AMENDED GENERAL RULE FOR PROCEEDING
BEFORE WARDENS.

WHEREAS by the *Mines Act* 1890, section 285, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court and any two or more of the Judges of the Courts of Mines from time to time, but subject to Part I. of the said Act, to frame such General Rules as to them shall seem expedient for and concerning and so far as not therein provided for the practice and proceedings in cases before the Wardens for the purposes and to the effect and under the conditions and limitations therein prescribed, and from time to time to rescind or alter any such rule. Now we the said Chief Justice of the said Supreme Court and Judges of the Courts of Mines, in pursuance of the said powers, do hereby rescind the General Rule numbered 1 of the General Rules which commenced and came into operation from the first day of March, 1891, and in lieu thereof do frame and declare the following General Rule which shall commence and come into operation from the first day of December, 1907.

VENUE.

1. Every suit before a Warden shall be commenced by a summons from a Warden in whose district or portion of whose district the subject-matter of dispute if land or an interest in land lies, or where a sole defendant resides; but if there are several defendants the suit may proceed before a Warden in whose district or portion of whose district any of the defendants resides; and if there be no such district which includes the residence of such sole defendant or of any of such several defendants then before the Warden whose district is nearest to the residence of such sole defendant, or of any one of such defendants, with power however in the latter case for the Warden to stay the proceedings with or without costs in order that proceedings may be taken before a Warden more convenient, regarding the residence of the defendants and witnesses, or to direct that any suit or proceeding may be heard, transferred, or adjourned to some other place or before some other Warden having jurisdiction.

AMENDED GENERAL RULE FOR PROCEEDING
IN COURTS OF MINES.

WHEREAS by the *Mines Act* 1890, section 285, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court and any two or more of the Judges of the Courts of Mines from time to time, but subject to Part I. of the said Act, to frame such General Rules as to them shall seem expedient for and concerning and so far as not therein provided for the pleadings practice and proceedings of the Courts holden under the said part of the said Act for the purposes and to the effect and under the conditions and limitations therein prescribed, and from time to time to rescind or alter any such rule. Now we the said Chief Justice of the Supreme Court and Judges of the Courts of Mines, in pursuance of the said power, do hereby rescind the General Rule numbered 1 of the General Rules which commenced and came into operation from 1st March, 1891, and in lieu thereof do frame and declare the following General Rule which shall commence and come into operation on the first day of December, 1907.

VENUE.

1. Every suit in a Court of Mines shall be commenced in the district and division where the subject-matter of dispute if land, or any interest in land lies, or where a sole defendant resides; but if there are several defendants the suit may proceed in the district and division in which any of such defendants may reside, and if there be no such district which includes the residence of such sole defendant or of any of such several defendants, then in the district and division which is nearest to the residence of such sole defendant, or of any one of such several defendants, with power, however, in the latter case for the Judge to stay proceedings with or without costs, in order that proceedings may be taken in a district or division more convenient, regarding the residence of the defendants and witnesses, or to direct that any suit or proceeding may be heard, transferred, or adjourned to some other division in the same district.

Marine Department,

Wellington, N.Z., 17th October, 1907.

NOTICE is hereby given that a new entrance has been cut through the Boulder Bank which encloses the harbor at Nelson. The channel outside and the cut through the bank have been completed, and the channel now has a minimum depth of 15 ft. at L.W.O.S.T., but dredging is still being continued inside the harbor to make a uniform channel of 15 ft. depth to the wharves. At present the channel inside the harbor has a minimum depth of 12 ft. at L.W.O.S.T.

Ships enter the port through the new entrance at the discretion of the pilot, and under his charge only, until dredging-work inside the harbor has been finally completed.

The source of supply is to be the Goulburn River, by way of the Goulburn-Waranga-Mallee State Works of Water Supply.

The winter season is to extend from 11th June to 15th November in each year, the summer season is to extend from 16th November in each year to 15th April in the year following.

Such rate is hereby made for the year 1908, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1908, and terminating on the 31st day of December, 1908, and shall be payable on the 1st day of January, 1908.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive such rates, or such portion thereof as they may be appointed to demand and receive.

MOOROPNA WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
BY-LAW FOR 1908.

THE Commissioners of the Mooropna Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, do hereby make the following By-law:—

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1908.

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the district of the Mooropna Waterworks Trust shall pay for water supplied by the Trust:—

1. For every house or land under Twelve pounds ten shillings annual municipal value, the sum of One pound five shillings sterling.
2. For every house or land valued at Twelve pounds ten shillings and upwards, according to the annual valuation for the municipal rate for the municipal district in which such house or land is situated, a rate of Ten pounds per centum on the amount of such valuation shall be charged.
3. For all water sold by meter by the Trust, the sum of Ninepence per 1,000 gallons shall be charged, except in the case of the supply by meter to the Mooropna Hospital, to which institution the charge shall be Eightpence per 1,000 gallons.
4. For every public and private water trough supplied by the Trust, the sum of One pound per annum shall be charged.
5. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where the water is supplied by measurement shall be the quantity for which the charge of Ninepence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate if the water were supplied otherwise than by meter.
6. The above rates and charges are made for the year ending 31st December, 1908, and the rates shall be payable in advance, in two moieties, on the first day of January, 1908, and the first day of July, 1908.
7. All rates remaining unpaid for six months after they have become due and payable shall bear interest at the rate of six per cent. per annum until they are paid.
8. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Mooropna Waterworks Trust may appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and receive the said rates and charges.

By-law determining the rate payable for the year 1908 for water supplied within the boundaries of the Pyramid Hill Waterworks Trust district.

1. A rate of Three shillings (3s.) in the pound sterling on the municipal value of all rateable property situate within the waterworks district of the Pyramid Hill Waterworks Trust, is hereby made for the year 1908.
2. The minimum rate on any tenement used as a domicile shall be 30s. (Thirty shillings).
3. On all unoccupied allotments or pieces of land within the waterworks district, and not rated under the foregoing clause, a minimum rate of 10s. (Ten shillings) shall be charged.
4. The foregoing rate is hereby made payable on the first day of March, 1908.
5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint is or are hereby authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates.

BOROUGH OF DAYLESFORD WATERWORKS
TRUST.—RATING BY-LAW FOR 1908.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, make the following by-law:—

BY-LAW NUMBERED 27.

Fixing the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied within the Trust District, such rate being made for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1908.

The rates and charges which shall be payable by the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust District, who are supplied with water by the Trust, shall be as follows:—

1. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel or wine shop, of the annual value of Twenty pounds or under, the sum of One pound one shilling per annum.
2. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel or wine shop, above the annual value of Twenty pounds, and not exceeding the annual value of Two hundred pounds, the sum of Five pounds per cent. per annum on the valuation.
3. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel or wine shop, above the annual value of Two hundred pounds, the sum of Four pounds ten shillings per cent. on the valuation.
4. On every hotel or wine shop of the annual value of Thirty pounds and under, a minimum rate of Two pounds per annum.
5. On every hotel or wine shop above the annual value of Thirty pounds, the sum of Six pounds per cent. per annum on the valuation, provided that the charge shall not in any case be less than Two pounds.
6. On unoccupied lands, and lands on which no tenements are erected, nor water laid on, the sum of Five pounds per cent. on the annual valuation. Should water be laid on, the charge to be in accordance with the rates fixed in this by-law for tenements.
7. On livery, coach, and hotel stables, at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for the first stall, and Seven shillings and sixpence per annum for each additional stall. In open sheds used for stabling, each 6 feet to be considered as one stall. For horses kept on private premises, Ten shillings per annum for the first horse kept, and Seven shillings and sixpence per annum for each additional horse.
8. Cows to be paid for at the rate of One shilling each per annum.
9. Water-troughs, Ten shillings each per annum.
10. Water supplied by meter to be at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, except to manufactories, aerated water makers, &c., to whom the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, provided that not less than 60,000 gallons per annum is consumed, failing which the charge shall be Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.
11. Water supplied for irrigation of gardens, nurseries, cricket grounds, &c., to be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum quantity charged for shall be 20,000 gallons per annum.
12. For water supplied to buildings in course of erection, the charge shall be Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of the contract for brickwork, stonework, or plastering; or, should the Trust require a meter to be affixed, the rate shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.
13. For water supplied to steam-boilers, the charge shall be at the rate of Ten shillings per horse-power per annum.
14. The charge for water supplied for mining purposes shall be as per agreement.
15. These rates and charges shall be payable by equal half-yearly instalments, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1908, except in cases where the Trust may have made a special agreement regarding the times of payment for water supplied by measure or for mining purposes.
16. Such person or persons as the Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint, for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

15. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure, except in the cases of special agreement with the Trust, shall be the quantity for which the charge, at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate if water was supplied otherwise than by measure.

The foregoing By-law, numbered 27, was made and adopted by the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust this 27th day of September, 1907.

MOOROOPOONA WATERWORKS TRUST.—BY-LAW.

THE Commissioners of the Moorooopna Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the power conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, No. 2016, do hereby make the following by-law:—

1. That the regulations made by the Commissioners of the Moorooopna Waterworks Trust, on the 8th day of December, 1890, shall be, and the same are hereby, repealed.

2. All works to be done in connexion with the repair, connexion, extension, or improvement of any of the Trust's mains, or of any service attached thereto, shall be in accordance with the above Act, and to the entire satisfaction of the Trust or its officers.

3. The time for executing such work shall be fixed by the Trust, which shall direct its officers accordingly, who shall at all reasonable times inspect any service or work, whether within or without any building.

4. No connexions shall be made with the Trust's main, or additions, or alterations to any service, without the consent of the Trust having first been obtained.

5. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter, or repair, uncover, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or fittings connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain a licence from the Trust in that behalf to execute such work. Any unlicensed person uncovering, affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fittings as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such offence.

6. Before any licence shall be granted the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber.

7. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving 24 hours' notice of the day and the hour when such pipe is to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, or who shall make such communication except under the supervision and, according to the directions of some officer of the Trust, or who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Trust, shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

8. Iron pipes of the following dimensions, viz., 2-inch diameter or bore, galvanized, of approved quality, will only be allowed for external or internal services. Ordinary connexions with cast mains must be made with proper brass ferrules, to which must be attached approved stop-taps. One service-pipe to each tenement will only be permitted. A service-pipe of greater diameter may be allowed by the express approval of the Trust on special application thereto.

9. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting the service-pipe, or otherwise as the Trust may think fit, and the supply of water shall remain cut off until the necessary repairs shall have been effected, and this shall be without prejudice to any remedy the Trust may have against such person in respect thereof.

10. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, or shall allow the water to be wasted by reason of any leakage in the pipes or taps, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

11. All persons supplied with water by the Trust are required, in the event of any breakage occurring in the pipes, taps, or meter whereby any water may be wasted, to give notice to the Secretary to the Trust within twelve hours of such occurrence; and in the event of such notice not being given, such person or persons shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such offence, and the supply of water to such person may be discontinued by the Trust.

12. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall wilfully offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipes or pipe the property of the Trust, without giving 24 hours' notice to the Trust in writing of his intention to do so, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust without the permission in writing being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, valve, pipe-work, or engine the property of the Trust, shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

13. For water supplied from stand-pipes or hydrant, for each load of two hundred gallons, or under, one shilling, and for each additional load *pro ratio* upon aforesaid scale.

14. For water supplied temporary during erection of new buildings, repairs, or additions, Twenty shillings per centum on the amount of stonework, brickwork, and plastering or, in absence of a contract, Twenty shillings per centum on the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or the said Trust may require a meter to be affixed, when the charge shall be by measurement.

15. The Trust may, on giving seven days' notice in writing, require any owner or occupier of property supplied with water to cause a meter to be affixed to the supply-pipe, and such meter shall be provided at the expense of the consumer, the water supplied to be charged for at the aforesaid rate.

16. No meter shall be allowed to be affixed unless the dial of same is capable of registering 200,000 gallons.

17. If any meter should cease registering, or be reported by the inspector or other officer of the Trust to be out of repair, or registering inaccurately, the Trust shall estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period the meter was known to be out of order or registering inaccurately, and until the meter shall be repaired and refixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter or during the corresponding period of the previous year, or the Trust may attach a check meter to the service-pipe at the expense of the person using the water.

18. Any person or persons receiving water from the Trust, who shall take and carry away such water from his or her premises, or shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or who shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such offence.

19. Any person, who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such offence.

20. Overflow-pipes to baths or any other vessels will not be permitted.

21. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing thereto a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of steam from reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

22. Any person or persons guilty of any of the by-laws or conditions herein mentioned, or doing anything in contravention of the *Water Act 1905*, shall be liable to have his or her supply of water discontinued upon a resolution to that effect being carried at a meeting of the Trust.

23. All communications signed by the Secretary to be taken as issued by the Trust.

24. In the construction of this by-law the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether sole or aggregate.

REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS it is among other things provided by section 118 of the *Stamps Act 1890* that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, add to, alter, amend, or repeal regulations for carrying out all or any of the provisions of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, acting with the advice of the Executive Council of the same, doth hereby make the following regulations, that is to say:—

REFUND OF FEES PAID IN MONEY.

1. Where through any mistake, inadvertence, omission, or other irregularity on the part of any officer of the Public Service any fee has been unnecessarily paid to the Collector of Imposts under the *Stamps Acts* on any instrument tendered or lodged for registration or in relation to matters to be done in the offices of the Registrar-General or Registrar of Titles, and the instrument in respect of which such fee has been paid is useless for the purpose intended and has never had any operation, the Head of the Department may certify that such fee may be refunded in whole or in part, or where through any mistake inadvertence, omission, or other irregularity on the part of any person other than an officer of the Public Service in connexion with any instrument tendered or lodged for registration or in relation to any matter to be done in the offices of the Registrar-General or Registrar of Titles any fee has been unnecessarily paid to the Collector of Imposts under the *Stamps Acts*, the Minister may if he think fit certify that such fee may be allowed in whole or in part, and on the production of such certificate and the instrument to which it relates, the Collector shall refund such fee but shall retain such instrument and duly cancel the same. Every application for the refund of fees shall be made to the Registrar-General or the Registrar of Titles as the case may be, and shall set out full particulars of the claim, and the Registrar-General or Registrar of Titles shall cause a report thereon to be supplied for the information of the Minister or the Head of the Department.

2. At the end of each month the Collector of Imposts shall make application to the Treasurer for reimbursement of the amounts refunded as aforesaid, and shall forward therewith the vouchers for such amounts.

3. No person having knowledge or the opportunity of knowledge of the facts set out in or that should appear in any instrument on which a fee has been paid, and who has lodged the instrument on the chance of succeeding, shall be entitled to a refund of the fee paid thereon because the instrument through error or omission therein or otherwise may fail to be registered.

And the Honorable John Mark Davies, His Majesty's Solicitor-General for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

- (b) That the lessee shall reside on the allotment. (Personal residence by the wife or any child not less than eighteen years of age of the lessee, may be considered personal residence by the lessee, with the approval of the Board.)
- (c) That the lessee shall not transfer, assign, mortgage, or sublet, or part with the whole or any part of the allotment within the first six years of the lease.
- (d) That the lessee shall not erect more than one residence or place of business on any one allotment.
- (e) Such other conditions and covenants not inconsistent with the Act as the Governor in Council may by regulation prescribe.

The purchase money, with interest at 4½ per cent., must be paid by 63 or a lesser number of half-yearly instalments (including deposit), calculated according to any of the tables under Division 3 of Part I. of the *Savings Banks Act 1890 Amendment Act 1896*. Each instalment will include interest upon the balance of the purchase money remaining unpaid.

SHIRE OF NUNAWADING.

BY-LAW NO. 14.

A By-Law of the Shire of Nunawading made under Section 197 of the "Local Government Act 1903," and numbered 14, for the purpose of applying the provisions of Sections 512 to 525, subdivisions 1, 2, and 3, Division 10 of Part 18 of the "Local Government Act 1903," to the Shire of Nunawading.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the "Local Government Act 1903," the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Nunawading order as follows :—

1. DIVISION 10.—FIXING THE LEVEL OF STREETS, AND LAYING OUT STREETS ON PRIVATE PROPERTY.

(1) Application.

512. *Application of Subdivision.*—The provisions of this Division of this Part of this Act shall apply to all boroughs and to all parts of shires which have been at any time boroughs, and to all parts of shires to which the same have by any by-law in force in such shire been declared applicable.

(2) Fixing Levels of Streets.

513. *Meaning of "Street" in this Subdivision.*—In this subdivision the word "street" shall be deemed to include any portion not being less than ten chains of the length of such street.

514. *Level how Fixed.*—The level of every street not already fixed shall be fixed under the direction of the surveyor of the council, subject to such right of appeal as hereinafter mentioned; and the level so fixed if not altered on appeal shall be kept thereafter by every person erecting any house or other building in such street.

515. *Notice by Council of intention to fix level.*—One month at the least before fixing the level of any street which has not theretofore been levelled or paved the council shall give notice by advertisement to be twice inserted in some newspaper generally circulating in the neighbourhood of their intention to fix the level thereof which notice shall set forth the name and situation of the street the level whereof is to be fixed and shall refer to plans of such intended work and shall specify a place where such plans may be seen and a time when and place where all persons interested in such intended work may be heard thereupon.

516. *Hearing and determining objections.*—(1) The council shall meet at the time and place mentioned in such notice and consider any objections made against such intended work.

(2) All persons interested therein or likely to be aggrieved thereby shall be entitled to be heard before the council at such meeting.

(3) Thereupon the council in their discretion may adopt or abandon or make such alteration in the said intended work as they judge fit.

517. *Appeal against order determining level.*—(1) Any person aggrieved by any order of the council as aforesaid relating to the level of any street may at any time within fourteen days next after the making of any such order give notice to the council that he intends to appeal against such order to a police magistrate sitting in a court of petty sessions holden nearest to the street to which such order relates and within one month of the service of such notice.

(2) If within eight days after giving such notice the party enters into a recognisance before some justice with two sufficient sureties conditioned to try the appeal and abide the order of the court and to pay such costs as may be awarded by the court thereon, the order so appealed against shall not take effect until after the judgment on such appeal.

(3) Such court shall hear and determine the matter of the appeal and shall make such order thereon either confirming quashing or varying the order of the council as to it may seem fit.

518. *Power to council to raise or lower by successive steps the soil of a street so as to conform to the level as fixed.*—When the level of any street has been formally fixed under any law for the time being in force relating to local government in altering the level of the ground in such street to conform to the level of such street as so fixed the council of the municipality shall not be compelled at any one time to raise or lower the level of the ground to the full extent that may be required in order to conform to such level as fixed but may raise or lower the level of the ground to a less extent than is necessary in order to conform to such level and so on from time to time, and the municipality shall not be compelled to make compensation to any one in consequence of so proceeding, providing that the level of such street as so fixed is not exceeded either upwards or downwards.

519. *Municipality altering level once fixed to make compensation.*—If after the fixing of the level of any street under the provisions of any law for the time being in force relating to local government, the council of any municipality alter the level of the ground in such street, save to conform to the level so fixed, the municipality shall make full compensation to all persons interested in any property injuriously affected by such alteration.

520. *Alteration of water or gas pipes on notice from council.*—(1) If after the fixing of the level of any street under the provisions of any Act for the time being in force relating to local government the council deem it necessary to raise sink or otherwise alter the level of any street in which any waterpipe or gaspipe or other waterworks or gasworks are laid they shall from time to time by notice in writing require the person to whom such pipes or works belong to cause forthwith, or as soon as conveniently may be, such pipes or works to be raised sunk or otherwise altered in position in accordance with the altered level of such street, provided that such alteration be not such as permanently to injure such works.

(2) The expenses attending such raising sinking or altering, and full compensation for every damage done thereby, shall be paid by the council, as well as to the person to whom such pipes belong as to all other persons injuriously affected thereby.

521. *Council may act on default.*—If the person to whom any such pipes or works belong does not proceed forthwith, or as soon as conveniently may be after the receipt of such notice, to cause the same to be raised sunk or altered in such manner as the council require, the council may themselves cause such pipes or works to be raised sunk or altered as they think fit, provided that such works be not permanently injured thereby.

(3). *Laying out Streets on Private Property.*

522. *Notice of laying out new streets.—Plan to be submitted.*—(1) Every person who intends to make of lay any new street in any part of any municipal district to which the provisions of this Division of this Part of this Act apply shall:

(a) Give notice of such his intention to the council of the municipality in order that the level of such street may be fixed by the council; and

(b) Submit to the council a plan showing such street and the lands abutting thereon and the levels thereof so as to enable the council to ascertain whether such street and lands can be sufficiently drained.

(2) *Report and inspection by engineer or surveyor.*—The council may refer such notice plans and levels to their surveyor or engineer to report thereon, and may demand and receive from the person giving such notice

such fees as they think reasonable; and the council shall pay such fees to their surveyor or engineer for any report, inspection or other service made or performed by him under this section.

523. *No person may lay out street until council certifies that such street and lands abutting can be drained.*—

(1) Notwithstanding anything in this Division contained such person shall not lay out such street unless the council certify in writing that in their opinion such street and lands can be sufficiently drained.

(2) *Person aggrieved may appeal from decision of council.*—But if any such person is aggrieved by the neglect for three months after delivery of plan or by the refusal of the council to give such certificate he shall have the same right of appeal as is hereinbefore provided in the case of any person aggrieved by any order of the council relating to the level of any street and all the provisions relating to such last-mentioned appeal shall be deemed to apply accordingly.

524. *Proceeding on default of council in fixing level.*

—(1) If the council do not fix such level within three months from the time of the delivery of such notice as aforesaid unless the fixing of such level is delayed by the appeal hereinbefore provided the person giving such notice may proceed to lay out the street at any level which will allow of compliance with the other provisions of this Act as if such level had been fixed by the council.

(2) In such case every change of the level which the council afterwards deem requisite and all the works consequent thereon shall be made by the council and the expense thereof and any damage which any person sustains in consequence of such alteration shall be defrayed by them.

525. *Default of giving notice by person laying out street.*—(1) Every person who makes or lays out any such new street as aforesaid without causing such notice to be given to the council or without receiving such certificate as aforesaid except as provided in the last preceding section shall be liable to defray all the expenses consequent upon any change of the level of the said street deemed requisite by the council.

(2) Every person who in building a house or other building in such street does not keep the level fixed by the council shall be liable to defray all the expenses consequent upon any change of the level of that part of the street on which such house or building abuts which the council deem requisite.

2. This By-Law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

3. Every person who shall, by any wilful act or default, be guilty of any breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10 nor less than 5s. for each such breach.

4. This by-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipality on and after the 1st day of January, 1908, except as to that part of the Fairfield Riding east of Sparkes-avenue, and Fairfield-road, as far as Rushall-street, and to the east side of Perry-street, from Rushall-street to the railway line.
