Contracting Parties in pursuance of the present Treaty should be also claimed by one or several other Powers on account of other crimes or offences committed upon their respective territories, his extradition shall be granted to the State whose demand is earliest in date.

ARTICLE XV.

If sufficient evidence for the extradition be not produced within ninety days from the date of the apprehension of the fugitive, or within such further time as the State applied to, or the proper Tribunal thereof, shall direct, the fugitive shall be set at liberty.

ARTICLE XVI.

All articles seized which were in the possession of the person to be surrendered at the time of his apprehension shall, if the competent authority of the State applied to for the extradition has ordered the delivery of such articles, be given up when the extradition takes place; and the said delivery shall extend not merely to the stolen articles, but to everything that may serve as a proof of the crime.

ARTICLE XVII.

All expenses connected with extradition shall be borne by the demanding State.

ARTICLE XVIII.

The stipulations of the present Treaty shall be applicable to the colonies and foreign possessions of His Britannic Majesty, so far as the laws in such colonies and foreign possessions respectively will allow.

The requisition for the surrender of a fugitive criminal who has taken refuge in any of such colonies or foreign possessions shall be made to the Governor or chief authority of such colony or possession by the chief Consular officer of the Republic of Panamá in such colony or possession.

Such requisition may be disposed of, subject always, as nearly as may be, and so far as the law of such colony or foreign possession will allow, to the provisions of this Treaty, by the said Governor or chief authority, who, however, shall be at liberty either to grant the surrender or to refer the matter to his Government.

His Britannic Majesty shall, however, be at liberty to make special arrangements in the British Colonies and

foreign possessions for the surrender of criminals from the Republic of Panamá who may take refuge within such Colonies and foreign possessions, on the basis, so far as the law of such Colony or foreign possession will allow, of the provisions of the present Treaty.

Requisitions for the surrender of a fugitive criminal emanating from any Colony or foreign possession of His Britannic Majesty shall be governed by rules laid down in the preceding Articles of the present Treaty.

ARTICLE XIX.

The present Treaty shall come into force ten days after its publication, in conformity with the forms prescribed by the laws of the High Contracting Parties. It may be terminated by either of the High Contracting Parties by a notice not exceeding one year, and not less than six months.

It shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at Panamá as soon as possible.

"THE SOLOMONS (CUSTOMS) REGULATION 1907."

By His Excellency Sir Everard Ferdinand im Thurn, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Companion of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, His Britannic Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific.

In virtue of the powers vested in me by the "Solomons (Customs) Regulation 1907," section 77, sub-sections (2), (4), and (1) (2), I hereby order and proclaim that on and after the fifteenth day of September, 1907—

- (1) Gavatu, as declared by section 2 of the Regulation aforesaid, shall cease to be a port of entry, and Tulagi shall be a port of entry, within the meaning of the aforesaid Regulation;

- (2) A Government Bonded Warehouse shall be established at Tulagi for the reception and securing of dutiable goods; and

- (3) The following duties and fees shall be paid in respect of dutiable goods landed and stored at such port of entry as aforesaid:—

(a) Threepence for each packet landed and delivered at the Custom House; and

(b) One penny per packet for each week that any such packet shall be stored in the Government Bonded Warehouse.

Description of Land.—Two acres one rood twenty perches, county of Delatite, municipal district of Wangaratta, being allotments 6, 7, 8, 9, and 10 of section 20: Commencing at the intersection of the south side of Docker-street and the west side of Baker-street; bounded thence by the latter street bearing south 4 degrees west three chains twelve links; thence by Owens-street bearing south 40 degrees west two chains thirty-three links; thence by allotments 11, 12, and 13 bearing north 86 degrees west three chains sixty-three links; thence by allotment 5 bearing north 4 degrees east five chains; and thence by Docker-street aforesaid bearing south 86 degrees east five chains to the point of commencement.

Names of Trustees.—The Church of England Trusts Corporation for the Diocese of Wangaratta.

Power of Disposition.—With the consent of the Bishop of Wangaratta, acting under the advice of the Council of the Diocese, to mortgage, sell, lease (on building lease or otherwise), exchange, and transfer the said land, or any part thereof, and to make and reserve roads and grant easements over the same, or any part thereof, and subject to such powers and the exercise thereof to hold the said land, or so much thereof as may from time to time remain vested in the trustee, upon such trusts for the Church of England within the Diocese of Wangaratta, in Victoria, as the Bishop of Wangaratta, acting under the advice of the Council of the Diocese, may direct.

RESERVE FOR WATERING PURPOSES AND FOR
MOORABBIN, AT CHELTENHAM.
PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF
REGULATION.

WHEREAS by the Crown Grant, issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works and the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Moorabbin (hereinafter designated the grantees), and to their successors in respect of the Reserve for Watering purposes and for Public Recreation in the parish of Moorabbin, at Cheltenham, it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted, and the buildings for the time being thereon, shall be at all times maintained and used for Watering purposes and for Public Recreation and offices and conveniences connected therewith under and in accordance with such Regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor or Administrator of the Government of the Colony of Victoria for the time being, with the consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in the meantime under and in accordance with such Regulations as shall from time to time be made by the grantees or their successors: And whereas by section 137 of the *Land Act* 1890 it is provided that where any such land has been vested in trustees, or jointly with the Board of Land and Works and trustees, it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council, from time to time to make, alter, and rescind Rules and Regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in clause 1 of the said section: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works and the Council of the Shire of Moorabbin do hereby make the following Regulation in respect of such portion of the said Reserve for Watering purposes and Public Recreation in the parish of Moorabbin, at Cheltenham, as is indicated by pink tint on the plan annexed hereto and marked "B."

REGULATION.

The undermentioned gentleman shall be a member of the Committee of Management to exercise control over such portion of the Reserve for Watering purposes and Public Recreation:—

JOHN MCINDOE,

in the room of Maurice Edward Benjamin, who has ceased to be a councillor of the Shire of Moorabbin.

Provided, nevertheless, that the said John McIndoe shall hold office as a member of the Committee of Management of such portion of the Reserve for Watering purposes and for Public Recreation for so long only as he may continue to be a councillor of the Shire of Moorabbin.

REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE
CRESWICK BOROUGH COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the 8th day of January, 1902, the Council of the Borough of Creswick, as Managers of the Creswick Borough Common, having drafted the following Regulations for the management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such Common.

REGULATIONS.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licences, or carriers' licences, and farmers residing within 5 miles from the Common, may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle or the equivalent of the whole or portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on the Common one additional head of large cattle or the equivalent in small cattle for every ten (10) acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. Holders of miners' rights, business licences, or carriers' licences shall produce their respective miners' rights, business or carriers' licences to the Managers of the Common for inspection immediately prior to requiring their stock to be registered, otherwise the Managers may refuse registration.

3. No person shall depasture on the Common stock of which he is not the *bond fide* owner.

4. The Managers of the Common shall be at liberty to appoint certain times and places for registering and branding, or renewing registration of stock, and shall give due notice thereof; and the Managers or herdsman shall attend at such times and places for the purposes aforesaid. Every person entitled to commonage shall, before depasturing any stock on the Common, give to the herdsman thereof a true and correct description of such stock and their brands or other distinctive marks, and shall obtain from the herdsman a certificate to that effect; and, after having paid the prescribed commonage fees, shall obtain from the herdsman the necessary number of badges and chains, which shall be at all times the absolute property of the Managers. Every such person shall then be responsible and liable to be charged for stock equivalent to the number of badges and chains from the time of receiving such badges and chains until they are returned to the herdsman.

No person shall use other than the authorized or registered badge and chain in connexion with stock legally depasturing on the Common. In addition to the fee for depasturing stock, the sum of One shilling shall be paid to the herdsman at the time of registration for the hire of each badge and chain, but should any person cease at any time to depasture stock on the Common the amount paid for each badge and chain shall be refunded to such person, provided the badge and chain be returned to the herdsman in good order and condition. Should any badge be from any cause removed or lost from any stock legally depasturing on the Common, every such badge so removed or lost shall be at once replaced by a new badge at the sole expense of the owner of the stock, and the sum of One shilling shall be paid to the herdsman for such extra badge, but no refund shall be made by the Managers for any badge removed or lost. No person shall place, or allow to be placed or remain on any stock on the Common, a lost badge, or one removed from another animal, without the authority of the herdsman, and any stock wearing or carrying a lost badge or one feloniously removed from other stock shall be treated as illegally depasturing on the Common, and shall be liable to be impounded by the herdsman without notice to the owner.

5. All stock legally depasturing on the Common shall (as far as possible) be branded by their respective owners with some distinctive brand or mark for the purpose of identification.

6. The Managers shall be at liberty from time to time to call upon the owners of stock on the Common by advertisement in any newspaper circulating in the district to muster their stock at the appointed yards for the purpose of registration, or to see that all the stock depasturing on the Common are duly registered and carrying the correct badges, and the herdsman shall give every assistance at every such mustering.

7. All fees as hereinafter set forth shall be paid on registration of stock, and unless the prescribed fees are paid for renewal of registration within seven (7) days from the due date, the unregistered stock remaining on the Common shall be liable to at once be impounded by the herdsman.

8. The financial year of the Common shall commence on the first day of January in each year, and all registrations shall be made and fees paid within seven days from the said first day of January. No rebate or reduction shall be made in the fees for registration of stock for a portion or portions of the said financial year.

9. The fees for depasturing stock on the Common shall be as follow, and shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July in every year:—For large cattle, Three (3) shillings per annum; for small cattle, Two (2) shillings per annum. Calves under the age of six (6) months, the progeny of the cows legally depasturing on the Common, free.

10. No bull, entire horse, or swine shall be allowed to depasture on the Common without the special permission, in writing, of the Managers, and all other swine found on the Common shall be liable to be impounded, and all geese thereon shall be liable to be destroyed.

11. All unregistered stock found on the Common, with or without badges, shall be liable to be forthwith impounded.

12. The licences to depasture stock on the Common and the badges shall not be transferable. Substitution licences may, however, be granted in respect of stock placed on the Common in lieu of stock permanently removed therefrom, but only in cases in which the owner shall give

notice, in writing, to the herdsman of such removal, as well as the full descriptions and brands or marks of the new stock.

13. Whenever the Managers have reason to believe that any animal on the Common is affected with any contagious disease the owner of such animal shall, within twelve (12) hours after receiving notice, in writing, to that effect from the Managers or herdsman, remove such animal from the Common, and in case of neglect or refusal to so remove such animal the Managers shall be at liberty to order its immediate destruction and burial (if necessary) at the expense of the owner thereof, and the Managers shall be at liberty to refuse the registration of any other stock of such owner until he shall have paid the expense so incurred. No compensation shall be allowed for the destruction of any diseased animal.

14. No dead animal shall be allowed to remain on the Common, and if a carcass be not removed after twelve (12) hours' notice has been given to the owner thereof, the Managers shall be at liberty to cause such carcass to be removed and buried (if necessary) at the expense of the owner thereof, and to refuse the registration of any other stock of such owner until the expense so incurred has been paid.

15. Owners of registered stock shall be required to give immediate notice, in writing, to the herdsman of any stock sold or permanently removed from the Common.

16. The Managers shall not be responsible for the safe custody of stock depasturing on the Common, or for loss or damage sustained through neglect or mistake of the herdsman, or from any other cause whatsoever.

17. No person shall unnecessarily disturb any stock legally depasturing on the Common.

18. The herdsman shall give notice to the owner (if known by him) of stock impounded in any Pound where the Common brand or badge is registered within twenty-four (24) hours after receiving notice of such impounding, but the cost of releasing impounded stock shall in all cases be paid by the owner thereof.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any Justice of the Peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £20 for each offence.
