A By-law of the Shire of Winchelsea Waterworks Trust, made under the *Water Act* 1905, for the purpose of imposing, levying, and receiving a rate.

**I**N pursuance of the powers granted and conferred by the *Water Act* 1905, the Commissioners of the Shire of Winchelsea Waterworks Trust hereby make the following By-law:—

A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all the rateable property in the Waterworks District of the Shire of Winchelsea Waterworks Trust, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of Winchelsea in which such lands and tenements are situated, for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1908, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1908, provided that the sum of Ten shillings shall be the minimum amount of rates to be paid annually by every occupier or owner of such lands or tenements.

Such rate shall be payable and collected in two equal proportions or instalments of One shilling each, and the first portion or instalment shall be due and payable on the first day of January, 1908, and the second portion or instalment shall be due and payable on the 1st day of July, 1908.

Such person as the Commissioners of the Shire of Winchelsea Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

ELMORE WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING  
BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1908.

**T**HE Commissioners of the Elmore Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, for the purpose of the *Water Act* 1905, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the By-law following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1908 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Water Supply District.

1. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of the annual municipal value of Sixteen pounds (£16) and under, the sum of One pound (£1) shall be paid.

2. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of the annual municipal value of Seventeen pounds (£17) and upwards, a rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound shall be paid.

3. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant lands shall be One shilling and threepence (1s. 3d.) in the pound (£1), according to the municipal valuation, provided that in no case shall a rate of less than Twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.) be paid.

4. For water supplied to public troughs, a charge of Two pounds (£2) shall be made, provided that no person shall be charged for more than one trough.

5. Any water supplied to troughs other than public troughs must be paid for by meter or by special agreement, at such rates, upon such terms, and subject to such conditions as the Trust and the person requiring such supply may agree to adopt.

6. For water supplied by measure, a charge of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons shall be made, except in the case of special agreement with the Trust.

7. The foregoing rates are made payable in equal moieties on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1908.

Payment for supplies to troughs and by meter shall be made in advance or as may be demanded by the Trust.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

**W**HEREAS the Governor in Council has, by an Order made the 5th day of December, 1900, under the provisions of section 100 of the *Water Act* 1890, divided the Shire of Numurkah Waterworks Trust District (exclusive of that portion thereof proclaimed an Urban District on the 23rd day of June, 1890, and the 30th day of September, 1895, and the 17th day of July, 1899, that portion proclaimed an Urban District on the 5th day of December, 1900, that portion proclaimed an Urban District on the 23rd day of September, 1901, and also that portion proclaimed an Urban District on the 25th day of February, 1905), into divisions, and directed that the necessary rates for paying interest on moneys borrowed by the Shire of Numurkah Waterworks Trust for the construction and maintenance of its waterworks, or to meet any other expenses in connexion therewith, shall be levied in such divisions, viz.:—No. 1 Division and No. 2 Division; and has further directed that such rates be levied differentially as between such divisions; and has, by a further Order, made the 24th day of September, 1907, determined the proportions in which such divisions shall be rated respectively one to another for the year 1908.

The Commissioners of the Shire of Numurkah Waterworks Trust, under the powers conferred by the *Water Act* 1905, hereby make the following rates to be levied within the aforesaid divisions of the district of the Trust, the boundaries of which such divisions are fully set forth in the Order in Council of the 5th December, 1900, first above mentioned:—

1. In No. 1 Division, Fourpence in the pound sterling; in No. 2 Division, Threepence in the pound sterling. The respective rates to be levied on the annual value of all rateable property situated as above described, according to the valuation for the time being for the municipal rates for the Shire of Numurkah. The rates hereby made shall be for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1908, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1908.

2. Such rates are hereby made payable in one instalment and shall be due on the 1st day of January, 1908.

3. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

2. On every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds, according to the municipal valuation for the time being thereof, the sum of Two shillings in the pound of such valuation.

3. For each vacant allotment or piece of land rated separately from any building, Two shillings in the pound of the annual municipal valuation thereof.

4. Tenements situated within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe shall be charged one-half the assessed rate.

5. All accounts for water supplied by special agreement shall be paid as may be agreed upon.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

By-law for the making of a rate for the year 1908 on all rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Lillydale Waterworks Trust: Also, for dealing with charges for the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust.

1. A rate of One shilling in the pound sterling shall be paid on the annual value of all rateable property in the Waterworks District, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of Lillydale, but no such rate for tenements shall be less than One pound.

2. A rate of Five shillings shall be charged on all unoccupied lands facing the mains.

3. Where water is supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic use, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate payable for the year in respect of the premises supplied. Where water is supplied for other than domestic use solely, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly shall be 10,000 gallons. Charges for water shall be due and payable on 1st January and 1st July, 1908.

4. The foregoing rates are made payable in equal moieties on the 1st January and 1st July, 1908.

5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

MANSFIELD WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING  
BY-LAW FOR 1908.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Mansfield Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1905*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by such Act, make the following By-law:—

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1908.

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1908 in respect of water supplied by the said Trust within the Urban District:—

1. For every house and tenement of Ten (10) pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One (1) pound sterling.

2. For every house and tenement over Ten (10) pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Two (2) shillings in the pound sterling.

3. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land, a rate of Two (2) shillings in the pound sterling shall be paid up to One pound maximum.

4. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for when used for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which, at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure. Where water is used solely for other than domestic purposes it shall be charged for half-yearly, and the minimum quantity to be charged for during each half-year shall be 10,000 gallons.

5. The Trust reserve the right of putting on a meter and supplying water by measure.

6. For the right to use a hose for watering ornamental plots or gardens not exceeding one square chain, Ten shillings shall be charged, and Eight shillings for every additional chain, such right not to be exercised between the hours of Nine p.m. and Six a.m. Any person who transgresses this provision, or wastes, or misuses the water of the Trust, or interferes with any property vested in or controlled by the Trust, shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

7. For a temporary supply during the erection of a building or repairs, One pound per cent, shall be charged on the cost of the brickwork, stonework, and plastering; or the Trust may cause a meter to be fixed and a charge made by measure; or a special agreement may be made for the supply.

8. For every water-trough, a charge of Twenty (20) shillings shall be made. But on unoccupied lands, if the owner or occupier desires a trough, his rate payment shall be reckoned part of that One pound (£1).

9. For every steam-boiler supplied, except by special agreement, a charge of Thirty shillings per each horse-power shall be made.

10. For a supply to livery or carriers' stables, a charge of Five (5) shillings per each stall shall be made.

11. The fee to be paid for a plumber's licence shall be One pound per annum.

12. Provided that where persons within the Waterworks Trust District desire to have the service-pipes of the Trust extended to their properties, and are willing to pay the cost of such extension, the Trust shall have power to make a special agreement with them regarding the payment of water supplied, so as to cover their outlay.

13. The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1908, provided that the charge for a temporary supply shall be paid in advance, or as may be agreed upon.

14. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover such rates and charges.

BALLAN WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING  
BY-LAW FOR 1908.

THE Commissioners of the Ballan Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, make the following By-law:—

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1908.

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Trust District shall pay for water supplied by the Trust for the year 1908:—

1. For every vacant piece of land which has a separate annual municipal value of any amount, and past which any water main is laid, the sum of Five shillings (5s.) per annum.
2. For any shop which has a separate annual municipal value of any amount not supplied with water, and past which any water main is laid, the sum of Five shillings (5s.) per annum.
3. For every house or tenement of under Fifteen pounds (£15) annual municipal value, the sum of One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.) per annum.
4. For every house or tenement of Fifteen pounds (£15) and under Twenty pounds (£20) annual municipal value, the sum of One pound fifteen shillings (£1 15s.) per annum.
5. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds (£20) and under Twenty-five pounds (£25) annual municipal value, the sum of Two pounds (£2) per annum.
6. For every house or tenement of Twenty-five pounds (£25) and under Thirty-five pounds (£35) annual municipal value, the sum of Three pounds (£3) per annum.
7. For every house or tenement of Thirty-five pounds (£35) and under Sixty pounds (£60) annual municipal value, the sum of Four pounds (£4) per annum.
8. For every house or tenement of Sixty pounds (£60) and under One hundred pounds (£100) annual municipal value, the sum of Four pounds ten shillings (£4 10s.) per annum.
9. For every house or tenement of One hundred pounds (£100) and over annual municipal value, the sum of Five pounds (£5) per annum.
10. For water supplied to Government Departments, police stations, court house, post office, State school, show yards, cricket ground, shire hall, and similar properties shall be charged One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.) per annum.
11. All water supplied by the Trust by measurement shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and threepence (1s. 3d.) per thousand (1,000) gallons, but in no case shall the amount to be paid be less than that which would be payable for the premises under its municipal assessment.
12. For every public water trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the sum of One shilling (1s.) per annum shall be paid.
13. All public water troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps to prevent overflow; such taps to be approved by the secretary for the time being of the said Trust.
14. It shall be unlawful for any person to have an overflow waste pipe from any private bath.
15. The Trust may by notice, in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier using water for other than domestic purposes solely that the water supplied is to be charged by measure, and may by such notice require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within fourteen days after the receipt of such notice; and thereupon such owner or occupier shall, within the time specified, at his own expense provide a meter.
16. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined and approved and a certificate from the Board of Works or other authorized person be produced for the inspection of the secretary of the Trust for the time being that such meter is in proper order.
17. Every person requiring to remove or alter the position of any meter shall give six days' notice, in writing, to that effect to the Trust, and a registration of the quantity of water used shall be taken before such removal or alteration is made.
18. If any person who has provided any meter fail to give the notice required of any repairs required for such meter he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).
19. If any person refuse or delay to have such meter properly repaired and put in correct working order after having been required by any officer of the Trust so to do the Trust may shut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the service pipe or otherwise, until such meter shall have been properly repaired and certified by some officer of the Trust as being in proper working order.

20. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, or who shall use or allow the water to be used in an unauthorized manner, or who is in arrears with the payment of his water rate, the Trust may, after one hour's notice, cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person either by cutting the pipes by or through which the water is supplied or by any other means that are available, and may cease to supply such premises with water so long as the Trust may think fit.

21. It shall be lawful for any person appointed by the Trust for such purpose to request permission from any owner or occupier to make an inspection of the water service to ascertain if water is being allowed to run to waste, and, if such owner or occupier refuse permission for such inspection, the Trust may, if it think fit, refuse to supply such premises with water; and such refusal on their part will in no way relieve the owner or occupier from payment of any rate or rates as may be levied on such property.

22. If the person appointed for such inspection shall ascertain that any owner or occupier is allowing water to waste by reason of leaky taps or otherwise, he shall be empowered to authorize the repair of such taps or pipes and to notify such owner or occupier that the waste of water must at once cease.

23. No person shall affix any service pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter or repair or in any way interfere with any pipe of the Trust or any service pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust until he shall have obtained from the Trust permission to execute such works, and such permission shall be at and during the pleasure of the Trust, who may at any time cancel such permission.

24. Any person, whether licensed or permitted as aforesaid or not, who shall require to affix any service pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or to make any repairs to pipes under the control of the Trust shall give notice to the Secretary of his intention so to do.

25. All connexions from the Trust mains to property shall be made at the expense of the owner or occupier of the property to be supplied, and all repairs or renewals shall, when necessary, be made by the owner or occupier, and such pipes shall at all times be under the control of the Trust.

26. All connexions, pipes, and fittings shall be of the best quality, and approved by the Secretary and Chairman of the Trust.

27. The service pipes from the main being the property of the owner or occupier of the tenements supplied by such service pipes, the occupier (if any), and, if none, the owner, shall, upon receiving notice that his service pipe requires repairing, immediately proceed to repair the same, and he shall be responsible for any loss of water or other damage which shall be caused by reason of such service pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, and the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises in any way it may seem fit until such repairs have been effected.

28. Fire plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires unless any other use of them be allowed by the Trust, and they shall at all times be under the control of an officer of the Trust.

29. Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose except under the direction of the officer of the Trust shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

30. For any breach of these Regulations a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) shall be imposed.

31. The above-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1908, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1908, and shall be payable in two instalments; the first instalment shall be due and payable on the 1st day of May, 1908, and the second instalment on the 1st day of November, 1908. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Ballan Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rate.

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1908 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District:—

1. A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all rateable property in the Waterworks District, according to the municipal valuation of such properties. The minimum rate to be paid shall be Twenty shillings.

2. For water supplied by the Trust for domestic and other than domestic purposes by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of lands and tenements within the Trust District shall be the quantity for which the charge at One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by the Trust by measure, in excess of such aforesaid quantity, shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

3. For water supplied by measurement for other than domestic purposes solely, a charge of One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be made (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than Twenty shillings.

4. All water supplied by the Trust outside the Trust District shall (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) be charged for at the rate of One shilling and ninepence per 1,000 gallons up to the minimum charge by the Trust, and for all water used in excess of such quantity the charge shall be at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons; provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than Twenty shillings.

5. Such rates and charges, other than charges for water supplied by measurement in excess, are hereby made payable half-yearly, in advance, one moiety on the first day of January, 1908, and one moiety on the first day of July, 1908.

6. Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates and charges.

BOORT WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING BY-LAW

BY virtue of the *Water Act 1905*, By-law for imposing, levying, and receiving water rates and charges within the Boort Waterworks Trust District:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Boort Waterworks Trust District shall pay for the year 1908, namely:—

2. On every house or tenement abutting or fronting every street within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the purpose of supplying water, and such house or tenement being of the annual value of Eighteen pounds or less, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement for the said year, One pound seven shillings.

3. On every house or tenement abutting or fronting any street within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the purpose of supplying water, and such house or tenement being above the annual value of Eighteen pounds, according to the municipal valuation for the said year, the sum of Two shillings in the pound of such valuation.

4. On every house or tenement not abutting or fronting a street within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the supply of water, and to which house or tenement the water shall not have been laid on, a rate of Thirteen shillings and sixpence shall be paid where the municipal valuation of such house or tenement does not exceed Eighteen pounds. Where such valuation exceeds Eighteen pounds, a rate of Ninepence in the pound shall be paid, provided that in no case shall a rate of less than Thirteen shillings and sixpence be paid.

5. In every case where the water shall have been laid on to a house or tenement not abutting or fronting a street within which the Trust shall have laid down a pipe for the purpose of supplying water, the rates provided by clauses 2 and 3 of this Regulation shall be paid. Also, that any ratepayer who may be considered to be using an undue quantity of water shall be compelled by the Trust to provide a meter; water to be charged for at the rate of One shilling per (1,000) thousand gallons.

6. The above rate shall be due and payable on the 1st day of May, 1908.

Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates.

1. For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual municipal valuation or under, the sum of Twenty shillings.

3. For every unoccupied allotment of land, and for every vacant piece of land, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling of the annual municipal valuation of such allotment or piece of land, provided that in no case shall a rate less than Ten shillings be charged.

For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe of the Trust, there shall be paid one-half of the above rates, and for all such lands and tenements being over a quarter of a mile, but within half a mile from such stand-pipe, one-quarter of the full rate shall be paid.
5. For every steam boiler supplied with water by the Trust, there shall be paid the sum of £5 (Five pounds) sterling.
6. For water supplied by the Trust for domestic and other than domestic purposes by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Trust in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.
7. Water supplied to the Government Departments, religious denominations, and persons outside the Trust Districts shall be by measurement or special agreement.
8. The above-mentioned rates and charges (except for water supplied by measure) shall be payable in equal moieties half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1908.

Water supplied by measure shall be paid for on demand any time after it has been supplied.

9. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Rushworth Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

4. For every steam boiler supplied with water, a charge of Five pounds will be made for the year 1908.
5. Water troughs will be supplied at charges as follows:—For each trough or tub in an allotment of five acres or under, a charge of Fifteen shillings shall be made for the year; and for each acre above five acres, a charge of One shilling per acre shall be made, in addition to the payment of Fifteen shillings for the first five acres. But this charge shall not be enforced on tubs or receptacles of any kind in a house-yard, unless used to water stock. The maximum amount to be paid for a supply of water to any trough shall be Five pounds per annum.

For the supply of water to each hotel trough, a charge of One pound ten shillings shall be paid for the year.

6. Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum amount so charged for any half-year shall be 12,000 gallons.

7. Gardens and lawns will be supplied at charges as follows:—

- One-eighth of an acre or under, Five shillings.
- Exceeding one-eighth but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, Ten shillings.
- Exceeding one-quarter but not exceeding one-half of an acre, One pound ten shillings.

The charges for gardens and lawns are for the year 1908, and no reduction shall be made where the water is used for a portion of the year only.

8. The above-mentioned rates and charges are made for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1908, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1908. And such rates shall be payable on the 1st day of July, 1908.

The charges for water shall be payable quarterly, or at such time as payment may be demanded by the Trust.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Avenel Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

In cases where water is sold by measure for other than domestic use solely, the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly shall be 27,000 gallons.

7. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties on the 1st of January and 1st of July, 1908.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the *Small Improved Holdings Act 1906* (6 Edw. VII. No. 2053), power is given to the Governor in Council to make regulations for the various purposes specified in such section and for fully carrying out the objects and purposes and guarding against evasions and violations of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS.

The Regulations following, numbered 7, 9, 10, and 11 respectively, are substituted for the regulations bearing corresponding numbers made on the 12th March, 1907:—

7. Every *Gazette* notice announcing that allotments are available for Small Improved Holdings shall notify the date up to which applications will be received.

9. Applications for advances of necessary materials for erecting dwellings and fencing, or effecting other improvements, or for implements or live stock, shall be made in the form prescribed in Schedule "C" hereto.

10. Should the Minister sanction the advance of materials, implements, or live stock to the probationary tenant of an allotment, an order as prescribed in Schedule "D" shall be issued to such person as may be authorized by the Minister or the manager to supply the materials, implements, or live stock.

11. On receipt of the order the materials, implements, or live stock (as the case may be) to the value mentioned therein may be supplied, and on production to the manager of such order, together with the invoice received by the tenant, and countersigned by the foreman, acknowledging the delivery in good order and condition of such materials, implements, or live stock, the amount will be paid.

AMENDMENT OF SCHEDULE "B."

## SHIRE OF WARRAGUL.

## BY-LAW NO. 24.

A By-law of the Shire of Warragul, made under sub-section 29 of section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, for prohibiting or regulating the use on any public highway of traction engines or other vehicles having projections on their wheels, and under section 594 of the said Act for regulating the conditions on which traction engines may proceed over any public highway.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Warragul order as follows:—

*(Bars, Spikes, Grips, or other Projections on Wheels.)*

1. No person shall use or cause or procure any other person to use on any public highway any traction engine or other vehicle having on its wheels any bars, spikes, grips, or other projections:

This prohibition, however, shall not apply to—

- (a) Any traction engine, used only for hauling agricultural machinery, or hauling a vehicle containing such machinery only, if the projections on the driving wheels of such engine consist only of bars at least two and three-quarter inches in width and not more than one and one-sixteenth of an inch in thickness, or
- (b) Any traction engine the driving wheels of which are cylindrical and smooth soled, and having no projections thereon other than diagonal bars of not less than three inches in width nor more than three-quarters of an inch in thickness, and extending the full width of the tire, and the space intervening between such cross bars not exceeding three inches, provided in such last-mentioned case—
  - (i.) That the owner of such engine has previously obtained from the Council or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf a permit in writing specifying the public highways on which it may be used, and that the engine is being used on one of the highways so specified.
  - (ii.) That the owner has agreed in writing to pay to the Council the cost of making good any damage done to any roadway, bridge, or culvert by such engine or any vehicle drawn by it.
  - (iii.) That such engine is not being used (unless with the written consent of the Council or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf) to haul more than two vehicles, exclusive of any vehicle solely used for carrying water for such engine.
  - (iv.) That the loading of any vehicle drawn by such engine does not exceed nine tons in weight, including the weight of such vehicle.
  - (v.) That the weight carried by any vehicle drawn by such engine (including the weight of such vehicle does not exceed three hundredweight for each half inch of bearing surface of the tire or felloe of each wheel of such vehicle).

*(Weight of Engine, etc., to be Painted thereon.)*

2. Every owner of a traction engine shall cause to be painted in legible letters not less than one inch long on a plate attached to the engine, or on a conspicuous place on the engine, the exact and true weight thereof, and the maximum weight of water and fuel necessary for its propulsion.

*(Person to be in Attendance whilst Engine contains in itself sufficient motive power to move it.)*

3. So long as the fires of a traction engine are alight, or the traction engine contains in itself sufficient motive power to move it, one person shall remain in attendance whilst it is on any public highway, although it is stationary.

*(Taking Engine across or along Bridges, Embankments, etc.)*

4. No person shall take any traction engine across or along any bridge, culvert, or embankment so as to meet or pass thereon any other traction engine or any person with a horse or a vehicle drawn by a horse.

*(Engines not to Halt in certain parts of Highway.)*

5. No person shall halt (unless through unforeseen circumstances, or unless actually engaged in loading or unloading) in any part of a road where the traffic way is

narrowed by fences, excavations, embankments, dangerous depressions, or such like, but shall draw off at least twenty feet from the middle of the formation in the case of a made road, or the middle of the surveyed road if unmade.

*(Engines not to Halt on Bridges or Culverts.)*

6. No person shall permit any traction engine or any vehicle attached to or drawn thereby to stop on any bridge or culvert for the purpose of drawing water, or for any other purpose whatever.

*(Driving Engine between Sunset and Sunrise.)*

7. No person shall drive any traction engine between sunset and sunrise, unless by written permission of the Council or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf, defining the route to be travelled and the extended hours during which such travelling is permissible, such permission to be withdrawable at any time upon written notice to that effect being served on the owner or driver of the engine, or being forwarded to him by registered letter. No person who has received such written permission shall drive any traction engine between sunset and sunrise, unless there shall be exhibited on such engine proper and sufficient carriage or other approved lights, one at each side on the front and one in the rear, or when a vehicle or vehicles are being drawn by such engine, then in rear of the last vehicle.

*(Wooden Planks to be carried on Engine, etc.)*

8. No person shall use or cause or procure to be used on any public highway any traction engine unless there is carried on such engine or some vehicle drawn by the same, at least four wooden planks twelve inches in width, four inches in thickness, and at least twelve feet in length, and when crossing any bridge or culvert the driver or the person in charge of such engine shall lay down such planks, and no engine shall be permitted to cross over any bridge or culvert except on such planks.

*(Skidding of Wheels of Engine.)*

9. The driver of a traction engine shall shut off steam immediately the driving wheels of the engine commence to skid, and he shall not start the engine until he has taken all necessary and proper means to prevent damage being done to the highway by the skidding of the wheels.

*(Penalties.)*

10. Any person shall for any wilful act or default contrary to this By-law be liable to the following penalty:—

- (a) For the first offence, a fine not exceeding Three pounds.
- (b) For the second offence, a fine not exceeding Five pounds.
- (c) For any subsequent offence, a fine not exceeding Ten pounds.

*(Extent of Operation of By-law.)*

11. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Shire of Warragul.
